## SUMMER ENTERTAINING / OULSUICE DÉCOR

Every year when summer rolls around I stare out at the deck and start amassing large scale plans for vegetable beds and new furniture, sunshades and fire pits. The season closes and alas, we have usually accomplished one or two of those items. Sun kissed and relaxed, I normally care less about the surroundings and more about the summer experience – family, friends and being outdoors.

But let's face it, as a designer, or as anyone who looks at Houzz, reads decorating magazines like OUR HOMES, goes shopping or surfs the net, we are inundated with ideas – there's always a desire for change. Here are a few ideas to modernize your outdoor entertaining space and a few others that will make life that much easier:

LIGHTING: You can't depend on candles and a still night when entertaining outdoors. Make sure you have adequate lighting. I love the pendant light by Davey Lighting. It's industrial, classic and modern all at the same time. Hang one off to the side as a subtle design feature or over your side entry.

SHADE: As an alternative to a patio umbrella or a built-in pergola, a shade sail is a fun way to stay protected from the sun. The waterproof polyester material comes in great colours, like rust or royal blue, adding a pop of colour to your space. It also protects you from UV rays. They look modern and they're budget-friendly.

EXTRA SEATS: If you entertain for larger groups, then be prepared. Have an extra bench or two around to cram a few little ones onto or to pull up for extra seating around a pool. I love a mix of white weave with teak for these pieces. The simple design will collaborate well with existing pieces.


PORCH SWING: You can't go wrong with Dedon. If I could break into someone else's bank account, then their new Swingrest may be my first purchase. For a more budget-friendly approach, consider a simple, classic wood swing hanging from chains on your outdoor porch. You know what makes this design decision work best? SHATTERPROOF GLASSES: If you're going to entertain outside, then you may want to leave the crystal inside. There are tons of amazing plastic-type glasses on the market that look just like glass. FAKE GRASS: The new faux grass is truly impressive. With an under-layer of what appears to be dried grass, you would be hard pressed to tell the difference. It no longer looks like Astroturf. And the best part? No dandelions. If you have an area that doesn't get a lot of light or you're short on time to care for your lawn, then try it! You won't be disappointed. 

When Nora and Dave first settled in Mildmay, Nora was working as a French teacher and Dave was in insurance and financial planning. Today, Nora still teaches French and Dave works long hours as a lawyer with his own practice in Hanover.

Since then, the couple have added four members to their rank: Jillian (now in Grade II), Graeme (who has returned from his first year studying marine biology at Dalhousie University), Rex the dog and Brandy the cat. With two children in tow, they were quickly outgrowing their first home but couldn't bear to leave the neighbourhood. They relocated in 2005 to a home around the corner. The current residence offers increased space and "great bones," says Nora.

"We love to entertain and with two kids we needed a lot more space," she says. Although their new home, originally built by **Ruetz Contracting**, was spacious, it still needed customization to meet the needs of the family. "We blew out a wall in the kitchen to open up the room," explains Nora, which brought the eating and cooking areas together and exposed a series of large windows along the west wall.

The kitchen was renovated in co-operation with renovations project manager **Heidi Schaus** of **Heidesigns**. It boasts granite countertops and modern cabinetry by Johnson Woodworks, with oak hardwood from **JD's Flooring Centre**.

"Heidi has been instrumental in the design of this house," says Nora. "She is great at using what you already have and seeing how your family functions. If I wanted to buy something and it didn't have functionality she told me 'no'." The family enjoys cooking together in the kitchen so two sinks were a must, as was a microwave that doubles as a second convection oven. Function is everywhere and appears in the most unexpected places, including a nifty stepladder disguised as a bottom drawer.

The real centerpiece of the Donnelly home, however, is the backyard oasis, designed (with help from Heidesigns) and constructed by **Ground Effects Landscapes** in Hanover.

What was once a steep yard backing onto a forested river is now a smoothly landscaped space suited for entertaining. "I used to make the kids wear helmets and they would race down the hill on their toboggans," recalls Nora. Aside from winter play, the backyard was simply nonfunctional, and function is what it's all about for the Donnellys.

Completely transformed with natural stone, the backyard revolves around a sparkling pool from SanJaun Fiberglass Pools. The hot tub, with custom jets installed by Ground Effects, sits in proximity to the patio doors, looking across to the bar area and outdoor TV. On the opposite side

of the pool is a large cabana built by **Kraemer Construction**, complete with patio furniture from Sherri's Living Large, and featuring a custom built wood-burning fireplace. The backyard is surrounded by a sleek fence from **Modern Fencing** in Chesley.

