A lot of my friends never pay full price for anything. I've never had a knack for negotiating and I always spend more than I've budgeted for. How can I find a good deal on big (and not so big) ticket items? When is the best time to buy furniture, appliances and seasonal items and is there room to haggle on the ticket price? - Faith R.


Stephanie Redmond replies:

Patience! People who tend to find deals scout out shops and wait until the end of a season (when sales begin) to make their purchases. There are certain items worth waiting for (the expensive ones!), but you run the risk of an item selling out. A lot of new lines launch in spring or fall, but don't be shy about asking when a sale might start. Explain your budget and ask if it's realistic. You're not asking for a discount, you're doing your

On another note, be realistic about your budget and allow a bit of leeway. Remember that long-term purchases are worth saving for and make sure to avoid impulse shopping!

Dear Stephanie,

The holiday season is fast approaching. We go to a lot of parties and I always bring a hostess gift, usually a nice bottle of wine. I want to change it up. Can you give me some ideas on what I can bring that will be useful in the home? - Janine L.



Stephanie Redmond replies:

A general rule to follow for a hostess gift is giving something that can be consumed. Avoid knick-knacks and dust collectors that vour hostess will feel obliged to politely keep on display. Keep in mind what your friends are interested in and go from there. Perhaps a cooking magazine (Donna Hay or Anna are really nice), white tapered candles, chocolate truffles or a book, movie or CD you've enjoyed. Having said that, if you ever come over to my place, I like an oaky chardonnay.

Dear Stephanie,

What's hot in decorating for 2010? My house is ready for a change and I want to know "what's hot" and "what's not" so I can start planning my projects. I don't want to make any mistakes. Can you help? - Carolyn S.

Stephanie Redmond replies:

My bet is more sustainable style to come for 2010 – think eco-chic in all shapes and forms - Low VOC paints, furniture in recycled materials, organic cottons and linens.

As far as colour trends go, use earth tones or, in direct contrast, shockingly bright colours and metallics. Primary tones are everywhere from kitchen utensils to appliances in red, yellow and blue. Going "green" could take on a whole new meaning next year. And the good news about paint is, if you make a mistake, you can always get out the paintbrush and apply another coat.



This mix of neutrals and shocking colours can be really interesting and easy to accomplish. Look at the décor mags and pay attention to the rooms you like. A lot of the colour comes in the form of "changeables" – painted walls and throw cushions. These items jump out from a neutral base, which is where you can use your organic linens. If you don't want to make any mistakes, take a chance on low cost items and stick to the basics for the forever pieces. OH





The 1919 photo of Alex and Linda Coles' home, found in a newspaper of the time, shows it to be the only house on the south side of the Sydenham River in Owen Sound. More than a century later, this classic, Tudor-style home, on what locals call "Millionaire's Drive," a short walk from downtown Owen Sound, is surrounded by picturesque homes with broad green lawns and well-cared-for flowerbeds.

This solid red brick house stands out among its younger neighbours – its white porch columns and matching trim framing an imposing threestory monolith of historic proportions. The red Japanese maples that frame the entrance hint at the Asian artwork inside and the rejuvenated perennial gardens, complete with English roses, reflect the work that Alex and Linda have put into revamping this unique home.

Past the massive oak door, guarded by black iron carriage lamps and a matching stone lion sculpture, visitors enter a foyer of rich wood and a vestibule with a historic horsehair plaster ceiling, providing the cream-coloured canvas for the decorative artwork of the locally renowned Miller Brothers.

The historical marvels continue when you take in the large dining room lined in mahogany panels. Alex compares the large bowed windows of the room "like being on a ship." A similar sense of quality and tradition is carried into the spacious adjoining room, with its vintage quarter-sawn red oak floors, allowing for more of the wood's grain to be viewed. Here, below a century-old, plaster ceiling with wooden cross-timbers and within reach of the original functioning fireplace, recessed wooden shelves function as the Coles' library. *Continued on page 22*

The dining and library areas open on to a fully equipped bistro kitchen. The eating area's leather club chairs and stainless steel appliances, set against the old servants' staircase and collection of dishware, provide what Linda calls "a mixture of modern and cosy antique." Wooden cabinetry complements the rich timber textures of the surrounding rooms. The kitchen, in turn, flows into a relaxed family room of comfortable sofas surrounding a modern gas fireplace. The north wall of the gathering area is constructed of floor-to-ceiling windows that allow natural light to flood the space and offer a panoramic view of the natural beauty beyond.

