





To navigate the dos and don'ts for your outdoor life experience, first, ask yourself, "How much time do I want to devote to maintenance?" A bit of research will make your lounge time more enjoyable.

CABINETRY AND FURNITURE — MAINTENANCE 101

- Most products are made of plastic, wood, aluminum or wicker, and each material has its own set of positives and negatives.
- Take time to read and follow manufacturers' instructions to clean and maintain any products. It'll make your life easier in the short and long run.
- Corrosion- and weather-resistant means the finish protects materials. It is not waterproof.
- UV-stable and light fastness is a stabilizer added to protect from deterioration or fading in the sun.
- Fire, heat and impact-resistant materials are easy to clean and non-corrosive. The most practical is stainless steel
- The easiest solution is to cover your furniture and place in storage when not in use.


Look for recycled plastic, reclaimed wood or FSC-certified wood. Teak is well known for durability, beauty and strength and is popular on ships.

FABRICS

Cushions and fabrics make outdoor lounging comfy. Make sure fabrics are breathable and



SHADES AND CANOPIES

Extend your outdoor stay in a natural way to keep cool, protect yourself from UV rays and reduce the premature ageing of wood and fabric. Add a fan for ultimate breezy coolness.

FLOORING

What's under your feet needs to be practical, beautiful and long-wearing. First, take an inventory of the area you want to cover. Assess conditions such as drainage, holes made by animals, soil type and exposure to sun and rain. This will determine what materials you'll need to use. Flooring options include:

Wood: It's versatile. Redwood and cedar have a natural resistance to rot and the elements. Other woods require sealants.

Stone: Natural and durable. Includes granite, slate and marble and still requires care. Dark stones absorb the heat and will scorch your tender tootsies.

Brick and permeable concrete pavers: Great hardscape options for eco-friendly patios and walkways.

Tile: Porcelain tiles can mimic the look of other materials, including wood and stone, all while being durable and budget-friendly.

Rubber paving stones and recycled plastic: Helps divert waste from landfills. Resilient, durable, slip resistant and shock absorbent - a favourite around pools and kids' playgrounds.

Composite Decking: Wood fibres encased in plastic and binding agents. Low-maintenance, easy to install with a multitude of great traits. Very popular despite higher cost of materials.

Carpets: Makes the outdoors homelike. The synthetics are easy to clean, and are mould, mildew and stain-resistant. Many are made of recycled materials.

Artificial Grass: It's not the real thing, but it is easy to install and long-lasting. You do need to vacuum it.

NOTE: Make sure your flooring has a matte or non-slip finish. Shiny surfaces are hazardous around water and in the winter.



Finally, your evening outdoor stay is more enjoyable when you light things up! Make sure any fixture you use is wet-rated. Safety first. on





1 cup melon, balled (your choice: cantaloupe, watermelon and/ or honeydew)

1 cup bocconcini cheese

8-10 pieces of thinly sliced prosciutto

Mint, to garnish
Basil, to garnish

DRESSING

¼ cup olive oil

2 Tbsp wine vinegar, your choice

1 tsp honey

A few leaves of basil, thinly sliced Salt and pepper, to taste

HOW-TO

In a large bowl, mix together dressing ingredients.

Add melon and cheese and toss to coat in the dressing.

Place the melon mixture on a platter and arrange with slices of prosciutto.

Tear mint and basil to garnish on top. **OH**

2020 was a wild year that brought so many challenges – some were utterly heartbreaking and others were just plain annoying. The lack of availability of items we take for granted was frustrating, including plants. Many garden favourites just weren't attainable. Seed-sowing to the rescue!



Most garden seeds (both flowers and veggies) are readily available online and at your local nursery, often in varieties you might otherwise never find. Plus, growing plants from seed is an inexpensive, fun and rewarding process. Most seeds can be started indoors earlier in the growing season but for this piece I'm focusing on the direct sowing method because it's terrifically simple. Direct seeding/ sowing means to plant seed directly in the garden. Sounds easy doesn't it? That's because it is!

Unlike their inside-grow counterparts, seeds that have been grown in place don't experience the stress of transplanting and won't need to adjust to their new surroundings. Often you won't lose any time at all direct-sowing and I learned this (again) firsthand during last year's growing season when a friend gifted me a variety of veggie seeds in June. With no time to start indoors I had no choice but to direct-sow them. To my surprise, many of these sown-in-place seedlings grew better and produced more than the ones I started inside the previous months.

