





STAIRCASES GOING UP AND DOWN IN STYLE

Interior Designer **Dolores Pian** shares her ideas.

Staircases are corridors, leading both the eye and visitor from one storey to the next. An important element in the design and function of a home, stairs can make a dramatic or subtle statement.

When planning a new staircase or renovating an old one, it's important to seek a reputable staircase manufacturer who can provide expert advice on types of steps, spindles and handrails, as well as crucial information regarding timing and pricing.

DECISIONS, DECISIONS

Staircase design is based upon your needs and wants, for example:

Architectural style: Gothic Revival, Georgian, craftsman or modern?

Function: utilitarian, statement piece or discreet?

Shape: straight, scissor, open, closed or double (à la *Gone With The Wind*)?

Materials and finishes: wood, glass, iron, metal, painted or carpeted?

SAFETY FIRST MAKE IT STRONG AND MAKE IT SAFE

"Stairs are the most complicated aspect of your home, and your contractor can't make important decisions on-site that could contradict the Ontario Building Code (OBC)," states seasoned contractor Dan Robinson. "Even the smallest change can become a life-safety issue, affecting permit requirements and construction. Hire a professional who can design what you want and help you make important decisions to get your permit."

ALL GOOD THINGS REQUIRE TIME

Whether traditional or modern, all professionals agree: Stair placement and design should be one of the first interior elements considered when planning a project. "It's important



to have a clear, unified vision between all parties: client, builder and homeowner," says Lee Whitaker, President of Barrie Trim & Mouldings. "Make sure all parties involved are all on the same page, trying to achieve the same outcome."

TIPS FROM THE PROS

Ask for shop drawings and 3-D renderings. They're a great way to review your decisions prior to building and installing a staircase.

Beware of falling in love with internet images. Staircase details from other jurisdictions may not follow strict OBC requirements.

OPEN-PLAN LIVING

Minimalist staircases are the eye-catching, sculptural focal point of many interiors. Their seamless design utilizes materials used elsewhere in the home, adding to a spacious feeling. A modern staircase can be the hallmark of a unique home.

To create a sound staircase with minimal structure, customstair professionals prefabricate each component, often using computers to ensure each piece is precisely cut. With the skeleton installed early in construction, all details must be finalized in advance – details cannot be modified on-site.

THE FUTURE OF SPECTACULAR STAIRS

Lighting: LEDs show stairs in their best light, and can be placed on the wall, tread, handrail or riser. To avoid shadows on staircase treads, use a light source with a wide beam.

Varying materials: Mixing metals and metal finishes offers another colour and sensory option for your décor.







Bake for 13-15 minutes, or until bottoms are light brown.



Throughout my 20 years as a landscape designer, I've witnessed countless disparaging remarks about the humble cedar - the most common being their tendency to attract mosquitoes. It's certainly true that, in the wild, cedar trees naturally populate damp areas, and these damp places appeal to mosquitoes. But in a cultivated setting, a cedar will attract no more of the biting insects than any other tree on your property.

In fact the common and unpretentious cedar has a place in nearly every outdoor space, no matter how large or small - and has countless positive attributes.

As evergreens, cedars retain their foliage throughout the winter, keeping their lush look year-round.

Cedars are fast-growing, robust conifers that hold up well in cold climates.

Great for small spaces, cedar is quite malleable - trim it to fit the height. shape and width desired.

A hedge of cedar makes an excellent privacy, wind or sound screen.

Planted along a driveway, they're brilliant as a barrier for rolling basketballs and the like

A cedar can be an excellent refuge and nesting site for small animals, and the ample seeds a food source for local birds and wildlife.

Cut branches of many types are excellent for Christmas arrangements, inside and out.

Cedar wood is naturally disinfecting and resistant to water damage, hence its use in applications from saunas to cutting boards.

The compound thujaplicin gives cedar its trademark pleasant scent.

COMMON VARIETIES OF CEDAR

EMERALD CEDAR (THUJA OCCIDENTALIS "SMARAGD",

With a very tight, emerald green, conical form, these are the formal types often planted in a stately row, in pairs to flank an entryway or as a specimen planting. For best success, young trees should be protected by a wrapping of burlap for the first winter after planting. Like all cedars, they favour moist soil.

