SPORTING GEAR

Designer Tamarisk McNalty Stephens shares her ideas.

Storage for your sports gear isn't given much consideration when planning and designing a new home or renovating an existing one. However, if an average family stays relatively active and participates in organized sports or recreational activities, a significant amount of equipment can accumulate, which requires substantial square footage.

Gear varies based on individual and family interests but can include:

- √ camping tents and cookware
- ✓ fishing poles and tackle boxes
- ✓ golf clubs
- √ bicycles
- √ rollerblades, skateboards and scooters
- ✓ helmets
- ✓ lacrosse sticks
- √ soccer balls
- √ footballs and cleats
- √ baseball gloves
- ✓ balls and bats
- ✓ curling brooms
- √ skates and hockey equipment
- ✓ skis, snowboards, boots and poles
- √ tennis racquets and balls
- ✓ canoes, SUPs, kayaks, paddles and life jackets
- ✓ motocross and snowmobile gear

Proper storage solutions make it easier to keep a tidy home and an organized system allows family schedules to operate more smoothly during busy seasons when you need to get out the door to the big game. Here are some tips for planning functional sports equipment storage in the home.

INVFNTORY

To determine what storage solutions you need, you must first evaluate what you have. Go through everything and donate, sell or pitch gear that is outgrown, worn out or irrelevant. Once you have purged, determine which items can be stored in a garage, outbuilding or shed without air conditioning or heat, and which items will need to find room in the home (so mould doesn't grow and rodents don't chew).

SPACE/LOCATION

Think about what gear you need to access in each season. Depending on space, you may need to design a system that can rotate between summer/winter sports. Take a look around your home to determine if there is space not being utilized to its potential. Whether it's a closet, a corner in the basement, a spare room upstairs, space under the stairs, or some wall space in the garage that can be transformed into gear storage - claim it as such. Locating storage in an area accessible to children can encourage them to take responsibility for putting away their gear. They'll know where to find it when they need it and proper storage can also prolong the life of equipment.

INCORPORATE TARGETED SOLUTIONS



equipment should be aired out after each specialized hanging racks should be considered essential (and good ventilation is key!). In-floor heat in a mudroom also helps dry items quickly in the winter.

Some

Make use of overhead space in a garage for hanging bikes, canoes, kayaks, etc. In addition to typical hooks, baskets and shelves, a slat-wall system offers flexibility you can tailor to your needs with specialized attachments. You can install mesh baskets for balls, wire shelves/baskets for boots and cleats, stands that keep golf bags off the floor, shelves and hooks for skis and boards, racquets and various helmets, and utility hooks for paddles and fishing rods. Wall-mounted clips can keep hockey sticks, curling brooms and lacrosse sticks organized.

Deep customized wood shelving is handy for storing large totes and clear bins for camping equipment, off-season gear and hockey bags.

Locker room-style storage with a designated space for each person keeps their belongings organized. There are also bags designed to accommodate specific equipment, which keeps required items together for easy access when heading out.

MATFRIAIS

Use appropriate materials and finishes that can stand up to wear and tear. Consider solid wood for doorjambs, casings, millwork and wall treatments (it stands up better than MDF to heavy use). Drywall corners with a radius are generally less susceptible to damage and chipping from being bumped. Durable floor surfaces such as porcelain tile and concrete can be swept and mopped easily. OH





APPLE Dumplings

RECIPE AND PHOTOGRAPHY JENELLE MCCULLOCH

These apple dumplings follow the traditional approach. Whole apples are wrapped in pastry and baked in a brown sugar sauce. They are perfect served with a scoop of ice cream.

INGREDIENTS (Makes 4)

Brown Sugar Sauce

2 Tbsp butter

3/4 cup brown sugar

34 cup water

Apple Dumplings

4 medium-sized baking apples, peeled and cored

½ cup sugar

1 Tbsp cinnamon

Pastry dough

Egg wash (1 egg whisked with 1 tsp of water)

Butter

INSTRUCTIONS

Brown Sugar Sauce

In a pot over medium-low heat, combine the ingredients for the brown sugar sauce. Bring to a boil and let simmer for 5 minutes. Remove from heat and set aside.

Apple Dumplings

Preheat the oven to 375°F.

Combine sugar and cinnamon in a bowl

Roll out pastry dough and divide into four equal squares. Place an apple in the middle of each square. Place one spoonful of cinnamon sugar into the middle of each apple and top with a dollop of butter. Fold the dough around each apple, matching all corners and seal the sides with egg wash as needed.