"When Dave and I get in the hot tub in the middle of winter and the snow is falling all around and we put on the fire and turn on the TV, that's the best," she says.

The unique outdoor SunBriteTV is built to withstand a minus-40 degree winter, rain, snow, wind and sun – basically anything Bruce County can throw its way. The audio and TV in the backyard were installed by Mark Pinder at Balaklava Audio, who also brought hardwired audio into most of the home. Music is often heard softly piping through the rooms, which the Donnellys find great for entertaining their many guests. Continued on page 28

Dave works long days in a windowless office and the backyard transformation was a way of coaxing the family outside. "The backyard forces my husband outside as soon as he gets home from work. It's the de-stressor our family needed," says Nora. It's now a common sight to find Dave outdoors barbecuing dinner.

Step over the threshold into the Donnellys' walk-out basement and you'll find another bar area equipped with a full kitchen, installed by Royal Oak Kitchens, a cosy gas fireplace to warm up by after an evening dip in the pool and a pub-style eating area. The basement also hosts a pool table (Double D Co. in Walkerton) and ping-pong table, and is usually packed with Jillian and Graeme's friends.

"The basement is beautiful and really bright," says Nora. "It's great for when we have large groups for family dinners."

Dave hails from nearby Pinkerton and at least once a month the family

Despite the renovations, Nora's favourite part of the home remains its most unchanged space: the sunken living room where the original hardwood survives. 



## SUMMER IS HERE, LET'S LEARN ABOUT BEER













I have to start by saying that I'm not talking about the mass-market lagers that are pretty much all the same beer housed in different packaging. Instead, I am talking about beers that are made to be distinctive, interesting and typical to the styles that they represent – beers that command a moment to acknowledge what's in the glass. On the topic of glasses, if you're drinking a quality beer, pour it into a glass to maximize your enjoyment, it allows all the wonderful aromas to be enjoyed. The experience is similar to how wine's volatile aromas travel up and out from the open mouth of a wine glass.

Many of the interesting beers on the market (but not all) will be found in individual bottles, or perhaps in a case of six and many are produced by microbreweries or craft brewers.

I find most of my beer at the local wine store. One of the great things about trying new beers is that you can try two or more beer styles in one sitting. For under \$10 you can experience some real taste sensations. Great beer, like great wine has wonderful aromatics and flavours but is enjoyed for a fraction of the price. You can also indulge more because the alcohol content is almost always lower than that of wine.

Let's have a quick beer-making lesson to understand why beers taste as they do.

#### **BEER IS MADE OF FOUR THINGS:**

- 1. Water, which eventually becomes the beer
- 2. Malted Barley or Malt, which is produced by soaking barley grains and then letting them germinate (or sprout). They are

then dried and ready to be toasted. The level of toasting will dictate the eventual colour and flavour of the beer. For example, a lightly toasted malt could be for a pilsner and a dark-roasted malt (which is almost black) will give a stout or porter its desired rich, dark colour and distinguishing mocha aroma.

- **3.** Yeast, which ferments the malt's sugar into alcohol.
- 4. Hops, which are the flower buds from a climbing vine, and have been used for centuries to impart aroma, flavour and bitterness to beer. The hops are added to the beer to give the desired qualities to the end product. For example, an India Pale Ale (IPA) will traditionally be higher in hop flavours (thus more bitter) than an Abbey Ale, which is rounded and soft. There are many different varieties of hops, and brewers will choose their favourites depending on the style they are trying to create.

Simply put, the water is boiled with the malt so that the malt imparts colour and flavour. The liquid is then strained from the solids. The yeast and hops are then added to the liquid (or wort). The fermentation process begins and alcohol and bubbles are created. This is an oversimplified description but you get the idea.

All beers are one of two styles – either ales or lagers, which is determined by the yeast that make them. Ale yeasts are used in warmer conditions, and tend to create beers with more aromatics. Lager yeasts are allowed to ferment under cooler conditions, which produce a crisper, fresher style of beer.

Now, here's a beer primer to get you started to a summer full of great taste experiences involving a handful of my favourite beer styles and beers.

## BACK ON THE

## The Hatchers were long ready for a backyard retreat.

Their one acre ravine lot nestled in Georgian Bluffs, on the edge of Owen Sound, had served as an adventure park for their three growing sons for over a decade. When it was time to fix the retaining wall, which secured their 38-foot pool in place, Sheri and Dave Hatcher knew it was also time to re-imagine the space into something the maturing family could continue to enjoy for years to come.

