





# Curate WELL-BEING AT HOME

Designer Tamarisk McNalty Stephens shares her ideas.

Creating a home that nurtures overall health and wellness has proven to be an important topic of conversation.

The beautiful thing about a home is that it is (or should be) a unique reflection of the values, priorities and lifestyle of its inhabitants. However, there are some basic tenets that can be applied regardless of style, aesthetic and functional requirements to create an atmosphere that fosters a greater sense of well-being. These recommendations can be implemented without a complete redesign or renovation.

# Determine the pillars of how you want your home to feel



It is a privilege to have a home where you and your family can retreat. Having the ability (financial and otherwise) to curate a home that feels

welcoming, calming, nourishing and restorative – especially when unpredictable circumstances occur in the world – is a true blessing. Take the time to determine how you want your home to feel. For example, creating a calming space is especially important when the news of the world feels heavy. A clean and clutter-free space can quiet the nervous system and make you feel better physically, mentally and emotionally.

# Create peace of mind



Taking small steps to create a home that is a little more self-sufficient can contribute to a greater feeling of safety and security – especially when unpredictable circumstances arise. At the end of the day, food, water and shelter remain the fundamental and universal basic needs.

There has been a tremendous resurgence of people growing and raising their own food. There are also many local farmers who offer CSAs (community-supported agriculture) throughout the year and frequent the seasonal farmers markets. Consider installing a pantry or transforming a closet into food storage so you can buy more items in bulk (flours, beans, etc.) and if you have a cold-storage area, you have the ability to store certain vegetables long into the winter. Investing in an appropriate freezer and learning to preserve food are other helpful options. Condo dwellers can experiment with container gardening, learn about becoming a member of a community garden or perhaps barter with family or friends to use a piece of land for a small garden patch.



Generating your own electricity allows you to be less dependent on the larger system. For those not connected to the grid, investing in a generator in the event of a power loss enables you to keep the fridge and freezer running so you don't lose your food supply – just create a regular maintenance schedule and ensure you have the appropriate fuel. Also having a stock of water on hand for a couple of weeks, or a filtration system (such as a Berkey) if you have access to fresh water, can provide added peace of mind. The notion of creating a safe home extends beyond a security system.

# Define various zones

The experience of sharing space with the entire family at home for such an extended period of time, with multiple tasks happening simultaneously – such as working, learning, food preparation, etc. - has emphasized the importance of creating specific zones to maintain a semblance of order in the home. If you don't have a spare room you can transform into an office, or the floor space for designated desks and workstations, consider purchasing totes that hold everyone's individual work or projects. Investing in proper storage such as closed cabinetry or even open shelving with baskets (simple and easy to access) helps to keep everyone organized and the house from becoming overrun with the business of the day. It is also important to keep sleeping spaces reserved for rest and minimize technology there (avoid it if you can). We all know blue light from devices negatively impacts our circadian rhythm and the body's ability to prepare for sleep. It's difficult to relax at the end of the day if you're still looking at a large pile of work or if the notifications on your phone are going off at all hours.

# Bring nature inside

Not only are houseplants an extremely cost-effective way to completely transform the feeling of your space, but adding greenery into your home can reduce stress and anxiety. There is the added benefit of air purification. Nature-inspired artwork can also help calm the senses. Connecting with natural materials such as linen, raw wood, beeswax candles, marble and wool can also help evoke a sense of well-being within the home. OH





1 cup farro

Feta cheese, to garnish

Pumpkin seeds, to garnish

### **DRESSING**

1/4 cup olive oil

2 Tbsp balsamic vinegar

2 Tbsp honey

½ tsp each salt and pepper

# **DIRECTIONS**

Preheat oven to 400°F.

Clean vegetables and cut into similar sizes.

Toss with olive oil, allspice, salt and pepper.

Place on a baking sheet and roast for 25-30 minutes, adjusting the time to the size of your vegetables, until cooked through.


Meanwhile, cook farro to package directions.

When we think of fall gardens, many of us often imagine ornamental grasses, the changing colour of leaves and perhaps some berries. Of course these are part of the beautiful autumn season but garden flowers should not be forgotten! Add some spice to your blooming borders and keep your flower show going right up until frost with these beauties.