Place the dumplings in a baking dish and pour the brown sugar sauce on top of the dumplings. Bake for 35-45 minutes, or until the apples are tender. This will vary with the variety and size of the apples you choose.

TIP: If the tops start to brown but the apples are not cooked through, place a piece of aluminium foil or parchment paper on top of the dumplings.

Serve each dumpling with a scoop of vanilla ice cream. **OH**

ABCS AND 5 DS of PRUNING

STORY TERESA MATAMOROS

Why Prune?

Every shrub should have a purpose in the overall garden design and that purpose will dictate how the shrub should be pruned.


The goal of pruning is to enhance and emphasize the natural shape and to maintain the health of shrubs and small trees. A well-pruned shrub can live for 100 years!

Afraid or reluctant to prune for fear of not doing it right or hurting the shrub? Follow these few steps and you'll be a pro.

A is for assessment. First and foremost, identify the shrub you are pruning. Questions to ask are:

- 1) When does it flower? Spring or summer? If it flowers in spring, it often means it is blooming on last year's wood and shouldn't be pruned until after it has flowered and before it sets new buds for next year. Forsythia, Bridalwreath spirea and lilacs are in this category. Roses, Hydrangeas and Rose of Sharon can be pruned early in the spring as they bloom on the new wood.
- 2) What is its natural shape? Prune to accentuate the natural shape of the shrub and please put the hedge shears away! No balls or squares here unless you are into topiary and that's a topic for another article.
- **3) What is the purpose of this shrub?** Is it for flowers, fruit, for the birds or for privacy? Continued on page 34

B is for take a breath. Relax and give yourself time to know the shrub and look at it from all angles so you have the full picture of what you will be pruning.

 \mathbb{C} is for confidence. With time, trial and error (plants are very forgiving), you will gain confidence in your pruning abilities.



Now the **5 DS**. The Ds help you figure out what to prune.

Dead or dying branches. Remove the dead and dying branches for aesthetics but also for health. Dead branches can be an entry point for various pathogens. Always remove the dead branch to a healthy, green node.

Diseased refers to anything that has a disease or pest problem that could potentially harm the plant if left unchecked. Cleaning your tools after each cut of a diseased branch is important.

Damaged is just that! Any branch that has been broken from winter snows or spring storms needs to be removed. These are weak points and again could be an entry point for pathogens.

Doubling branches. Sometimes the shrub will have two branches in close proximity growing in the same direction. Pruning one of the branches out will open the shrub, giving it better air circulation and strengthening the remaining branch. Also, remove any branches that are going from the outside to the inside of the shrub.

Desirable. This is what we want the plant to be. Do we want lots of flowers or is it the fruit or both? Do we want the shrub for privacy or is it a focal point in the garden?





Tools For Pruning

Invest in a good pair of secateurs or bypass pruners and a good hand saw. Loppers will help to remove the stems larger than three-quarters-of-an-inch. Always wear your personal protective equipment, such as gloves and safety glasses.

How To Prune

Cut branches/stems at a 45-degree angle, one-quarter-inch above an outward facing bud or branch. Be careful not to leave a stub as this could be an entry point for pathogens.

I hope you feel confident now to get out and prune your shrubs. Doing is the best way to learn! он

Before diving into the myriad of white shades, evaluate the natural lighting in your space. North-facing rooms tend to have cooler light, while south-facing rooms are warmer. East-facing rooms receive bright morning light, while west-facing rooms are illuminated by afternoon and evening sun. Understanding your room's lighting will help you choose the right white with the ideal undertones.

2. Determine The Atmosphere

The ambience you want to create plays a crucial role in selecting white paint. If you desire a clean, crisp feel, opt for a pure white shade like Benjamin Moore Chantilly Lace, a designer favourite. For a warmer and cosier atmosphere, consider whites with yellow or beige undertones like Benjamin Moore Simply White. If you seek a modern and sophisticated look, cooler whites with grey or blue undertones may be more suitable, such as Benjamin Moore Designer White.

3. Consider Undertones

White paints can have undertones that subtly influence the overall look of a room. Common undertones include blue, grey, green, beige and yellow. To prevent a clash with other elements in your space, consider the undertones of your furniture, flooring and fixtures. Warm undertones pair well with warm colours, while cooler undertones complement cool colours.

4. Test Before Committing

Always test paint samples before committing to a particular shade. Apply large swatches of white paint on different walls in your room and observe how they appear in various lighting conditions. One product I love to use is from Hello Paint, where you can order peel and stick paint swatches that can easily move from room to room. Assess the samples at different times of the day to see how they respond to changing natural light. This process will help you choose a shade that harmonizes with your space.



