AREA RUGS

Interior Designer **Dolores Piar**

Back in the 50s, 60s and 70s, families were very proud of their luxurious wall-to-wall carpeting, and in some cases, installed it up the wall. Slowly, wood plank flooring became the norm. In came the area rug.

Hard surface floors, whether stone, wood or laminate, can use an area rug to help define a space, mute noisy footsteps, camouflage worn or uneven floors or add warmth and cosiness to a space.

EVOLUTION OF CARPET

Carpet design is a huge industry and area rugs especially are a great way to add a bold statement, a splash of colour or a large pattern. While neutrals still dominate area rug purchases, more people are picking modern designs and brighter colours. Even traditional Persian motifs are getting a colour refresh.

Once furniture is placed on a rug, the rug pops enough to give your room some panache. Michael Pourvakil, owner of Toronto's Weavers Art, believes floors are a room's fifth wall, and another place to enjoy visual luxury.

Creative Matters, another Canadian company, designs custom area rugs for the rich and famous worldwide. Known for practical products with vibrant hues, they use as many as 50 different yarn colours for each unique rug.

Not only are carpets tufted and woven, they can be printed with the use of tiny ink jets. For example, Pantone, known for their colour matching, is using its ink-printing knowledge to produce playful and emotional colour combinations for the floor.

FLOR, a carpet-tile manufacturer, took their office products and recoloured and restyled them for the residential market. You can cut, mix or match any shape or size you need.

MATERIAL POSSIBILITIES

NATURAL FIBRE

Natural fibres singe and are naturally fire resistant, and include:

Wool: From sheep. Luxurious and durable. Fibre traits reduce visible soil. Hard wearing.


Silk: From the silk worm's cocoon. It has a sensual sheen and soft feel.

Jute / Sisal: Plant fibre. Has a strong, rough texture. Stains easily. Can turn mouldy when wet.


Cotton: Comes from a plant seed-pod. Stains easily. Not long wearing.

SYNTHETIC FIBRE

Synthetic fibres can melt or burn and include:







Art Silk / Bamboo / Silk Viscose: Made of cellulose, which is a synonym for rayon. Crushes easily. Does not wear well. Difficult to get stains out.

Olefin / Acrylic / Polyester: Petroleum products. Resist fading. Chemical, moisture and stain resistant but crush easily. Low appearance retention.

PRACTICALLY SPEAKING

areas. Easy to clean.

When selecting a carpet, focus on:

Appearance or newness retention Retention of original colour and texture.

Fibre properties, yarn characteristics, finishes and construction features.

Anticipated traffic levels.

CARPET CARE

Rotate: Balding will occur over high traffic areas, so turn rugs periodically or flip where possible.

Vacuum Regularly: Sand and dirt can act as micro blades sawing away at fibres, so vacuum regularly.

Pad: Using an under pad makes carpets soft and cushy, prevents slipping and sliding and protects





the underside of the carpet, allowing sand and dirt to filter to the under pad and not scratch your floor.

Pets: Our four-legged furry friends can have accidents. Protect with a carpet sealant.

Beverages / Food: The worst offenders are red wine and blueberries. The 10-second rule does not apply. Send carpet to be cleaned, you'll be glad you did.

DESIGN TIPS

Choose your rug before you've chosen fabrics for your drapes and sofa. It's difficult and nearly impossible to find an area rug to coordinate with an existing colour scheme.

Let the carpet reveal your ideal colour scheme. Use carpet colours to pick your fabrics and paints.

WHAT'S NEXT FOR CARPETS?

Look for intelligent rugs that can detect your fall and then call for help.

Net-works by Interface recycles fishing nets from the Philippines to create carpet tiles, providing work for small fishing villages and cleaning up their beaches.

Know that area rugs are now the fifth wall of your room, lying under your feet – there to make your feet and your visual senses happy! **oh**

FEELING BLUE REASONS TO LOVE NAVY BY YANIC SIMARD



Wondering why navy blue is such a perennial favourite? There are more reasons to love it now than ever (trust me, it will fit in perfectly with your dream 2018 colour schemes), but for now here are my top five, along with many great ways to use this true-blue hue in your own home.



