

STAYING

AND OTHER WAYS TO KEEP IT TOGETHER

Interior Designer **Dolores Pian** shares her ideas.



Feeling stressed because you're surrounded by stuff? That stuff can actually make you happy, if it's efficiently and artistically displayed. And when organized properly, you can grab and go. Technology has helped reduce or eliminate the need for some stuff, like books and record albums, but we still need to store the items we do collect.

Storage, home organization or space solutions - whatever you call it - has become a science using the latest technology. For

example, hardware supplier Richelieu has teamed up with Panasonic to create revolving closet systems and shelves that pull down and return pneumatically, providing innovative ways to make our lives easier.





START RIGHT - GET ORGANIZED

Whether you're living in a tiny studio or a mansion, many of the same rules apply when it comes to getting organized:

Purge: Get rid of things you don't need or that don't give you pleasure in some way.

Learn to make sacrifices: In a small or large space, every object matters. Make choices and focus on priorities.

Inventory items that need storage and display: Determine what type of storage or shelving you need. Make this scientific by calculating how much linear space and square footage

Design and plan: Plan where these items are going and then find the design solutions you need to maximize and beautify your space.

DIVIDE AND CONQUER

Storage is designed in three style categories:

DWR: Kai Shelving High

DWR: LineCredenza

DWR: Story

1. In sight and in mind.

Open shelving allows us to see what we own, defining our unique personalities. Freestanding or bolted to the wall, shelving is simple. The structure itself can be a design feature, elevating your simple objects into things of beauty.

2. Out of sight and out of mind.

Closets or storage rooms are enclosed empty spaces. You

can add rods or shelving to suit your requirements. People are now choosing to turn closets into dressing rooms, enclosing items in cabinetry and revealing only what's most precious and notable through glass cabinets. If you own shoes, purses, belts or ties that are beautiful and cost a pretty penny, then why not put them on display like an art object in a glass case?

3. Combining in and out of sight.

Say we've opted for open-plan spaces instead of separate rooms for our functions. Even kitchens are now blended in, requiring special thinking on how to manage all its requirements. While one-room living reveals all, do we really want to show off everything?

Storage credenzas, shelving and wall units can act as freestanding room dividers to delineate space. One company that provides unique items is Design Within Reach (DWR). RESEARCH PHASE:

GOOD THINGS COME TO THOSE WHO WAIT

Looking to renovate a room or two? Want to refresh your space before a big event? No matter the size or style of project you're planning, this guide will help you know how long you really need to achieve your home makeover – and trust me, it's nothing like what you've seen on television.

Start by gathering lots of ideas. Save images from magazines and blogs - the more you collect, the easier it will be to figure out what elements you are drawn to again and again, and which are fleeting trends. Give this 1-2 months at the very least to find ideas that stand the test of time.

Television often portrays renovations as costing much less than they do, so it's important to determine what you want to spend and what your dream design will cost. Starting with a realistic and honest budget (with padding for emergencies) will help you and your designer avoid big surprises later that can end up halting your plans.

> Make sure to check with local building codes, inspectors, condo or neighbourhood boards (and the like) to make sure your dreams are possible. This can take just 1 week to 3 months, depending on your site conditions, so it's smart to start early.



Renovating a kitchen or bathroom? Besides selecting the basics like paint colours, you'll need to choose the grout colour, tile pattern, orientation of cabinet handles, paint finish, placement of light fixtures, style of faucet, counter edge profile... the list goes on, and can seem overwhelming when rushed. Give at least 6 weeks to 2 months for one room, and at least 4 to 6 months for a large multi-room project. Choosing many elements that work together can take a lot of searching and re-evaluating, and it's much easier to change your mind before construction or delivery than after.

Don't forget that not all products or tradespeople can be available instantly, especially around busy seasons like spring. If you want to work with the best materials and trades. add at least 1 to 2 months extra, with custom products or anything shipping from overseas taking 2 to 6 months. Don't get stuck picking from what's available last-minute for a design that will last for years!

Expect even minor construction to take at least 1 month to prepare, conduct and touch up, with 2 to 6 months for larger projects. Then add a time buffer of 1 to 3 months before any sort of event when you want the work completed, to account for surprises.

