





THE **ETHICS** OF SOURCING

Interior Designer Tamarisk McNalty Stephens shares her ideas.

The housing industry contributes significantly to the Canadian economy and plays an important role in our local – and global – communities. However, the procurement of products involved in the construction, design and decoration of our homes can also have a significant impact on the well-being of both people and the planet.

To meet a growing expectation from consumers, businesses are adopting an ethical sourcing approach to ensure products are obtained responsibly and sustainably. To be effective, it depends upon the integrity of the entire supply chain to include environmental standards as well as a commitment to safe working conditions, fair labour practices and living wages for the workers producing

In a global economy, with different environmental and social standards across countries, this can be a complex, layered issue - so how do we know where to begin?

Here are some simple ways we can all source more ethically:

Choose less. The most sustainable product is the one that is not produced.

Choose local. A local supply chain reduces shipping, emissions and energy usage.

Choose vintage, reclaimed, recycled or **upcycled.** Reuse or repurpose a material or product that is already in circulation.

When sourcing, do your own research and don't be afraid to ask the supplier questions on the procurement of goods. Businesses must take responsibility for the goods they provide. A transparent process builds trust with customers.

- Where was this product manufactured?
- Mow was this product manufactured? What resources and energy were required?
- What raw materials were used in the production? How sustainable are they?

- Does the production of this material cause environmental degradation to the local
- what is the company's policy surrounding ethical sourcing?
- Are the working conditions safe for those who produced the product? Are living wages and fair labour practices ensured?
- What will happen to this product at the end of its useful life? Does the company offer a recycling program? Will it eventually biodegrade? Or will it end up in a landfill?

Several certifications have been developed to help consumers identify responsibly sourced products. Although these certifications provide a good starting point, it's important for buyers to continue asking questions and performing independent research to understand the certification requirements. Consumers can also identify products that may not carry certification, but the producer/ supplier/business may still have high independent standards for their procurement of goods. Examples of certifications to look out for:

- Fairtrade sets standards for sustainable production and livelihoods for factory workers and farmers.
- FSC (Forest Stewardship Council) responsible forest-management standards.
- GoodWeave certifies child-labour-free rugs.
- GOTS (Global Organic Textile Standard) products meet strict organic criteria.
- Nest Ethical Handcraft Program monitors artisan supply chains for ethics and sustainability.
- OEKO-TEX textile certifications concerning health, environment and fair manufacturing.
- RWS (Responsible Wool Standard) supports the well-being of sheep and the land they graze on.

A criticism of ethical sourcing is that it does not address the core issue of consumerism. If sustainability is a basic tenet of ethical sourcing, as privileged as we are in the Western world, we must acknowledge that our current rate of consumption is simply not sustainable. We can begin to evaluate basic needs, research the environmental impact of purchases (big and small), prioritize the well-being of people and the planet, support local supply chains and become more intentional and mindful consumers. Aligning our habits of consumption with our values will help contribute to the world we wish to see today – and for future generations. OH



From a design perspective, "imperfectly perfect" interiors have been gaining popularity as the world becomes more accepting of imperfection and increasingly seeks out the beauty in it. Gone are the unattainable, stress-inducing standards of perfection. This interior trend is all about living our best life in comfort and style. Here's how to get this look.

MIX OLD AND NEW

Vintage pieces are key to this aesthetic. If it's distressed, aged and faded, all the better. Remember, they're not just scratches, they're stories. 

Textiles can completely change a room, adding warmth and dimension to what would otherwise be a cold and sterile space. Along with this particular aesthetic, pillows and throws were never intended to be neatly lined up and folded into a perfect little square. Just toss, drape and pile them where needed.

Your fabric choices create a mood and set a tone. Layer bold animal and cultural prints with more subtle patterns and solids for instant impact without having to make a huge investment or commitment. You can lighten up your fabrics during the warmer months with linens and cottons and go warmer and heavier during the winter with wool, faux fur and chunky knits.

Consider adding reclaimed antique rugs, window coverings, wall coverings, upholstery and accessories such as cushions and throws. Again, look for variety in colour, vibrancy, pattern and texture.

TELL YOUR STORY

Incorporate sentimental items and found objects that speak to your personal interests and experiences. Find a place to display that retro typewriter or your vintage camera collection. Put yourself out there through things that bring you joy and help tell your story.

Bring added interest to your collections by peppering your display with plants, books and artwork to create mini focal points through the space.