Navy is Versatile. Navy is a rich hue and a steadfast neutral at the same time, which makes it a savvy colour choice for those who are weary of simple grey – it will cooperate with other hues, but brings a little personality of its own. Also, while navy will never be the "new black," it is a great stand-in for pitch shades, which can sometimes feel a little harsh against the cheerful colours that are popular today, like soft pinks and leaf greens.

ry his: Use navy blue for investment pieces that you want to endure through years of colour trends, like a great sofa – it can mix with changing accent hues, so you can evolve your look over time. It's also a great colour to use tone-on-tone, so if you aren't colour-confident, feel free to partner navy with diverse blue shades for a foolproof scheme.




Navy is Liveable. I find clients are often a little shy about using a dark colour on the walls. Some crave the dramatic look, but are scared it won't feel liveable. However, dark navy shades feel as natural as the dusk skyline, so they won't grow tiresome – just make sure to include some visual breaks with light accents like white door trim, breezy curtains, pale upholstery and art.

Try this: Whether you have a colourful palette that needs a calming hue to tie elements together, or want to add drama to a neutral palette, try a rich navy paint like Benjamin Moore's Delft from their new Century Collection, in an au courant matte finish. For a subtler, greyed-out shade, try Celestine Blue, which is a bit off-navy but brings a similar regal air. Continued on page 28



Navy is Architectural. Looking for a way to accent architectural elements? Navy makes a perfect pop colour for doors, kitchen cabinets, niches or high ceilings – it calls a bit of attention to such features but lets your other accents be the true star.

(all over or just an accent wall) up to about 54 inches, and leave the upper half white or off-white. Use this line or a bit higher as a centre point for some framed photos, to break up the look a little more. Now you've got an architectural look that retains an open and breezy eyeline, so the space feels enriched but not overwhelmed.

Navy is Textural. Well, to be fair, this one isn't exactly true – navy as a colour can't add any texture to a space. BUT, it is great for playing up the texture of surfaces it's used on. From polished backsplash tiles to rugged stair runners, the demure nature of navy helps bring the textures of a surface to life – especially since its murky depths will set off glossy highlights.

Try this: For a sophisticated scheme, add navy elements in interesting textures such as glossy subway tiles, velvet cushions or draperies, woolen throw blankets, lacquered bentwood chairs, sumptuous leathers, sisal carpets and expressive contemporary paintings.





Navy is Mysterious. It's almost 2018, why limit yourself to a strict, pure navy hue? Nebulous, spaceinspired hues are huge right now – rich purple Shadow is even Benjamin Moore's current Colour of the Year – so consider using a warm off-navy indigo shade for even more inky interest.

ry this: Use a crossover blue-purple shade like Benjamin Moore's Thistle or Larkspur Seed to create a mysterious air in an intimate space (like a dining room or den), and let your guests debate whether it reminds them of blackberries or lilacs. OH

This well-established neighbourhood in Hanover is not the place you would expect to discover a brand new build. But standing stately and sure with timeless tradition, Courtney and Eric Hopkins' two-storey home is settling into the surrounding landscape.

The property backs onto the public trail system and blends the tranquility of country scenery with the proximity to amenities offered by living in town. When speaking of the lot, Courtney says "We're so fortunate and it's not something we'll likely find again." She, along with husband Eric and their two daughters, Macie, 7, and Lilah, 4, can easily hop on the trails for walks and bike rides during the summer months, winding their way along the meandering Saugeen River and throughout town.

This balance of traditional and modern elements is a theme throughout the home: mixing old and new,

combining refined finishes such as chrome light fixtures (Hanover Home Hardware **Building Centre, Dingwall Electric)** with more rustic elements like driftwood.

