





editor's note





STAYING AT HOME to help keep a lid on the COVID-19 pandemic has been a chance to catch up on chores.

Cleaning out years of saved wood scraps from below my workbench and painting the basement floor, walls, doors and trim took a little effort, but not much time. There is more to do outside now that warmer weather has arrived but the lull in immediate projects has been a chance to catch up with my birds.

For the first time I succeeded in drawing woodpeckers to suet hung in our cedar tree. A pair of tiny downy woodpeckers were the first to feast on the mixture of fat and seed. A pileated woodpecker, spectacular and startling in its primordial splendour, also snacked on the suet, but only occasionally.

Mourning doves are among my favourites. Ever so humble, they keep their heads down while patrolling for food. Their doleful cooing and the sound of their fluttering wings are endearing. Doves seldom perch on my elevated bird feeder; most of the time they scrounge for fallen seed on the ground. Scattered sunflower seeds drew a dozen or more mourning doves each morning and afternoon. I took attendance, counting the flock on every arrival. Sometimes more than 20 doves descended for a quick, furtive meal.


When I built a tray feeder and bolted it on a post in the front yard, it immediately drew blue jays and cardinals that vied for the new noshing spot. But black and grey squirrels soon took possession, kept birds at bay and made it their own. The tray was a bust as a bird feeder but it inspired my admiration for squirrels. These pint-sized rodents are voracious, tenacious and relentless. When I scatter sunflower seeds on the ground, these bushy-tailed opportunists are always among the first to arrive. I learned to keep scatterings of seeds well-spaced to keep squirrels from fighting and bullying over the grub. They definitely prefer social distancing at meal time. For the moment, they're way ahead of the curve.

Classic FURNITURE

PIECES YOUR KIDS WILL ACTUALLY WANT TO INHERIT. WHAT MAKES A CLASSIC PIECE OF FURNITURE?

Are you downsizing, rightsizing and considering selling or giving away your furniture? The reality is that some people don't want your "old stuff" no matter how much money you spent on it.

Whether your life is transitory or you want to complete a quick project, there's a tendency to buy inexpensive furniture that may, in a short time, wobble, peel or just fall apart in front of you, creating a throwaway mindset.

Furniture you want to keep is valuable, familiar, branded or easily recognizable icons of the 20th Century. Many are approaching the 100-year antique status. For example, two significant pieces from Poltrona Frau's collection, the Chester Sofa and the 1919 Armchair, seen in many James Bond films, are synonymous with status. The 1919 Armchair has been so successful that it's been reissued and reinterpreted with larger proportions to satisfy the modern-day notion of comfort. The more modest Thonet Coffee House Chair can still be seen in French bistro cafés. Good design lasts forever.

We see pieces in architectural design magazines or celebrity interviews in the pages of GQ and Voque. Cultural institutions such as New York's Museum of Modern Art and London's Victoria & Albert Museum have large exhibits displaying the perfect examples of modern-day aesthetics and good taste.

Also, popular television shows have embedded many of these pieces in our modern psyche. Notable examples include Breuer's Cantilever Chair and the Barcelona Chair by Ludwig Mies van der Rohe, both on display in Mad Men's stylish offices and lobbies. Who could forget the Mid-century modern Eames Lounge Chair in Frasier's sleek modern apartment, elegant and separate from his father's old recliner?





Why Are They Valuable?

Modern furniture is mobile and lightweight, designed for city residents in smaller urban homes. It's relevant for today's interiors, ensuring these pieces will keep their inheritance value for a very long time.

Manufacturers such as Knoll and Herman Miller employed Charles and Ray Eames. Marcel Breuer, Ludwig Mies van der Rohe and others to design quality, mass-produced furniture, all while educating clients and the public on principles of good design. Retailers such as Design Within Reach sell prestigious brands direct to the consumer, making these pieces accessible and contributing to their popularity and status. They're also instrumental in introducing the new 21st century classics, such as the Louis Ghost Chair by Philippe Starck or the LEM Piston Stool by Shin and Tomoko Azumi, to the world.

