WE HAD A FLOOD. I LEFT THE LAUNDRY SINK

running and later found myself moving boxes out of our raining storage room, while wading through an inch of water. There's nothing like a little rain to get you in the mood for some spring cleaning.








SCANDINAVIAN (INTERIOR) DESIGN

THE FASCINATION AND popularity of Scandinavian interior design is remarkable to me. It's not that it isn't well deserved, quite the contrary. These countries - Denmark, Norway and Sweden - are characterized as dark and cold. Yet the interiors are white and simple. Somehow, the starkness of the interior reflects the chill of the landscape, but still evokes incredible warmth. How is this possible? And what's the obsession? A main characteristic of Scandinavian furniture design is minimalism, but also incredible craftsmanship. Simple lines using natural elements - wood, metal, stone, paper and felt. When something is really simple, you tend to see every working part unless it is carefully hidden. Take this Alvaar Aalto stool as an example. Instead of hiding the screws that hold the backrest to the stool and the footrest to the legs, they become the simplest design element. Other than the shape of the piece, it remains the single outside element that decorates this stool. (He was Finnish, but Finland is oft considered a Scandinavian country). Simple and beautifully crafted; this is typical of a Scandinavian piece.

It's not to say that Scandinavian design is clinical, not by a long shot. The backdrop may be white, the lines might be clean, but there is often a sense of humour. What pops out of the strictness of this white palette are primary colours and fun patterns in some cases. Take this table lamp by Claesson Koivisto Rune. It follows the rules of simplicity, but comes in a fabulous bright green for added pop. We also see these primary colours in textiles with patterns that reflect a rich history in weaving and embroidery.

In a modern arrangement, we typically see a more organic approach: wool, felt and linens in off-white and soft grey. What stands out in this type of setting are the items placed

against the backdrop. It's a gallery style setting fabulous if you have an art and/or photography collection. The key to this approach though, is to keep it simple. If you have a vast array of tchotchkes and knickknacks. Scandinavian living may not be for you. One of my favourite things is a

collection of curiosities. Odd found items put out on display. It's the kind of thing my husband might throw in the woodstove. But this creates warmth. A great piece of bark hung on a wall can look like a masterpiece in the right setting.

The best modern designs in woodstoves are also Scandinavian. No question. Take the Rais Epoca as an example. A woodstove is a quintessential item in this setting and the lines on this piece follow the typical aesthetic - simple yet beautiful. Paired with a fur rug we have immediately created a warm environment, both aesthetic and physical!

So what is the obsession? I believe a clean surrounding that is relatively clutter free gives us a sense of calm in an otherwise hectic life. This style is like a detox for your home. And let's be honest, who wouldn't want to kick back in front of a wood stove at the end of a long day? OH







Kissten and Rod Matthews' 4.200 sq. ft. timber-frame home, built by Clancy Builders Ltd. on Georgian Bluff's Balmy Beach, was designed to highlight their incredible waterfront and garden views. But inside, it's their chef's kitchen that inspires awe.









In the year since the couple moved in, their gas Wolf range and eight-appliance kitchen has plated meals as extravagant as some of Owen Sound's finest eateries. Equipped by Macdonald's BrandSource Furniture & **Appliances** in Meaford, the kitchen features a double oven, microwave, warming drawer, two dishwashers, Sub-Zero fridge and an upright freezer. Let's not forget the 100 cu. ft. walk-in cooler where Rod ages loins of beef, or the walk-through pantry stacked ceiling-high, or the oversize industrial stainless-steel sink.

"Rod and Kissten did an excellent job at designing a home that reflects their passions," says **Tim Clancy** of Clancy Builders. "They positioned the house to maintain the gardens, built a professional-grade exercise room and designed a true chef's kitchen, complete with custom wine-chilling cabinetry."

One wall of the kitchen and dining area is

a dedicated floor-to-ceiling wine cellar. Three panel windows display dozens of wine bottles, while the cooler stores even more, kept at a steady 55-degrees F. Local craftsmen Norm Aubin and Grant Nicholson designed the solid black walnut trim surrounding the cooler and the Matthews had Markdale metalworker **Dano Harris** forge elegant iron handles.