Courtney and Eric are no strangers to building, renovating and moving as this is the couple's third build together (with multiple renovations prior). Eric was the general contractor for the build, as he operates Eric Hopkins Limited, a multi-crew residential trim and framing company, while Courtney, who offers consultations through her company Stay Awhile Decorating & Design, made all of the finish selections. Being willing and able to put their skills to use on personal projects has allowed them to refine their preferences along the way, learn what they'd do differently and then re-invest their knowledge, skills and earnings into the next project. This house marks a culmination of lessons learned. The primary focus this time around was to ensure the space was light and bright, and they were mindful to limit design elements that would interrupt natural light flooding the space. Just inside the front door, a soaring, sun-drenched two-storey foyer is anchored by a suitably scaled staircase that is over four-feet wide (Century Stairs Systems Inc.). A main floor office is conveniently located to the right of the entrance, a favourite spot for the girls to play when Eric is at his desk.

The light greys, creams and whites help achieve the bright space the couple envisioned, while also being suitable for life with kids. Courtney explains that she knew she didn't want a white kitchen as she had previously spent too much time wiping down $\,$ cupboards from fingerprints and the wear of day-to-day living. They opted for grey cabinetry (Barzotti Woodworking Ltd.) and topped it off with a granite countertop from long-time friend **Reay Hunter of The Old Barn Polished Stone Creations.**




After battling with footprints and every speck of dust on dark engineered flooring in a previous build, this time they opted for a much more forgiving medium grey engineered hickory.

A linear gas fireplace (Wilson Plumbing Services) with white, dry-stacked stone surround is the focal point of the living area, although the window grouping with a lovely landscape view is also a great feature of the space. In the winter months the family tends to cocoon in the lower-level family room, a perfect place to watch TV and stay cosy.







YUCK-FREE kitchen composting

Many of us are guilty. With good intentions of using the green bin or compost, we've caught ourselves tossing food scraps and leftovers into the garbage. For some of us it's not worth the stench or grime involved in scraping the remnants into the green bin in an age of efficiency and busy lives; it seems easier to toss it all into the garbage.

But, it is fairly easy and worthwhile to live a greener life. While composting and green bin use isn't always pretty, it may soon become mandatory by municipalities. To help make this job easier, here are some products and tips to help make your green bin experience more bearable, less of a choice and more of a routine.

Products

A. BioBag: These bin liners are designed for 35-litre containers and are highly breathable, made of biodegradable plastic and ideal for kitchen waste. BioBag products have a very high penetration barrier against bacteria, viruses, spores and mould.

B. Compost Pail Charcoal Filter: The charcoal filters in these Canadian-made pails absorb odours.

C. Greenlid: No leaks, no smells. This Canadian-made compostable bin boasts that it is leak-resistant.

D. Waste Management Odour Disposer:Using plant-based ingredients safe for

Using plant-based ingredients safe for kids and pets, this spray rapidly eliminates odour-causing bacteria.

E. Ecolife Odour Blaster: Eliminates odours instead of masking them.

Preventative measures:

To avoid those smelly liquids often found beneath your biodegradable kitchen-catcher, layer newspaper inside the bag to soak up any liquids or smells. You can also line the bin with newspaper or egg cartons to catch any spills from holes in the plastic.

Use a smaller bin that is easy to access in your kitchen. The more frequently this bin is emptied, the less likely odours will consume your kitchen. Be sure to wash your small bin after emptying with warm, soapy water.

To prevent a gag-reflex-worthy encounter with pests and bugs, it is best to avoid tossing expired meats or meat scraps in the bin too early in the week. Wrap your meat scraps in newspaper and store them in the freezer until collection day.

In the winter, to keep your outdoor bin from freezing, try spraying the lid lightly with cooking oil.

In the summer, it is best to keep your bins out of direct sunlight, either in the garage or in a well-shaded area. The warmth from sun exposure causes moisture and makes the matter start to decompose and cause odours.



Problem solving:

Use natural cleaners in the bin to get rid of unwanted odours or pests. Sprinkling baking soda, spraying the bin lid with vinegar or cleaning with lemon juice are all appropriate ways to clean your bin without the use of harsh chemicals.

Eliminate odours by spraying the bin with a solution made of 50 per cent water and 50 per cent vinegar.