Unfortunately, many of these designs have been reproduced, knocked-off and made cheaply, spoiling the original design intent. However, this makes the original and authentic pieces more valuable. Authentic pieces are still produced by the original manufacturer, branded with copyright labels placed somewhere discreet. These pieces are Sotheby's-worthy and carry certificates of authenticity.

- Buy via auction, consignment or internet.
- Buy one piece at a time all good things are worth waiting for.

COLOUR COMBOS

PURPLE AND ORANGE

Purple flowers abound in gardens everywhere, but too much purple can seem a bit dark and dreary. Adding orange makes cool blue and purple tones sing with vibrancy.

PINK AND ORANGE

Pink is another prevalent flower colour and can look tiresome on its own. Mixing in some orange transforms a pink palette into a gorgeous mix of sorbet colours that looks fresh and modern amidst green foliage. You can even see Mother Nature combining these colours in many blossoms sporting pink petals with orange centres, such as Coneflower and Cosmos.

RED/YELLOW/ORANGE

MELANIE'S PLANT PICKS

Geum Totally Tangerine' – Avens

This perennial has an abundance of tangerine coloured blossoms held high on airy stems. It flowers in spring, is outstanding and underused.

Calendula -Pot Marigold

This beautiful, sunny-orange annual plant is really easy to grow from seed outdoors and self-seeds for subsequent years too. Its petals are edible or can be used to make skin-healing salves due to its natural antifungal and antibacterial properties.

Hemerocallis – Daylily

There are so many varieties of orange daylily beyond the wild ones often known as "tiger lilies." Daylilies have evolved and are often shorter with finer foliage and longer bloom periods. The flower buds on this perennial are edible. Two of my favourites are "Ruffled Apricot" and "Tiger Kitten."

Cosmos sulphureus *'Cosmic Orange'*

Another amazing annual, Cosmos is so easy to grow from seed. This variety is covered by a profusion of two-inch carroty orange blooms that float above fresh fern-like foliage.

Nasturtium 'Troika Orange'

Nasturtium is an old garden favourite. An edible annual, it thrives in poor, dry soil and is so easy to grow. This glorious orange variety is a high-performance bloomer with stunning white-streaked leaves. It's semi-trailing and looks great at the front of a border or in planters.

Orange is like a breath of fresh air. From bright tangerine to soft auburn there's an orange hue for everyone. It is said that a change is as good as a rest and now more than ever we need to look forward to the future with renewed hope and positivity. It's time to give orange - the colour of life, vigour and vitality - a try. oh






On the morning they bought their Mirage Lake cottage, Michael and Davinia Hopfes kindled a lifelong memory.

Huntsville, she says, has great restaurants, great stores and great arts. "And an ice rink," Michael adds. "It just felt like home straight away," says Davinia.

The architecture of their 10-year-old cottage impressed Michael. "The structure itself is amazing. It feels like it's strong," he says. With five bedrooms on three levels, the building is easily and quickly heated with propane or cooled with air conditioning. Its 3,300 square feet of space gives them ample room to share cottage life. "It's a home that's big enough to have lots of family and friends enjoy it with us," says Davinia. The couple's four fluffy white dogs, who loudly announce any visitors, are a huge part of their family life. Simba and Pumpkin are siblings that Michael kept when he rescued a litter of six puppies in Mexico. Gini is also from Mexico while Bella came from Korea.

In addition to its large area for family gatherings, the lake house has lots of quiet nooks in which to read, rest and relax. Large windows overlooking the lake fill the cottage with light. "Everywhere you look, there's a view. Light is very important to us," says Davinia. "It's a nice, open feeling."