Think in odd numbers when displaying your collections and curios on tabletops, shelves or the fireplace mantel. Arrange your accessories in groups of threes or fives, with the largest item in the middle. This draws attention to the centre of your display and creates balance.



The final piece of decorating advice could easily apply to life as well. Rather than trying to fight the randomness that sometimes surrounds us, embrace it. Do things just because and you might be surprised by the outcome. **OH**



Award-winning designer and builder Gordon Weima and his wife Debbie moved into their new home in September 2018, when pockets of Ottawa were dark because multiple tornadoes touched down throughout the region. They had no power and no furniture their first night, so they stretched out on a mattress in front of the fire. While the scene sounds spartan, it was perfect, as this was a moment they had waited decades for. That night, Debbie turned to Gordon and said, "I'm finally home." Continued on page 35



Thirty-six years ago, Gordon, Debbie and their six children happily occupied a small bungalow in Nepean's Heart's Desire. As the years passed, they outgrew the space and moved to another home – keeping their bungalow, in the connected community they loved, as a rental property. Decades later, the time was right to come back, raze the original home and build new from a design that had been collecting in Gordon's mind for a generation.

This sleek and airy home is award-winning, with Gordon grabbing multiple Greater Ottawa Home Builders Association (GOHBA) awards in 2020, including Best Home Office, Best Custom Home 3000 sq. ft. or Less and Custom Home Builder of the Year.

Is it different when a designer plans their own home versus designing homes for clients? Not really, says Gordon, because his fundamental approach begins with a deep understanding of the intentions on how to use the space day-to-day.

"I always put myself in my clients' shoes, and base my design on what I know about them," says Gordon. "I always ask myself, 'If this was my house, would I do this?'"


"We knew we wanted a kitchen and front room facing the river," says Gordon, referring to the open-concept main floor. "We wanted to create flow from room to room."

That flow is predicated by an abundance of natural light spilling through large and plentiful windows (**Pella Windows**). "I am huge on natural light," he says. "Natural light is key in any house." He paid special attention to window placement, connecting indoor and outdoor living spaces. Both the front balcony off the kitchen and rear patio off the dining room benefit from clear and wide sightlines, where floor-to-ceiling windows frame exterior views and create the appearance of uninterrupted space.

After living in their original bungalow on this site for 10 years, the Weimas knew exactly where the light would fall during different seasons and different times of day. They incorporated that knowledge to maximize light and assist with heating and cooling during winter and summer.

The design centrepiece is the staircase (Accurate Stairs & Railings), placed in the middle of the main floor. With open-tread risers, steel stringer railings and intricate details in the corners and connections, the staircase promotes airflow and movement of light, all while creating a "wow" factor.

Open-concept living spaces can be cavernous, but Gordon cleverly delineates the areas in a simple but ingenious way, drawing the eye upwards. Over the staircase, he creates a subtle focal point, accomplished by applying an extra layer of drywall. Coffered ceilings, trimmed with lights and a bold light fixture grab the gaze in just the right spot.

"It visually breaks up the open concept," says Gordon.

That ceiling detail was used in other areas of the house, like the kitchen, dining room and primary bedroom. This is reflective of the cohesiveness of the design, where every element overtly plays a role in creating dramatic impact and the comfort that comes with home.








In the kitchen, stone (Merkley **Supply Ltd.**, installed by **Dawson &** Jacklin Masonry) runs up the wall to balance the weight of the stately stone fireplace (High Energy Gas & Wood) in the opposite space. Stone also lines the wall in the bright walkout lower level. In the mudroom on the lower level, Gordon used the same rich hardwood (Gaylord Hardwood Flooring) as the main floor, installed shiplap-style behind a custom bench.

With a big extended family that includes 11 grandchildren, the kitchen had to be spacious enough to accommodate lots of people and multiple cooks. An oversize island (Gerry's Custom Built Kitchens & Vanities, countertop from Ottawa **Granite Pro Inc.**) stretches out with plenty of room for two workstations. There are three ovens and a large pantry with rollout drawers.



Just off the kitchen is a laundry room, which functions beyond wash and fold. It's also home to the Weimas' second dishwasher, second fridge and a smart gadget that just makes life easier – a HandyWaiter (WB Fowler Industries). It runs down to the lower-level garage and delivers groceries to the kitchen and pantry for unpacking.

The home office provides a cosy and creative space for Gordon to drive his designs, but is practical as well. It is plumbed and can be easily converted to a second mainfloor bedroom with bath to permit aging in place down the road.