TIPS FOR SEEDING SUCCESS

Though direct-sowing is easy, it doesn't mean your new plant babies won't need care. Follow these tips for the best direct-seeding success:

- Make sure to clear your seeding area of any weeds and have the soil loose, damp and ready for planting.
- Most of the specific sowing info per plant variety is found on the seed packet. Please read carefully. The rule of thumb is to plant a seed three times as deep as its circumference, but some require light or a cold stratification to germinate. Also keep in mind that when to sow is equally important, as some seedlings are frost-hardy and some are not.
- Mark your spot. It's really easy to forget where you planted seeds once springtime growth is in full swing.
- Water your seeds gently as needed until you see germination, then again whenever you see the soil surface looking a bit dry. Watch the weather and adjust your watering. Schedule accordingly as seedlings can easily die from drought or drowning at this delicate stage.
- If you have a good germination rate, you may need to thin your seedlings to give them airflow and room to grow. I find it's better to pinch the unwanted seedlings off at the base because pulling them disturbs their delicate, young root systems. If the unwanted seedlings are edible plants you can eat them, too.
- Keep watching and caring for your new brood until they're established plants, and always be on the lookout for pests and predators. Some insects love to snack on and decimate defenseless seedlings.

MFIANIF'S PIANT PICKS

Annual flowers, vegetables, and even some perennials are great candidates for direct-sowing. Some plants even seed themselves for subsequent years. Here is my list of favourites, but please don't let it limit you. There are many others that will work.



THE EDIBLES

Beans, salad greens, parsley, basil, dill, borage, cilantro, fennel, beets, carrots, peas and radish.

BLOOMS-FOR-DAYS ANNUALS

Cosmos, zinnia, calendula, sunflowers, nasturtium, nigella, bachelor buttons, california poppies, morning glory and moonflower.



DEPENDABLE PERENNIALS/BIENNIALS


Foxglove, blue flax, black eyed susans, milkweed, butterfly weed, columbine and lupine.

PRO TIP: After your seed garden is well established, don't forget to sow succession crops of both flowers and veggies to keep those beautiful blossoms and edibles coming all season long. You can even save some seeds at the end of the season for next year.

Lessons learned? Direct sowing is a little bit risky and patience-building but also incredibly easy and inexpensive. Which method will you choose this gardening season? **OH**













Rachel and Ben Helder love their home.
They created almost 10 years of memories there before deciding it was

They created almost 10 years of memories there before deciding it was time for a major overhaul of the main floor. Their family had grown substantially over the years – six children between the ages of four and 16. Nothing was more important than spending time together as a family, but they weren't sure how to make it happen. And they didn't know the best design plan would include a drastic flip, reversing the first draft of the new floor plan entirely.

Decorator Mary Cath Altobelli of Alto Interiors and Rob VanderBrugghen of Ridgeline Renovations knew. The original design didn't relocate the kitchen or dining room, but after

giving it some thought, Mary Cath realized doing so would best serve the Helders.

"The drawings were done, so Rachel and Ben were hesitant to make drastic changes," Mary Cath says. "But the drop-dead gorgeous island and kitchen wouldn't have been the same without flipping the design plan, making the space much more inviting and user-friendly."

They switched the dining room and kitchen, removing the wall between the kitchen and living room to create an open space that's now uniquely framed by floor-to-ceiling pantries, the result of Rob and brother Todd's design genius.

"The pantry area became a feature unto itself," Mary Cath says.

"One pantry is for food and kitchen supplies, and the other houses kids' stuff like snacks and lunch goodies, making it easy for the kids to get ready for school. Together, the pantries are an architectural conversation piece."

The homeowners also love how the flip gave them clear sightlines to the backyard so they can watch the kids play outside.

The Helder home is nestled on a three-acre parcel along the Niagara Escarpment in Grimsby, only minutes from city amenities and schools. "We fell in love with the area, and the house was only a year old when we bought it," Rachel recalls. Continued on page 26



Before the renovation, the 2,800 sq. ft. home had two eating areas, both too small for a large family, and a kitchen layout that made it difficult for more than one person to cook. "We knew from the start the kitchen and dining areas would be a problem for our growing family," Rachel says. "But we wanted to live there for a while before making changes so we'd know how we use the house."