The couple began making the cottage their own by refinishing the wide-plank pine floors, sanding the wood to its original blonde hue. For a better view of the lake, they installed tempered glass railings along the deck at the front of the house. Continued on page 36

They furnished the great room with chrome-accented, white Italian leather sofas with flip-up headrests from La Vie Furniture. Adjacent to the great room, white dining chairs with wood and metal benches flank the live-edge acacia dinner table from Primitive Designs. A unique console table made from the gnarled roots of a teak tree hugs one wall. In a spot near the fireplace, they used weathered barn board to build an entertainment centre. They named each of the four guest bedrooms – Bear, Moose, Lavender and Nautical – and decorated each accordingly. "We thought it would be cute to have themed rooms," says Davinia. In the kitchen, quartz countertops complement cabinets with a cream-coloured antique finish. Above the sink, tiny flags of the nautical

alphabet spell out the couple's surname.

The cottage loft holds their master bedroom, which overlooks the great room and the lake view.

Framed on three sides with large windows, the Muskoka room is one of their favourite spots. "From this room you can see the sunrise, which is amazing," says Davinia. "It's full of windows. It's full of light. It's very relaxing." A grey sofa bed provides extra sleeping space for visitors. "It's pretty in here when it's raining or snowing," says Michael. Fastened to the wall is a white and gold Olympic torch from the 2018 Winter Games. Its five-pronged flames representing five continents reflect the couple's eclectic tastes. Continued on page 38

They've brought home mementoes from their travels – furs from Finland, a unique black vase from Austria, woolly sheep figurines from Tallinn, Estonia, vases from Mexico and tissue holders from the Philippines. "Every single piece that we've chosen has a story," says Davinia.

For their living room, they asked Huntsville's **Living Wood Design** to build a coffee table of spalted maple, accented with a rivulet of coloured epoxy. "We had a vision of how we wanted that table to look," Michael explains. "It took us a while to find the right company that could piggy back off our vision and allow it to become a reality." Michael and Davinia share a creative vision for their country home. "It's not easy to find the right people that can make our ideas come to life," Michael says. *Continued on page 40*






The couple plans to build a Finnish grill house – an all-season cooking hut - in the front yard. Traditional Scandinavian fixtures, these six-sided huts are typically made

TIPS FROM A **PROFESSIONAL** STAGER ON ORGANIZING YOUR HOME BEFORE A SALE

When you're living in your home, storage goals are simple. It's all about attractively corralling your family's shoes, homework, jackets and - ouch! - stray LEGO pieces. But when you're selling, says Kristyn Pereira, lead stylist and account manager for home staging company Well Dressed Home, there's a twist.

"We look at resale value, and all our recommendations are potentially to make the seller more money." When it comes to organizing your home before a sale, Kristyn says things become stylized and not terribly realistic. "Nobody actually lives like that so it's kind of creating this facade." You're striving, she says, to create clean, fresh spaces buyers can imagine themselves living in.

Decluttering and staging is a lot of work, Kristyn admits, but she says it can really pay off. "It all comes down to your photographs," she says. "Because when people are shopping they're scrolling through photos that their realtor sent them, or they're on realtor.ca. And when those photos stand out, that's the house they want to go and look at. You'll see that a staged house is going to get more showings because people get excited looking at this beautiful space."

THE FOLLOWING ARE KRISTYN'S INDUSTRY-**TESTED TIPS FOR GETTING YOUR HOUSE** READY FOR THE MARKET.



DO A WALK-THROUGH RESTYLE

Moving is a good time to start purging and looking at what you really need and what you are actually using. With her clients, Kristyn likes to start by doing a walkthrough of the entire house. "It's usually an hour-anda-half to two hours and we go through every nook and cranny." She recommends looking at everything with fresh eyes to decide what needs reorganizing or purging to create that sublime first impression for buyers.

DO A CLEAR-OUT

Cull, and once done. Kristvn recommends a couple options. You can neatly store excess belongings on-site. "If you have an unfinished basement, garage or storage room, as long as those spaces are fairly organized, then it's OK to load those spaces up."