THE PLACE: Nearly 60 years ago brothers Harold and Ralph Stobbe, contractors in the Owen Sound region, were having difficulty finding a local source for stone window sills. Taking it upon themselves to find a solution, they discovered some local stone, opened a quarry and Ledgerock got its start. Over the years, **Owen Sound** Ledgerock Limited has grown in scale and production (they currently employ about 150 people locally), but remains a family owned-and-operated business. Harold's

children, Lynda Grimoldby and Tom Stobbe are the owners and work alongside various members of their families.

THE GOODS: Ledgerock extracts a variety of stones, including the popular Eramosa marble, from its three quarries located in Owen Sound, Wiarton and Hope Bay. From quarry to production, Ledgerock supplies a broad range of products, including landscape materials (such as pavers, flagstone, steps and

armour stone), a variety of stone masonry cladding options (full bed and veneer), floor and wall tiles, as well as countertops. They also import Indiana limestone, which is a softer stone to be used for carving custom architectural details, such as columns, trims and mouldings, door and window surrounds and sills and headers. Their work is found on some of the most luxurious and prestigious homes and commercial buildings throughout Canada, the United States and overseas.









THE PROCESS: Although the quarries operate from approximately April through to October, Owen Sound Ledgerock is a year-round business. All materials from the quarry are put to use with net-zero waste as the stone remnants are crushed and used for gravel. All of the water utilized in the quarry extraction process is rainwater that is harvested and stored for cutting as required. In production, each slab is inspected, graded and assigned to particular uses depending upon the current orders and project requirements.

THE STYLE: Clients desire a style with the beauty and longevity of natural stone. The variety of cuts and finishes available allows a stone to be selected to suit a project, whether modern or traditional. Finishes include flamed, honed, polished, bush hammered and sandblasted. Ledgerock also does restorative work on historical buildings. In-house CADD technicians utilize software to draw historical stone details to exacting dimensions and then send the drawing to a machine in production that carves a perfect replica.



It's hot and it's only getting hotter. No, not the weather, the real-estate investment market. That means buying a home and renting it out. Analysts and agents alike believe realestate investment remains a positive venture.

A growing population – and in some cases provincial legislation – are pushing people to rural municipalities to invest in real estate. There are plenty of opportunities.

"Everywhere you look, there is opportunity for investment," says Ettore Cardarelli, president of the Ontario Real Estate Association (OREA). "For anyone who wants to go that route, in my mind, it's better sooner than later."

He says continuing and past trends indicate the housing market will remain strong.

Experts agree it's generally a great idea because of market potential and a high rate of return.

According to research by the Real Estate Investment Network (REIN), flourishing markets in Ontario include Hamilton, the Tech Triangle (Kitchener, Waterloo and Cambridge), Barrie, Milton, Orillia and Scarborough.

"We take into account 12 economic fundamentals of a region, including transportation, accessibility, lifestyle, current pricing and property supply to uncover the truth about markets," says REIN President Don Campbell.

In today's market, says Campbell, it is critical that investors are patient and are only buying properties where revenues outstrip operating expenses, including the mortgage. As well, given the anticipated increase in utility prices, investors should ensure the tenant bears that cost.

Properties that are ground-oriented will have the highest rate of increase in value and demand over the next five years, he says. Condos will also do well, but without an associated increase in land costs, the actual values will not go up much.

Adding to that, Hamilton-based real estate agent Erwin Szeto says, "One pragmatic recommendation I would give is to purchase a property with an accessory suite or with a legal basement apartment. If one has an aggressive savings plan, live in the unit that rents for less. Or, if you live near a postsecondary school, rent out rooms to students." In Ontario, those investment opportunities can be found in Windsor, London, Guelph, Owen Sound, York Region, Toronto, Oakville-Burlington-Mississauga, Peterborough, Ottawa and Niagara Falls.

Another option, he says, includes investing strategically by charging above-market rent and giving the tenant the option to purchase the investment property at a set future price.

But it's not just Ontario that's lucrative for real-estate investment.

REIN also lists Victoria and New Westminster in British Columbia, and Edmonton and Calgary in Alberta as places to invest.