WHITE CEDAR (THUJA OCCIDENTALIS)

Often referred to as swamp cedars, these native cedars can be found growing in moist areas and along shorelines, though they also occur in dry areas where the soil is not acidic, such as on limestone. They provide invaluable shelter to a host of birds and mammals all year long. In urban settings, this variety is normally grown as a hedge.

BLACK CEDAR (THUJA OCCIDENTALIS "NIGRA")

Very similar to white cedar.
Tough, and even tolerates
some shade. Another great
hedging variety, it has a
smaller stature and its bark
and leaves are a darker green.

DEGROOT'S SPIRE CEDAR (THUJA OCCIDENTALIS "DEGROOT'S SPIRE")

An interesting cedar tree with slightly twisted branches and a narrow, upright form. It's quite beautiful, but less vigorous than other types. Planting these cedars in a protected area with adequate moisture, plus wrapping them for their first winter after planting, is essential.

HEALTHFUL BENEFITS

Cedar has a long and impressive history of medicinal uses, earning the name arborvitae, meaning "tree of life."

With potent and beneficial phytochemicals, the essential oil of Thuja occidentalis is antimicrobial, antibacterial, antiviral and antifungal – with immunestimulating properties as well. Cedar also acts as an expectorant, aiding in chest congestion and productive coughs.

Cedar is a sacred plant to Native

Americans and revered for its medicinal, household and ceremonial purposes. Exceptionally high in Vitamin C, cedar was used to treat and prevent scurvy, and indigenous people taught early explorers and settlers to the New World to make tea from cedar and other conifers. Some First Nations communities would dry and powder the leaves to use as a poultice for various skin conditions. Traditionally, the Algonquin used an infusion of the leaves to treat children with colic. The Abnaki, Algonquin and Iroquois treated rheumatic illnesses with topical applications of this versatile plant.

This winter season, why not try adding cedar to a bath for its immune-boosting, circulatory-stimulating and mild pain-relieving properties. Cedar foot baths work well, too: Simmer a few hearty handfuls of leaves in a pot on the stove for about 20 minutes and strain. As an herbal steam, cedar is wonderfully aromatic and helpful in breaking up sinus and chest congestion.

For all its medicinal, aromatic, aesthetic and utilitarian qualities, the cedar has remained a humble tree – one that warrants consideration in your next outdoor project. **OH**

More than a year later, when she was ready to renovate her own home, she did some sleuthing and, after a few false starts, finally tracked down the designer, **Terri Clark** of **Terri Clark Interiors**. "I called the May Court Club to get the contact information for the homeowner, and she gave me Terri's phone number – but the number wasn't working. Terri had just ditched her landline in favour of her cell phone, but Jane finally connected with her in late 2018.

The home on a quiet street in Midhurst was built in 2002 and Jane and her family have lived there for almost 10 years. They love the location, but the home became dated and Jane decided it was finally

time for an overhaul. "For some reason I painted everything dark brown back then," she laughs.

Terri saw the potential immediately, especially in the expansive kitchen. Its original layout was awkward. Jane, an avid cook, kept banging her head on the too-low range hood and says there was a "dance floor" between the kitchen island, sink and counters. The wall oven was far from the cooktop, tucked away in a bank of cupboards closer to the dining room.

Jane made it clear right away that she was leaving most, if not all, the design and décor decisions to Terri. Jane's career doesn't leave her a lot of down time and her husband is equally busy, so she felt

overwhelmed when faced with the mountain of decisions involved in a renovation.

Jane says Terri was great to work with: organized, deadline-oriented and respectful about the budget.

The goal of the main floor renovation was white, bright and light - modern and contemporary but with nods to traditional décor here and there. Jane only asked that Terri work around several must-keep items: the original rustic wood floor, the built-in unit in the family room off the kitchen area and beautiful original paintings of her three children. Terri painted the built-ins white including the backs of the glass inserts – so they transitioned seamlessly into the new design. The couple's beautiful Mid-century modern dining table and chairs were also staying, so Terri replaced the original orange leather upholstery with a bright cream leather. To complement the dining set, Terri hung a daring Mid-mod wallpaper on one wall and brought in potted plants to add natural beauty.

A see-through, vertical fireplace provides a clear view from the kitchen into the family room, adding warmth and a wow factor to the renovation.