What this home demonstrates is that, although the concept of home is intangible, it can be broken down and built through physical design, especially when you have decades to distill your ideas.

"This home is really just an extension of where we lived 35 years ago," says Gordon. OH





Many apartment buildings still employ older design practices that have major weaknesses that allow air to be shared from unit to unit. Typically, the air would be pumped into common areas such as hallways and then transfer into the individual apartments. This poses a potential problem as you are exchanging pet dander, food odours, bacteria, and other particulates which seep through filters and may be inhaled. One might think to solve this by cracking open a window, but this is not always convenient, especially when the weather is inhospitable, be it during our harsh winters or hot, humid summers. Not only that, but by opening a window, you may now invite noise pollution from outside, as well as vehicular exhaust, dust, pollen, and mould. Adding to this dilemma is the global virus outbreak. Now more than ever, we do not want to be sharing our "bubble" with others, as we try to reduce infection rates in time for a vaccine to be dispersed.

Thankfully, there is a practical solution to poor indoor air quality: Compartmentalization.

When looking for a rental with high-quality air, you want to ask your agent or prospective landlord about Apartment Compartmentalization. Higher quality apartment buildings will be designed in a series of self-contained compartments. These compartments each make up an individual unit, separated from common areas, other apartments, and the garage itself. You want to find a builder who designs every single unit to be supplied with its own fresh-air intake, with ventilation taking the exhaust directly outside. This will prevent air transfer from one apartment to the next.



One final element you might want to explore when shopping for a new residence is the engineering behind the windows and their installation. High quality windows will prevent exterior air flow from getting in, insulate internal temperatures, and minimize convection, all while providing natural outdoor light and contributing to an aesthetically pleasing home.

When looking at a residence's windows, you want something with a low emissivity rating. This will keep the outdoors outside and allow for better temperature control. In an ideal unit the windows would be double-glazed with sealed argon gas to keep the cold from seeping in. Beyond the glass itself, be sure to ask about how the window is seated into the frame and wall. Professional builders will employ extruded window frames with a compartmentalized design that buffers against exterior air transmission and moisture. In Canada's unruly climate, you want your windows perfectly airtight through a combination of caulking, insulation and framing.

Your apartment is your sanctuary from the outside world. You want it to provide you with a clean and healthy space for you and your loved ones. Cosmetic finishes are the first thing we notice when shopping but should not be the last. Air may be invisible, but the implications it brings are glaringly salient. When shopping, it is well worth your time to investigate the engineering and thought processes behind your new apartment and what lies hidden beneath the surface.

WHAT YOU WILL NEED

Meats and cheeses - choose 2-3 of your favourites

Dried fruits - apricots, figs or dates

Condiments – olives, jams, grainy mustard and nuts

Crackers and bread

A portable to-go box - you can use a baking dish as well

TIPS AND TRICKS

Try layering a variety of textures and colours. You don't want similar items next to each other.

Start with the bowls you will use. These will act as a placeholder for the rest.

Next, layer in your larger items (the cheeses and then the larger fruits).

Crackers come next, then fill in the spaces with things like dried fruits and nuts.

Rule of thumb: Start with the larger items and work your way into filling the gaps. Finish by filling your condiment bowls.



TO-GO APEROL SPRITZ

This classic summer cocktail is perfect to enjoy outdoors. It's easy to make ahead and ideal for sharing.





INGREDIENTS

Aperol

Dry sparkling wine Soda

Oranges, to garnish 1L sealable container

DIRECTIONS

The recipe for this cocktail is very simple – just follow this ratio: 1 part Aperol and 1 part soda to 2 parts sparkling wine.

Simply mix together all ingredients in a

resealable container. Serve over ice with a slice of orange.



DIRECTIONS

Over a double boiler, whisk together egg yolks and 1/4 cup of sugar. Continually whisk for about 10 minutes until the sugar is dissolved and yolks double in size and turn pale yellow. Set aside to cool.

In a separate bowl, whip cream and the remaining sugar until stiff peaks form.

Once cooled, fold the mascarpone cheese into the egg yolk mixture until combined.

Next, gently fold yolk mixture in the whipping cream until combined.

In a shallow bowl, combine espresso and liquor.

TO ASSEMBLE

Break lady fingers into pieces to fit the circumference of the mason jars. This will be a bit messy and won't be perfect. Quickly dip the lady finger pieces into the espresso and place into the mason jar in an even layer.