This was a good call. The house was hemmed in by the pool, septic system and garage, making expansion impossible. By removing a few choice walls, Mary Cath, Rob and Todd maximized the workable space within the existing square footage, creating the open-concept living, dining and kitchen area that's become the epicentre of the home.

Rachel loves to bake, often with the kids, and the dining area now accommodates up to 22 people thanks to a custom dining table by **Expressions in Wood** – perfect for this family of eight and their friends. The family often hosts birthday parties and holiday gatherings.

New flooring was installed throughout the main floor. Hardwood from **Flooring Liquidators** was chosen for its warm colouring and texture, perfect for hiding scuffs and scratches. To make things softer on all those feet, an area rug from **Décor on a Dime** was added to the family room. One window was bricked over, one was added, and two were replaced with larger panes to flood the place with natural light. Window treatments from Gotcha Covered are there for privacy when needed. With six kids, most still small, the family needed shelving that was easily accessible to everyone. The living room built-ins surround a **Distinctive Fires** fireplace offering a stunning focal point, and art by Marina Randazzo adorns the walls here and in the family room. "We love the built-ins," Rachel says. "They add much-needed storage and give the house character."

Mary Cath also found creative storage space in every nook and guided the homeowners in picking furniture and drapery.

A coffered ceiling was added to the family room as well, taking it "from a square box to a cosy lounge area," Rachel says. "It's now a room we love to be in."




The homeowners also love the built-in wine bar and dining area, which is great for entertaining. "We are very happy we had Rob and Mary Cath to help us," Ben says. "We didn't have the time needed to plan and follow through with every detail, and these guys helped immensely. Always hire professionals."

The Helder home renovation also included the main-floor office, laundry room, powder room, entryway, second living room and staircase to the upper level.

Having finished the reno in March 2020, the timing couldn't have been better. A province-wide COVID-19 lockdown meant all six kids were out of school, studying online alongside Rachel and Ben working from home. "We made the dining area into a classroom," Rachel says.

The dining room also became a place of worship when their church closed to contain the virus. "If there was ever a great time to test the success of this renovation, now is the time," Ben says with a laugh. **OH**



HOME IMPROVEMENT FORECAST 2021

What homeowners can expect

IF YOU TRIED TO COMPLETE SOME HOME IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS (OR EVEN BASIC MAINTENANCE) OVER THE PAST YEAR AND HIT A FEW SNAGS, YOU'RE NOT ALONE.

Homeowner Karen Homer has certainly been there. Homer, who's been completing a string of projects on her Guelph century home over the past year, recalls encountering everything from booked-up contractors to lumber shortages to COVID-related product and shipping delays. With a custom door for example, she says, "This door should usually take nine weeks to come, which is long enough, but it took 16 weeks."

Add to that an extra layer of COVID protocols and PPE. At one point, during some mould remediation work in her basement, Karen found herself dealing not only with "guys in COVID suits but others in mould-hazard suits. So it's been fun!"

For industry players and homeowners alike, 2020 was uniquely and unforgettably challenging. If you plan to begin a new project this year, here's a look at what's in the forecast for the home improvement industry plus advice on navigating challenges.

MORE OF THE SAME BUT DIFFERENT, TOO

What can homeowners expect this year? We talked to Michael Garrity, CEO of Financeit, a Toronto-based company that provides mobile-friendly financing apps for things like home renos.

Michael begins by making sense of what happened last year. "If there was a theme for 2020, it would be 'Dealing with change without a playbook,' right? We had no idea this was going to come, once it hit us we had no idea how big it was going to be, what the implications were going to be, what the government reaction was going to be, what people's perceptions of safety would look like. It was all trial by fire."

Adding to the complexity, says Michael, after an industry lockdown in Q2, the home improvement sector saw a wild 60 per cent year-over-year rise in the third quarter – hand-in-hand with unprecedented delays and shortages.

For 2021, with a second lockdown in January, he says, "We are going to continue to wrestle with effects and implications of the health pandemic for the entirety of the year." Yet Michael also sees more reasons to be encouraged.