In this detached basement bathroom renovation, for example, we had very low ceilings (just under six feet) and only a single sconce above the vanity mirror, not providing nearly enough light for the entire space. We had planned to increase the ceiling height and add recessed lighting. During demolition we discovered venting all through the above area and no room for pot lights. We required a bit of time to come up with an alternative plan, which was this stunning, sleek custom LED feature running from floor to ceiling and overhead. It created ample illumination and is beautiful. The solution also allowed us to hang our new mirror very close to the ceiling, creating the illusion of even more height in the room, and allowing the LED strip to reflect. Fortunately, with buffer time in place, we had the plan reworked for the better, and the beautiful results were worth the extra wait!

If you've been doing the math, you'll see that even small projects can easily take almost half a year, which is far from the three days you see on television. However, you get what you put into your design, and taking the proper time leads to timeless results - all while avoiding a lot of stress and the potential for costly mistakes along the way. Working with a reputable firm can expedite this process and keep you on time and on budget. OH

Customize the height of the ladder to suit your space. These step-by-step instructions create a two-planter ladder.

TOOLS & MATERIALS

Two 6-foot, 1-by-6-inch cedar planks (each 6-foot plank will make one planter box)

One 8-foot, 2-by-6-inch cedar plank

Mitre saw

120-grit sandpaper

Nail gun or hammer and nails

2-inch galvanized wood screws

HOW-TO

Cut box fronts, backs and bottoms:

From each 6-foot plank, cut two 24-inch lengths to be used for the front and back of the planter box, and one 21-inch length for the bottom.

Cuts box ends: Set your mitre saw to 15 degrees. Take the 2-by-6 plank and cut the end 15 degrees. Flip the board and measure 5-1/4 inches along the short edge and cut again with the 15-degree mitre. This will create one end of the planter box. Proceed until you have the four ends cut.

Cut ladder rails: From the remainder of 2-by-6, one end will already be cut at 15 degrees. Measure your finished ladder height (in this case we chose 3 feet for the two-box ladder) and make a cut at 15 degrees along the same angle for the first rail. Repeat for second rail and cut it



to match. To have the back of your ladder sit flush against a wall, measure 2 inches in from the pointed upper tip of each rail and cut perpendicular to the 15-degree surface.

Construct planter boxes: Sand all freshly cut edges to smooth out roughness. Place end pieces long-side down. Place the 24-inch front and back pieces flush against end pieces and nail together. Flip the box right-side up and drop the 21-inch bottom in. Secure the bottom by nailing it to the sides. Repeat for each box.





box from outside

Construct planter box ladder: Lay the ladder rails on the floor and place your planter boxes between the rails at the desired height. Secure planter boxes to the ladder by drilling two-inch screws from inside the planter boxes to the ladder.



Display and grow: Place finished planter box ladder against a wall, fence or deck, fill with potting soil and get growing! OH

ABOUT HAMILTON'S
LOWER CITY.

It wasn't safe, people said. It existed on the other side of Hamilton's not-so-invisible cultural and economical divide. Above the steep slope of the Niagara Escarpment is where people lived in safety and security. The lower city was dark and urban.

Neither of them listened. A little over 20 years ago – long before it was cool – the couple bought a house a block away from the lower city's storied green space, Gage Park. Now, the Mittons have the last laugh.

With their Delta West area home, built in 1923, the Mittons have created their own individualized sanctuary, and it's one that's quadrupled in value since they bought it 20 years ago. They turned a sunroom into a year-round sitting area that overlooks their garden. They created a basement entertainment area with a large TV and a bathroom with heated floors.

The garage doesn't hold a car anymore. It houses Olwyne's home floral business, Lulabelle's Floral Studio (named after one of their two cats). There, Olwyne gives floral workshops and meets with brides about how to add beauty to their big days. Behind the garage is a lounge area where the couple relax on comfortable chairs from Stoney Creek Furniture, surrounded by fragrant flowers and drink wine as they listen to the wafting sounds of music festivals in the park nearby.

They have a spacious front porch where they sit in nice weather. On summer mornings, Olwyne takes her coffee outside and watches newly-awakened neighbours walk their dogs. Hamilton's lower city has been described as a front porch community – one where people socialize by walking down their streets and talking to people on their front porches.