Alternatively, if you live in a condo or have a lot of clutter, off-site storage can work too. Kristyn uses a company called Second Closet, which will pick up and store homeowners' belongings and return them after the sale.

YOUR CLOSETS

With closets and cupboards, ensure they have some negative space. Kristyn says, "If the closets and cupboards are overflowing, buyers think, 'If you don't have enough space, then we're not going to have enough space."

UPGRADE YOUR CLOTHES HANGERS

Weed out those skinny wire hangers from your closets - "They're very distracting to the eye," says Kristyn. For a beautiful, clean look, make sure your coat hangers are all matching.





MAKE USE OF BINS

Bins and baskets are great for attractively organizing items on closet shelves and bookcases. Colour co-ordinate and even add labels to lend extra style, says Kristyn. "It gets people excited to see those types of things."



PARE BACK IN THE BATHROOM AND KITCHEN

Remove clutter and keep surfaces clear in both of these important areas. For example in the bathroom, Kristyn says, "With shampoos and conditioners it looks very messy to keep them in the shower itself so we usually ask sellers to put them in a basket and store the basket in a cupboard.'

STYLE KIDS' ROOMS

With kids' rooms, Kristyn suggests creating a dream and using a light hand with décor: "Sometimes we'll put a little stuffed animal on a bed or add a cute piece of art," she says, suggesting you can style bookshelves with items like piggy banks and a few books, and place cute toy storage bins on the floor.

CONSIDER YOUR TARGET MARKET

Finally, unlike with your personal décor, when you're decluttering and staging for sale, Kristyn says you should stay away from anything too trendy when it comes to colours, furniture and styling. "Most of the time we want to be in the mainstream area because that's where most people are." он



SMALL BUT SWEET





THE PLACE

Overlooking the Indian River at the hub of Muskoka's big lakes, the **Red Canoe Gallery** houses a unique collection of all-Canadian art. Images of bears, moose and foxes stalk the gallery walls, interspersed with colourful landscapes and augmented with pottery, wood carving, sculpture and jewelry. Established 27 years ago by painter Carola Grimm, the gallery has evolved organically, adapting every year to the current tastes for art.

PRODUCTS

The gallery's primary focus is Canadian paintings, with a little bit of sculpture, wooden bowls and gift items. "I try to have a lot of variety in style," says Carola. Paintings include moose and bear by Paul Garbett, foxes by Melissa Wakefield and birch trees, colourful tree trunks and stacked canoes by Carola. There are forest scenes by Peter Reid and Nancy Yanaky, landscapes by Brent Garbett, and Brigitte Nowak's distinctive, larger-than-life renderings of canoes. John Van Kessel's turned-wood bowls lend new life to aged hardwood. Handmade painted paddles by Jo Mann brighten the gallery corners filled with raku ceramics by José Drouin. David Trant's hockey moose sculpture and fun t-shirts by Carola's sister and pop artist Ileana Grimm blend humour into the mix.


Large paintings are in demand.

They say that a picture is worth a thousand words but according to professional photographer Harold Feng, it can say so much more. Not only does a captivating image dress up a blank wall, but it can do double duty by bringing a feeling or sense of emotion to a space.


"Having and displaying photos lets you express yourself and your personality," Harold says. Melissa Heaman, owner of Harbour Mill Design in Baden, Ontario, feels the same way. "Photography is a great way to display images of personal significance as well as evoke emotions and personal style."

From special pieces of art to innovative sculptures and planters, there are so many ways to add interest to your walls. But few tell a story quite like a photograph. Whether you invest in professional imagery or choose to display some of your own photos, here are a few tips to make the most of this special medium.

COLOUR OR BLACK AND WHITE?

It depends, Harold explains. Both are popular but if you're hoping to evoke a more uplifting, cheerful ambience, colour is the way to go. Black and white images tend to create a more moody, mysterious feeling and work well on a white or grey wall. Walls painted a more dramatic hue are better balanced with colour images.