Top with about two tablespoons of the cream mixture and repeat the layers.

Sprinkle cocoa powder on top to finish.

Place the lid on each jar and store in the fridge for up to one week. They taste better after a few days!

RECIPE NOTES

*Traditionally, tiramisu is made with Marsala wine but you can also use rum, brandy or coffee-flavored liquor.

**Depends on the size of your mason jars.

Traditionally, tiramisu is made with raw egg yolk but this recipe tempers the yolks to ensure safe consumption and shelf life. OH


Designed by Jason Flynn of Flynn Architect, the home is inspired by the iconic style of Frank Lloyd Wright, updated to meet the needs of the modern family. Clean lines and neutral stonework from Merkley Supply Ltd. allow the home to blend naturally into the streetscape of the established neighbourhood without sacrificing architectural interest. To keep it from overpowering the surrounding homes, its size and placement respect the contours of the lot. "It sits well within the minimum setbacks," notes Claudio.

The generous, two-storey foyer is flooded with natural light that streams through the many large windows from Dalmen Pro Windows. Conveniently tucked off the main entrance is a home office, complete with beautiful and functional double doors from De La Fontaine Doors to muffle the sounds of family life happening in the rest of the house. Floor-to-ceiling windows provide a clear view of the front yard from the office space, perfect for keeping an eye on the kids while working from home (landscaping by ALM Construction & Landscaping).

The remainder of the main floor is dedicated to an expansive open-concept kitchen and living space. The kitchen has an immediate wow factor, equipped with all the bells and whistles, including top-of-the-line Fisher & Paykel appliances from Universal Appliances, modern European-designed cabinetry from Irpinia Kitchens, and the enduring beauty of quartz countertops.

Back in the foyer, the striking staircase seems to float towards the second level, its open risers and clear glass railing allowing for unobstructed sightlines throughout the main level.



Just outside of the bustling city centre of Ottawa lies the quiet, rural community of Diamondview Estates. This quaint Carp neighbourhood is comprised of new two-storey and bungalow homes by **Phoenix Homes**.

Rahul Kochar is the Vice President of Operations for Phoenix Homes. He says they put their own spin on designing a modern bungalow that families can transition through.



"You're seeing bungalows with secondary and tertiary bedrooms as being a reasonable size for full-time occupants," he says.

It's easy to see why this model has been among the builder's most acknowledged designs. No small detail has gone unnoticed in the bungalow, which features an expansive entryway, three spacious bedrooms and a swoon-worthy en suite bathroom.

The back half of the house opens up to

what Phoenix Homes calls the great room, which is comprised of an open-concept kitchen (**Spectrum Kitchen & Bath Design**), living room and dining space. Impressive 12 ft. ceilings open up the space and give it a sense of grandeur.

With a choice between four striking exterior options, Springfield homebuyers have flexibility and variety in both the outside and inside of their bungalow with an assortment of custom finishes and upgrades.

One of Rahul's favourite features is the striking row of windows that runs along the entire back portion of the house, bathing the main living space in an abundance of natural daylight.

"You get a design impact item there," he says. "For a targeted demographic this home really ticks all the boxes."

So far, the Springfield model has been a popular choice in both the Diamondview Estates and White Tail Ridge (Almonte) communities. In the Diamondview Estates neighbourhood, five Springfield models were sold during Phase Two, with Phase Three properties set to be released shortly.

Since the model was released in March 2019, Rahul says its popularity has only increased. He attributes this to people being able to walk through and feel the attributes that could potentially make up their future home. Continued on page 78



"It's not unusual for builders to see the sale of a particular model ramp up considerably after they've built a physical model of that house," he says. "There's a very strong correlation to people being able to physically walk through a model and that model's success."

Springfield didn't just catch the attention of homebuyers; it has also been widely recognized by the Ottawa design community, with Phoenix taking home a number of awards at the 2020 GOHBA Awards. They received two for the Springfield bungalow, including Production Home: Single Detached Under \$600,000 and Best Single-Family Home Under 2,000 sq. ft.

The awards, presented early this year, came at a time when the construction industry was facing, and continues to face, unprecedented challenges due to the global COVID-19 pandemic. Like many companies,

Phoenix Homes had to comply with imposed regulations, which have included halts in construction, impacts to human resources and shortages of crucial building supplies.

Despite the setbacks, Rahul says the company took the opportunity to strengthen their online resources by going paperless. In doing so they were able to cut down their environmental impact, reduce office costs and improve efficiency for new buyers all while minimizing human contact.