"Living on the mountain, you didn't have a porch," Greg says. "I had a very small porch on Mohawk Road but you didn't really hang out there. Now you sit on it and think 'This is fantastic.'"

In the tale of two Hamiltons, they like the side they've chosen. When they moved to the Gage Park area, "nobody could believe it," Olwyne recalls. "People said, 'Oh my God, you can't go down there. Nothing's down there.'"

"If you grow up on the Mountain, you usually stay on the Mountain."

When friends visit now, she says, "they can't believe there's an area like this."

Greg grew up near Upper Sherman and Mohawk Road; Olwyne near Upper Ottawa and Limeridge.

In her early 20s, Olwyne longed to see the world and get out of Hamilton. She ended up in Vancouver, where she was drawn to floral design. She has a knack for colour, and she liked the idea of making living creations.

After working for a florist in Vancouver, she returned to Hamilton to work for one here. "I wanted to get something with a career, and I wanted to settle down," she says. She and Greg met at a pub at Mohawk Road and Upper Gage, and they married 24 years ago.

Olwyne studied landscape design at Kemptville College, and worked at a pair of Hamilton furniture stores. At Greg's encouragement, she applied for and received a government grant, and about two years ago, opened Lulabelle's to work for herself.

The house made it possible, they say. They moved the contents of the garage into their large garden shed, and turned the garage into a workspace. Continued on page 34

There are still elements that look like a car stall. The door, for example, remains, as does the storage area above where a car would normally be parked. But the pair painted it white, and used their knack for upcycling everyday items. An old filing cabinet, for example, holds floral supplies, as does an old dresser. Small chalkboards bear inspirational messages. The french doors are from Hart Design Centre.

As for the house itself, that's been a 20-year work in progress. They looked at 35 houses back then, Greg remembers, and "this was number 33."

"We wanted an old house," Olwyne says. "A friend bought around the corner, and we fell in love with the area. That's how we ended up looking in this neighbourhood."


The previous owner, they say, used it as multi-residential, so it was divided to house several families. There was even someone living in the garage. The living room was bubblegum pink – a "very 80s" colour, Olwyne says. They have since repainted it cream with an accent wall in light green wallpaper.

When it came to renovations, the kitchen was a pressing matter. Its cupboards were so narrow, Greg says, that they scarcely fit a dinner plate laid flat. They installed cabinets with wider shelves, and as with other rooms, refinished the old hardwood floors through **Berdula**Finished Interiors. Now, a long table serves as an island, and sprigs



and pine cones dot the décor. The range hood that clears the air while cooking came from the **Habitat for Humanity ReStore**

They reinforced the back sunroom and turned it into a year-round sitting area where they can overlook manicured gardens filled with greenery from Harper's Garden Centre. Upstairs, they turned four small bedrooms into three larger ones. They built a second bathroom downstairs with a large glass shower and heated floors. Much of the tile in the house came from Mario's Tile & Interiors. Continued on page 38

Olwyne decided on most of the colours, including the light green in the living room. Much of the furnishings came from Stoney

"Olwyne just sees colour, so she uses her tastes for what the colours should be, even the colour of the dining room chairs," says Greg, who's a biomedical technologist. "She sees it, puts it there and it works."

The gamble of living in the lower city has paid off financially, too. As the Toronto housing market becomes increasingly unaffordable, people there are relocating to Hamilton. Numbers from the Realtors Association of Hamilton and Burlington show that in 2017, the median price of a house in Hamilton's lower city cracked \$300,000. The median price of a home sold there was \$337,250 in 2017, up 22 per



The mimosa is a staple of every brunch, traditionally made with sparkling wine and orange juice. This recipe uses poached peaches for a refreshing twist.

INGREDIENTS

2 cups water

½ cup granulated sugar
½ cup honey

2-3 peaches, halved and pitted

Sparkling wine

Combine water, sugar and honey in a saucepan over medium heat. Stir until sugar and honey are dissolved.

DIRECTIONS

Add peach halves and simmer for 5-10 minutes, turning until tender.

Remove peaches and reduce poaching liquid by half. Put peaches in a small, sturdy bowl and reserve liquid in a separate bowl. Cool both. Using a muddler or the back of a spoon, press peaches against the side of the bowl. Press hard and twist. The goal is to break up the fruit, release liquid and intensify the flavour.