"What's different this year from last year is we have information; we know what to expect. We're done with [establishing] policies and procedures and protocols. We know how to operate in a lockdown... in a grey zone, and a yellow zone and red zone. We're ready as an industry."

BETTER TECH TOOLS

In 2021 we're all also armed with geeky new skills, having mastered virtual meeting platforms and other tech tools thanks to COVID. Michael says on the industry side, "We've moved to virtual consults, taken advantage of new tools that are available so we can minimize interruptions with customers." In this wider-scale adoption of tech, he says his own company's online applications, which allow customers to finance home improvement projects online, also saw real growth in 2020. "Electronic payments and online financing tools like ours exploded because of again just health concerns and the inconvenience of cash."





SUPPLY ISSUES

Supply issues are improving. Overall, Michael says, "I think that supply chain issues are going to be less frequent because of knowledge. We know and we can plan for alternative places to source material from."

SPECIFIC TRENDS

Michael says the past year also brought a "reinforcement of the value of the home." In 2021, with people still not travelling, we should see more of the same – spending on backyards, pools, spas, outdoor kitchens, new driveways, basketball courts and anything that maximizes enjoyment of our homes.

ADVICE

For 2021, with home improvement projects, Michael advises planning ahead as much as possible. "Secure the contractor that you want to work with as early in the season as you can because there will be an increased amount of demand."

And for larger spends, particularly if you might sell down the line, Karen says a savvy realtor with good local knowledge can really help you prioritize spending. "I had a realtor walk through the house with me and make lists of bare minimum things that needed to be addressed," she says.

Finally, the right mindset – being patient and flexible – and the need for good safety protocols will stay with us this year. "We're going to experience elements of the health pandemic for all of 2021," says Michael. "It's safe to do projects, as long as you take care." **OH**

FOR MORE THAN 15 YEARS, NIAGARA WINE COUNTRY WAS JANE WOOLSEY'S FAVOURITE ESCAPE – trading the bustle

of Etobicoke for the calm of the vineyards at every opportunity, daydreaming of the day she could retire along the southern shores of Lake Ontario.

"Every time I left, I wanted to get back. It's such a calm and welcoming feeling here on the (Beamsville) Bench," Jane says.

When Jane met David Jacobs, they found their future plans to be as in sync as the two of them. With Jane approaching retirement from the corporate world, and David semi-retiring, they knew there was no better time to find their forever home in wine country.

In 2019, their realtor found a brick bungaloft in Beamsville with the dynamic property of their dreams: front-to-back views of Lake Ontario, sprawling vineyards and the Niagara Escarpment.


"The property was perfect," Jane says. "We wanted space and vineyards around us, and having the escarpment almost in our backyard was a bonus."

The 4,900 sq. ft., 1992 custom build was a vision with clean sightlines and grand, arched windows. But it needed to be opened up and modernized to bring the outdoors in.

The couple partnered with designer Laurie Sprague of Laurie Sprague **Designs**, whose vision aligned perfectly with Jane and David's for their country home. Laurie spearheaded the heavy lifting on the project, contributing to the overall re-design of the whole home, including lighting, kitchen design, material specification, wallpaper, window coverings, millwork design and art arrangement. Throughout, she drew inspiration from items that were significant to the couple, ensuring a place of prominence in her designs for David's incredible rug collection and a vintage hutch, for example, in the dining room.

"We wanted it to be more sophisticated than a cliché farmhouse, but full of warmth and personality like Jane and David," Laurie says. "One of my missions is to make every home feel cosy. Homes are meant to be lived in and enjoyed. This was a team effort with great trades."

Their first step was to open up the interior to let light flood in. Contractor **Brad** Robinson of BMR Group Homes Ltd. began removing walls, doors and sight barriers that blocked any views.

First to go was the maple staircase set in the centre of the foyer. It was replaced with a contemporary glass staircase with soft wood railings and minimal structural metal. Envisioned by David and executed by **E&B** Glass Enclosures along with Stairfab and Railings Inc., the staircase now acts as a functional centrepiece to the home and allows for uninterrupted light flow.

We wanted to see the view of the vineyards in our backyard the moment we walked through the front door," David says.

The matching glass railings extend from the staircase and frame the upper loft landing, which overlooks the main floor. The loft - featuring two guest bedrooms, a guest bath and sitting nook – is home to two of the couple's favourite spaces.

