





THE **ETHICS** OF SOURCING

Interior Designer Tamarisk McNalty Stephens shares her ideas.

The housing industry contributes significantly to the Canadian economy and plays an important role in our local – and global – communities. However, the procurement of products involved in the construction, design and decoration of our homes can also have a significant impact on the well-being of both people and the planet.

To meet a growing expectation from consumers, businesses are adopting an ethical sourcing approach to ensure products are obtained responsibly and sustainably. To be effective, it depends upon the integrity of the entire supply chain to include environmental standards as well as a commitment to safe working conditions, fair labour practices and living wages for the workers producing the goods.

In a global economy, with different environmental and social standards across countries, this can be a complex, layered issue – so how do we know where to begin?

Here are some simple ways we can all source more ethically:

Choose less. The most sustainable product is the one that is not produced.

Choose local. A local supply chain reduces shipping, emissions and energy usage.

Choose vintage, reclaimed, recycled or upcycled. Reuse or repurpose a material or product that is already in circulation.

When sourcing, do your own research and don't be afraid to ask the supplier questions on the procurement of goods. Businesses must take responsibility for the goods they provide. A transparent process builds trust with customers.


- Where was this product manufactured?
- Mow was this product manufactured? What resources and energy were required?
- What raw materials were used in the production? How sustainable are they?

- Does the production of this material cause environmental degradation to the local ecosystem?
- What is the company's policy surrounding ethical sourcing?
- Are the working conditions safe for those who produced the product? Are living wages and fair labour practices ensured?
- What will happen to this product at the end of its useful life? Does the company offer a recycling program? Will it eventually biodegrade? Or will it end up in a landfill?

Several certifications have been developed to help consumers identify responsibly sourced products. Although these certifications provide a good starting point, it's important for buyers to continue asking questions and performing independent research to understand the certification requirements. Consumers can also identify products that may not carry certification, but the producer/ supplier/business may still have high independent standards for their procurement of goods. Examples of certifications to look out for:

- Fairtrade sets standards for sustainable production and livelihoods for factory workers and farmers.
- FSC (Forest Stewardship Council) responsible forest-management standards.
- GoodWeave certifies child-labour-free rugs.
- GOTS (Global Organic Textile Standard) products meet strict organic criteria.
- Nest Ethical Handcraft Program monitors artisan supply chains for ethics and sustainability.
- © OEKO-TEX textile certifications concerning health, environment and fair manufacturing.
- RWS (Responsible Wool Standard) supports the well-being of sheep and the land they graze on.

A criticism of ethical sourcing is that it does not address the core issue of consumerism. If sustainability is a basic tenet of ethical sourcing, as privileged as we are in the Western world, we must acknowledge that our current rate of consumption is simply not sustainable. We can begin to evaluate basic needs, research the environmental impact of purchases (big and small), prioritize the well-being of people and the planet, support local supply chains and become more intentional and mindful consumers. Aligning our habits of consumption with our values will help contribute to the world we wish to see today – and for future generations. OH

TO-GO APEROL SPRITZ

1L sealable container

DIRECTIONS

The recipe for this cocktail is very simple - just follow this ratio: 1 part Aperol and 1 part soda to 2 parts

Simply mix together all ingredients in a resealable container.

Serve over ice with a slice of orange.

MASON JAR TIRAMISU

This recipe is the perfect to-go dessert this summer – easy to transport and eat outdoors. It also stays true to the original by utilizing egg yolk to give it a custard-like feel.

INGREDIENTS (Serves 6)

4 egg yolks

½ cup granulated sugar, separated

34 cup heavy cream 1 cup mascarpone cheese

1 cup espresso, cold

1/4 cup liquor of choice*

12-18 lady fingers**

Cocoa powder, for dusting 6 500 ml mason jars

DIRECTIONS

Over a double boiler, whisk together egg yolks and ¼ cup of sugar. Continually whisk for about 10 minutes until the sugar is dissolved and yolks double in size and turn pale yellow. Set aside to cool.

In a separate bowl, whip cream and the remaining sugar until stiff peaks form.

Once cooled, fold the mascarpone cheese into the egg yolk mixture until combined.

Next, gently fold yolk mixture in the whipping cream until combined.

In a shallow bowl, combine espresso and liquor.

TO ASSEMBLE

Break lady fingers into pieces to fit the circumference of the mason jars. This will be a bit messy and won't be perfect. Quickly dip the lady finger pieces into the



espresso and place into the mason jar in an even layer.

Top with about two tablespoons of the cream mixture and repeat

Sprinkle cocoa powder on top to finish.


Place the lid on each jar and store in the fridge for up to one week. They taste better after a few days!





