

It's the best of both worlds, the ambience of a country retreat with all the amenities and convenience of city living.

Just minutes from downtown Peterborough, Chris and Andrea Hickey's new home overlooks a tiny, idyllic lake at the headwaters of Harper Creek, upstream from the city's largest natural woodland and wetland. The little lakeshore teems with wildflowers. Songbirds, redwing blackbirds and ducks flock to the protected pool, their summer oasis.

"It's peaceful, like a symphony orchestra with animals," says Andrea. She and Chris owned a century home east of town and later a house on the north side of the city when they began searching for a home with space, privacy and natural surroundings.

"It took us years to find the right house," says Andrea. **Stephen Coughlin**, a sales representative with **Exit Realty Liftlock Brokerage**, found exactly what they were seeking. "When we came here in the summer, everything was in full bloom in the backyard. It was just spectacular," says Chris as he recalls the first time he saw the house. He and Andrea, he says, are water people. "We both love the water and being on the lakes. This was the closest we could get in town."

Jim Williams Construction built the two-storey 4,500 sq. ft. home about 10 years ago after the original home on the site burned to the ground while the owners were away. With a good knowledge of building practices, Chris thoroughly inspected the home before they bought it and found the quality of construction excellent. "It's a well-built house." While the professionally landscaped backyard, with its kidney-shaped swimming pool, thriving mulberry trees and colourful perennials was appealing, the home's large open-concept living space made it irresistible. A wooden coffered ceiling and fireplace give the family room the vibe of a Montana resort. An octagonal dinette adjoins a glass-walled sunroom with a panoramic view of the lake. "It's all windows and warmth," says Andrea. "It's just a lovely place to sit."

Large windows in the family room look

out on the lush backyard and the park beyond the rear fence line. Early morning is a favourite time of the day. "I love when the sun comes up and warms everything up in the living room and in the dinette," says Andrea. "You just sit in the back and have your coffee. I remember growing up in Muskoka and sitting on the lake. It's just about like that and yet I can be five minutes from anything. It's kind of an extraordinary place in that respect."

With the help of designer **Leadia Younan** of **Knock On Wood**, Andrea gave the ground

floor a cosmetic makeover. She finished the dining and music room walls in **Benjamin**Moore's Seattle Gray from **Charlotte Paint**& Wallpaper. To complement the Hunter Douglas wooden blinds, she added French toile curtains, custom-made by Window

Care. "I just love decorating," says Andrea, who also stages homes when she has the time. "I like making things beautiful." Knock On Wood furnished most of the home.


Leather sofas, wood, steel and glass lend the main living areas a modern, eclectic and classical style. Continued on page 26



Across the travertine-tiled foyer is an office with an antique butternut bookcase they retained from a large collection of antiques that furnished their century home. A large kitchen with a granitetopped island, cabinets, custom made by Cabinetree, and a dining bar extends from the dining room to the family room.

Upstairs, oak washstands serve as night tables in the large master bedroom. A hallway runs between a long vanity with double sinks and a walk-in closet to an en suite with a corner tub. Next door to the master bedroom is a luxurious dressing room with open closets, shoe cubbies, built-in dressers and hat shelves. A blue cuddle chair and a polished, log-frame bed define the masculine flair of Josiah's bedroom. In the third upstairs bedroom, a Lake of Bays pillow, perched on a cushioned wooden bed bench, serves as a reminder of the family's Muskoka cottage. Continued on page 28







On the home's basement level, Chris and Andrea built a kitchen to service the big screen TV room and recreation area. Outside, they installed a hot tub near the pool. They retained the stately exterior look of the home, enhanced with a carriage style garage door by the Overhead Door Company of Peterborough.