Dubbed the Georgian Bay Room, the guest bedroom pays homage to Jane's family cottage.

It incorporates antique furniture and artwork from the cottage, including a painting by Jane's mother, all with the intention of honouring the family heirlooms.

"I feel so good every time I come in this room," Jane says. "I feel connected to something important."

The sitting nook has David's passions on display. Laurie chose the bright space as the backdrop for showcasing David's collection of guitars and tall-ships artwork.

Back on the main level at the base of the stairs is the master bedroom - elevated by a board-and-batten wall that complements wainscotting in the foyer. The en suite features an oversize, double-glass shower by E&B Glass Enclosures and a heated basket-weave tile floor selected by Laurie. Continued on page 40

A surprising statement is the powder room, which is tiled with unique hexagon flooring and wrapped in a whimsical abstract floral wallpaper.

"Both bathrooms are so unique," Jane says. "I told Laurie, 'Nothing vanilla' and she delivered."

The kitchen, living and dining areas are at the heart of the home with the open-concept layout now allowing for conversation to drift from room to room.


The bright kitchen underwent a complete overhaul by **Justine Driedger** of **Mission Custom Cabinetry**. This included a white subway-tile backsplash by Laurie, new cabinets by Mission Custom Cabinetry and appliances by **Nickerson Appliances**. A larger window and statement lighting by **Universal Lighting** were installed to further brighten the kitchen.

The standout is the sage green and Cambria quartz L-shaped island used in place of a kitchen table for seating.

"We didn't want the island to match the kitchen; we wanted it to be a statement on its own," Jane says.

The warm and inviting family room is decorated with antique pieces and new furniture from **Stoney Creek Furniture**. A custom floor-to-ceiling stone fireplace, supplied by **Stamford Fireplaces** and designed and created by Laurie and Brad, warms the space and is a favourite feature of David's. "That was a beautiful architectural detail, executed perfectly by Brad, and was a big part of the project," Laurie says. "It makes the dining room feel more intimate and defined."



Egg Carton FLOWER PICTURE FRAME

These adorable flowers are so easy to make and no one will guess they're made from egg cartons! Use them to embellish a picture frame, mirror, memo board or anything else in your home that could use a makeover with some pretty flowers.

Tools & Materials

Scissors

Paintbrush

Hot-glue gun

Egg cartons (1 egg carton makes 3 flowers)

Acrylic craft paint in colour of choice

Acrylic craft paint in metallic gold

Picture frame

How-To

PREPARE EGG CARTON

Tear off the side and top of your egg carton, and using your scissors, cut out 12 individual cups.





Tear off the tall corners and around the top edge of each individual cup until the height is somewhat even all the way around. Don't worry about getting it perfectly straight the imperfection adds to the rustic beauty of these flowers.

Divide your cups into groups of four. Each flower uses four cups.

ASSEMBLE FLOWER

Take three of the cups and cut slits into each corner, down to the bottom where the cups are bent. Take the fourth cup and cut slits in each corner, a little further past the bend towards the centre.

Tear around the edges and remove sharp corners to create a more rounded shape for each petal. Curl each petal out with your fingers.



To make the outside portion of the flower, glue together the first three pieces, offsetting the petals of each layer.





For the middle of the flower, take the fourth piece, overlap each petal and glue together. Curl out the top edges.





Attach the middle piece to the outside pieces. Now you have a full flower.





Make a stamen for your flower by cutting out a small rectangle from the top of the egg carton. Cut two slits into the rectangle and curl it into itself. Place a dot of glue on the bottom and attach it inside the middle of your flower.

Repeat the above steps until you have enough flowers to cover your frame.

PAINT FLOWERS

Mix your paint with a couple drops of water. This makes it easier to apply.

Coat your flowers with paint, making sure to cover all the petals, front and back.

Once the paint dries, take a very small amount of gold paint and lightly brush the edges of all petals.

EMBELLISH FRAME

Paint your frame the same colour used for your flowers. You can brush a little bit of gold paint over the edges of the frame as well.



Using your glue gun, attach finished flowers around the edge of your frame.