"In B.C., when the government stepped in

a year ago, foreign buyers decided they will avoid the tax and buy outside the cities," says Campbell. "Our government (in Ontario) has done the same thing. They put in a foreign tax, but only in the Greater Toronto and Golden Horseshoe areas. It won't take long for people to realize it's okay for them to go to Woodstock or Orillia or further out, because the tax doesn't apply there."

Whether you invest in commercial or residential properties, mind the basics of the business, says Shannon Murree, a Barrie-based Re/Max Chay Realty sales representative. "You really need to know what your goals are, your risk tolerance, your investment capacity and how much time you have to invest," she says.

And don't look at it as a quick get-rich scheme, think of it as a slow and steady, long-term strategy.


Remember not to buy with emotion, but to do an in-depth analysis of the market.

Look at trends published in studies done by investment networks and heed advice given by experts in the field, such as realtors with an expertise in investment, property managers, accountants and real-estate lawyers, says Murree.

A good way of going about determining potential in a market, she advises, is to educate oneself and to learn details of the fundamental economic factors in the area, such as jobs, rate of development, incoming new investments and numbers around population growth and other factors for a comprehensive and useful analysis.

And remember, Murree says, to "learn from others who have achieved success and truly walk-the-walk and talk-the-talk." OH

The single glycol solar panel on the roof conducts energy to a heat pump in the mechanical room, which heats water before sending it to the floor and showers. The solar shingles generate more than enough electricity for the home over the course of a year and are an alternative to the typical Photo Voltoic (PV) panels in widespread use today.

At the front door, a LEED platinum plaque shines proudly. A LEED certification is awarded by the Canada Green Building Council, and stands for Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design. The platinum level is the highest rating on the LEED scale.

The exterior of the home is protected with what Gord calls the "Gore-Tex of building." The DuPont Tyvek Building Envelope is a full weather barrier system that ensures the house is kept safe from those strong Lake Huron winds, keeps water out but allows the home to breathe and dry out. The insulation levels of the main walls in the home have a thermal resistance level (R-Value) of R48 and the attic is R70. The single biggest waste of energy in homes is unwanted air leakage through holes in walls and attics. Derek worked very hard to ensure this home has minimal unwanted air leaks and the result is the most airtight house known in Canada with 0.19 ACH (air changes per hour) at 50 Pascals (Pa), as measured by a blower door test.

Southampton has always felt like home

for **Gord Cooke** and his family. As an engineering consultant, and president of **Building Knowledge Canada Inc.**, Gord travels a lot for work – training, educating and lecturing about the importance of improving air quality and building energy-efficient homes.

Practicing what he preaches, Gord and his wife Linda started planning a custom cottage on an empty lot between Southampton's downtown core, the river and the shore. Local third generation builder **Derek Seaman** of **Seaman & Sons Builders** was the couple's first call. Gord had worked with the Seaman family for many years and knew they were familiar with the kind of R-2000 home he was looking to build. R-2000 homes are described by Natural Resources Canada as the "best-in-class energy-efficient homes that include high levels of insulation, clean air features and measures to help protect the environment."

Together, Derek, with architectural designer **John Peirson**, and the Cookes, set out to build a net-zero home (a home that only uses as much energy as it generates on site) with many sustainability features sure to provide a cosy, quiet retreat for family and friends.

HERE ARE 20 IMPRESSIVE FACTS ABOUT THIS LEED CERTIFIED HOME:

Gord Cooke travels North America to speak at conferences with builders and provide on-site training sessions. When Linda and Gord are in Southampton, they enjoy entertaining friends and family and spending quality time with their grandson, Oliver, 2.

Derek Seaman has been framing homes since he was 13 years old, and, after graduating with a business degree from the University of Guelph, has been running the family business since 2002. Seaman & Sons Builders has been operating in Southampton since 1954. It is their impeccable attention to detail and commitment to learning the newest technologies and practices that sets them apart in their field.





The flooring on the main level is an acidwashed epoxy-coated recycled slag concrete (Extreme Linings and Coatings) and is heated by solar-preheated circulating water. The beautiful blues in the flooring are reflected on the walls in the main living area, which are painted in the colour Pacific from the ECO Collection at RONA Southampton, which is all recycled paint and continues the marine theme the couple were hoping to achieve.