## **NEW ENGLAND ASTER** (SYMPHYOTRICHUM NOVAE-ANGLIAE)

One of the first fall flowers that comes to mind, New England asters are the backbone of many attractive fall borders. These reliable, native perennials form dense, fluffy mounds of white, purple, pink or blue flowers. Growing between 36 and 72 inches and requiring moist soil and part shade to sun, they're also extremely attractive to butterflies, particularly hungry monarchs looking for a meal along their fall migration path.



# **DENIM'N LACE RUSSIAN SAGE** (PEROVSKIA ATRIPLICIFOLIA)

The distinctive, lacy flower spikes of Russian sage can last for weeks, typically blooming at the end of the summer to early fall. I prefer this smaller 36-inch variety as it doesn't require staking. The beautiful amethyst-coloured blooms begin slowly, and the flower colour gets more brilliant as the small blooms fully open. Mass planting is the best way to enjoy its frothy purple spikes, and it needs full sun and well-draining soil to look its best. It is yet another pollinator favourite. You may be noticing a theme here.

# **JAPANESE ANEMONE** (ANEMONE X HYBRIDA)

Elegant Japanese anemone blossoms are a welcome treat to the late summer and fall garden. With pretty leaves and blossoms borne on tall, slender stems. the showy pink or white flowers come in abundance once the plant has had some years to establish. It's elegant in every stage – from tight round buds to spherical seed heads - and deserves a prominent place in the garden. Plant it in part shade to sun and give it enough moisture and you won't be disappointed. Like many of the other fall-blooming perennials, this one is also known to attract butterflies.



## **JOE-PYE WEED** (EUTROCHIUM PURPUREUM)

Perennials don't get much tougher than Joe-Pye weed. This tall and rugged native Ontario plant can reach up to a towering seven feet, though there are some dwarf varieties including Baby Joe available. It can spread aggressively, so be mindful where you plant it. It produces handsome burgundy-green foliage and has large, showy heads of whitish-purple flowers in the late summer and fall. Butterflies and bees love these nectar-rich flowers.



## **BLACK-EYED SUSAN** (RUDBECKIA HIRTA)

Likely one of the most popular wildflowers grown, native black-eyed Susans are a showstopper with their bright golden-yellow aura. These happy, daisy-like flower heads grow to about 36 inches, are drought-tolerant and require full sun. A very low-maintenance native perennial whose blooms make a long-lasting cut flower, these are also an excellent food flower for many hungry garden pollinators.



## **TOAD LILY** (TRICYRTIS HIRTA)

Unique and delicate, common toad lily blossoms appear much later than most other shade-loving plants. Reaching 24 to 36 inches, these upright, intricate, orchid-like and speckled flowers will stop you in your tracks. There aren't many plants that flower like these in shady situations. If you have a shade garden and need some fall flowers, this is the plant for you!



# STONECROP / SEDUM

These rugged plants are virtually indestructible and come in a wide variety of shapes, sizes and colours. Sedums have fleshy foliage that make them super drought tolerant. Plant them in a sunny spot and stand back in awe. It's the taller, upright varieties (growing 24 to 36 inches tall) that produce large flat heads of pink or red flowers through the late summer and fall. The nectar-rich blossoms attract all sorts of bees, butterflies and bird species. Some commonly seen fallblooming varieties are sedum Autumn Joy and sedum Matrona but new varieties are popping up every year.



# NIPPON DAISY (NIPPONANTHEMUM NIPPONICUM)

Sometimes called Montauk daisy, Nippon daisy is well-known for its late-season explosion of perky, white flowers. It grows from 18 to 36 inches and thrives in full sun. Nippon daisy blooms from August to frost as both the leaves and flowers are frost tolerant. The nectar-rich blooms will also lure colourful butterflies to your garden.

Most of these gorgeous, autumn-blooming lovelies are food-flowers for bees, butterflies and other pollinators. Isn't Mother Nature so clever, making these plants flower at exactly the time when many pollinators need them? Of course gardens are beautiful to look at but they are so much more than just good looks to a host of other creatures. Gardens are in fact beautiful, blooming ecosystems! он






She relays the history of the home, which is more than 100 years old. There is another foundation, of both a house and barn, on top of a hill in the field at the farm. It's a beautiful

Kate typically works on either new construction or large-scale renovations like this one. 



