RAW & INDUSTRIAL IN 2013

With watermelons and popsicles a distant memory, it's time to forecast the upcoming trends for 2013. Ironically, when I look at the number "2013," I think of space travel and futuristic design. Maybe we're not guite there, but we are definitely heavy on industrial style - metals, glass and a whole lot of technology and innovation. Have designers been drawing inspiration from manufacturing plants? Not sure. But we will certainly be able to decorate our homes to look like one.

METALS


TECHNOLOGY



The dolostone cliffs

and clear waters of the Bruce Peninsula make it one of Ontario's iconic landscapes. Something about the confluence of rock, water and trees – that contrast of colour and texture – will always enthrall. The presence of the Bruce Trail, several nature reserves, and a national park drive home the fact that this is part of a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve. Thankfully, much of the coastline is protected from overdevelopment but if there are going to be new houses here, North Green Living, Inc. should be the company to build them.

George Benes, founder and owner of North Green Living, can't say enough about the beauty that surrounds the home he shares with his wife and design partner, Nancy Watson, on three forested acres north of Lion's Head. "It's a privilege to work here," he says. The talented couple recently completed this house, which also serves as the model home for the

company. They've dubbed it "The Watson," and it's an impressive build with the rustic touches of a cottage married with a minimalist design.

Rarely does a house seem to spring so naturally from its landscape. With local stone and wood and an abundance of large windows, the 2,363 sq. ft. house – slab-on-grade, one-and-a-half storeys, with three bedrooms, two full bathrooms, a powder room and open-concept floor plan – seems a part of its surroundings rather than an intruder. This is the result of North Green Living's attention to detail and philosophy of sustainability and low-impact building.

George and Nancy don't plan to build off-grid homes, though they do have plans for solar arrays, either on the roof of The Watson or on the ground nearby, to supplement the high-efficiency fireplace insert and radiant in-floor heating throughout. The carefully considered materials are the key to the home's sustainability. The lightweight "lifetime" steel roof is 60 per cent recycled pop cans, plus zinc and sand grit. The dormers and upper exterior siding are cedar milled locally at Liverance Home Building Centre. "As much as we could, we used local materials," says Nancy. "All the stone except for the kitchen wall is local, and all the wood with the exception of the interior doors is reclaimed barnboard."

An elemental marriage of stone and wood, this house – like the peninsula itself – has many stories to tell. George and Nancy source their reclaimed barnboard from Andy Bowman of **The Rustic Wood Company** in Chatsworth. The Watson maximizes the utility and beauty of this irreplaceable old-growth hemlock cut so long ago by pioneer sawyers. The main open staircase, interior trim detailing and window frames, as well as the interior and exterior beams, are all barnboard. The upstairs floor



is also barnboard, cut into quarter-inch tongue and groove, sanded and sealed, then glued and nailed into two-inch concrete with sleepers. So the floor is not only solid and soundproof, but also quiet. "On a regular wood floor after some years," says George, "the nails will start to squeak when you walk." Not this floor. To fill in the knotholes, George and Nancy took dead branches from hemlock trees on their property, cured and cut them, then sanded and glued them into the holes. This floor is a masterpiece of heritage restoration.

The downstairs floor, kitchen and bathroom countertop, shower surrounds, sills, side patio and front porch stone are all from **Owen Sound Ledgerock Ltd.** in Wiarton. An interesting study in contrasts greets you upon entering the home, where the floor is Ledgerock polished Eramosa (vein cut) and the wall a much rougher shore stone. Continued on page 26

The master en suite takes the term spa-like to a new level. A reclaimed wood vanity is paired with modern sinks and faucets; a glassed-in shower sports a stone wall and a loose pebble floor with wooden slats for standing.

This shore stone, that composes the façade as well as interior accent walls and the magnificent centerpiece hearth and chimney (fireplace from **The Fyre Place & Patio Shop**), is a rare type that is no longer quarried. George found it while digging out the foundation of an old cottage he was renovating for a client at nearby Barrow Bay. "We hauled it all here and power-washed it many, many times – it was all covered in clay," says Nancy. Examined closely, each stone reveals fossil textures that could never be imitated synthetically.