Terri designed the kitchen Jane has always wanted. Built by **Bateman Fine Cabinetry**, it replaces the old yellow cabinets and includes an expansive island that runs the length of the room, filling the old dance floor. The back wall houses a Wolf range

with an induction stovetop and electric oven with a custom walnut range hood. The lower cabinets keep going and offer endless storage. Original windows in the corner let an abundance of light into the space. The quartz counters have gold veining, matching the luxe faucet and cabinetry hardware. There's more storage in floor-to-ceiling cabinetry on the opposite wall, designed to look like a modern buffet and hutch. Bamboo counter stools with a white seating weave surround the island, now a favourite place for Jane's children to do homework. "I just love the stools; they're beautiful and very comfortable to sit in," says Jane. The island also houses a second full-size oven directly across from the range.




Throughout the renovation process, Terri and Jane continued to surprise each other with Terri's unerring vision and Jane's leaps of faith that everything would tie together in the end.

Terri made some simple changes, such as repositioning the dining room table so it runs parallel to the living room instead of perpendicular, allowing for greater movement and flow in both rooms. Even though Jane was initially reluctant to consider curtains, she now says they definitely add a finished, formal look to the rooms. Because the stairs were a foyer focal point that would have distracted from the rest of the brighter design, Terri painted the staircase a dramatic black and white. 

Repurposing the old kitchen cabinets and anything else that was being replaced was paramount. "Recycling is very important," says Jane. "We have teenagers, and it's important for them to see us making sure we divert as much as we can from landfills." Some of the former kitchen cabinets went to the laundry room while others went to relatives' homes or were donated via the website letgo.com

Terri says the most rewarding part of her job is helping people create a home unique to them by working somewhere between their preexisting taste and introducing new ideas to update the space. In the world of interior design, there is always a debate about minimalism versus maximalism, and whether "more of less" or "more of more" reigns supreme. It becomes as much a philosophical debate as an aesthetic one.

One is not better than the other, trendy or passé. They are simply different approaches on how to curate and edit the environment in which you inhabit, based purely on personal preference.

Both aesthetics are equally difficult to execute properly and require just as much thought and attention to detail. A minimalist space of "too little" can feel cold, bare and incomplete when implemented with the wrong formula. A truly maximalist space of "too much" can seem chaotic without consideration of the principles and elements of design.

MINIMALISM

Although the term minimalism has become more mainstream during the last decade, the concept emerged in the 1950s visual arts and was later applied to other streams, such as architecture and interior design. Its focus is on intentionality – removing the distraction of excess to focus on core values or life purpose. Minimalism is not so much about how much (or how little) stuff you have but is focused on deciding what is wanted and needed. One of the biggest misconceptions about minimalism is having to live with bare necessities and doing without life's luxuries. The intention is the opposite - to consciously decide what is important in your life and creating a life centred around that.

Minimalist interiors tend to exhibit the following qualities:

- an uncluttered, simple, clean space
- * a monochromatic colour scheme
- items that meld function and beauty
- focus on architectural features rather than on decorating
- focus on essentialism (nothing is generally present without thought to function)
- a strong emphasis on light, form and material selection

You might prefer a minimalist interior if:

- you like clean lines and uncluttered space
- * you're overwhelmed by too much stuff
- you prefer the calming effect of natural, subdued colours







MAXIMALISM

In the world of interiors, maximalism was born as a reaction against minimalism. A maximalist space is defined by more of everything colour, patterns, art and accessories. The appeal for people who love decorating and collecting is that there are no hard and fast rules and it's about personalization over perfection. Although minimalists would find a maximalist space cluttered and excessive (one of the biggest misconceptions about maximalists is that they are hoarders and that there is no sense of order in their space), a successful maximalist space has been highly curated to keep it from turning into complete disarray.

Maximalist interiors generally include the following characteristics:


- * layers of patterns
- * bright, bold colours
- a blend of different period styles
- * collections of art, found objects, heirlooms, etc.
- * an air of glamour

You might prefer a maximalist interior if:

- you are energized by bright, bold colours and various patterns
- * you love collections
- you find minimalist spaces to be boring and devoid of self-expression

At the end of the day, the way you choose to live in your home is an expression of your style, lifestyle, beliefs, appreciations and values. Everyone has different preferences and can handle various levels of stimulation in the environment that surrounds them. Whether you prefer "more of less" or "more of more" – regardless of what's trending – just do you. OH

18-gauge galvanized wire

Glitter paper or glitter foam (we used gold, silver and white)

Glue gun or bottled glue Length of ribbon or twine, for hanging

Wire cutters

Scissors

How-to

Determine the size of the wreath by forming a circle with the wire. Continue to wind the wire, forming between seven and nine circles in various diameters. Leave a tail of wire about two inches long.