# Dogs



# Cats

When designing for cats, focus on the texture and weave of the fabric as opposed to the hue (granted, darker colours tend to hide stains better). Instead, opt for tighter and more condensed fabrics like velvet, suede, microfiber or other synthetics like acrylic, polyester or nylon. They will be harder to scratch without ample grip. # The Hottest Gig In Town

Housing prices across Ontario are soaring. A recent Aviva Canada report found 31 per cent of Canadians are considering relocating as a result of the pandemic, with more than one third considering a move to a semi-rural or rural location. And that doesn't include the thousands of people who have already moved to greener pastures over the past year.





THE LATEST PASTIME on every street in Ontario is finding the answer to "How much did they get?" and then dreaming of upsizing or downsizing with a pocket full of dough. Imagine being a realtor in this crazy housing market.

Sherry Rioux, with the Rioux Baker Team at Clairwood Real Estate Corporation, has been a realtor for 16 years in the Southern Georgian Bay region, where home sales have reached historic levels and housing prices are at an all time high.

"Sellers have to be reminded that although we remain in a strong seller's market, we can't let greed overtake common sense," says Sherry. "Many sellers are doubling and tripling what they originally paid for their properties in a very short time. But sometimes we can easily lose sight of what is a "good and fair" offer. That can come back to bite you if you lose perspective and don't listen to the advice of an experienced, knowledgeable realtor. Sherry uses waterfront measurements, price per square foot, comparables and local real estate statistics to guide her sellers. "There are many ways to create a list price, and it takes experience, market knowledge and a bit of good luck!"

Home values in Windsor and Essex County barely budged for years until the onslaught of the pandemic. In June, the average price of a home jumped a whopping 38 per cent, and sales increased by almost seven per cent compared to a year ago.

Windsor's John Rauti, the top producer for 17 years at Remo Valente Real Estate, represents both local and out-of-town buyers. "Most are buying in this region because prices are lower than where they're coming from," he says. He too has to temper the expectations of sellers. "My advice to sellers is simple: Price the home properly and accordingly. Do not let a hot market go to your head; you could price yourself out and pay for it later."

In Ottawa, Brent Conley of Royal LePage Team Realty says it's more strategic to list at equivalent market value to similar sales that have recently sold. "In some instances, it may motivate and spur activity and showings to list slightly below market value," he says. Brent says his buyers must be pre-approved so he knows what their top-dollar purchase power truly is. Ottawa's resale market is starting to stabalize after a busy spring. The average price of a residential home in July was \$645,426.

Buyers, of course, are still on edge, some forced to put most of their nest egg into the housing basket, yet getting out-bid for properties over and over again.

"We are experiencing a lot of buyer fatigue right now," says Sherry. "My team members and I have had clients who have submitted offers on four or five different properties and have lost out." That forced Sherry and her team to change their strategy. "In the beginning we would suggest that they put their best foot forward with the highest price they were prepared to pay and add in some representations and warranties to protect them," Sherry explains. "As you start to lose out on the bidding process you quickly turn your strategy to, 'If the next buyer gets this property for even one dollar more than you offered, will you be upset?

If the answer is yes then that is not your number.' That means submitting the offer as clean as possible, meaning no conditions, no seller representations and warranties. I don't personally feel that this is the best way to represent buyers, but if you don't follow those rules, your buyers always lose out."

John urges his buyers to think long-term. "When you are interested in buying a specific home, take a look at the potential future value," he advises. "Do not look at the past or historical value. Remember the area comes into play as well. This can help you to make a proper offer and get the home!"

For these realtors, the current market is exhilarating, lucrative and frustrating.

John tells clients who have been pushed out of the market to cut frivolous spending and start saving, just like house hunters in expensive cities like Toronto and Ottawa have to do. "I tell them to start off in their price range and respect and take care of their home investment so it appreciates to its fullest potential," he says.

Brent says his biggest frustration is low inventory. "I can't satisfy expectations," he says. "I find this difficult to navigate as I truly want my clients to be happy and satisfied and to achieve their personal and financial goals."

Without a crystal ball, it's anyone's guess how long the red hot market will continue.

"Buyer fatigue is showing its true colours right now," says Sherry. "But I do expect to see a continued seller's market. With low interest rates and a strong demand to own in Southern Georgian Bay, I could see this continue well into 2023." OH

#### MATERIALS

Glue stick

Brown kraft paper Scissors Tape Wooden dowel Pencil

To make a large palm leaf, cut one 24-inch section of kraft paper. Fold the paper in half. Starting on the folded side of the paper, draw half a palm leaf in a teardrop shape. Once you are happy with the shape and size, cut the outline and unfold the leaf.