But that doesn't mean you can't mix both, Melissa says. "Combining black and white and colour photographs together is absolutely acceptable if the room's design allows it. Where black and white can be timeless and classic, colour can complement other accents in the room's décor. Continued on page 54










PLACES, PEOPLE **OR THINGS**

When it comes to subject matter, the sky's the limit. Landscapes, architecture and people are photography mainstays, Melissa says, but today's trends are focusing on images of barn animals and abstract photography using experimental photography methods. Still, she suggests choosing art based on personal interest over passing trends.










PUTTING THEM ON DISPLAY

This is where the possibilities are truly endless, far beyond arranging frames on a table. Robin Boles, owner of Robin Interiors in Kitchener, Ontario, suggests creating a gallery wall-style grouping, designing a picture ledge or going with large-scale photos either framed or blown up on canvas. Spacing between multiple photos should be kept to a few inches, she recommends, and remember the rule of odd numbers. "Things on display usually look better in groups of three or five."

There are several ways to replicate a gallery feel, though Harold says he prefers a balanced layout of black and white images hung next to each other along a wall. The hanging height is very important as well. "The museums and galleries have all photos at eye level," and though that height can differ from person to person, the rule of thumb is 57 to 70 inches from the floor. If you're hanging an image above furniture, leave a five- to eight-inch gap.



MELISSA OFFERS SOME ADDITIONAL IDEAS FOR HANGING YOUR **FAVOURITE PHOTOS:**

- Pairings, groupings or grids for a more organized and traditional look. (She suggests using vintage frames to display modern photos.)
- Large scale, either on canvas, metal, wood or framed behind glass.
- Wire hung/gallery-style by dropping an image into the room from two wires above.
- Leaning on a picture ledge, dresser, shelf or tabletop is a great way to create an effortless look and easily switch pieces out.
- Mounted in front of millwork or shelves - a fun way to experiment with traditional style.

MIXING MEDIUMS

There are no rules when it comes to placing a striking photo beside a beautiful watercolour or a unique wall sculpture. "I absolutely would display them together without really overthinking it," Robin says. "Pay attention to repeating motifs - colours, shapes, sizes."

Considering your room's style and function is crucial, Melissa suggests, before choosing the subject matter, display method or size of photos.


Budget is also key and with today's technology don't be afraid to mix your own photographs with professional works of art to create a price-conscious, truly custom look.

If you want to add a sense of variety and another dimension of interest to your home décor, photography is a fantastic option. For those who want to invest beyond their own photographs, your best bet is to consult someone like Melissa, who is an arteducated designer, or an art dealer, gallery or professional photographer. OH





Years ago, BONE Structure, a Quebec company that uses recycled metal and high-tech energy conservation to build homes and commercial buildings, piqued Ken's interest. "The more we looked into it, it seemed the design and style of the home that we wanted could be accommodated and built using the BONE technology," Ken says. BONE's building method and the way its houses work appealed to them. "They're perfectly square and things are in perfect alignment. Everything is very precise," Ken says.

Now retired, the couple had searched for vacant land on which to build a new home in Prince Edward County and the Collingwood area but didn't have much luck until they found seven building lots near Port Severn, offered on BONE's website. They checked out the area and liked it. "What we wanted was a large property that provided a peaceful, natural setting and interesting view," says Kathy. "It fit the bill. It's a great location."

They created the overall concept and floor plan of their single-level home on their own. "It was a project we wanted to do ourselves," says Kathy. They brought their design ideas, with lots of windows, wide doorways and halls to BONE, which converted their plans to architectural drawings and began manufacturing.

Their building site was carved out of an oak forest on Darling Island. Enough trees were left to ensure privacy for each building lot. The property borders a protected wetland on Gloucester Pool, an islandspeckled lake that flows into Little Lake and eventually Georgian Bay.