The view is priceless. The first time people witness it, they blink their eyes in disbelief. It's as if they've been magically transported to cottage country. What lies beyond is a tree-lined river view as far as the eye can see. Beyond the canopy of fluttering leaves is the reflective shimmer of the river's ripples and steady flow.

An expansive rear deck, which Linda laughingly compares to the size of a "railway platform," sports patio chairs, two sun umbrellas, a barbecue and potted flowers, and extends across the entire length of the home. The refurbished deck looks out onto a sloping back lawn that descends to the treed riverfront and an oval, in-ground pool, bordered by a concrete deck and surrounded by a black wrought iron ornate fence by

Tony Bell of Blue Water Machine & Tool in Meaford. The cottage has come to the city.

The home's original covered porch, linked to the rear deck, is also a great place to sit out and enjoy the idyllic scenery, even on a rainy day.

Linda is enthusiastic about the stunning natural setting where her home is found. "People in the area have not groomed their riverfronts, so the view is perfectly natural," she says, gazing out at the swans cruising the river in the morning sunlight. "The milldam nearby regulates the river's depth so there's no erosion and only kayaks and canoes are allowed on this stretch of water, making it very peaceful. The only sound you might hear in summer is the sound of lawn mowers...Alex and I often walk down the few steps to our dock, have a coffee, and bring along a bucket of corn to feed the swans and the mallards that float by."

It's hard to believe you can have it all: downtown living and a peaceful retreat. "It's amazing," says Linda, elaborating on the opportunities the home's location allows. "You can take a canoe or kayak downriver to Harrison Park, a family conservation area, which has a zoo and lots of walking trails. It's a two-minute walk to downtown, where I go to the Farmer's Market on Saturday mornings. Once a year, the Sydenham Regatta is held where people on the river dress up and provide boaters with treats."

joy and peace. "Owen Sound is rated as one of the top 10 retirement communities in Canada," she notes. "It's got everything you could want, from box stores to boutiques - all within a two-and-a-half-hour drive from Toronto. It's one of the last undiscovered treasures...Here, I know who my neighbours are. I feel comfortable and secure. I love the fact that the neighbourhood is a wonderful mix of all sorts of people – from

The home is now too large for this couple to fill, with their daughter Ashley moving to Scotland for her Master's degree, and the Coles are ready to pass this stately gem onto a new family where new history will be created. However, it will be a difficult place to leave. "There isn't anything I don't love about this house," says Linda, beaming with pride. on

SOAKED!

IS THERE A SIMPLE SOLUTION TO SOARING WATER COSTS?

It's been humbling to discover that one of the most expensive items in the never-ending project of improving our old home has been human error – not the architect's, not the contractor's, not the electrician's or the plumber's, but my own. I could probably place a dollar value on how much I've cost myself, but it would be too depressing. Just thinking about it makes me cringe.

When we bought the building – a mid-19th century commercial structure – the previous owner had already begun the saga of turning it into a modern dwelling. Then he'd run out of money. Or maybe the sheer magnitude of the work had ground him down and he'd given up in despair. There were even rumours that marital strife had led him to sell – a not unknown consequence of renovations that go on for too long. Whatever it was, we showed up, and his last straw became our call to arms.

We discovered, among other things, that he'd roughed in two separate waste water collection systems, one for the toilets and one for all the rest – from the sinks, the showers, the washing machines, the dishwasher, the bathtubs. Though I didn't know it at the time, he'd actually created the infrastructure for what we would now call a "grey water system." The "black water" from the toilets would go into the holding tank, and all the rest – contaminated by little more than hair, grease and soapy residue – would go its separate way, in this case, through a pipe and straight into the river at the bottom of the garden. It would clearly have been both illegal and harmful and, feeling very righteous, we ripped out the secondary system and rerouted all the plumbing to the holding tank.