The Matthews entertain friends and family nearly every weekend. "I wanted not only to be able to see the water from the kitchen, but to be part of the conversation with my guests while I'm preparing a meal," says Rod. They enlisted Exquisite Wood Designs Inc. to produce the cabinetry, all topped in quartz. The 10-foot long cantilevered dining table was sourced at DJ's Handcrafted Solid Wood Furniture in Hanover. Rod's passion for fine food is one way he unwinds after work - he

has owned and operated Pete's Auto Body in Owen Sound for the past 25 years. "I get to be creative when I cook, and, as it turns out, I'm pretty good at it and people like what I do," says Rod.

Kissten does the heavy lifting in the gardens, with nearly three acres of established perennials, shrubs, herbs and flowers. "The former property owner was a founder of the Georgian Bay Garden Club and left behind a greenhouse and bunkie stocked with pots, tools and everything but a manual," laughs Kissten.


The couple had been looking for waterfront property for a few years. "When this property came on the market, there was no question it was what we were looking for," says Rod, "A lot of water frontage, existing gardens, an existing harbour of stone walls built in the 1940s and a stone patio at the waterfront that was done in the 1940s. It was stunning."





They lived in the original house while they played with floor plans in 3-D rendering software until they had a feel for what they wanted. When the duo brought their ideas to local architectural designer Greg Williamson, he recommended they build a timber frame home (Thistlewood Timber Frame Homes). Williamson was able to guide the design to incorporate the garage at the bottom of the hill without crowding the front door. Exterior landscaping by MacDonnell Excavating; sod supplied by Town & Country Garden Centre in Rockford.

When it was time to enlist a builder the Clancys were an easy choice. "We meshed really well with Tom Clancy and his son Tim," says Kissten. "Tom had an 'I can do it' attitude. What we saw, he could envision and was able to turn that dream into reality." Continued on page 26


The Matthews worked with interior designer **Heather Smillie** of **House Rules Design Shop** on the finishing touches. She helped select the home's furniture, tiling, paint colours, provided by **Grey Bruce Paint and Decor**, and suggested flooring in engineered hickory.


The couple didn't want any small glass panes – the 32-foot high great room features windows at 11-by-nine feet and seven-by-nine feet (Van Dolder's Home Team). "It was important for us that when you looked out at the water from the ground floor or from the catwalk, that the beams were above or below your sight line," says Kissten. The great room fireplace and kitchen stove stonework were sourced at Shouldice Designer Stone and installed by Rob Hicks Masonry. The fireplaces came from **The Fyre Place & Patio Shop**, while the in-floor heating and forced air were installed by **Actons Plumbing**

Smillie designed the master en suite with wood-grain ceramic flooring and polished river pebble. Eight vertical water jets and two rain-shower heads offer a complete experience in the glass-walled shower (Fulford: Kitchenware Bathware Hardware).

The Matthews sourced local Eramosa marble at Owen Sound **Ledgerock Ltd.** in a variety of finishes to use throughout the house. The master bathroom features the marble in a polished fleuri cut that exposes hues in the grey range. The two guest bathroom counters are



also polished but in a warmer vein-cut variety. The main floor laundry room is done with the same fleuri cut, but hand sanded to keep the colour grey. Finally, the hearth is also fleuri cut but honed to have

The pièce de résistance is a spectacular 14-and-a-half foot solid steel chandelier hanging above the front entrance. Rod designed and fabricated it in his autobody shop, with a few elements forged by Dano Harris. Made to look like an upside-down bouquet of calla lilies with stems wrapped, the fixture is very organic. "I wanted all of the globes of light to hang within the large front pane of glass, so that the window frames the whole thing and it gives off light in all directions," Rod explains. He also fabricated four sconces on the back porch in the same style.

While the home itself is a masterpiece by Clancy Builders, the gardens and the kitchen continue to show off the masterful work of Rod and Kissten. он











LOOKING TO CLEAN HOUSE THIS

season? Why not make some extra cash while you're at it and host a successful garage sale?