Add a dollop of muddled peaches to champagne glasses, then add a ½ tsp of poaching liquid to each glass.

Top with sparkling wine. он











Growing food is one of the most popular forms of gardening practised today.

Given the ever increasing costs (and lack of nutritional content) of current grocery store produce, it makes sense. Growing food at home is actually pretty easy to do. For example, throwing a tomato plant or two in a sunny spot in your garden, and giving it an occasional watering, will likely produce a few fruits. But for your veggie garden to be truly successful in both health and bounty, a number of requirements must be met.

PLACEMENT

Food gardens need sunshine, but only about eight hours per day. East facing is ideal, followed by south and west. Veggie gardens need not be planted in rows if you prefer free-form arrangement. Add some inexpensive and edible flower seeds such as sunflower and nasturtium to punch up the colour. Be artistic as crops will change year to year so nothing is permanent.

CROP ROTATION

Certain plants are heavy feeders while others actually increase soil health in the areas in which they grow. This makes crop rotation very beneficial to the home garden. For example, legumes fix nitrogen into the soil, so plant cabbage and cauliflower in an area where you previously grew beans and peas. Root crops don't like very rich soil, so plant these in areas previously inhabited by demanding cabbage and cauliflowers.

SOIL

Just as it is with good relationships and sound construction practises, a successful vegetable garden is built upon a solid foundation – its soil! Healthy soil is composed of weathered rock, organic matter, water and air, yet it also contains the magical hidden element of beneficial organisms. Let's take a closer look.

Minerals: Roughly half of soil's composition is made of bits of broken down weathered rock – the vital minerals necessary for healthy plants. The size of these particles determines the texture of soil. Large sand particles are found in sandy soil, medium particles in silty soil and small particles in clay-based soil.

Organic Matter: These are the partially decomposed remains of plant life, soil organisms and all kinds of vegetative matter. Although organic matter makes up only five to 10 per cent of soil composition, it is essential to bind soil particles together, retain moisture, allow air flow and provide food for the allimportant microorganisms. All soil types will improve with an increase in organic matter so add in compost, aged manure or seed a "cover crop" such as annual rye grass, then till it into the existing soil to decompose.

Soil Life: Beneficial bacteria, fungi, nematodes and earthworms are just a few of the important creatures found in garden soil. These tiny beings are imperative to help convert the organic matter and minerals in soil into vitamins. hormones and nutrients plants need for optimum growth. Avoid sterilized commercial soils and composts, pesticides and herbicides. Add in worm compost, home compost or leaf mould to enhance your colonies instead.

PERFECT COMPANIONS

Some plants have similar growing requirements and even grow better when planted together, making them natural allies. Other plants, like people, compete for resources. Many companion planting charts are available online so with a little research you'll find out exactly which of your plants are friends or foes.

THE HARVEST

Every great chef knows each dish is only you'll have an abundance of one crop or have many crops that mature all at once. Don't let those extras rot in place! Freezing and canning are easy and you may end up with enough delicious and nutritious preserves to last you until the following July.

Most mass-grown fruits and vegetables are sprayed with dangerous herbicides and pesticides, planted in depleted soil and shipped an average of 2,500 kilometres before they reach the local grocery store. Even much of our livestock is given loads of antibiotics and an unhealthy diet that then trickles down to us when we consume them. Given the state of the average Canadian's body fat level, coupled with mass vitamin and mineral deficiencies, our bodies are simultaneously both starving and storing fat! However, when the body is nourished at a cellular level, cravings disappear, natural energy is restored and many health problems retreat. Food is the original medicine so why not give a healthful, tasty organic veggie garden a try? on



The just-finished property on the Hamilton mountain, designed by Frank Bandiera
Architect Inc., is on the same site where the homeowners, a Hamilton couple and their four now-grown sons, have lived since 1996.
As their children approached adulthood, the couple decided to tear down the original family home and create something built for the next chapter in their lives with the help of Marcel Poirier Custom Built Homes and Emilio Violin of Violin Contracting.

During the planning stages, the couple kept coming back to Frank Lloyd Wright's Martin House in Buffalo. "Not that our house looks like a Frank Lloyd Wright design from the outside, but I was inspired by quite a few things at the Martin House," the homeowner says.

