




"They were perfect clients" jokes **Ornella Bertoni**. "They were clean-slate clients."

clever solution. It gives the room warmth, texture and an organic design element that is a great backdrop for the walnut, mid-century designed credenza (Bertoni Chairs & Things) and flat-screen television.

"To make a room work properly you have to have flow," says Rebecca. "I find it comes down to practicality. I always start with the big pieces like sofas, dining tables and stools at the island. In this home I was able to work with some lovely elements that were already here, like the countertops and the hardwood." In the great room, though, she took a somewhat different approach and began with a 100 per cent hair-on-hide area rug. The homeowners loved it and that became the design direction for the entire space. "It was the statement piece and we scrapped a lot of other ideas to work with it," Rebecca says. To round out the cool vibe, she ordered two, three-seater salt-and-pepper tweed sofas and two Geno chairs in a colour she loves. "It's called Kiran Caviar and is a velvet, smoking jacket sort of colour," says Rebecca.