5. Evaluate Contrast

White paint doesn't exist in isolation. Consider how your chosen white will interact with other elements in the room. If you have vibrant or dark-coloured furniture, a pure white may create a striking contrast. Alternatively, if you prefer a more harmonious look, consider selecting a white shade that is like the colour of your furniture or other design elements.

6. Consider The Finish


The finish of the paint can significantly impact the final appearance of your walls. Matte or flat finishes create a soft, smooth look but are more prone to marks and smudges. Satin or eggshell finishes offer a slight sheen and are more durable, making them suitable for high-traffic areas. Glossy finishes provide a dramatic shine but are best reserved for trim or accent areas.

7. Seek **Professional Advice**

Seeking professional advice is a wise step if you find yourself uncertain about choosing the perfect white paint. Interior designers or colour consultants can offer valuable insights and help you select the best shade to suit your needs.

Remember, choosing the right white paint in your home may seem daunting, but armed with the knowledge of lighting, undertones, atmosphere, and finishes, you can make an informed decision. Remember to test samples in your space, consider contrast and seek professional advice if needed. ABOVE THE PEACEFUL SHORELINE OF LAKE HURON,

a spacious family home looks down on the crystalline turquoise waters near Kincardine Harbour. With the home's gabled roof (Karn's Roofing), exterior palette of driftwood greys, nautical blues and ox-eye windows, the house conjures the look of places on the Atlantic coast.





This is the home of Lisa and David Waite, their children Cooper, 13 and Everlie, 10, Lisa's father, Peter Reynen (who enjoys a 2,000 sq. ft. basement walkout complete with its own kitchen and laundry), and their two spirited Yorkshire Terriers, Molly and Pixie. Building began in 2019 and was done in 10 months, with timing that helped the Waites avoid the supply-chain shortages that plagued the building industry during the pandemic.

The property's original house, built around 70 years ago, was one that Lisa's parents called home for 10 years. After Lisa's mother passed away, Lisa had a vision of living closer to her father – in "a home where they could all come together," she says.

At first the Waites entertained the idea of an addition to the original building but were advised by local builders that starting fresh might be an easier feat. So, designing their family home began. Continued on page 42

"I had a dream one night," says Lisa. "I sketched out a picture of what I wanted, and I started doing the floorplan and designing it in my head. I had the whole thing – almost the way it turned out – in my mind."

She brought her plans to **Dan Murawsky** at **Murawsky Design** in Port Elgin. He was able to make her dream – presented to him as a collection of notes and pictures – a reality. Some key elements included a bank of west-facing, floor-to-ceiling windows in the living room and a large deck overlooking the lake. Above the garage is a one-bedroom vacation rental, *Lakeside Terrace*, with a full kitchen and balcony that takes advantage of the beautiful sunset views.

While the old home was taken down by **Kempton Construction** and the new one expertly built by **Quality Construction Services**, the Waites lived in a rental just 15 minutes away and checked on the project a couple of times a week. "We had a great partnership with our builder, which was very important to us. They were professional, responsive and available to help us make all the details I had imagined come to life. Not only did they do an outstanding job, but they also became friends along the way," says Lisa. Her dad used to build homes and encouraged them to be involved in the process, which was great advice.


"It was fun to see the old house come down but something new go up in its place," says Lisa. The new siding was installed by **Jeffrey Michaels Custom Siding**.








The heart of the home is the open-concept kitchen/ living room/dining room, where Lisa says the family spends most of their time together – when they're not spending their days at the beach in the summer. The palette of this grand space is muted, with greys and whites set off by pops of deep blues and sea greens. The dining room, under a coffered ceiling, leads into the living area, a stunning space that boasts white leather sofas from **Austin & Taylor Home Furnishings**, a cathedral ceiling and a central fireplace from **Troy's Plumbing & Heating** with an eye-catching blue limestone surround from West Shore Stone & Brick and installed by **Russell Masonry**. The fireplace is framed by built-in bookshelves. The space is furnished with heirloom pieces - including a buffet and side table that belonged to Lisa's grandmother that Lisa repainted with chalk paint in a cheerful cyan. Window coverings were sourced and installed by **Sunset Blinds**.

A deck, built by **Precision Deck and Fence**, with a view of the sloping backyard and the lake beyond contains an outdoor dining area and several Muskoka chairs for taking in the dramatic vista.