A commissioned piece of stained glass welcomes people through the front door. Gord and Linda asked a local artist **Paul** Villani (who has since retired) to incorporate all of the themes they enjoy about the area into a transom for their new cottage - including the Chantry Island lighthouse and Southampton shoreline.

Since it is a secondary home, it is handy for Gord to be able to monitor and adjust the heat in the house through apps on his phone that are connected to the water heater and thermostat.



All of the lighting in the cottage is 100per cent LED, with fixtures from **BJS Electric**. Visitors are shocked at how quiet the appliances are, an added bonus of the high efficiency, top performing Energy Star qualified kitchen fixtures. A zero VOC (volatile organic compound) finish was used on the kitchen cabinets (The Bamco Group), instead of the oil-based lacquer that can be found on most kitchen cabinets.

All of the glasses on this shelf were found in the sand during excavation and construction. Upon researching the lightbulb, Good discovered that manufacturing was halted on this particular model in the 1940s – incredible that it is still intact!



All of the windows (Armor Windows & Doors) are triple-glazed, designed to optimize the solar gains and losses related to heating and cooling the home. The south-facing windows have a higher solar gain coating to draw heat in during cooler months and the overhangs on these windows keep the heat out during warmer months, reducing the overall energy usage. North and east-facing windows are coated to minimize winter radiant heat losses and the west windows minimize solar gain. Window coverings from Blinds-to-Go.

A cosy and welcoming living area walks out onto the back patio. The furniture in the living room was purchased from Smitty's Fine Furniture with TVs from Square Deal Neil's TV & Appliances and audio visual by Advanced Technologies.

The Vetrazzo blue slab countertop in the main recycled glass. A recirculation loop in the mechanical room ensures that water is not wasted waiting for warm water to wash hands at the sink. It does so by "trickling a little bit of hot water periodically so when you turn on the tap, hot water comes immediately," Gord says.

All of the toilets are dual flush, ultra low-flow and that is collected in a 4,000-litre cistern underground in the backyard. The water in the eight-by-four foot cistern is collected from downspouts from the roof and is also used to irrigate the property as needed.














■ Both bedrooms on the main floor feature custom builtins for efficient storage. Gord says, "we've had people tell us they've never had a better night's sleep than in this house." He credits this to the fresh air he has running directly to each bedroom. In order to ventilate the air-tight house and still receive the benefits of air circulation from ventilation, a heat recovery ventilator (HRV) was installed to bring fresh air inside without having to open any windows. Fresh, cold air from outside comes through a duct across a heat exchange core to a high efficiency HEPA filter, and is warmed before delivering a little bit of fresh air to every bedroom. In the opposite direction, on the other side of the filter, exhaust air from the bathrooms and kitchen is passed across the other side of the heat exchange core, "the whole system recovers 85 per cent of waste heat," Gord says. The furniture in the second floor bedroom was sourced from Crate Designs Ltd. Continued on page 60

A sloped ceiling with exposed pine beams defines the 600 square foot upper level of the cottage. The coffee table in the sitting area is made from a slice of an oak trunk that was taken down at the Cookes' primary residence.

Insulated storage and crawl space areas run the length of the living area upstairs (carpet from Paul Eagleson Furniture Carpets & Bedding).

Behind one door is a playroom space that Gord finished for his grandson, Oliver. This upper-level floor acts as a guest space and bedroom for visitors.











A small mechanical room is tucked away off the laundry room at the front of the house – and inside is where all the magic happens.

The high-tech mechanics of this net-zero home really don't need that much space (Bridge Plumbing & Heating).

Gord collaborated with other industry professionals to develop an app called Construction Instruction that is used by over 120,000 builders. It was designed for on-site learning for builders and tradespeople with videos that explain the technology behind energy-efficient builds.

Gord explains that he has been solving mould issues in basements for years.