Garrison Creek erected the home's steel frame in about 10 days and did all the interior finishing. BONE's steel building components are all pre-engineered and cut to fit. They're simply bolted together, quickly and more efficiently than conventional woodframe construction. Continued on page 61








During the year-long construction project, Kathy and Ken lived in a rented townhouse at the nearby Oak Bay Golf Club. "It was a good way to get to know the area," says Kathy. "It helped to make the transition from the city easier."

They frequently visited the building site. Garrison Creek enabled them to closely monitor progress by posting daily online updates. "We could see every day what they had done," says Ken.

The couple say they're very pleased with Garrison Creek. "The quality of the work is fantastic. All their employees and tradesmen were great to work with. They

On the opposite side of the house, the family room has a linear Napoleon fireplace recessed in a unique feature wall of tile and cold-rolled steel. Varied ceiling heights, ranging between nine and 12 feet, partial walls and large openings define individual living spaces, providing privacy while maintaining an open ambience. "We kind of built the rooms to accommodate custom furniture pieces we already had," says Kathy. "To me that was a way to bring the family home with us." In-floor heating warms the porcelain tiles in every room. Walls in the main living areas and kitchen are painted Behr Halation. Bedrooms are painted Benjamin Moore Collingwood and bathrooms are Silver Satin.


Two brothers went big with their new cottage on Huntsville's Fairy Lake.


With seven bedrooms and bathrooms, two living rooms, a home theatre and bar, the 7,600 sq. ft. lake house has room enough for three or more generations of their family. As long-time cottagers in the Kawarthas, they always had guests coming to the family's Pigeon Lake cottage and they expect the same at their new Muskoka retreat. "We wanted to make sure there's enough room for another family or two," says one brother.

Built like a large rustic farmhouse with modern touches, the cottage has a kitchen table that seats 16. The great room fireplace ascends more than two storeys to the vaulted ceiling. Wood-sheathed beams float over wide living spaces and a tall sweeping wall of windows overlooks the lake and the surrounding birch trees and pines. Continued on page 80

craftsmanship and the people on site. After visiting the home Blayne built for his own family a little farther east on the lake, and a few more conversations, they decided Attainable would build their cottage.

Big wooden beams and columns, reclaimed hemlock floors and natural stone from local quarries were integral to the design the brothers, their mother and a fiancée developed. "There were some long nights to get some of the details pounded out," the owner says. "We wanted to keep in mind what the land was used for prior to us. It was an old

farm. We left a lot of the finishes looking older while still being modern." On each of the three floors, a western wing contains two bedrooms connected through a shared bathroom with double vanities, soaker tub and glass-walled shower. The open kitchen - with a large island topped with Cambria quartz, Silestone countertops and cabinetry by Muskoka Custom Cabinets Ltd. – occupies the east wing of the main floor. Made of walnut slabs, the live-edge, matchbook kitchen table sits below a chiseled wooden beam hung with Edison bulbs. The large dinner table was a must-have for their mother who raised three competitive athletes. "Family meals are important because when we were all young, playing hockey and swimming for my sister, we very rarely got to eat together until Sunday. Having family meals is a big thing for us."

A sliding door off the kitchen opens to the Muskoka room where granite covers the floor. Huge pine timbers, a vaulted ceiling and large windows give it an outdoor ambience while maintaining a bug-free zone. Continued on page 82

"We love being up there," the owner says. "Cottaging is a big part of our family life. Our weekends are important to all of us because it's the time we get to spend with one another, away from work." When Attainable Realty Inc. broker Blayne Hutchins first showed them the wooded, three-acre property, the brothers noticed the house Blayne's company Attainable Solutions Inc. was building next door. Blayne walked them through it. As owners of a construction

Throughout the cottage, hemlock flooring cut from old Ontario barn beams, reclaimed by **Nostalgic Wood**, replicates the farmhouse theme and enhances the warmth of the building. The master bedroom and en suite occupy the east wing, where a crew of several strong builders carried up a large slab of custom granite to serve as the bench in the en suite shower. Stone veneer clads the shower walls and angled ceiling.