By successful, I don't mean just throwing some junk on some tables and putting up a cardboard sign. By following these seven simple practices, you can optimize your sales, get rid of more stuff and have fun doing it!

1. Make It Big

There's nothing worse than losing time driving to a sale with a measly two or three tables of junk. If you don't have much to sell, team up with some neighbours or friends and combine your stuff to create a bigger, more attractive sale.

Tip: Have each contributor use different coloured price tags, then pull off the tags each time someone buys something and stick it to a clipboard to track sales.

2. Advertise

Think of your yard sale as your one-time business. It's a real opportunity to make some extra cash, so treat it like one. Regulars don't just stop by the occasional sale while out driving, they look at ads and plan their morning around the biggest and best-sounding sales.

Many communities have buy and sell groups on Facebook, and sites like Kijiji and Craigslist, which are great places to post your sale. Create your own Facebook event where you can post photos of the stuff you'll be selling and remind people about your sale. Don't forget about the local newspapers and radio stations.

Finally... signage, signage, signage! Put signs at every intersection near your home and all major crossings nearby. Use big, bold lettering! It's mind boggling how many people put up the big "Garage Sale" signs then write their address with a thin Sharpie or even a pen.

People driving by have under two seconds to read your sign so make it big, make it clear and use arrows! Not everyone will know where 777 Smith St. is located.

3. Price Properly

Price everything! It may seem like a big pain, but lots of people can't be bothered to ask the price of everything. Plus, you'll be tempted to offer a lower price when asked in person.

With that in mind, price fairly. People don't go to yard sales expecting to pay the prices you'd find on Kijiji and Craigslist.

Be prepared to negotiate your prices. That's half the fun of yard sales. Keep this in mind when pricing and if there are certain items you're not willing to budge on, mark "firm" on the price tag.

4. Merchandise

Many people slowly drive by a sale to determine whether it's stop-worthy or not, and sadly the verdict is often no. Do you like shopping in a messy, disorganized store? Probably not, so why should your sale be any different?

5. Be Organized

Don't leave pricing and merchandising until the morning of your sale. You'll have early birds, and you don't want to miss out. Have everything ready to go a half hour before your advertised start time and, if possible, start a bit earlier than most other sales.

Be sure to have a dedicated checkout table with a cashbox, float and someone to watch it at all times. It's no fun trying to figure out who's running the sale and trying to get their attention.

6. Biggie Size Your Sales

Have some lemonade or bottled drinks, baked goods and snacks by the checkout table to increase your sales. Shoppers may browse longer if they have a treat to enjoy.

7. Have Fun

Make a day of it. Invite some friends and family over to help, play some music, have a drink or two and enjoy some time outside. A fun atmosphere will draw browsers in and keep them shopping longer. OH

Some Great Merchandising Tips

- Put big items like furniture pieces closer to the curb. This will attract attention, and you don't have stealing these items.
- Organize similar stuff together, like electronics on one table, kitchen gadgets on another, etc.
- Make sure everything is visible and use dollar store tablecloths to give the whole sale a more uniform look.
- Display books and movies on a

- use a big tarp to display items like children's toys on the lawn.
- Display smaller, valuable items like jewelry near the checkout table
- Demonstrate that items work Buy some batteries and plug in some extension cords so people can feel confident that the item they're buying works.





ON THE WALLS

THE CENTURIES-OLD BLACKBOARD IS MAKING A

resurgence into the modern home in the form of a fun statement wall, which can be utilized in almost any room.

With the increasing availability of specialty paint, the blackboard has become a versatile home décor tool, transforming empty walls that have proven difficult to decorate. Both whimsical and practical, a blackboard can improve family organization or provide a place for displaying inspirational quotes and original art.

The kitchen is one of the most popular spots to paint a blackboard. For the aspiring chef or dinner hostess, blackboards make functional menus. They're also great places to jot down the ever-evolving grocery list. If you don't have wall space in your kitchen, the end of a cabinet or the fridge are alternative spaces to paint. Transforming a traditional backsplash into a blackboard is also a unique option.