Rather than include a basement, Gord and Linda opted for a slab on grade to avoid the complications that often occur with water damage (a significant issue for homes in Southampton). Around the back of the home, an outdoor entertaining area with furnishings from Martin's Home Hardware is anchored by an Ontario brick outdoor fireplace by JR Masonry. The surrounding landscape work was completed by Ground Effects Landscapes. OH

WHERE THE STANDS STILL

Comfort, safety and dignity. These three simple yet powerful words were and continue to be the pillars used in both the design and function of Chapman House Residential Hospice of Grey Bruce in Owen Sound. Those three words characterize the foundation of Chapman House, from its palliative care to the way in which its volunteer staff are administered.





It was stressed from the very early stages of its design (only three years ago), that the 18,700 sq. ft. hospice was to emulate a residential experience as much as possible, explains architect **Grant Diemert**, of **G.M.** Diemert Architect Inc.

That concept is reflected upon arrival. It's a beautiful stone building (general contractor JP Commercial Contractors Inc.), but its design runs so much deeper than what meets the eye.

Diemert says the design of the building was dictated to a certain degree by the site on which it sits. Its triangular shape was determined mostly by its axis; the line which runs from the street out front to a niche in the Family Room at the back of the building.

"This particular property presented the opportunity to orient the building to the winter solstice," Diemert explains. The vestibule - the first point on the axis - reveals a curved donor wall that leads to the main hall.


"From that point on, you can't walk on its axis, except for short distances here and there," says **Wendy Bye**, the project's Interior Decorator.

"The architecture actually reflects a journey, if you care to interpret it that way," adds Diemert. "Significant spaces and functions occur along the central axis: the protective canopy at the exterior vehicle crossing, the entrance vestibule, the kitchen within a double height space lit with clerestory windows, a skylight feature, the nursing station, an empty niche and finally, the family room with its culminating box bay window."

A journey through the building's corridors channels one back and forth across the axis to spaces such as the residential rooms or the quiet rooms where families can gather.

Bye compares these spaces to eddy points at a river's edge, causing one to turn or pivot back out onto the path. "Every time you make a turn, you find a calming spot," she explains.

The first example of an eddy point can be found in the main hall of Chapman House, aptly named for the family behind Canada's largest independent ice-cream maker, which generously donated \$1 million towards the project. Bye's vision saw that people could find tranquility in the kitchen with its beautiful floor-to-ceiling living wall that functions as a bio-filter.

Stone counters in earth tones sit atop the large island in the atrium kitchen café. The

cabinetry is a mix of blonde and dark woods and a pop of colour comes from the blue tiled backsplash, mimicking the colour of the water around the Scenic city.

"The kitchen acts as the focal point for the community of the building and it must be part of the initial experience and impression of the facility," Diemert says.

As with many homes, the kitchen is where people congregate and it was the designer's hope this space is one where strangers come


together and find comfort in one another while at the hospice and in the difficult days ahead.

A dining and sitting room are located to the right of the kitchen, serene in design with cool blues and soft beiges. Close by, local art lines the wall adjacent to the hospice's classroom - a space Betty Boice, Manager of Resident and Family Care, hopes will be the hub for excellence in hospice palliative training for the community as well as an integral component in the hospice's outreach program.

From there, wide, angled corridors filtered by natural light, lead to the first of the nine resident rooms (only eight of which are funded).

Both Diemert and Bye toured other hospices in Ontario to understand the technical requirements of such a building.

"The tall order provided to designers, Wendy and myself in particular, is that it's a highly-charged environment; very emotional. And if you think about it, it may be the last building these people are ever going to go in," explains Diemert.

Bye decorated each room to provide the comforts of home for those staying in their final days. Each bed is adorned with a beautiful, handcrafted quilt. The colours on the walls are calming in nature and every detail, big and small reflects that calmness. Each room has soft, dimmable lighting. Roll out patio doors allow residents to be outside and take in the beauty of the hospice's surroundings.

With this in mind, Diemert referred to the importance of two walls that he fought to have built on either side of the hospice. He admits they hold very little function other than to pay homage to the concept "paradise is a walled garden."

"Culturally the solstice, the notion of paradise, and the relationship to public and private, are cultural things that persist in buildings and our behaviour all the time," he explains. "I felt it was important to heighten that; you're in another realm; you've stepped through that threshold."