Sheri and Dave consulted with Mark and Ken Hutten of **Hutten & Co. Landscaping** in Owen Sound. The Huttens presented such tempting ideas that the couple had them begin work as soon as the snow melted in the spring of 2012.

Inspired by the local landscape, the transformation is stunning. "Sheri and I have always been into the outdoors and canoeing in Algonquin Park, so we tried to make everything as natural as we could," notes Dave. The pair worked with Hutten to enhance the natural features of the ravine, such as using glass deck railings without a top rail, to create an unimpeded view, and laying a diving rock alongside the pool instead of a plastic board.

Hutten brought in armour stone to replace the aging wooden retaining wall and created a larger patio around the pool. Pavers, supplied by **Shouldice Designer Stone** in Shallow Lake, in a soft-yellow tone, blend nicely with the colour of the house. The patio connects to decking off the backdoor that hosts the family's large outdoor dining area (decking sourced at **Moggie Valley Timber Inc.** in Holland Centre). A bridge leads off the deck, across a dry pebble stream bed below and a basement walkout (stone supplied by **Owen Sound Ledgerock Ltd.**). Continued on page 40
















Lighting was a major focus of the project. While updating the plumbing in the swimming pool, the Hatchers took the opportunity to add underwater lights (Clark Pools and Spas). Lights were added to the hot tub and Hutten installed softly glowing feature lights into the trees and plantings around the property, to enhance the nightscape for entertaining. Fixtures were sourced at Living Lighting.

At the rear of the property, a fire pit draws the boys and their friends. The pit has been well used this spring thanks to the sugar maples dotting the ravine. Dave and his sons boiled 250 litres of sap over a single weekend, after tapping countless maple trees on the property. Together they bottled five litres of maple syrup for the family to savour throughout the year.

Entering the house through a heavy glass and metal patio door, sourced at **Grey Bruce Patio Enclosures Inc.**, the Hatchers step onto a painted mat commissioned from local artist **Carolyn Skene** with a Tom Thompson-Group of Seven-style forest sunset scene. The home reflects Sheri and Dave's devotion to their children.

In the mid-2000s, they hired **Jesco Builders** to renovate the main floor and kitchen (birch cabinets by **Hanover Kitchen & Bath Gallery**). Sheri wanted the household cook to have a vantage point of the family room and through to the front yard, where the boys played or caught the school bus. More recently, they replaced the kitchen flooring with Brazilian cherry sourced at **Greyfair Flooring and Furniture** in Owen Sound and installed by **Winmar**. They converted a fourth garage bay at the front of the house into a spacious office, containing a desk and computer for each family member. Family photos adorn nearly every wall in the home, including a portrait by local photographer **James Masters**. Their front yard converts into a hockey rink in winter where Dave and the boys play shinny. *Continued on page 42*

divider creates a cosy guest sleeping space off of the rec room.

It's a testament to the quality of the neighbourhood that 15 years later, Sheri and Dave remain in their first home in Owen Sound. The couple moved to Georgian Bluffs after meeting in Thunder Bay once Dave completed his studies. One of the first renovations they undertook in their new home was to breathe life into the front foyer. They hired **Gabrielle Phillips Designs** to open up the ceiling above the stairs into the attic with skylights. They welcome visitors through an impressive front door from **Georgian Bay Window and Door Ltd.**, adorned with new windows on either side. They also enjoyed working with **Northern Heating & Ventilation**.

"It's a fantastic neighbourhood; at one point there were 34 kids living on this street," says Dave. The family can walk to the Bruce Trail nearby and explore the never-ending escarpment. With their new backyard escape, says Dave, "We're planning to stay here at least until the children have moved on – and after they leave Owen Sound this could give them a reason to come back."







## A BREATH OF FRESH AIR: CONSIDER YOUR FLOORING

Living in a house with two- and four-legged occupants means a soup of familiar smells that a resident nose can easily identify. Like a wine sommelier, my nose can sense many smells in a regular day: the smell of nice cologne that follows my husband to work in the morning, the three-sport-a-day scent of my teenage daughter before a shower, and the garlic and onions hanging in the air at dinnertime.

While some of these sources are innocuous to our environment, others we need to get educated about to breathe easier and be healthier. The floor, ceiling, walls and furniture can emit invisible pollutants that can degrade the air we breathe. The scientific name Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) we hear bandied about in eco-speak is also known as off-gassing.