Twelve years and thousands of dollars later, it pains me to admit that the former owner was, perhaps without knowing it, a visionary. Today, a growing number of householders and cottagers in water-rich Ontario are discovering what hundreds of thousands in arid regions like the American southwest or Australia or in places like Japan, already know: that separating grey water from black water is one of the best things you can do to conserve water, take pressure off overloaded sewage treatment systems and save yourself money while helping the environment.

There are several ways, all of them legal, to benefit from grey water. The most straightforward is to redirect your domestic grey water to an indoor tank that will filter out impurities, chlorinate it and then pump it back to the toilets for flushing. This way you get double mileage out of your grey water, which in most households accounts for about 70 per cent of the total water usage. There's a Canadian-designed system called the Brac that will do just this. Chris Thompson, who sells it though his company, The Install Team (www.theinstallteam.com), has retrofitted his Barrie home with a Brac, and he reports that in the past 12 months, his five-member household saved about 100,000 litres of water. If the pattern holds, it will net him \$300 in savings next year, and if the cost of water continues to rise at the current rate, his Brac system will have paid for itself in five years.

Denis Orendt, executive director of the Ontario Onsite Wastewater Association, confirms that interest in grey water systems is surging in Ontario. Orendt's company, eco-work (www.eco-work.ca), is involved in both residential and larger projects. The CNE, the Royal Botanical Gardens in Hamilton, Trent University and some summer camps, like Camp Kawartha, are installing grey water reuse systems, some of them in conjunction with new rainwater collecting systems that lessen the demand for municipal water even further. And some homebuilders in Oshawa, Newmarket and Owen Sound are preinstalling the Brac, or similar systems, in their new housing.

There were even rumours that marital strife had led him to sell – a not unknown consequence of renovations that go on for too long. Whatever it was, we showed up, and his last straw became our call to arms.

We discovered, among other things, that he'd roughed in two separate waste water collection systems, one for the toilets and one for all the rest – from the sinks, the showers, the washing machines, the dishwasher,

Section 8, for instance, lays down the minimum legal requirements for another type of dispersal system, officially called a Class 2 Sewage System, but more commonly known as a "leaching pit." For those like myself, with an older home on an appropriately sized piece of property, this system may be the best choice. If the flow of grey water from your home does not exceed 1,000 litres a day, you can run it outside into a specially constructed pit. From there, the water will leach into the topsoil and be purified by the action of microbes and plants in the soil. The system is both legal and safe, as long as setback and construction guidelines are followed. (Further information at www.ontario.ca/buildingcode or 416.585.6666.)

Although it's hard to find anything seriously flawed about modern grey water systems, the battle to gain them acceptance is just beginning. Many inspectors are nervous about requests for permits and some municipal officials are even hostile to the idea, apparently believing that a boom in grey water systems would mean reduced water revenue for them. It's a short-sighted view, especially given the increasing pressure on our water and sewage treatment plants. Some cities, like Guelph, have been quicker to recognize the benefits and are offering rebates to residents who install approved systems, something Orendt believes the province and the federal government should take up as well.

Grey water systems aren't the sexiest fare on the eco-menu but they may well be the next big thing. From now on, my mantra is: Grey is the new Green. I will be repeating it often as I continue to shell out to rectify the stupid mistake I made so many years ago. **OH**

This four-bedroom home is a beautiful complement to its natural surroundings. Its exterior façade is composed of granite on the bottom and board-and-batten on the top half. The roof is covered in cedar shingles and a dark shade of green frames the windows and garage doors, highlighting the forest surrounding the home. The generous front porch offers a covered haven for reading and enjoying a cup of coffee.


The foyer of flagstone (**Ledgerock** in Owen Sound) faces a wall of windows in the great room. The eye passes the soaring ceilings of the second floor loft and the indoor ceramic-tile garden planter, built into the home between the beams to bring a little more of the natural environment inside, to the view beyond. The dropped great room leaves an unobstructed view from the eat-in kitchen and foyer.