All the interior detailing, décor and furniture is innovative and unique. Two of the bathrooms feature vintage cabinets and hardware while the gallery-worthy dining area chandelier, created by Brothers Dressler in Toronto, is made of reclaimed walnut and bolts. A vintage Lebanese fish mosaic adorns the main floor bathroom wall, while a pillow made by Nancy out of a multi-coloured patchwork of leather samples, tops a living

room bench built by George. He also made the eye-catching reclaimed wood sofa in the master bedroom, which sports old copper pipe for legs and orange cushions – more of Nancy's handiwork.

Since his apprenticeship in Communist Czechoslovakia where he was born, George Benes has always made the most of the resources around him. "It wasn't like today, when you can buy everything," he says. "If you wanted to build something under communism, you had to think about it. You had a long list of what you needed, but you could get only two things. So you had to figure it out, because there was nothing in the market!" After coming to Canada in 2000, George built houses for large-scale developments in London. Today, he prefers to design and build one house at a time, with a smaller footprint, out of durable and beautiful materials. 





Down a lane of maple trees planted on Christmas Day in 1878, Kathy Galbraith and Russ Smith's new bungalow

Christmas Day in 1878, Kathy Galbraith and Russ Smith's new bungalow glows warmly in the crisp air. Set a few dozen yards in front of the property's 1870-built barn and to the side of a large blacksmith shop from the same era, the modern home stands at the edge of 200 acres of rolling pastureland and bush, with views of the community's old stone schoolhouse and a neighbouring white stallion in his paddock.

The couple had been living in Port Elgin where they run the seasonal 200-site **Kenorus Campground and RV Resort Inc.** In 2011, they decided to build themselves a home in the country east of Southampton where they would have their own getting-away-from-it-all feeling all year round. While they host campers from May to October, Kathy and Russ look forward to the quiet winter months when they are able to reconnect with friends and family and host holiday gatherings in their beautiful new home.

For the 2012 holiday season, they also welcomed the community to

tour the house as one of the stops on the **Chantry Island Chambettes Christmas Home Tour**. As a showcase of newly built homes in the area, the tour pairs homeowners with local designers to set the stage for Christmas. Kathy and Russ were paired with **Robyn Christie** of **Diva Decor** in Tara.

Robyn says working with Kathy was inspiring. "We had a lot of fun bringing the outside in, using a lot of real cedar and twigs." Kathy cut much of the festive greenery herself from the property's bush lot. "We like spruce and pine, but we use a lot of cedar for scent and there are fewer needles to clean up," she says. "I cut branches that are green and full and have seeds on them. I also like to use twigs, such as black walnut, which have a nice sheen on them; red-stick dogwood as well." Robyn describes the finished look as beautifully rustic with a bit of bling. "Holiday decorating is so unique and personal," she says. "Everyone's tastes and traditions are different and it's a joy to reflect those things when helping clients decorate." Continued on page 36

Aside from stunning holiday decorations, tour-goers also saw the wonderful work of architectural designer <code>Daniel R. Murawsky</code> of <code>Murawsky Design & Drafting</code> who designed the home. Murawsky worked with Kathy to locate the kitchen, by <code>Pear Tree Cabinets</code>, on the rear perimeter of the house where two windows bring ample light in to inspire cooking and baking. Windows throughout the home are by <code>Georgian Bay Window & Door</code>; appliances from <code>Square Deal Neil's TV & Appliances</code> in Southampton; granite counters from <code>The Old Barn Polished Stone Creations</code> in Hanover.

Builder **Brian Snyder** of **Snyder Development** in Port Elgin brought the plans to life. "Brian was marvellous to work with," says Kathy. "He was very particular about materials and how the house was built." The design called for decorative beams across the main living area, but upon receiving the wood, Snyder felt that the beams weren't of sufficient quality. Rather than delay the build, he suggested that the couple keep the ceilings bare. The result is an airiness in the space that draws the eyes to the outdoor views of the barn and fields, as well as to the numerous antique and heirloom pieces throughout the home.







"I like to blend old and new," says Kathy. The heirloom dining room hutch and sideboard, for example, are paired with a new dining table. "We're lovers of wood. I don't feel like you have to have wood all in the same colour. Our style is more rustic, very relaxed."