The ground floor holds another large living room with a walkout to the front yard, a fireplace, bedroom wing and a wellequipped bar, furnished with cabinetry and a table mounted on Jack Daniels whiskey barrels. At one end of the bar are three hockey stalls, built like those in a professional team's dressing room. Hung with the sweaters of the junior hockey teams for which the two brothers played, they're a reminder of the stalls in which they'd so often sat. Just off the bar is a theatre room with a large screen, popcorn machine and enough soft leather seats for a large family audience. "Everything that we've put into this place is what we value most - family, good food and a good time," says the owner. Continued on page 84








Wine cellar walls are clad in reclaimed hemlock, the same wood used for the cottage flooring. The cellar has a sliding barn-style door made of hemlock. Contemporary lighting, hardware and a glass entrance give it a modern edge.

The owner praised Attainable's foreman **Keith Maclennan** for expertly steering the building project. "He was everything you'd come to expect from someone who builds custom homes. As an individual, his craftsmanship is fantastic." The owner also commended Saunders Masonry and Jason Bidan of **TruNorth Tile Inc.** "Both of those folks were fantastic because working with granite and stone in general is a challenge."

Attainable owner **Blayne Hutchins** says the brothers and their family had great ideas and were an awesome team to work for. Steel beams were used to support the building due to the required spans and wind loads on the front wall. "It was convenient to have our own welders on staff who were able to make any of the required adjustments and the many welds that were required," Blayne says. "To cover the steel beams, we disguised them with pine cladding to look like an old timber frame. Our foreman had a great time antiquing the wood, using chains, grinders and blow torches to achieve the final product." The same technique disguised some of the duct runs over the kitchen. 

MULTI-PLANT HANGER

A VERTICAL HANGER THAT MAKES IT EASY TO GROW HERBS OR DISPLAY FLOWERS.

MATERIALS

3 round cork trivets Paper for template Heavy card stock 1 spool of cord 1 metal ring

3 small plant pots 3 flowering plants or herbs

TOOLS

Scissors Pencil Utility knife Glue Small drill bit





Start by creating a paper template to use for cutting and drilling your trivets. On a piece of paper, draw a circle 1 inch smaller in diameter than your trivet and cut it out. In the centre of your paper circle, draw another circle 1 inch smaller in diameter than the mouth of your plant pot and cut it out. Fold your paper template in half twice, then unfold. These fold lines will indicate where to drill the holes in your trivets.

Place your paper template in the centre of a cork trivet and trace around the smaller, inside circle. Cut out the circle using the utility knife. Repeat with the remaining two trivets.

Stack trivets and place your paper template on the centre of the top trivet. On the outer edge, using the fold lines as a guide, drill four evenly spaced holes in the trivets.

Next, make some extra circles out of heavy card stock, which will be glued to the bottom of each trivet for more stability. To do this, place your paper template onto your card stock and trace and cut three more circles. Glue these to the bottom of each trivet.





Now you're ready to attach your trivets with cord.

Cut 2 pieces of cord into 8 foot lengths, fold in half and loop through your metal ring, making a knot. Now you will have four strands hanging from the ring.

Thread the cord through the holes of the first trivet, then wrap the cord over the edge and thread through the holes again for adjustable stability.

Place the second trivet on the cord 12 inches from the first trivet and repeat threading. Do the same with the last trivet, leaving enough cord to tie a knot.

Adjust and level trivets. Apply glue into the holes to secure cords and let dry.

Gather the bottom cords, tie a knot and trim if desired.

Plant flowers or herbs in planters. Add planters to trivets and hang! OH

SANDWICH


Steam shrimp for 5 minutes or until cooked through. Cut into small chunks.