The 3,800 sq. ft. bungalow sits on a two-acre parcel of land. "We love the area," says Natasha. "Farms and country homes surround us, yet the town of Hannon is quaint, and only minutes from Hamilton amenities." While the house, designed and built by **Mariman Homes**, was still in the framing stage, Natasha and Jamie could envision how they would make it their own. "**Shawn Stringer**, the foreman for our build, was awesome to work with," Natasha says. "He understood our wants and needs, and despite COVID delays, kept the project moving smoothly."

The original design included a primary bedroom, two guest rooms and an in-law suite. Natasha's experience in the industry has advanced her eye for design. She had fun designing and decorating the new house, with the staging help of Andrea Kluczenko of Gracewood Homes. Every room is flooded with natural light thanks to extra-large windows (by **Pollard Windows & Doors**) and vaulted ceilings. European white oak engineered hardwood flooring, in nine-and-a-half-inch wide planks, runs the entire house. The light stain and natural character of the oak will do a wonderful job of hiding wear and tear over time. The gas fireplace in the living room, from **Broom's**, is tiled with a natural slate herringbone mosaic, repeating the colour of the kitchen island and marrying the open spaces.

"We love the open-concept kitchen, dining and living space," says Natasha. The couple extended the kitchen to incorporate an expansive island. "This is where everyone will gather for holidays and special occasions," she explains. They wanted space for an eat-in kitchen island while still having room for a sizeable table. Built-in appliances that disappear into the cabinetry and an altered layout draw the eye to Natasha's pride and joy, the custom La Cornue stove from France. Wingers Cabinets designed and installed the stunning kitchen cabinetry and millwork, as well as the built-ins in the living room, bathrooms and laundry room. "The cabinetry is another of our favourite features," says Natasha. 



smooth RENOVATION

A smooth renovation requires partnership, a melding of minds. Beyond sheer manpower and expertise, a homeowner needs to know that a contractor or builder shares their vision. It might surprise you to learn a contractor needs the same from a homeowner. The result of this perfect pairing is often visible: a well-built home that meets or exceeds the expectations of both sides - the builder and the homeowner.

How does this kind of magic happen? Here are the top five things a contractor and homeowner need from each other to make a renovation run smoothly.



BIG-PICTURE SCOPE

While details such as lighting, flooring and cabinetry are always discussed, both parties need more. "It's imperative we draw out the homeowners' core needs," says Brent Pym, president of Pym & Cooper Custom Homes in Niagara. 


historical BEAUTY

oday, vestiges of the village remain, from the Kilbride Country Store to the old United Church. Residents Jen and Sam DeAth fell in love with a vacant Victorian farmhouse built in 1823 and decided to renovate it and make it their own. "I just love the giant willow trees, beautiful tree-lined driveway and old red-brick Victorian farmhouse. Kilbride is a quaint community in north Burlington, small enough to know most people, and we didn't want to move from the area," says Jen.

The home is nestled within 50 acres of land and was rebuilt after a house fire in 1870. The original farmhouse was preserved when a 4,000 sq. ft. addition was added in the 1980s. Classic historical details reflect the

era's architecture, from the peaked roofline and arched windows to the decorative gingerbread trim.

Jen's aunt and designer Anne Vernon of Rooms & Blooms was involved from the start of the renovation. "She was the key person for our design," says Jen. The redesign began with the lower level's awkward layout and dated finishes.

Anne drew up preliminary designs and Slotegraaf Construction carried out the renovation. "Slotegraaf came highly recommended to us from friends, and they were beyond my expectations," says Jen. "They were really awesome to work with. They have their own design team, but they were happy to work with me," says Anne. "It worked out really well." Continued on page 66

THE ORGANIZATION

Food4Kids Ontario is a non-profit grassroots organization working to serve children in Hamilton, Halton, Mississauga, Guelph and Niagara. Founded by Executive Director Lena Bassford in 2012, Food4Kids provides packages of healthy food for children with limited or no access to food on weekends or during summer months.

THE GOAL

Food4Kids currently feeds 3,050 children each week, but there are 6,000 children in need. "It's hard to believe kids in our own community go hungry, but it is a reality," says Lena. "It's not that







parents do not want to feed their kids, they can't. Whether it is the worsening economy, job loss, physical or mental illness or they are refugees fleeing their home country for a better life in Canada, there are many reasons parents find themselves turning to Food4Kids for support."

THE PEOPLE

Volunteers ensure Food4Kid's success. They assemble food packages, which they deliver to schools each Friday. At each school, the package is quietly tucked into the child's own backpack to ensure a non-stigmatizing approach. In the summer months and during COVID restrictions, the food or grocery cards are hand-delivered right to the children's homes.