The main floor also contains the primary bedroom and a gorgeous en suite boasting a deep freestanding tub and modern walk-in shower, also installed by Troy's Plumbing & Heating. The floors and walls are done in glossy white tile veined with smoky grey except on one shower wall and an inset over the bath, decorated with intricately patterned azulejo-style tiles. 




"I loved it," she says. "I absolutely loved the process. In fact at the end, I said, 'I should change careers! I love this!' It was so fun. And it's such a nice spot because it reminds me of my mom."

GREEN TERMS DEMYSTIFIED

A CHEAT SHEET FOR SUSTAINABLE SHOPPING

Feeling overwhelmed by the search for truly eco-friendly products? You're not alone! Labels and packaging can be downright misleading. Did you know that the labels "natural" and "sustainable" are not regulated by any institution? Marketers certainly don't make it easy, whether you're scrolling online or strolling the aisles.

The bad news: Consumers are endlessly plagued by confusing jargon from companies who seek to profit from conscientious shoppers who want to do the right thing.

The good news: Most people love the planet and want to do the right thing.

So what does green really mean? If you are tired of being duped by pretty packaging and generic labels like "sustainable" or "natural", use our green terminology cheat sheet to help identify the earth-friendly options among the fakers.

ORGANIC

- The product or its materials were grown or produced without harmful chemicals.
- **Benefits:** Better for the human body and better for ecosystems
- **Certifications:** Canada Organic Trade Association, Pro-Cert
- **Examples:** Organic cotton, organic apples, organic skincare

FAIR TRADE

- The product was made ethically with fair labour practices, working conditions and wages.
- **Benefits:** Higher environment, economic and social standards
- Certifications: Fairtrade Canada (for products), B Corp Certified (for companies)
- **Examples:** Fair trade coffee, fair trade clothing, fair trade furniture

RECYCLED/UPCYCLED

- The product was made using some recycled materials, or it was creatively transformed.
- Benefits: Reduces demand for new resources, minimizes environmental impact
- **Certifications:** Recycle BC, UpCycled Certified
- Examples: Furniture made from recycled plastic, scrap pullovers from deadstock fabric

ZERO WASTE

- The entire product's lifecycle minimizes waste and prioritizes reuse over recycling.
- **Benefits:** More effective at reducing waste than recycled products
- Certifications: Zero Waste Canada, SCS Zero Waste, GBCI's TRUE
- **Examples:** Zero waste coconut dish scrubber, zero waste wheat straw toiletry case

BIODEGRADABLE/COMPOSTABLE

- The product can break down naturally over time, when properly disposed of.
- **Benefits:** Returns valuable nutrients to soil, avoids landfills
- Certifications: Compost Council of Canada, BPIWorld
- **Examples:** Compostable cornbased packaging, biodegradable natural loofah

NON-TOXIC/CHEMICAL-FREE

- The product meets rigorous standards for safety and health.
- Benefits: Minimize harmful chemicals for the planet and the human body
- Certifications: MADE SAFE, NTC (Non Toxic Certified), EcoLogo, Green Seal
- Examples: Non-toxic toys, chemical-free clothing, chemical-free lip balm

ENERGY EFFICIENT

- The product uses less energy than a standard product.
- Benefits: Reduce your carbon footprint, save on energy bills
- Certifications: ENERGY STAR® Canada
- Examples: Washing machine, dishwasher, light bulb, computer

Buying cosmetics: Look for the COSMOS and Canada Organic labels to find natural (not synthetic) body products. For cruelty-free products, the Leaping Bunny and Certified Vegan labels affirm that no animal was harmed in the testing or creation of the product. Zero waste and recycled packaging minimize your impact. Scan the barcode or use the Think Dirty app to learn more.

Buying cleaning products: Look for the EcoLogo, Green Seal, MADE SAFE or NTC labels. If possible, try a zero waste product that allows you to refill at an eco store. The Think Dirty app works for cleaning products, too.

Buying textile products: Look for the GOTS, OCS and OEKO-TEX labels from the Sustainable Apparel Coalition and Canada Organic Textiles Standard. These labels guarantee that the product has been tested for harmful chemicals and produced in a socially responsible way. Fair trade and organic cotton, hemp and linen are the most sustainable textile materials. You can also look for the PETA-Approved Vegan label to find items made without animal products or animal cruelty. For clothing, the Good On You app can help you find sustainable options.

Buying wood products: Look for the FSC (Forest Stewardship Council) certification to ensure you're supporting responsible forestry. Non-toxic and fair trade labels may also apply.

Buying electronics and appliances: Look for the ENERGY STAR® label. Even better, buy from a company like Miele or Dualit that encourages repairs and is committed to reducing carbon emissions.