Holding the bundle in one hand, wrap the tail around the wire circles

Cut pairs of stars from glitter paper or foam in a variety of sizes for the front and back of the wreath.

Grab a pair of stars and apply glue to one side of each star. Pick a strand of wire, line up stars on each side, then sandwich the wire between the two stars. Repeat, adding stars at random throughout the strands until you love your design.

> Tie ribbon or twine at the top of the circle to hang your wreath. OH

Historically, fish huts have been hammered together with scraps of lumber, sheet metal and leftover building materials. Hauled onto frozen lakes, they've sheltered fishers who ply their sport year-round, no matter the temperature or season.

Ice fishing has a simple appeal. "Good company, tall tales, a little bit of whisky and the odd fish," says John Rider. "It forces you to be patient and relax."

John's Buttermilk Falls Resort in the Algonquin Highlands rents up to a dozen very basic huts to anglers on Boshkung Lake every winter. His shelters have a bench, a heater and an opening in the floor enabling anglers to fish through the ice.

It's a competitive business that's seen some operators offering more and more creature comforts to lure winter anglers.

On Lake Nipissing, Chilly Willy's Ice Fishing Adventure offers overnight stays on the ice for up to six people in heated huts with propane stoves and lights, kitchen sink, toilets and furnishings, dinnerware and utensils.

A Minnesota company makes luxurious Ice Castle Fish Houses like The Rodfather, a 26-foot rig that sleeps five and has seven fishing holes. Finished with cedar and carpeting, it boasts a shower, a kitchen and connections for satellite television. Some models have fireplaces and wiring for underwater cameras that can show passing fish on a large-screen TV. These winter fortresses cost many thousands of dollars, topping out at more than \$40,000.

Despite the allure of modern amenities, the traditional architecture of the ice fishing hut still thrives in Canada's hinterland. Toronto photographer Richard Johnson has made ice huts an art form. He spent 10 years photographing tiny, colourful fishing shelters on iced-over lakes across Canada. Framed prints of his beautiful photos sell for more than it cost to build most of the huts he photographed.

When fish huts pop up on local lakes, their lights in the dark winter night are an enchanting vision. It's an image that helped inspire a group of Haliburton friends who celebrated this atypical, rural architecture last winter when they organized a two-day Ice Cube Gallery. Hundreds of people trekked onto Lake Kashagawigamog to see paintings shown by a handful of artists in three ice huts specially built for the event. Clad in metal with clear plastic roofs to admit natural light, the huts were built with high ceilings, allowing visitors to comfortably enter and stand. There was a pop-up restaurant, a beer tent and music. At night, LED lights shone on the snowy walkways. "It was quite magical," says Collin Burke, one of the organizers. Public response was amazing, he says. "It's a truly Canadian adventure. It's a 'true north, strong and free kind' of thing." If they can pull it off, organizers would like to expand the gallery this winter. "You can imagine if there were 10 or 12 huts that were all lit up at night."

Designer Andria Cowan Molyneaux

encourages fish hut owners to make the best of their winter lairs. Last winter, she once again invited anglers to enter her Helluva Hut ice fishing hut makeover contest. People submit photos of their ice shacks and Andria's team picks one for a renovation.

Carpenter Shawn Casey of Twelve Mile Lake was the winner of the latest makeover contest. Unveiled at Haliburton's Frost Festival, the remodelled hut has newly painted, white interior walls, a padded bench with storage space below, carpet tiling, fishing rod holders and a secured fishing hole, designed to be safe when small children are present. Large maple leaves in the Haliburton tartan decorate the red metal exterior. "They did a great job," says Shawn. A lifelong ice fisherman, he has no idea how old his fishing hut is. It was given to him more than 10 years ago. "It's definitely going to be more comfortable."

Andria says the contest showcases her work and its diversity. Learning about clients and developing spaces that meet their needs isn't restricted to palatial lakefront homes, she explains. "Ice fishing is actually pretty technical and personal," she says. "There's a lot of people in a tiny box that are very active, participating in a sport, so you have to find ways to store the materials, seat them, make them comfortable and safe, and, of course, we like to make it beautiful."