"You're sort of now buying a home online. You're not necessarily putting it in a virtual shopping cart and hitting checkout, but essentially your entire process can be handled without actually having to go to a sales centre," Rahul says. "You need to take the best of a bad situation and figure out how you can pull some positives out of it for your process and the health of the company." Continued on page 80





Hammer

Pry bar

Jigsaw

Nails or deck screws

Exterior paint

Metal swivelling caster wheels

Painter's tape

Exterior paint

2 wood pallets of the same size

 $4-1 \times 6$ " spruce boards in 4-foot lengths

Paintable exterior caulking

Clear polyurethane

HOW-TO

Carefully disassemble one of the pallets using a pry bar and hammer.

Using the hammer and claw, carefully remove all nails from the boards.

To create your tabletop, use the decking boards from the first pallet to fill the open spaces on the top of the second pallet. You may need to trim some of the boards with a jigsaw to fit. Hammer or screw all boards into place.

Flip the pallet and nail or screw stringers from the first pallet around the perimeter of the base. This will add height to the table and create a stronger base for installing the caster wheels.

Attach the new spruce boards to the sides of the table, creating a skirt. You may need to trim the boards to fit. Remember to keep the top edge of the boards even with the top of the table.

Attach the casters to each corner of the table's underside.

Use caulking to fill nail holes or cracks on


Paint the entire table with an exterior paint.

Choose a design or pattern of your choice for the top. We used a fivepointed star from a quilting pattern and marked the design using painter's tape.

Apply two coats of paint to your pattern, allowing time to dry between coats.

Finally, seal the table with two coats of clear polyurethane, allowing time to dry between each coat. on



THE BIRDS OF SUMMER feathering your nest

WITH THE ONSET OF LENGTHENING DAYS AND WARMER TEMPERATURES, many

OUR HOMES readers will be familiar with the urge to change up winter clothes and comforters and feather their nest with fresh décor for the fine weather ahead. It's something we have in common with the avian migrants that have just returned to our backyards, fields, forests and lakes – the birds have transformed their drab winter wear into fresh and colourful spring wardrobes. Once winter settles into spring, thoughts turn to summer construction season, for humans and birds alike.

MASTER BUILDERS

From hummingbirds, the original "tiny house" builders, to osprey and eagles with their palatial lakeside and rural homes, birds are master architects and master builders. Much of this construction gets underway right in your own backyard. If you want to expand your knowledge of bird biology you can be the local bird building inspector! A typical property with established trees, shrubs and gardens could easily be home to up to 10 different species of birds, all working on their nest projects. It can be a fascinating deck-chair study to see just how many species are exercising squatter's rights on your property for the season.

MASTER ARCHITECTS

Each bird builds its nest with an architectural

style unique to their particular species. Each style perfectly suits the species' needs. Exuberant house wrens are easily attracted to bird boxes and will stuff it high with fine twigs. Occasionally a sweet little chickadee will use the birdhouse and fill it with only the softest quality materials. In more rural settings the bluebird of happiness will gladly occupy a bird box, as will the tree swallow, which will swoop by with incomparable grace. Chirping sparrows, with their jaunty red caps and sporty white eyeliner, and serenading song sparrows will seek shelter in lower, thicker shrubberies, lining their tightly spun fine grass cups with cosy hair or fur linings. Mourning doves are not famous for their nest-building abilities – a few twigs laid on a supporting spruce branch will do. The ubiquitous robin will build its sturdy, mud-lined grass nest on almost any tree branch or ledge. Eastern phoebes will construct their lovely, moss-covered nests under an eave, often on a light fixture – if a robin doesn't get there first. Cardinals and blue jays will hide their rather large but loose twig nests deep in your cedar hedge. Brilliant Baltimore orioles, master architects, will hang their intricately woven deep pouch nests from the outer branches of tall backyard trees. Meanwhile, goldfinches will wait until later in the summer when thistledown is available to line their lovely nest beds. Depending on your location, numerous other species may be busy at work in quiet corners of your yard as well.

AN ABUNDANCE OF BIRDS

Discovering this hidden activity can open your eyes to the secret life of birds. Birds are the most apparent form of wildlife you will encounter. Just think, you might see a few mammals in your yard once in a while, but it's possible to see dozens upon dozens of different bird species migrating through or stopping to nest from time to time. To give you an idea of the possibilities: I've documented 292 different species in, flying over, or seen from my yard alone! Obviously, there's a lot of time involved staring out the windows, but it's time well spent, considering the interest and entertainment songbirds bring.