The truth is that your consumer choices can help shape a better world. Low-waste, fair trade products really do contribute to a healthier planet!

Start by finding an ecofriendly store near you. You'll have better luck finding a sustainable product if the shop itself values sustainability. Try eco+amour in Scarborough and Muskoka, or Toronto's RefillMe, Keep Refillery, Unboxed Market, Urban Bulk & Refill or Ecotique.

Decide on the green features that matter most to you, such as ethical sourcing, eco-friendly materials and waste reduction initiatives. Then, check the product's labels and look up the manufacturer on listings like Canada's Ecolabel Index or the Canadian Government's page on environmental labelling.

While it is always more sustainable to either buy second hand or not buy anything at all, sometimes a purchase is unavoidable. Remember: "Spend some time before spending a dime." **oh**



TOOLS AND MATERIALS

Felt in a variety of colours Yarn in a

complementary colour of choice

Yarn needle Pencil

Card stock Scissors

Rotary cutter (optional but handy)





HOW-TO

Make a leaf template with some card stock. Fold the card stock in half and draw half a leaf on one side of the fold and cut out with your scissors. When unfolded you'll have a full leaf template.

Place your leaf template on top of a piece of felt and cut around the outside with scissors or a rotary cutter. Repeat until you have enough felt leaves for the length of garland you'd like.

TIP: We found the rotary cutter a little quicker and easier to cut multiple pieces of felt at one time. You'll need to make sure to protect your worktop with a cutting mat.







Leave the yarn attached to the spool at one end until you have all your leaves strung, that way you'll be sure that you have a strand that is long enough. Thread the other end through the eye of the yarn needle. Fold one of your leaves from tip-to-tip accordion-style (this helps to keep your stiches even) and work the needle through all the folded layers and then gently pull the leaf over the needle and down the strand of yarn. Repeat this process until you have the length of garland you desire. Cut the yarn from the spool and knot the ends. Now you're ready

to decorate and

Whether it's the latest Hollywood blockbuster, the Stanley Cup Playoffs or La Traviata beamed directly into your home from New York's Metropolitan Opera, investing extra thought into the design of your media room or home theatre will create an optimal viewing and listening experience for everyone. Prices can range from \$10,000 for a simple home theatre package (projector, screen, speakers) to more than one million dollars for a mindblowing, subterranean, high-tech installation. Here's some advice from local experts.

USAGE

First, determine the primary usage of the space. If it's a multi-purpose zone such as a main-floor great room or a gaming area with a pool table and bar, there will be ambient light and sound issues, so it's better to stick with a large flat-screen television and strategically placed speakers. If you're a film enthusiast looking to faithfully recreate a movie theatre atmosphere, a dedicated room that can be effectively darkened, with a ceiling-mounted projector, screen and more complex sound system will be a better fit.

"Really cool projection technology is readily available," says Jason Rodrigues, general manager at London Audio, an audio/visual company specializing in home entertainment and automation. "For a multi-purpose media room, the current standard is a 75- to 98-inch high-definition 4K TV. Those with bigger budgets could opt for an 8K ultra-high-definition TV or the 114- to 140-inch micro-LED walls that are now available for residential use."
















John Stumpf, manager at Fergus-based Station Earth, a custom electronics integration company specializing in the design and installation of high-performance home theatres and automation, says shortthrow laser projectors will soon become more commonplace. These hybrid TV/projectors can throw a crisp image onto a 120-inch screen. The revolutionary LG Signature rollable television is also now on the market. The technology is housed in a sophisticated low black console with a front speaker and a 65-inch television rolled into a tube that can roll up for viewing or back

SOUND ADVICE

According to Jason, "You can't have a good home theatre without good audio. Clear, quality sound elevates the viewing experience, so it's important to invest in highperformance speakers. Entry-level packages include five speakers and one sub-woofer and go up from there."

John recommends installing Dolby Atmos overhead channels, which typically include 11 speakers and four subwoofers. "We can directly place the sound within the room, providing an enhanced experience. You feel like you're in the middle of the action – inside the car during a high-speed chase, in front of the tanks rolling towards you or directly beneath the plane flying overhead." But he adds, "don't forget the soundproofing."



STRATEGIC LIGHTING

Light spill will dramatically diminish picture quality in a home theatre, so it's critical to install automated blackout curtains or blinds. For safety, add LED floor lighting and for fun consider adding a dimmable fibre-optic ceiling to recreate the constellations.