In the front entrance, a blackboard makes a convenient message centre, and a home-office wall can always benefit from a calendar. Children will love having an expansive blackboard to create a mural in a bedroom or a playroom. Add one to the craft or laundry area, two possible locations where a blackboard can be functional and decorative.

Break Away From Black

Companies such as Benjamin Moore and Rust-Oleum offer blackboard paint in a spectrum of colours, while Krylon has a spray paint in basic black and vintage green. An off-white blackboard, styled with colourful sidewalk chalk, will set you apart from the crowd while blending seamlessly with your décor. Experiment with the subtle and varied tones of grey to give your blackboard a softer appearance, or forget subtle and get wild with a bold blue or tangerine hue.

If the right shade or tone remains elusive, mixing up custom blackboard paint is a surprisingly simple process.

Make Your Own Paint

- You will need 2 Tbsp. unsanded tile grout per 1 cup matte latex paint.
- Mix the paint and grout in one-to-two cup increments.
- Use a grout mixer to combine the paint and grout. (Paint mixer attachments are available for drills, which will make the task easier.)
- Properly prime your wall and then roll on your homemade blackboard paint. Once the paint has cured, it will need to be lightly sanded with 150-grit sandpaper and wiped clean.

Regardless of the paint you choose to use, season your new blackboard surface before you start practising any fancy typography.



Take the broad side of a piece of white chalk and rub down the entire area, then rub it clean with a dry cloth. Don't neglect seasoning the surface or a ghost of your first design will permanently remain.

Mastering Chalk

Deciding what to draw or write on a new blackboard is only half the battle. As a décor centrepiece, the content should look attractive, and mastering the chalk may take a bit of practise. Here are a few tips that will help transform even the most novice chalk artist.

- Lightly sketch out the design a few times
- Use a level and a ruler to keep things straight and symmetrical
- A wet Q-tip is the perfect tool for cleaning up lines
- To generate a paint-like effect, keep the chalk wet
- Sharpen the chalk
- Give chalk markers a try

Alternative Surfaces

If you're a commitment-phobe, painting a wall may seem daunting. Think about using blackboard paint in your home décor accents instead

- A painted playroom table can become an instant checkerboard, game of tic-tac-toe or artist's easel
- Create an erasable pantry system by painting labels on jars
- Coat a serving tray for easy identification of appetizers
- Customizable placemats make a unique adornment to

Bruce and Cynthia Everest's fondest memories include days spent at their old family cottage just minutes north of Southampton. It was where they watched their son and daughter grow, spending many a summer's day entertaining and enjoying all the coastline has to offer. Newly retired, they are back at their favourite retreat, full-time in a new home.

"We've been coming to the area for 30 years... since the kids were little," says Cynthia. "This house is kind of our dream for our retirement, and we chose this location because we think it's beautiful. It was always our refuge from our crazy work lives."

Before settling in Southampton, the couple resided just north of Burlington, commuting to downtown Toronto from Waterdown for work. Their new home in Southampton is a huge change of pace for their family.

They had originally purchased another lot closer to the downtown core, but Cynthia was having a hard time giving up the prospect of living so close to the beach.

"We were up here for the May 24th weekend and we drove by these three lots that had just been severed," she recalls. Accompanied by a three-season screened-in porch, which offers beautiful views of their property, the kitchen's traditional shaker cabinets line its three walls and complement the contemporary quartz counter tops (**The Old Barn Polished Stone Creations**). A farmhouse sink and glass subway tiles are perfect additions to the space and are bound to be admired by many who enjoy a cup of coffee or a glass of wine around the kitchen's large island.

"They did a beautiful job," says Cynthia about Bruce County Custom Cabinets. "I am so happy with the quality. I love the backsplash that Kaitlyn found to go with the quartz," she adds. Kaitlyn says they were always on the same page throughout the project.

Distressed oak flooring is a stylish but functional compromise for Abbey – their beloved Golden Retriever.