Next, create an accordion fold by making several alternating folds, creating panels that are similar in size. An easy way to get even panels is to begin folding on the side of your leaf outline. Fold your first panel approximately one-half inch from the edge of the leaf.

HOW-TO

Flip your paper over so the first folded section is on the bottom. Fold the next section, using your first section as a size guide. Continue this step until the whole leaf is folded.







Pinch the panels together at the larger end of your leaf and place your dowel in the middle. Tape the panel and dowel together where

Cut a small piece of kraft paper and apply glue to one side. Wrap the paper around the base to cover the tape. This will give your palm leaf a seamless look.

Create a grouping of leaves, with different shapes and sizes for more impact. Use your favourite vase to showcase your gorgeous palm leaves. OH


















## a tribute to THE TREES

Andrew, and it's no wonder. It would be difficult to call this four-bedroom, three bath timberframe built by The Great Lakes Frame Company anything but home. Surrounded by pine and birch trees, the property sits on its own peninsula. "It's a rare flat site near the water," says Pliny Loucks, owner of The Great Lakes Frame Company. "The location is wonderful with exceptional natural features. The house sits on a point on the Lake Huron side, and it's designed to take advantage of the views."


With 11 sliding-glass doors and two floors of windows facing the lake, the views are impossible to miss. It blends the rocks, trees and water with the home, which is built to incorporate those natural elements into the interior. Kelly and Andrew can enjoy the natural beauty of the landscape anywhere inside. Standing in the open-concept living area with Ontario hickory floors feels like standing in a cosy forest. The fireplace from **The Fyre Place & Patio Shop** stands at the centre of the home and rises to the second floor through the canopy of the vaulted ceiling. The living room has a wraparound view of the water and a floor-to-ceiling sliding-glass door to a flagstone patio. Kelly and Andrew's main-floor primary bedroom features a large en suite.



"My favourite spot in a timberframe house is often the second floor," says Pliny, "because you're living in the timberframe." That is exactly the feeling Kelly and Andrew enjoy when they climb the open-tread staircase to the upper balcony.

The second floor features three bedrooms and a common bath on one side of a sitting room. One bedroom features a dormer, while another has a walkout balcony overlooking the lake on one side of the home. A third bedroom upstairs features another walkout with a view of the lake on the other side of the peninsula.

Jeff Lockwood Painting Services painted the interior of the entire home.

Andrew says the most amazing part of the process was the ceremony that Pliny held for them when the frame was raised.

Pliny describes building a timberframe home as a turn-of-the-century barn raising. "But take that attitude and replace the horses with a crane," he says. "When we stand a timberframe, we climb to the top and nail a pine bough to the highest peak. It's a Bavarian tradition to thank the trees that gave their lives for the house. It also gives us a chance to thank the homeowner for being a part of their project and to thank the staff." *Continued on page* 78

"He hosted a barbecue for all of the neighbours," says Andrew. "It's supposed to be good luck for the family." Pliny takes this ceremony and the sentiment of thanking the land very seriously, ensuring that for every tree that is cut down for his projects, a new tree is planted.

Four years after the build, the couple offers glowing reviews of Pliny and his team. "They were really efficient," says Kelly. "He's honest and met all the major milestones. He coordinated everything. He wasn't our general contractor, but he acted like it." Landscaping was designed and built by **Hutten & Co. Land and Shore**. Continued on page 82



Vintage McCoy "Cookies" Cookie Jar

Edible history traces the invention of biscuit jars (or barrels) to the 18th century and jolly old England. Glass, metal and stoneware varieties evolved into more creative ceramic options. The designs began simplistically with floral embellishments or images of fruit and vegetables. With innovation, the jars took on the form of animals and popular characters. Post-war, companies decided to take a bite out of the growing popularity by incorporating advertising onto tins. Cookie tins and jars were becoming collectible, and for brands that had nothing to do with cookies – like Harley-Davidson or Coca-Cola – the tins were a surreptitious way to imprint.