A wood-burning fireplace heats the great room, creating ambience and augmenting the warmth from the property's geothermal heating system (Ron Nickason Plumbing & Heating Ltd.). With dark hardwood throughout the house (Bruce County Flooring & Interiors Inc.) the home is very unified. The trim work is also consistent in an antique white shade to match the kitchen cabinetry. The master bedroom features a coffered ceiling and a second, much smaller Christmas tree. Kathy and Russ luxuriate in their master en

suite with a walk-in tiled shower, a pair of vessel sinks and a new claw-foot tub.

The couple's daughter has a lovely lilac and green room adjacent to the Jack-and-Jill bathroom she shares with the guest room – regularly used by Kathy's mother.

Outside the home, Brian Snyder had great suggestions to incorporate the textures and styles Kathy wanted – board and batten adorns the majority of the home with several sections in stone and wood shakes on the upper decorative dormers. Most of the windows have shutters for visual interest. Above the bay window in the master bedroom they installed a copper roof, which has already begun to oxidize and darken. It will continue to change colour as the house ages. Continued on page 38

Neighbours across the road are hobby historians who know the area and have kept records of the property, says Kathy. That is how the couple learned the farmstead was settled by the Sang family and the original house burned in the 1970s. "It was important to us to know where we were living – information like that tends to be lost unless somebody records it. We find things in the barn all the time - old tools and horse equipment." She has put several items on display around the house – a wooden sled


sits atop the well lid in the yard, horse collars add interest to the garage entry; maple sap buckets, filled with seasonal cuttings or greenery, line the deck. "The house is lovely," says Kathy, "but the magnificent structures on our property are the barns. They were built with no tractors, just animals and people, and they're still standing."

This season, Kathy and Russ look forward to sharing their home, old and new, with community, family and friends. OH

ALMOND GINGER CHOCOLATE BARK + lots of topping variations

Every year about this time, as the mercury drops and the days get shorter, my mind naturally turns to the fast-approaching holiday season. And one of my favourite holiday traditions is poring over cookbooks looking for inspiration for this year's homemade gifts from my kitchen. Nothing is sweeter than stirring, swirling and baking up tasty treats to wrap and deliver to friends, family, co-workers, teachers and other special folks in my life. While the cookies, candies and breads I bake may vary from year to year, a staple gift from my kitchen is chocolate bark. It's appealing because of its simplicity and opportunity for variations. Plus, it's chocolate - and who doesn't love the gift of chocolate?

There are few ingredients involved, so I like to splurge a little and choose the best chocolate I can find. Dark chocolate is my favourite base for bark – its rich, deep flavour complements the roasted nuts and sweet fruits that dot the surface. But milk chocolate and white chocolate (or perhaps all three!) work wonderfully as well. As for the nuts and fruit, anything goes. Peanuts, cashews, pecans, pistachios, hazelnuts, apricots, cranberries, raisins, cookie bits, candy pieces, pretzels, marshmallows – you get the point! Stick to three toppings at most so that each flavour gets a chance to shine without getting muddled in the mix.

For this year's bark, I'm going with the combination of dark chocolate, almonds and candied ginger - a little bit toasty, a little bit spicy and perfectly decadent. Happy holidays!

ALMOND GINGER CHOCOLATE BARK

(Makes: about 20 pieces)

1 lb (450 g) dark chocolate, chopped

3/4 cup toasted whole almonds, coarsely chopped

²/₃ cup candied ginger, thinly sliced

- Melt chocolate in a heatproof bowl set over a pot of gently simmering water, stirring often until smooth.
- Stir in about one third of each of the almonds and candied ginger. Pour mixture onto parchment paperlined baking sheet and gently spread with the back of a spoon until about an even scant ½-inch (1 cm) thickness.
- Sprinkle with remaining almonds and candied ginger.
- · Refrigerate until solid, about 20 minutes. Break or cut into pieces.
- · The bark will keep refrigerated in an airtight container for about 1 week.
- · For gift giving, package as desired.

VARIATION:


Pistachio Cranberry Apricot Swirl Bark - Melt separately 10 oz. (280 g) dark chocolate and 6 oz. (170 g) white chocolate. Stir one third of each: 3/3 cup roasted shelled pistachios, ⅓ cup dried apricots, quartered and 1/3 cup dried cranberries into the melted dark chocolate. Spread onto baking sheet. Drizzle with melted white chocolate. Use toothpick, skewer, or back of knife to swirl the chocolates together. Sprinkle with remaining pistachios, apricots and cranberries. Continue as recipe above. он