#### What causes indoor air problems?

The Canada Green Building Council (CaGBC estimates that Canadians spend an average of 90 per cent of their time indoors, where levels of pollutants may be two-to-five times (and occasionally more than 100 times) higher than outdoor levels. We spend a lot of time in a sealed



environment, dependent on mechanical ventilation systems like Heat Recovery Ventilation (HRV) systems to circulate indoor and outdoor air. Good indoor air quality (IAQ) involves reducing and diluting pollutants with adequate fresh air. You could open a window, but a balance must be struck between additional fresh air, and the hydro meter spinning wildly as your furnace chugs along to heat or cool that air.

According to Susan M. Winchip, Professor Emitrus of Interior and Environmental Design at Illinois State University and author of Sustainable Design for Interior Environments, 2nd Edition, major contributors to VOCs in building materials include: adhesives and sealants, paints and coatings, carpet, composite wood products, furniture and seating.

Professionally, specifying materials is a large part of what we do as sustainable designers. Unbiased third party websites, like www.greenguard.org, provide a database to help consumers find building materials with low chemical emissions. The Greenguard Certification Program tests for VOCs, as well as other pollutants in a product, and reports the emission levels. Flooring is a good place to start, because it's one of the largest surfaces in your house.

### A SHORT PRIMER ON SOME COMMON FLOORING MATERIALS

#### I. Soft floor coverings:

#### a. Carpet, nylon

- Winchip says materials used in the fibres, sealants, and adhesives are harmful to the IAQ.
- Carpet adhesives can emit high quantities of VOCs. Winchip suggests tacking carpet rather than gluing is a healthier solution. Refer to the Carpet and Rug Institute's Green Label Plus program for the lowest VOC emitting products on the market.
- According to Winchip, the highest levels of VOC gases are emitted with new carpet. Some estimates indicate that after the first 72 hours the VOC off-gassing subsides significantly. Whenever possible, new carpet should be allowed to air out outside the building, and people should wait several days before occupying the rooms.

#### b. Carpet, wool

- Absorbs noise and noxious gases from the air.
- Resists odour and resists fire more than other fibre choices.
- Hypo-allergenic and does not promote the growth of dust mites or bacteria or give
  off harmful emissions.

#### II. Hard floor coverings: wood, stone, tile, bamboo

- According to Interior Designer Corky Binggeli, in her book, Materials for Interior Environments, the glue binding bamboo together contains formaldehyde unless specifically noted otherwise. The amount off-gassed is very little, however. Zero VOC bamboo flooring is available.
- Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) certified wood floors are made from sustainably harvested wood. Low VOC stains and sealants are available.
- Particleboard, which may be used for an underlayment, should not contain formaldehyde.

#### III. Resilient Flooring: Resilient floor finish is elastic and has some "give" to it. Examples include linoleum, cork, rubber, vinyl and vinyl composite tile (VCT).

- VCT and rubber tiles are available with recycled content.
- Linoleum is made from renewable resources: linseed, wood flour and pine resins on a jute backing and is compostable.
- Vinyl flooring contains plasticizers and releases VOCs. Look for low VOC or PVC-free products.
- Flooring adhesives should be solvent-free, low- or zero-VOC and water-based.
- Frequently, rubber flooring is recommended only for outdoor or commercial use due to the potential for off-gassing.
- Some binders used in flooring such as cork are made of Urea-formaldehyde. **OH**

## SAUCY SMOKY BBQ PORK RIBS

To me, ribs are the ultimate summer food. I mean, we're already eating outdoors – why not make it messy? On rib nights at my house, I cover the picnic table with paper, throw down a heaping platter of these ribs, a pile of napkins, a bowl of coleslaw, some fluffy dinner buns and we dig in! And if this scene doesn't evoke summer. I don't know what does!

Ribs do take a while to become tender, but so many steps along the way can be done in advance. The day before you plan to serve them, rub the ribs with the spices and marinate, and make the sauce. In fact, the sauce can be made up to five days ahead. The sauce is equally delicious on chicken, steaks, burgers, chops – you name it!

While you may want to experiment with other sauce/rub flavours through the summer, perhaps even the meat (beef ribs are a treat too!), this one is a total classic – saucy, smoky, a little sweet and may truly be the only rib recipe you'll need all summer!

#### CAN'T STAND THE HEAT? GET OUT OF THE KITCHEN...

• Too hot to bake the ribs first? Grill the ribs over indirect heat instead. The timing will be approximately the same, but your kitchen won't overheat. For indirect grilling, place the ribs over a portion of the grill that is not lit or heated. In a gas grill, achieve this by lighting only a few of the burners – in a charcoal grill, by piling the coals to one side of the grill. Be sure to place a drip tray below the ribs to catch the fat and prevent flare-ups.