DO NOT DISTURB

While observing nests and watching hatchlings grow on their bellies full of bugs (gleaned from your yard as a free pesticide service) can be exciting, always be mindful of the Code of Birding Ethics – the welfare of the birds and their habitats come first! Do Not Disturb! Resist the urge to get up close and personal. If adult birds become agitated, back off. Some birds such as red-winged blackbirds and the elegant barn swallow are not afraid to take you on with all of their 50 grams of heft behind them.

Finally, while you're enjoying your new-found feathered friends, perhaps think a bit about how you can give back to them. Incorporate native trees, shrubs and flowers in your landscaping plans. Native species provide a much greater abundance of higher-quality natural food sources birds require. Hang a hummingbird feeder, put out oranges for orioles, nuts for the nuthatches and sunflower seeds for almost all others. And sit back and enjoy! OH

The blend of dried oregano, thyme, marjoram, sumac and toasted sesame seeds will elevate your dishes in a fragrant way. Have you tried garam masala? Kaffir leaves? Turmeric has been trending for a while, but don't worry if you're late to the game. Aji amarillo, a chile pepper popular in Peruvian cuisine, has been keeping pace with black lime (dried key lime) as 2021's kitchen gamechanger. Don't forget about the world of hot sauces.

smooth RENOVATION

A smooth renovation requires partnership, a melding of minds. Beyond sheer manpower and expertise, a homeowner needs to know that a contractor or builder shares their vision. It might surprise you to learn a contractor needs the same from a homeowner. The result of this perfect pairing is often visible: a well-built home that meets or exceeds the expectations of both sides - the builder and the homeowner.

How does this kind of magic happen? Here are the top five things a contractor and homeowner need from each other to make a renovation run smoothly.



BIG-PICTURE SCOPE

While details such as lighting, flooring and cabinetry are always discussed, both parties need more. "It's imperative we draw out the homeowners' core needs," says Brent Pym, president of Pym & Cooper Custom Homes in Niagara. "Details like why the homeowners want to renovate, and why renovate versus move or build. Most homeowners are surprised to discover their needs aren't what they originally thought." Answers define the project scope - noted in writing, discussed and agreed upon before the work begins. "By creating and following a concrete plan," says homeowner Margaret Graves, "we met with vendors to choose fixtures, appliances, paint colours, etc., in an order that retained our vision while helping our contractor, Pym & Cooper Custom Homes, keep a steady schedule and finish on time."

BUDGET

By wading into financials, builders can help homeowners refine their wish list. "Budget is not a bad word," says Louie Zagordo, owner of SLV Homes and VP of the Ontario Home Builders Association. "Pricing and costs should be clear, documented and

discussed at length. It's the only way to ensure the homeowners' wants and needs are financially viable." A payment structure with clear instructions ensures contractors and their trades are paid at specific stages while homeowners understand what they're paying for. "Most projects don't go over budget," adds Louie. "The ones that do are usually homeowner-driven – add-ons or a change in the plan."

CLEAR EXPECTATIONS

When both parties discuss and document expectations, disappointment is rare. For example, when a builder creates a schedule and sticks to it, the homeowner understands how long each stage takes and respects those requirements. Renovations are messy, loud, inconvenient and sometimes dangerous for young children. When homeowners relocate and store personal items, contractors can work unencumbered. When moving out isn't possible, a contractor can make a plan to minimize any negative impact on the homeowners' lives. Communication is key to setting clear expectations. When both sides provide contact names and numbers and respond promptly, questions don't cause confusion or delays.

QUALITY WORKMANSHIP

When we think of quality workmanship, building materials come to mind, or the expertise of the principal contractor or project manager responsible for the renovation. While these elements play a part, quality workmanship must extend to the builder's staff, designers, vendors and experienced trades. "When a contractor and their trades present themselves in a professional manner, you can rest assured your home is in good hands," adds Ben Helder. Ben and his partner Rachel spent most of 2020 living in a rental while their home was under renovation.

TRUST

Trust flows both ways. Both sides must be professional and honest at all times. A contractor must trust the homeowner will respect an experienced perspective. "Trusting your contractor is paramount," says Ben Helder. "Rely on the professionals you hire, on their judgment, on their creativity. A contractor must respect your wishes, but you must respect theirs as well since they are the experts." When both parties understand what the other needs, the renovation experience is not only smooth but spectacular. OH