"I love that the house is so bright and airy, yet has amazing elements that keep it grounded, like the river stone in the fireplace," says Kaitlyn.





MAPLE

Just as spring slips into our consciousness, something almost mystical is taking place deep in the woods. It happens only when daytime temperatures inch above freezing and then drop back into crisp, frigid nights.

When conditions are just right, carbohydrates, stored as starch in the roots and trunks of maple trees, begin to morph into sugar.


The sugar merges with water while being pulled from the ground up through the roots, trunk and limbs. Warm days cause pressure to build up in the tree, forcing the thin, clear, slightly sweet and sticky sap to drip out of drilled holes (1).

Sugar maple (Acer saccharinum) is the most widely used tree for collecting sap for syrup-making, but other maple species, birch, walnut and beech trees are also tapped for sap. Modern methods of sap collection rely on an intricate network of plastic lines that funnel the sap directly to the boiler (2).

The sap is boiled until the water content is reduced and the sugars are concentrated into a syrup-thick liquid.

Syrup from the first sap run of the season is light amber and mild in taste, labeled No. 1 Extra Light. By the end of the season, the syrup is a rich, full-bodied and dark amber colour. This is the grade of syrup I prefer for both cooking and drizzling on pancakes because of its distinct maple flavour (3).

MAPLE-BRAISED APPLES AND PORK

Makes 4 servings

1 lb boneless pork loin or tenderloin, cut in 1/2-inch (1cm) thick slices

2 tsp chopped fresh sage

1 tsp chopped fresh rosemary

salt and pepper

2 Tbsp extra-virgin olive oil

1 onion, thinly sliced

4 apples, cored and thinly sliced

2 Tbsp (30 mL) maple syrup

½ cup (125 mL) apple juice

- Rub pork slices with sage and rosemary and season lightly with salt and pepper.
- In a large skillet, heat oil over mediumhigh heat. Add seasoned pork slices and cook until lightly browned, about one minute per side. Remove from pan and set aside. Reduce heat and add onion to pan. Cook, frequently stirring, for five minutes or until softened. Stir in apples and cook, occasionally stirring, for five minutes. Stir in maple syrup.
- Return pork and accumulated juices to skillet. Add stock, cover and simmer, until juices run clear when pork is pierced with the tip of a sharp knife, about five minutes. Transfer pork to platter and keep warm. Increase heat to high; cook apple mixture, frequently stirring, for three minutes or until liquid becomes syrupy. Spoon over pork and serve immediately. on

SHUTTER BUGS

Originally designed to shut out sunlight and prying eyes while protecting the glass from the elements, window shutters are practical and versatile ornaments. When they fall out of favour as window coverings, they can get a new life as a wall finish. Here's how to upcycle old window shutters to give walls a fresh, coastal look.







Tools & Materials

- Shutters and bifold doors
- Cleaning rags and sandpaper
- Putty knife, latex paint and brushes
- One-by-two-inch wooden strapping
- Wood screws and a screwdriver or a power drill/driver
- Measuring tape, spirit level, square and pencil
- Hammer and finishing nails or nail gun
- Saw for trimming shutters
- DAP DryDex spackling or other fillers for nail holes

How-To

- Collect shutters and louvered bifold doors from family, friends and at garage sales. Habitat for Humanity's Restore is a great source.
- Clean and lightly sand the shutters.
- Paint shutters in your choice of colours.
 Sometimes leftover house paint will suffice.
- You can plan a pattern of shutters by first arranging them in a grid on the floor.
- Using wood screws, horizontally strap a wall at 18-inch vertical intervals with one-by-two-inch boards. Shutters will be nailed to these straps using finishing nails or a nail gun.

OR

- If you're adventurous, simply start nailing up shutters and fit them as you work your way along the wall.
- Trim shutters, as needed, to fit around doors and windows.
- Use bifold doors as tall vertical shutters or cut them to make shorter shutters.
- Trim shutters around electrical outlets.
 Frame the outlets.
- Fill nail holes. Touch up the paint finish. on