The solid Douglas fir beams were reclaimed from a distillery in Belleville by carpenter **Keiran Glass** of **Century Timber Frame** in Durham. The window frames and trim were crafted from the excess material from the beams. The great room boasts a gorgeous view of the family's 100-acre property, comprised of mature forest, a river and a network of trails kept groomed and cleared for relaxing walks and exploring. This property has served John's love of nature photography and Nancy's hobbies as a Girl Guide and Junior Naturalist leader well.

The peaked roofline resembles a grand chalet from the trails behind the home. "The whole family skis, so I like the ski chalet look to it," says Nancy. The piano sits at one end of the dropped great room while the fieldstone fireplace sits at the other. The stones were gathered from John's childhood home in Chatham and crafted into this gas fireplace by stone mason **Steve Hodges** of Southgate Township. It features crossfire chambers and, when lit for only an hour, will radiate heat for another eight hours. The fireplace supports the furnace heat, which is sourced from the well (**Northern Heating & Ventilation**).

The eat-in kitchen features a breakfast bar and dining space surrounded in windows for spectacular views during mealtime. (The home's temperature is balanced with triple-pane, argon-filled Loewen windows and doors.) A spotting scope sits near the table, ready to give John a good look at some warblers snacking at his feeders. French doors open onto the wrap-around back deck with cosy seating to enjoy the cool night air.

PRESERVING HERBS

Whether you are a beginner or advanced gardener with a rambling English-style garden, a tiny deck or a sunny windowsill, growing culinary herbs can be one of the most satisfying adventures. By Maria Dasilva // Photography by scott hunter



These hearty plants are relatively easy to grow organically and are immediately rewarding with their scents, colours and pungent, flavourful foliage. A generous harvest can be preserved to keep that summer-fresh flavour lasting throughout winter. Here's a list of the best ways to preserve some of the most common culinary herbs.

BASIL – Although its rich licorice-like taste might lead you to believe otherwise, drying basil causes it to lose much of its flavour. The best way to preserve basil is to freeze it. Blend a combination of fresh basil leaves with just enough oil or water to make a thick paste. Freeze the paste in ice cube trays then transfer to resealable freezer bags to keep until needed. These cubes are great to boost the flavour of soups, stews and sauces.

CHIVES – Freezing is one of the best methods for preserving chives. Chop the leaves into the lengths you will require and freeze them on a baking sheet to prevent them from clumping together. Transfer the frozen chives to resealable freezer bags to use as needed.

CILANTRO – Like basil, cilantro loses much of its peppery appeal when dried, so freezing is best. Harvest and freeze the carrot-like white roots of cilantro to use in your favourite Thai recipes.

DILL - Dill weed can be preserved by drying or freezing. To dry, spread whole stems on a screen or cooling rack and keep at room temperature until dried through - this can take about a week. Crumble the leaves and keep them in a sealed glass jar.

MINT – Like dill, mint can be preserved by drying or freezing.

OREGANO - The best way to preserve oregano is to dry whole stems. Loosely tie three or four stems together and hang them in a cool dark place until the leaves and stems are dried through - this can take up to two weeks. When the leaves are dry, strip them from the stems and store in a sealed glass container.

PARSLEY – To preserve the bright, fresh flavour and vibrant colour of parsley, it is best to freeze it rather than dry it. Freeze whole sprigs in resealable freezer bags and snip off pieces as needed. The fresh leaves can also be blended with olive oil, garlic and pine nuts or walnuts to make a fresh version of pesto.

ROSEMARY – It's best to dry rosemary in the same way as oregano.

SAGE – Freezing preserves the fresh flavour of sage. Spread fresh leaves on a baking sheet and freeze. Transfer frozen leaves to resealable freezer bags for use as needed. Sage can also be dried. Because the leaves curl as they dry, and their thick foliage holds a lot of moisture, they need a lot of air circulation around them to inhibit the growth of fungus during drying.

THYME – Thyme is best preserved by drying in the same manner as oregano. Or freeze whole sprigs of thyme in resealable freezer bags. This method is best for flavouring stocks, stews, soups or sauces to which the whole sprig is added during cooking and removed just before serving. OH