Meow. Not that long ago, it was the norm to throw open the door and let your cats prowl the 'hood when they wanted out. More and more though, we've come to associate negatives with letting our kitties participate directly in the food chain. Not only are outdoor cats' lives drastically shorter thanks to dangers and predators, they also kill distressing amounts of wildlife, birds in particular. (For more details, see sidebar.)

In Ancaster, Jill Graham and husband Les Csepey reflect Canadians' changing outlook. Graham, an owner of three cats who grew up with outdoor felines and currently rescues cats says, "Absolutely, I would never let my cats outside. I don't believe in it."

According to Humane Canada's Cats in Canada 2017 Report, leagues of cat owners like Graham and her husband have produced a "particularly exciting statistic." Specifically. the 2017 public survey found 72 per cent of cat owners now prevent their cats from roaming free – an astounding 13 per cent leap from 2016 when only 59 per cent reported doing so.

BEHIND THE CATIO TREND

All great of course, but as any cat owner knows, simply herding cats indoors is a compromise. "These are such interesting little creatures," says Don Bacha, of Hellas Custom Catios in Edmonton, noting a cat's innate curiosity and activity level. So here's where catios come in. Don says outdoor pet enclosures can be a great solution, helping cat lovers embrace responsible pet ownership yet also give their felines back some of the outdoor experience - safely.

The concept isn't entirely new. "It's been big in Australia and Great Britain for 20, 25 years," says Don. Yet in North America, he says, we've only been hearing about catios for 10 years or so, with much more interest lately. In fact, Don and his wife and business partner Yvette recently scaled up their business due to demand. No longer only serving Alberta, they now ship their catio kits across Canada and the U.S.

A RANGE OF **CATIO OPTIONS**

Considering a catio? There are a range of options available today to fit varied budgets. At the low end, Don says, you could simply purchase a wire crate from a local pet store and place it outside so your cat can enjoy some fresh air and stimulation.

For DIYers, there are plenty of catio building plans and resources available online. (Local







SPCAs can help guide you.) Increasingly, there are also ready-made catio kits available from various suppliers, with Hellas being one of the notable Canadian-made options. Don says his company's solutions range "anywhere from \$1,500 to the sky's the limit" depending on size and customized options such as catwalks. His standard catio product measures four feet by four feet, and has a galvanized two by two-inch wire mesh, which Don says is both low maintenance and strong. "We're comfortable saying large dogs or even a small bear are not going to get in."

If your budget allows, Don recommends fitting your catio with an independent access (i.e. pet door) to let cats come and go from the house as they please. "If you have to take your cat out to [the catio], it's not as fun."

Finally, there are uber-highend solutions that are, let's face it, as nice for the humans as for the cats. In 2020, Jill and her husband completed a screenedin catio/addition on the back of their Lake Erie cottage. "We take our cats with us when we go down and wanted a safe spot for them to really enjoy the feel of the outdoors and being at the lake." Their simple catio project ultimately morphed into a \$20,000 project, complete with a screened-in porch, storm-proof slider windows, and two access doors into the cottage giving the cats a scrambling circuit. The space lets everyone enjoy the lake breezes and nature, but as Jill insists good-naturedly, "The initial intent was I wanted something for the cats."

BENEFITS

To be sure, safety and peace of mind are top benefits. Yet many catio owners also get a huge kick out of watching their animals safely playing or lazing in the sun.

Don says he's had many clients thrilled to see their indoor cats get a taste of outdoor fun. As a cat owner himself, Don says his cats' vear-round adventures in their (admittedly fancy) catio are hugely entertaining. "In the colder days they'll go out and check their little territory and run back in and lick their paws. In the summer they're like little children - they'll come in to eat and then run right back out!" он

FRFF-RANGE CATS: NOT-SO-FUN FACTS

- In Canada, cats are the number one killer of birds: They kill anywhere from 100 million to 350 million birds annually.
- Coyote attacks on outdoor cats are not uncommon. In California, one study found that 20 per cent of an urban coyote's diet consists of cat.
- Toxins like antifreeze and rat poison taste good to cats, meaning outdoor cats face more poisoning risks.
- Roaming cats are also frequently hit by cars. In Toronto, more than 1,300 dead cats were collected from city streets in 2017.
- The Ontario SPCA says the average life expectancy for a free-roaming cat is two to five years; for indoor cats, it's more than 12.