WHAT'S NEEDED

It costs \$15 a week to provide a balanced food supply for each child participating in the program. Donations from the community as well as volunteer participation are sorely needed. "While children have many things to be concerned about,



they should not have to worry about where their next meal will come from," says Lena. "No child in our community should go hungry." он

Nothing says summer like a backyard oasis, which is exactly what Patricia and Doug Phillips envisioned when they came across this Dundas gem. "WE BOUGHT THE HOUSE BECAUSE WE LOVED THE BACKYARD," says

Doug. The massive property backs onto mature conservation land, giving the homeowners a taste of wilderness at home. "It's like living in the country, in the city," says Patricia, smiling. also loves the outdoor fireplace and television, expanding the use of their outdoor space, even on chilly evenings. **Paradise Decks & Landscape Design** built the cantilevered two-tiered wood composite deck meant to last many years with little maintenance.

"Right now," says Patricia, "as we struggle with COVID, the backyard has been a summer escape. There are lots of outdoor spaces to get out of the house and spread out, surrounded by nature." Continued on page 88

Shades of Summer Landscaping has won several awards for this coveted sanctuary, including provincial awards for the landscape design, lighting, construction, maintenance and spectacular water feature. "The waterfall runs day and night," says Brad, "making calming trickling sounds." Both Brad and the homeowners love the Japanese maples dotted throughout the cascading stone tiers leading to the deck overlooking the ravine. The local deer are also fans. "We had to be super-careful choosing plant life that respected the natural order of the land without feeding the deer an expensive buffet," says Brad. The family





While the backyard was the lure that caught the Phillips' attention, they could envision the house with their added touch. "The house was only 10 years old when we purchased the property in 2013," says Doug. Other than replacing the front entrance door with a new system by **Ridley Windows and Doors**, the exterior was left untouched. The interior, however, was revamped. "We liked that the house was open and spacious," adds Patricia, "but we needed to make it our own, to match our lifestyle and tastes." The couple didn't hesitate to call Barnard & Speziale | The Interior Design Company, who they'd worked with on a previous house and cottage, and who they knew would understand their vision. 












Add a beachy vibe to your space with this fun and easy-tomake driftwood wreath, Plus. there's the added benefit of long walks along the water to collect driftwood!

TOOLS

Pencil Jigsaw or scroll saw

7-inch diameter bowl

Paintbrush

Glue gun

Screwdriver

Wire cutters

MATERIALS

1/4 to 5/8 inch-thick plywood (large enough to cut a circle 14 inches in diameter)

Roll of kraft paper

Lots of driftwood pieces, 9 inches in length or a little shorter

Sandpaper

Hot glue sticks

Acrylic paint in three colours (we've used navy, light blue and white)

Picture-hanging hardware (screws, D-ring hangers and wire)

HOW-TO

To create the plywood backing for your wreath, draw a 14 inch-diameter circle with a 10 inchdiameter circle inside. Don't worry if it's not perfect; it will be hidden behind the driftwood Cut your circles with either a jigsaw or scroll saw to create a wooden ring.

Place your ring on a large piece of kraft paper. Using something round, with a diameter of about 7 inches, trace a circle with a pencil inside your wood ring. This will be your guide as you begin gluing the driftwood pieces onto the ring. You can temporarily glue your backing to the paper to prevent sliding. Peel paper from wood when complete.





Paint approximately 10-12 pieces of driftwood in each of the three colours you've chosen and leave the rest of the pieces natural. Let dry before gluing onto backing.

Begin gluing the driftwood pieces onto the wood ring, using the longest pieces first. Do not go too far past your pencil guideline on the inside of the ring. Leave some space between each piece to get a nice starburst shape.



Once you have the first layer glued around the entire ring, begin filling the spaces with slightly shorter pieces. Continue lavering driftwood pieces until the backing is completely hidden.

Use shorter pieces and layer with the smallest pieces on the top layer.

Decide which way to hang the wreath and attach hardware and wire to the backing.

Now you're ready to hang and enjoy your work of art! on





WHILE TRAVELLING THE TREE-LINED BOULEVARDS OF LORNE PARK, IT'S EASY TO SEE WHY THE AREA WAS ONCE CONSIDERED COTTAGE COUNTRY.

IN FACT, a seasonal resort named after the Marquis de Lorne, Governor General of Canada from 1878 to 1883, was first established in the 1800s along the south side of Lakeshore Road. It was accessible by rail, steamboat or carriage and families flocked to the area in the summer. Back then, lots were sold to those willing to build a "neat and respectable" home or cottage costing not less than \$400.

Today, Lorne Park still radiates with the charm of narrow, tree-lined avenues and large lots, and is home to a variety of beautiful properties. Algonquin Drive is a meandering cul-de-sac with stately dwellings, including the home of Andy and Lucie. Situated on a 1.85-acre ravine lot, the 7,200 sq. ft. estate features anything a homeowner could want or need. Nestled among the trees, the classic stone exterior and gabled roofline blends effortlessly into the landscape but still invites glances of passersby. When Andy and Lucie first bought the home, they were attracted to the sprawling ravine lot and the home's unassuming nature, despite its size.