Another addition to each of the residents' rooms is a separate bedroom that accommodates loved ones with closet space and storage to hang their personal belongings. Moreover, floating shelves allow space for each resident to display special memorabilia and precious photographs.

"We wanted to make the space feel as comfortable as possible for families too," says Bye. "It's their experience that they carry forward." Continued on page 82


Three other examples of eddy points in the winding journey through the hospice can be found in the Quiet Room, the Family Room and the Kids' Room - special spaces where families can gather and gain a sense of normality during a time far from it. The Quiet Room, for example, is very non-traditional in shape. Its angled wall reinforces Bye's metaphor about providing a calm feeling before continuing the journey through the hospice.

Throughout the hospice, doorways are wide enough to accommodate beds if residents wish to be wheeled throughout the facility. For instance, the Kids' Room provides ample space for a resident to be wheeled in to visit with young members of their family as they play in the brightly-coloured space, complete with an animalthemed mural. The room has toys, craft stations, game consoles and a reading nook. Continued on page 84


Each room is equipped with its own ventilation system. Although the building functions electrically and mechanically like a hospital, the rooms reflect the comforts of home instead.

"That was the purpose," Diemert explains. Other hospices Diemert and Bye toured were designed to look like houses, and he says they had to keep in mind that a hospice is not a house.

"There is a special set of criteria and medical problems that come along with this process," he remarks. Both the architectural and interior designs were rendered a number of times along the way, incorporating the donated products as they came forward throughout the process.


"Really everything we looked at, we did so as a wonderful gift," says Bye. "The building was built without government funding, relying solely on donations. We took ideas from others, but we wanted to make sure our ideas worked best with our space, our community and our residents." Continued on page 86

The Nursing Station and Family Room are examples of spaces that follow the light-filtering axis, along with rooms on the second level of the hospice.

Those rooms include two meeting rooms – a public meeting room and the boardroom. Windows on either side of the boardroom allow a view into the front of the hospice and the nursing station – bridging the public to the private.

"The windows are deliberate," says Bye. "It reminds the board, I hope, of their overall responsibility." **OH**

INK TRANSFER TRIVETS

Add some decorative interest to your table setting, while protecting your table at the same time. These pretty wood trivets are so easy to make and you can choose practically any image you'd like!

MATERIALS

Milk Paint (optional)

Inkjet printer

Wax paper

Metal ruler

X-Acto knife

Self-healing cutting mat

Wood planks (we've used maple)

Credit or club card

Felt pads

A computer image of your choosing (we've used images from The Graphics Fairy). Visit ourhomes.ca/mag/trivets for image links.



How-To:

- Cut your wood into five-inch squares, or whatever size that's right for you. Sand wood squares until smooth and round off the sharp edges and corners.
- If you'd like to give your wood a paint wash, like we've done with ours, do so now and allow to dry overnight before transferring your image.
- Using your X-Acto knife, ruler and self-healing mat, measure and cut your wax paper to 8.5-inches-by-11-inches. The more precisely you cut your wax paper, the better the chance it will feed through your printer.
- Adjust your computer image to the appropriate size for your piece of wood. You'll also need to reverse the image before printing, so that it's facing the right way once transferred to the wood.

- Print your image onto the wax paper. If your wax paper has only one waxy side, be sure to load the paper correctly so that the image prints on that side. It may take a few attempts to get it to print properly, so it doesn't hurt to have a few extra pieces of cut wax paper.
- Acting quickly and carefully, place the wax paper, wet side down, onto your piece of wood. Be very careful not to let it move once it's touched the wood or it will smear. Take your card and run it over the wax paper. Carefully pull the wax paper off of the wood.
- Attach four felt pads in the corners, on the bottom side. Voilà! Your wood trivet is complete and ready to protect your table with style. **OH**

Note: We've chosen not to put a finish on our trivets. If you decide you'd like to add a finish, choose something that is not wax-based or it will transfer to the bottom of your hot pots and dishes. A natural oil finish may work best. Ask your local hardware store for advice on the best finish.