#### **RIB DONENESS**

• The phrase "falling off the bone" often comes to mind when we think of cooked ribs. However, technically, if the meat is actually falling from the bone the ribs are likely over cooked. A perfectly cooked rack of ribs is very, very tender but should still be clinging to the bone. The best way to test doneness is to insert a toothpick into the thickest part of the meat. If it pokes in and removes with ease, the meat ribs are done. Be sure to check each rack individually as each one is a little different.

#### **CHIP APPEAL**

• If using a gas grill, consider adding wood chips to achieve the natural smoky flavour that's inherent in a charcoal grill. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for using the wood chips, as each gas grill will have different specifications.

#### **SAUCY SMOKY BBQ PORK RIBS**

Serves 6 to 8

4 lbs pork back racks (about 2 racks)

1 tbsp packed brown sugar

2 tsp smoked or regular paprika

1 tsp garlic powder

1 tsp onion powder

1 tsp salt

½ tsp each dry mustard

½ tsp pepper

#### **SMOKY BBQ SAUCE:**

1 tsp vegetable oil

1 onion, finely diced

3 cloves garlic, minced

1 cup passata (strained bottled tomatoes)

1/4 cup molasses

¼ cup cider vinegar

2 tbsp packed brown sugar

1 tbsp chili powder

1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce

2 tsp smoked or plain paprika

1/4 tsp salt

- Trim fat from ribs: Remove membrane from underside of ribs, if attached. Mix together brown sugar, paprika, garlic powder, onion powder, salt, mustard powder and pepper. Rub all over ribs. Cover and refrigerate for one hour or for up to 24 hours.
- Smoky BBQ sauce: In saucepan, heat oil over medium heat; cook onion and garlic until softened and lightly golden, about six minutes. Stir in tomato passata, molasses, vinegar, brown sugar, chili powder, Worcestershire sauce, paprika and salt. Simmer, stirring occasionally, until thickened and reduced to about one cup, 20 to 25 minutes.
- Place ribs in shallow roasting pan. Bake, covered with foil, in 350°F oven until very tender, 1½ to 2 hours.
- For a charcoal grill, place ribs on grill directly over the coals. Cover and grill, turning once halfway through grilling and brushing occasionally with sauce, until ribs are browned, about 10 minutes. For gas grill, place ribs on grill over medium-high heat. Cover and grill as directed. Serve with any remaining sauce. OH





# MINIATURE MARVELS SINGING THE PRAISES OF THE LOWLY/ OMOUNTAINED ()

Considering groundcovers are often in the forefront of garden beds everywhere, it seems little praise is given to these tough, tiny plants.

Groundcovers can add a whole new dimension of colour to your garden through their foliage, texture and abundant bloom. Many, with their trailing nature, can soften hard stonework when tucked in crevices, or be encouraged to spill down the front of retained beds giving an "aged" feel. Groundcovers can also help retain slopes and discourage weed growth. Some are so strong that they can act as a lawn or path substitution. Read on to discover more.

#### **MELANIE'S PLANT PICKS:**

**Stonecrop** (*scdum*) – There are so many lovely trailing varieties of the sedum family that I cannot pick just one! The fleshy, succulent leaves of this little plant often look like a flower. It comes in a variety of foliage and bloom colours, plus it's drought tolerant and happy in lean soil. Bees and hummingbirds love them and the presence of pollinators is an important indicator of a healthy garden. Stonecrop favours sun but will tolerate partial shade. My favourites are:

*Angelina (Sedum rupestre)* – This spiky evergreen variety offers bright golden foliage and turns orange in fall, with yellow flowers in early summer.

Dragon's Blood (Sedum spurium) – This well-loved stonecrop is a semi-evergreen

specimen with rich reddish foliage and bright pink blooms in late summer. Bronze Carpet (Sedum spurium) – This showy stonecrop sports brilliant bronze red semi-evergreen foliage with flattering pink flowers.

*Miniature Stonecrop (Sedum requieni)* – This miniature stonecrop is a tiny leafed evergreen sedum and is the only one that tolerates foot traffic. It forms a dense mat with tiny white flowers and is extremely hardy.