With history comes controversy, as cookie jars were a popular outlet for stereotypical racial caricatures. McCoy Aunt Jemima jars



issued by Quaker Oats in the 1940s remain highly sought-out Black memorabilia items by the public and museum collectors alike since the recent branding change to Pearl Milling Company.

McCoy Pottery of Roseville, Ohio, and American Bisque of West Virginia are touted as foundational companies in the cookie jar movement, with the earliest kitchenware design appearing in 1929 by another Ohio manufacturer: Brush Pottery Company. American Bisque designs are easily recognized as the company specialized in generic clowns, Dutch girls and boys, grannies and chefs.

Jump ahead several decades to the 80s and the innovative scheme by Kraft to market peanut butter jars that could be repurposed as cookie holders. The bear head-shaped glass



jars topped with a plastic green lid (or red, for the crunchy-PB devout) are iconic, right down to their jaunty bowties. Whether the jars were filled to their brims with cookies or coins, both were an ideal investment. To boot, Kraft's classic three-ingredient cookies (1 egg, ½ cup of sugar and I cup of Kraft Smooth Peanut Butter) continues to provide an entry-level recipe for kids and newbies to attempt with a high-level of success.

Cookie jars are sentimental, purposeful and a whimsical way to showcase your interests and style. The options are so niche that they can be an ideal, unexpected housewarming gift. You can actually find a Mr. T-inspired cookie jar for your in-law who is a rabid A-Team fan. Don't forget to fill the jar with cookies for the ultimate surprise, though! OH











## Peanut Butter & Jelly SANDWICH COOKIES

Your favourite childhood sandwich just became your new favourite cookie. Perfect for after-school snacks, these PB & J cookies are your classic peanut butter cookie with a tangy raspberry filling. They'll bring back childhood memories and create new ones.

#### HOW-TO

Prepare the raspberry filling. In a saucepan over medium heat, cook raspberries into a jam-like consistency. Press through a fine strainer to remove the seeds and return to the saucepan. Cook purée until thickened. Line a sheet pan with foil and spread the puree flat. Freeze for 30 minutes.

Preheat the oven to 350°F and line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

In a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, cream the butter and sugars together. Add peanut butter and mix until combined. Add egg and vanilla and mix until combined. Add flour and baking powder and mix just until the dough comes together.

Remove the frozen raspberry puree from the freezer and cut into 12 squares. Take a golf-ball-size piece of dough and split it in half. Flatten one half of the dough and place the raspberry puree in the middle. Cover with the remaining dough and form into a ball, ensuring that all of the raspberry puree is covered. Place on baking sheet and score the top by gently pressing down on the cookie with a fork.

These cookies are quite big, so they will take a bit longer to cook. Bake for 15 minutes or until cookies begin to brown around the edges. OH





**Five years later**, they are grateful for the obstacles that suspended their project. "The best thing that happened to us was that decisions couldn't be made," Beth confides. Built in 1920, the harbour home and former fishing charter company had succumbed to mould, bats and a questionable foundation.

"The longer we stayed in the house, the more thankful we were that it would be torn down," Beth confesses. When lake levels surged, opting for a total rebuild over a renovation required pushing the house further back from the 100-year flood line. The move provided desired privacy and the new design capitalized on the mesmerizing view.

Paul's mother was born and raised in Tobermory, establishing the family tradition of summer vacations deeply steeped in lake life. Her tiny Harpur Drive cottage legacy was passed on to Paul and Beth, keeping the family connection tethered to Georgian Bay. Paul retired and put his muscle into an ambitious Harpur cottage rehab but Plan A always revolved around living on the water. When they put an offer in on the harbour listing, they never anticipated that their vision would take so long to come to fruition. **AND-ROD Construction Ltd.** had a

three-year waitlist, and finalizing plans with the architectural designer was a year-long process. As subcontractors fell into sequence, the 10-month schedule didn't account for a global pandemic.




#### **MATERIALS**

- 14-inch round wire wreath frame
- 12-inch round mirror
- 2-3 raffia bundles
- Scissors
- Tape measure
- Mirror or construction adhesive

#### STEP 1

Unravel raffia and cut in 12-inch sections.





#### STEP 3

Move to the inside ring of the frame. Repeat step 2, attaching raffia using lark's head knots until the entire ring is filled.