Everyone has thought about the perfect ice hut and their own best design, says John. While huts are integral to winter fishing, they're simply protection against the elements. "On a beautiful sunny day, no one fishes in their ice hut," he says. "They'll take their chairs or their benches out of the hut, drill a hole in the ice and enjoy the sun." They join neighbouring anglers, trade fishing tips and tall tales and bask in the sun. John's daughter calls their winter gatherings an ice burgh. on



The detail also demonstrates the priority Steve Kenyon and his wife Kathryn placed on family life as they worked with **Rinaldi Developments** to construct the perfect sanctuary for life with four young children.

"We wanted a home that could adapt to our growing family," recalls Steve, a residential designer who runs **Kenyon Design** from an office over the garage. Specializing in custom homes and renovations that provide energy efficiency and sustainable building practices, he selects projects carefully to maximize Daddy time. "When I began the design, we had two kids, but knew we wanted more. Now it does what we want it to for our whole squad."

Rinaldi executed the open floor plan of the two-storey building to go beyond typical sightlines.

"I wanted the first and second floors connected as well," Steve explains, pointing to skylights and an open stairwell system by **Barrie Trim & Mouldings Inc., Stairhaus** and Accurate Glass Products. "We can get the kids' attention from down here when they're in their rooms." Continued on page 56

With both Steve and Kathryn native to Barrie, their network of loved ones is large and they entertain often. When the youngsters are sleeping, strategically placed pocket doors are employed to have the opposite effect.

The couple took more than two years in the design phase to ensure the floor plan would work for everyone at all times of the day. The aesthetic evolved along the way. Although Steve has a personal preference for a modern style, Kathryn wanted to avoid a cold or sterile environment. "I want people to feel comfortable sitting down," she says.

At the centre of the 3,700 sq. ft. house – and of family life – is the 10-seat dining room table. Conveniently adjacent to the

kitchen, the eating area is lined with blond boards from **Grand Floors Ltd.** and flanked by two floor-to-ceiling **Napoleon** fireplaces clad in Ontario limestone by **JMC Stoneworks Ltd.**

"Everything radiates from here," says Steve, who knows the design decision goes against the current trend of hiding or removing the dining room altogether. For this family, however, coming together at mealtime is a daily ritual.

The see-through twin fireplaces, which warm the foyer to the front, and great room to the back, occasionally serve as end markers for a running track popular with the younger set during playtime.

"What I would have wanted before kids would have been very different," reflects Kathryn with a laugh. "I told Steve we need a loop – the kids need to run around."

Every aspect of the house was designed with the children in mind – from the extra-tall ceilings in the playroom to the **Empire Pools** landscaping in the backyard.

"With the pool, we don't need a waterfront property," she adds. "I want this to be the place where the kids bring their friends back to."

Designing a home with children also meant an extensive mud/laundry room with plenty of built-in storage by **Simcoe Custom Furniture & Cabinetry** for grab-and-go sports gear. Countertops throughout the



house were supplied by Northern Granite Works, while Custom Plumbing and Kent Daigneault Electrical did their part.

Simcoe County Custom Furniture & Cabinetry also crafted the kitchen cabinets, bathroom vanities, master closet and bunkbeds. "There's more custom cabinetry in our laundry room than there is in our kitchen," Steve quips.

"I love that room," answers Kathryn. "I like everything to have a place to be, and to be accessible to the kids so they can get it and put it away and learn how to be independent."

The couple shares a particular fondness for the north-facing great room, where an expansive sectional invites the family of six to play games or watch television. With no window coverings to mask the bounty of nature beyond, the minimalist, yet cosy, space is reminiscent of a castle lodge or oversize treehouse. Towering limestone stacks stand beside lofty wooden windows (from Marvin Windows Canada) that reach to a dramatic trey ceiling with wooden inlay. Continued on page 60

"I enjoy the proportion of it and the quality of light," says Steve. At Christmastime, this room plays host to a 14-foot tree that requires kid-approval before being cut down and brought home. "Every year, the decorations get a little higher," says Kathryn, describing the children (now aged five to 11) reaching up to hang ornaments.

A popular housing option for more than a century, modular homes have evolved from do-it-yourself kits to fully customized dwellings with the latest in finishes, energy savings and technology.