AUTOMATE

A single universal device eliminates the need for multiple controls. Local audiovisual companies can help set you up with a dedicated system that will not only automate all your media, but also lighting, sound, home security, heating/cooling and shading.



INTEGRATION

Integrating state-of-the-art wiring, sound and internet features when building a new house is a no-brainer, but if you're living in an older home, there are still ways to retrofit your rooms to hide unsightly wires, bulky components and speaker towers. Station Earth recommends using stealth speakers that can be installed behind drywall, wallpaper or wood veneer. An art-frame TV can camouflage a large black screen or hide it completely with a lift mechanism that allows a mirror or art piece to glide in and out of view.



Wood and other natural elements were used to blend with the forest surrounding their property and achieve a sense of warmth. Vinyl flooring, designed to reflect spalted maple, was a practical choice for durability and easy cleaning. 



AS CANADA'S HOUSING CRISIS GRINDS

on, governments have begun to pay much more attention to "gentle densification" – the concept of getting our existing properties to do more. In Ontario for example, the provincial government's "More Homes Built Faster" legislation loosens up rules pertaining to accessory dwelling units such as garden suites.

So what does that change mean on the ground? Well, if you've been toying with adding a separate in-law suite, a rental suite or even some cool studio space on your property, today you potentially have less red tape to contend with.

While many of us might be intrigued, garden suites are also a fairly new format that not everyone is familiar with. And many homeowners may legitimately wonder: "Is a garden suite the answer to my family's needs?" "Is this cost-effective?" And: "Can my property even accommodate a garden suite?"

We looked at the legislative changes and contacted a couple of industry experts about potential benefits and key considerations with garden and laneway suites.

Here's a closer look:

THE LEGISLATIVE CHANGES

Setting the stage, Ontario's Bill 23 (which passed in November 2022) stated: "One of the ways we propose to increase gentle density is by expanding what's allowed to be built without further planning approvals. Our plan would permit up to three residential units on most residential lots 'as of right' – that is to say, without needing a by-law amendment. For example: a main residence, a basement apartment, a garden house."

In Toronto, where the housing crisis has hit especially hard, city council permitted laneway dwellings in 2019. Then in February of 2022, the city adopted a "Garden Suites Official Plan Amendment and Zoning By-law Amendment" allowing garden suites in most GTA residential zones.

Samantha Chan is marketing and sales director of Toronto-based Elevate Realty Inc., a real estate sales brokerage that focuses on investing in houses and multi-family homes. In a nutshell, the new garden suite legislation translates into way more opportunities, she says. Realistically, Samantha explains, only about 47,000 or so properties in Toronto meet laneway suite requirements (i.e., they have laneway access and meet fire requirements). Yet, thanks to by-law amendments, now, Samantha says, "You don't need a laneway. As long as you have a big enough backyard, you can build a garden suite. If a homeowner wants to do it, it becomes a lot easier and more feasible for them." Continued on page 86

WHAT ARE GARDEN SUITES BEING USED FOR?

Bianca Acqua is director of sales and marketing for Woodbridgebased City Modular Buildings Inc., a company that specializes in modular homes, laneway and garden suites. From where she sits, Bianca is seeing various motivations in terms of why homeowners are building garden suites: "It really just depends on the needs of the individual or family," she says. "So some people are using garden suites as rental units to generate additional income, while others are using them as separate office or studio spaces to work from home. We see that these garden suites are a great way of providing additional living quarters for multi-generational families or to serve as a guest suite for visitors."

WHAT ARE SOME KEY FACTORS TO CONSIDER?

For homeowners exploring whether this option is workable, here are some key considerations:

- Lot size Samantha notes a difference between garden suites and laneway suites. While a "laneway house can span the whole distance of your backyard," she says a garden suite requires a setback on each side.
- **Compliance** Garden suites must comply with relevant Ontario Building Code regulations and zoning by-laws.
- Building permit These must be obtained.
- **Emergency access** A compliance review is required.
- Existing trees In Toronto, a garden suite "should not result in the removal of a healthy by-law protected tree."



- **Design** Bianca says some homeowners match the architecture of their garden suite and main structure, whereas others prefer a juxtaposition. "We have architects and engineers that work alongside the client to create and bring to life their vision."
- Construction Decisions include whether to hire a project manager and/or specialized builders and contractors, etc.
- Pricing This can range upwards from \$350 per square foot in Toronto (which is substantially lower than condo prices). Samantha notes that there are considerable fixed costs with garden suites and therefore building a two-storey suite can deliver both more living space and better cost per square foot as well.