#### STEP 2

Take 3 or 4 strands of raffia, fold them in half. On the second-to-last ring on the wreath frame, make a lark's head knot by taking the folded raffia and placing the rounded end underneath the ring. Take the other ends of the raffia and put it through the rounded end to make a knot. Make sure to pull it tight. Repeat this process until the entire ring is filled with raffia without any gaps.





#### STEP 4

Once your raffia completely fills both rings, apply mirror adhesive to the back of the mirror along the outer edge. Carefully place the mirror on the inside ring on top of the raffia. Flip upside down and add a few more drops of adhesive to ensure your mirror is properly attached. Follow adhesive instructions and drying times.

Once the adhesive has fully dried, find a great spot in your home to showcase this gorgeous raffia mirror for your friends and family. **OH**

## FADING INTO FALL

The crazy, hazy, not-so-lazy days of summer living are fading away, as are the hectic activities we pack into our short but sweet vacations. On the bird front, things are winding down as well. Some of us feel the urge to go south - the birds feel it too. But preparations are necessary, for us and the birds.

This is the time of year many birds disappear from your backyards, but they're not necessarily gone from the area. They need to lay low for a bit while they undergo a postbreeding moult of their now well-worn summer plumage in exchange for a new fall coat of feathers, fresh and strong

Fall is the time when birds of a feather flock together. As they prepare for their journey south, they instinctively know there's safety in numbers. You may start to notice hundreds of birds congregating, gathering on lines - or staging as ornithologists call it - in one area or another. These gettogethers can make for some captivating fall birdwatching.

#### MAGICAL MURMURATIONS

First up is the often much-maligned starling. However you feel about these ubiquitous birds, starlings are the darlings of the sky in the fall. Hundreds come together pre-dusk and put on a spectacular air show known as a murmuration. The birds fly tightly together, creating balloons, blobs, whales and other shapes in the sky as they undulate fluidly through the air. Watching the murmurations is mesmerizing, as is their final dive down into their roost with a wonderful whoosh of their wings. You'll never diss a starling again after witnessing one of these exquisite performances. You can catch this awesome avian action each fall evening if you keep your eyes to the skies and peeled for flocks, or if you know of a roost site in woodlots or thick brushy areas, often in or near towns.

#### **SWAMP SURPRISES**

Out in the wetlands, yet another fall show is taking place. Great egrets - tall, elegant white waders with gorgeous breeding plumes - have increasingly graced us with their presence. In recent years their breeding range has extended north to the off-shore islands of Georgian Bay and Lake Huron. They're usually seen in singles during summer as they wander far and wide to forage for food. But in the fall, they fly in from all directions to wooded swamps at dusk, to roost safely for the night. It's a sight to behold in the soft twilight over a quiet swamp. These roosts are few and far between, so if you do come across one, you're in for an ethereal experience!





#### A SIEGE OF SANDHILLS

Finally, we can't forget our fields. They hold autumn wildlife wonders as well. Sandhill cranes, of elaborate courtship-dancing fame, have spread throughout Ontario in recent years. In the summer they are largely inconspicuous with their cryptic colouring as they keep to the wetlands to raise their young. But come fall, they congregate and take to harvested grain fields to glean through the chaff and stubble to bulk up for their late-fall migration. They can be seen by the twenties, fifties and even many hundreds in a field near you. But you need to give these fields a good look, as they can be hard to see despite their size. And keep your ears open, too. Cranes have very loud, far-reaching, distinctive, primitive, guttural calls - providing you with a strange musical, as well as a visual, treat. Plus, they don't save their famous fancy dance moves just for the springtime; sit and watch a while and you may get a sneak preview.

So don't lament those lovely summer days with an abundance of birds in your backyard. Get out, look up, look around and discover these wonderful fall phenomena of the avian kind. on



#### **SWIRLING SWIFTS**

In towns across much of Ontario the chimney swift – a compact little brown bird affectionately referred to as a "cigar with wings" – provides more evening entertainment. True to their name, these aerial insectivores nest in chimneys. Come fall, hundreds congregate over old buildings in the evening hours to swirl and twitter before diving en masse into a choice chimney for their nightly roost. The chimneys they choose are often those on our grand old century homes and buildings, enabling swift watchers to have an architectural as well as an avian experience. Nightly swift watches, which contribute scientific data to bird biologists, have become a thing in some towns, and these sweet birds need our help as, unfortunately for them, fewer and fewer suitable chimneys exist on our modern builds.