**Creeping Phlox** (*Phlox subulata*) – Dense and low growing, this soft-looking plant is a prolific bloomer! It's covered in small purple, pink, white or variegated flowers in spring, with short, stiff evergreen foliage. This low-maintenance perennial prefers sun/part sun and is accepting of lean soils

**Golden Scotch Moss** (*Sagina subulata*) – Very dense and low growing, this mounding evergreen perennial, with tiny star-like white flowers in spring, boasts attractive chartreuse foliage. It tolerates foot traffic easily but its shallow root system requires steady watering to thrive. It prefers part shade.

**Hens and Chicks** (*Sempervivum*) – I like all varieties of this drought tolerant succulent. Their rosettes display dazzling progressive colour changes throughout the season. They favour full sun to bring out their





rich colour. Sempervivums will bloom after the second or third year. An odd looking flower stalk will shoot up from the centre of the main rosette with a cluster of flowers. After the flower dies, gently twist off the stalk. The main rosette has put on new offsets that will fill in.

**Cranesbill** (*Geranium Bloody*) – Of the many variations of the Cranesbill family, my absolute favorite variety is Bloody, which, to me, is one of the best Cranesbill introductions ever. It bears handsome dark green foliage with happy, upright clusters of bright violet-purple, cup-shaped flowers. Bloom period begins in early summer and continues on throughout the garden season. It likes sun to part shade.

**Creeping Jenny/Moneywort** (Lysimachia nummularia or Golden Creeping Jenny) – Creeping Jenny is accused of being an aggressive perennial, however the Goldilocks variety is restrained in habit. It is ideal to combat soil erosion or on rock walls and tolerates lean soil. Preferring full sun to part shade, its yellow-green foliage makes a bright statement when paired with common greens typically found in the garden. The name "wort" suggests medicinal use; it was used by early English herbalists to heal superficial wounds of both man and serpents. It was also used for ulcers, scurvy, hemorrhages and ailments of the lungs.

**Dianthus** (*Dianthus*) – Dianthus range in colour from pink, to red, to white flowers with notched petals and finely textured leaves. Sweet Williams (Dianthus barbatus) are larger and are biennial or short-lived perennials covered with bicolour flowers in late spring. Pinks are low-growing, low-care dianthus suitable for rock gardens with happy open-face flowers and attractive grey-green foliage. Dianthus prefers full sun and won't stand wet soils.

**Creeping Thyme Elfin** or **Minus** (*Thymus praecox Elfin or Minus*) – This tiny gem has gorgeous miniature flowers and compact leaves. This is another "walk upon" plant and when trod on will let go its thymey scent – plus it's edible! It favours full sun and tolerates lean soil.

A host of mature, entangled groundcovers can rival the beauty of a tapestry. But be careful to consider the aggressive habit of many and choose the right plant for the right environment. Groundcovers are not only at home in the applications mentioned – consider planting a "mini" garden in a planter or two. Children love this pint-sized forest idea, or dare I say living wall. Perhaps it's just the thing to take a ho-hum exterior wall to a front-and-centre showpiece! OH





#### finishing touch

An herb garden is a delicious way to keep your body, mind and cooking healthy. Since herbs don't need pesticides to keep critters away, tending to your herb garden is easy, fun and organic.

We've put together three creative ways to make a simple herb garden for your back porch, window or wall.

1. Reuse old mason jars on old barn board for a shabby chic wallhanging garden. Mark the spots you want your plants to hang from with chalk. Using screws, attach metal pipe clamps to the board. Insert jars and tighten clamps. Fill jars with rock and soil. Plant herbs. Affix chalkboard labels.

Materials: Mason jars, rocks, potting soil, screws, herbs, screwdriver/drill, barn board, metal pipe clamps, chalk, chalk labels.

2. Create a simple window garden with recycled cans. Use rocks to create a little bed at the bottom of each can. Fill with soil and transplant your herbs. Label with a paper tag, attach with twine.

Materials: Recycled cans, rocks, potting soil, screws, herbs, paper tags, twine and marker.

3. Plant your herbs in individual pockets of a hanging cotton shoe organizer. Fill each pocket with moisture retaining soil. Make cute labels from scrapbooking paper and plastic nametag covers

Materials: Hanging cotton shoe organizer, potting soil, herbs, paper or labels, marker, plastic nametag covers with pins.





- Fill your containers one-inch below the top with moisture-rich potting soil.
- If potting containers aren't breathable, then make a rock bed at the bottom to help drain excess water. Only a half-inch of rock is needed.
- For the shoe organizer garden, place a small plant underneath to catch water run-off. Water the plants from top to bottom, creating a waterfall effect.
- Use wide-mouth mason jars for large pre-grown herbs. on