Has there been an uptick in interest? In a word, yes. Already in the short time since new legislation rolled out, Bianca says she's seen homeowner interest rise: "More and more people are looking for creative ways to maximize their living space and a garden suite provides a unique opportunity to do this." он

A common introduction to birding is often triggered by what birders refer to as seeing a "spark bird." It's the sighting of the bird that sparks your interest in birding. It's the instance you really take notice of the unique beauty of a bird, or its song or its behaviour. Each person seems to have their own happy story about their particular spark-bird moment.

SPARK BIRD

Sometimes there are several such moments that come together to ignite the passion for birds. I know some birders who noticed a picture of a bird in a magazine, which sparked a desire to see it in the wild, setting them off on a spark-bird quest. Then, the quest may not produce your target bird, but searching for it inevitably opens your eyes to other birds out there that you would not have noticed before. You're on your way to discovering a previously unknown, virtual parallel universe, filled with birds. There's no going back.

American Redstart

NOW YOU SEE IT

The development of digital camera technology can be credited with turning many into birders. Let's face it, before the dawn of the digital age, you'd catch a fleeting glimpse of an interesting bird, you'd pull out your field guide and start flipping through the pages to pin down an identification. The bird flies off and you are left with a muddled memory of what you saw. Even with binoculars, its hard to embed the details of a quick glimpse in your brain. Such frustration could make it seem like birding is too much work and not fun.

However, having a camera at the ready to fire off a rapid series of shots before the bird flies leaves you with the opportunity to study the sighting at your leisure, with photographic images at hand to consult. It's a relatively new-age method of identifying birds, but one many have readily taken to. Photography is now an additional tool in the birders' bag of ID tricks.



THERE'S AN APP FOR THAT

Another dramatic change in the world of birding is the advent of bird apps. The bulky field guide that you leave in the car is now on an app on your phone, which is in your pocket and at the ready. The apps have everything your old field guide has and more. They come complete with range maps, male, female and juvie plumage plates, life histories and even each species' songs and calls! There are apps that will record birdsong around you and instantly pop up suggestions and pictures of possible identification. They're reasonably accurate, but not infallible - it's always best to get a look at the songster to confirm. These same apps will also suggest the identity of a bird from your photographs. And they will even suggest an ID of a bird you describe to it. Finally, there's an app (eBird) to record all your sightings on and in doing so you are contributing valuable data on a species' abundance and distribution to the scientific record, which informs conservation policy and action. It combines the fascinating joy of birding with a scientific purpose, making for a most honourable recreational undertaking.

GO BIRDING!



These apps and aids put you on the fast-track to building your birding skills for sure. They've contributed to a boom in birding as a recreational pursuit. But still, nothing beats simply getting out there in nature and self-finding a species you've never seen before. So pack up your gear and go birding! on

BECOMING A BIRDER This recent Instagram post about becoming a birdwatcher has, as they say, gone viral. It has raised a lot of laughs amongst the birding community because so many of us can relate. It's true, it is hard to put a finger on just how someone who's never noticed birds morphs into a full-fledged birder (pun intended).

For some, it happens slowly and insidiously, perhaps starting with a general interest in nature. For others, myself included, it is something innate. I can't remember ever not being interested in birds. I made up names for birds before I got my first field guide. I always had to know what bird that was, which bird sang that song, who built that nest and where did the birds

For many, it happens virtually overnight. Something awakens inside and you start to realize that you are always on the lookout for birds, you want to see new birds, you are going birding. You have become a birder!

What exactly is this thing called birding? A dictionary definition is "the observation of birds in their natural habitats as a hobby." But that simple definition doesn't cover the full extent of this pastime. Buying binoculars and trying to identify what you're seeing is the next step. Then comes a quest for information on each species, learning a bit about their song, their preferred habitat, their behaviour and their life cycles. The more you learn the more you want to learn. At passionate pursuit of birds; a compulsion, an obsession even. The more you see, the more you want to see. This is when you've become a birder, the more serious term for the next level of birdwatching.

THIS THING CALLED BIRDING this point your simple birdwatching activity evolves to a more

Jute & Macramé PLACEMATS

PROJECT AND PHOTOGRAPHY ERIN ROCHON

Elevate your table setting this season by crafting beautiful jute-andmacramé placemats, adding warmth and a personalized touch.



MATERIALS

Upcycled 15-inch round placemat or 15-inch round piece of burlap to use as a backing

Jute rope

Brown macramé cord (non-braided type)

Fabric scissors

Hot glue gun Comb

HOW-TO

Step One

Start in the centre of the upcycled placemat (or burlap round) and begin coiling the jute rope. Add a drop of glue to hold it in place. Continue to wrap the jute rope, adding glue to secure it in place as you coil, until it reaches 12-inches in diameter. Cut and glue the end of the jute rope to the placemat.