In the early 1900s, Sears, Roebuck and Company sold tens of thousands of prefabricated homes. Ordered from the Sears catalogue for as little as \$750 for a two-storey, three-bedroom house, they arrived by train in a kit, ready to assemble - some 30,000 pieces, including pre-cut lumber, nails, paint, shingles and an instruction booklet. The company shipped hundreds of homes every month. They were popular until the Great Depression, when the housing market crashed and Sears lost millions on loans issued to homebuyers

Today's modular homebuilders have taken most of the work out of the equation for homeowners. They manufacture houses in modern factories, then truck the modules to building sites where they're assembled with a crane.

Peter and Sara Orgill bought their new modular home, a two-storey house from Royal Homes, three years ago. The 2,200-square-foot house arrived on five trucks, less than nine months after they bought their lakefront property. Building homes indoors is a better way to do it, says Peter. "I'm convinced you get

a far stronger house," he says. "This thing is just rock-solid in high wind, so you don't hear any noises or creaking or anything like that." Asked if they're happy with their purchase, Peter says they are "thrilled to death."

Most clients come to Royal Homes because the company is a very qualified and leading custom homebuilder, says president Pieter Venema. The fact that they build homes using modular units is a supportive factor, he says. "We believe that's a better way to build just because of the quality of the structure. Building in a controlled factory environment reduces waste and produces a better product."

Home construction indoors prevents cold, rain or snow from delaying work or making its way into the structure, causing problems with mould. Building from the inside out, as opposed to the opposite in on-site construction, allows penetrations for electrical outlets, wires and plumbing to be sealed before insulation and exterior cladding is installed, Pieter explains. It enables Royal to build an air-tight house with good insulation and reduced heating costs. Royal

builds between 100 and 150 homes a year at its Wingham factory, and Pieter reckons demand has grown 10 per cent annually for the last three years.

George Tierney, marketing manager for Guildcrest Homes, a modular builder based in Morewood, expects his firm to build about 120 homes in 2019. While quality is the foremost reason people choose modular homes, the indoor building method ensures timing and controls cost, George says. "When we tell you we are delivering your home, that is the date we're going to deliver and complete your home shortly thereafter. When we give you a price for your home, that's the price you're going to pay," he says. Most modular builders have design centres where clients can choose their cabinetry, flooring, fixtures and finishes. Making those choices early in the building process provides owners with a price guarantee and assured delivery.

Modular homes are built to CSA standards and are certified by an independent inspection body. These steps significantly reduce the number of on-site inspections required of municipal building inspectors. In addition, builders have their own rigorous internal inspections. When home modules arrive on site, they are wired for electricity. Plumbing, windows, cabinets, flooring, trim and countertops are all installed. Crews simply marry the factory-built units, apply finishing touches and complete components, such as roofs with multiple peaks or long slopes, that are easier to build on site.

Factory-built homes cost roughly as much as homes built traditionally. "We essentially build custom homes," says Royal's president. At Guildcrest, George says his company does not sell on price. "We do not put ourselves out there as a less-expensive home. We simply aren't," he says. "You can't be better-built and cheaper. The math just doesn't work."

The growing popularity of modular homes is partly driven by a decline in the number of skilled tradespeople available for on-site building, George suggests. "By building 85 per cent of a home in a factory, the demand for skilled trades on site is dramatically reduced."

With fewer young people going into the trades, Pieter expects residential developers will move in the direction of modular building by using pre-engineered and pre-built panels. He predicts some may shift to modular building. "Eventually you're going to see one or two of the big developers setting up a modular factory strictly for their own building requirements," he says. "I'm sure that they will find economies of scale." **OH**



Having built their dream home to custom specifications, Nick and Wendy Cosentino happily admit their favourite room isn't inside their new house at all.

Tucked into a sheltered corner just outside their dining room is a cosy outdoor lounge warmed by a wood-burning fireplace and charmed by birdsong. It's a perfect destination to begin the day with a mug of coffee and a novel, or to wind down in the evening with a glass of wine.

"The tongue-and-groove wooden ceiling helps make it feel like its own room," Nick adds about the brick-walled retreat. A wrought-iron chandelier hangs in the centre of the space looking more like a vintage candelabra than its modern-day cousin (wiring by R&J Electric).

The porch also acts as a gateway to the backyard patio and treed expanse beyond,

where they like to entertain friends and family – or watch the blue jays flit from tree to tree.



"Some clients take their allowance and we don't hear from them," Tyler says. "Others prefer more guidance. The options can be overwhelming." Continued on page 84