Step Two

Wrap the macramé cord around the outside of the jute section and cut it approximately six inches longer. This will give you a filler cord to hold the fringe pieces around the outside edge of the placemat. Now, cut five-inch sections of the macramé cord to use as the fringe pieces. Cut enough to cover the circumference of the mat and a few more.



Step Three

The fringes are made using a Lark's Head knot. Start by placing the long filler cord flat. Then fold a five-inch piece of cord in half and place on top of the filler cord, creating a loop at the top. Bring the loop around the back, pull the ends through the loop and tighten. Repeat this step until the long filler cord is covered with the fringe pieces.



Step Four

Glue the fringe, with knots facing in, around the edge of the jute rope and cut off any extra length. Use the comb to brush out the threads of the macramé cord and create the fringe. Trim any uneven threads.





How Long Are LEFT OVERS Safe To Eat?

The holidays are right around the corner, and that often means a refrigerator full of food, and potentially a lot of leftovers. Leftovers can be great! It means cook once and eat for a few days. But how long are those leftovers safe to eat?

Most health experts suggest eating your refrigerated leftovers within three to four days. This time frame depends on the type of food and the storage method.

RISK LEVEL

Some foods are at higher risk than others for containing bacteria and other toxins, which is what can cause food poisoning. Some high-risk foods include meat, poultry, seafood, soups, eggs, stews and cooked rice. There is some variation in how long these leftovers last depending on the type of meat, or how the food was prepared, but the general recommendation for any of these higher risk foods is to consume them within three or four days (two to three days for soups and stews).

PROPER STORAGE TIPS

Once food stops cooking and starts to cool down (or is no longer kept cold and starts to warm up), it should be refrigerated within two hours. Keeping leftovers at 39.2°F (4°C) or below (typical refrigerator temperature) will slow the growth of potentially harmful bacteria.

If leftovers have been left at room temperature for longer than two hours, they should be thrown out.

When storing leftovers, be sure to use clean, airtight containers and keep different types of leftovers separate. Try not to overcrowd your refrigerator with leftovers and warm containers. This can raise the temperature of your fridge. And keep your leftovers in the coldest part of the fridge – the back of middle/upper shelves, not in the door.

If you know you're not going to eat something within three or four days, freeze it. Freezing leftovers can extend the life for a couple of months, depending on the food.

REHEATING

When it comes to reheating and enjoying your leftovers, there is a safe way to do that, too. Refrigerated foods should be reheated to an internal temperature of 165°F (73.9°C). Use a food thermometer to confirm. Soups, stews, sauces or gravies should be brought to a rolling boil before eating again. If something is reheated and not eaten, it should be discarded.

If something has been frozen, it can be thawed in the microwave, a sink or bowl of cold water or in the refrigerator. Thawed food should be cooked and/or consumed immediately. While many of us grew up seeing that night's dinner thawing on the counter all day and we all survived, for everyone's safety, it's best to follow one of the above practices.

SAFFTY FIRST

Just because leftovers look and smell okay, it does not mean they're safe to eat. Not all food will get mouldy or smell off. I know that it's hard to throw out seemingly good food, but trust me, food poisoning is worse than food waste. When in doubt, throw it out. OH

INGREDIENTS

2 cups butternut squash, peeled and cubed

4 cloves garlic, peeled

1 Tbsp thyme

½ cup ricotta cheese

1/4 - 1/2 cup vegetable or chicken stock

1 box (450g) dried pasta of choice

Fresh sage, to serve

Parmesan, to serve

Salt and pepper

Extra virgin olive oil



INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat oven to 400°F.

On a baking sheet, toss together butternut squash, garlic cloves, thyme and olive oil. Season with salt and pepper.

Roast squash for 30-35 minutes.

When tender, add the butternut squash, garlic and ricotta to a food processor. Add stock as needed and purée until smooth.

Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil. Cook pasta according to package directions. Save one cup of pasta water and drain the noodles when cooked.

Add a tablespoon of olive oil to a large skillet.

Over medium-high heat, fry sage leaves on each side for 30 seconds or until crisp. Remove from pan and set on a paper towel.

Add butternut squash purée, ½ cup of pasta water and cooked pasta to the pan. Toss to combine, adding more pasta water as needed.

Top with parmesan and crispy sage to serve! OH