"First, the windows are such an important part of the Martin home," she notes. In Wright's design, ample, detailed glasswork makes for a light-filled home and also provides an interior focal point. The same is true in this home thanks to strikingly tall and carefully crafted windows by Kolbe Windows & Doors that run most of the length of the home's south side overlooking the backyard.

There's plenty of natural light in the bedroom, living room and kitchen for most of the day. Remote-controlled blinds from **Girgenti Custom Window Treatments** offer shade and privacy when needed. In each room, the windows blur the line between the pared-down, peaceful indoor space, with interior design by **Jan Speziale** and **Shannon Thompson** of **Barnard & Speziale**, and the sculpted backyard featuring

a rock garden and vegetable patch designed by landscape architectural consultant **Lyn Glanfield Bravo** of **Lyn Glanfield Inc.** and built by **Dykstra Landscaping**.

"My oldest son has a friend in the Bruce Peninsula so he arranged for and trucked down 40 tons of these rocks," the homeowner says about the weathered boulders in the rock garden. "They came with little plants and moss growing on them, which helps them look like they've been here forever." He wanted to contribute to the project, she added, and has now started a business supplying it through **Wildewood and Stone**.

An outdoor kitchen, complete with pizza oven, and a deck that spans the length of the home's backyard, which also features furniture by Toja, plus a nook for a fitness spa, helps to further blend the outdoors with the indoors.

So does the homeowners' extensive collection of Canadian art, featuring bold and colourful natural or outdoor scenes. Much of the collection was purchased from the **Art Gallery of Hamilton** and local artists. Other works are on loan in the home with the help of **Mylene Farion** from the AGH.

Another hallmark of Wright's Martin House, and something the family wanted to capture in their new home, was a sense of craftsmanship and pared-down ornamentation. Interior finishing contractor Emilio Violin, who designed all the millwork in the house, says the Mountain Brow home is frill-free and intentional in much the same way. "Every line in here has a purpose," Violin says. "There are clean, simple lines throughout the house, and each room has its own finishes and transitions."

Also like the Martin house, this home embraces open-concept living. Where doors were needed, such as on bedrooms, they were sourced from **Turkstra Lumber** along with the trim throughout the home.

"We have a big extended family, and maybe the four boys will all have families of their own, one day," the homeowner says. "We like to entertain and we tend to be something of a hub, so we wanted a space where everyone could be together, even when there are quite a few of us."

The formal dining room was removed from one of the original floor plans in favour of a more casual eating area between the kitchen and the living room. The custom black walnut pedestal table by Millbank Family Furniture, however, lends a sense of occasion and is big enough that the entire extended family can usually take a seat around it. The kitchen, with its cabinetry by **Crescent Cabinet Co. Ltd.** and granite counters from **Granite By Design Ltd.**, is timeless and pared down. It was designed with function in mind and as the backdrop for everyday life as well as special gatherings. "The kitchen's always the spot where people end up," the homeowner notes. "I love that even if we're in here, we're still connected to whoever is in the family room. We had everyone here this past Christmas and for the first time I can remember, all the kids were in one place with the entire family. It was fantastic."

To help make open-concept living more practical, the family created a combination kitchen extension, similar to a butler's pantry, and mudroom. There's also a walk-in pantry in the nook and an oversize closet. "We built this home with lots of storage space," says the homeowner. "We did get rid of a lot of things when we moved to build the house, too, but we wanted to make sure we had a place for everything." In particular, that meant a spot on the main floor for everyday items. "In our old home we had a pantry in the lower level, but that gets a little harder to manage as you age," she adds.

The mudroom area is also the main access to and from the garage, with a discreet staircase down to the lower level. "The boys and their friends tend to come and go. With this side entrance and access to downstairs, they can have their own space and we can have privacy, too," the homeowner says.

It's also the perfect solution to the challenge of dirt tracked in from the garden, since the family will plant and grow a wide range of greenery and vegetables in the backyard. At the moment, one of the rooms in the lower level is serving as a temporary potting station until a mini greenhouse outside can be outfitted with geothermal heating, so there's lots of dirty foot traffic to keep tucked off to the side.



Often located adjacent to the garage, the mudroom can become the primary entrance in many homes and is a high-traffic area. It's the last place you see when you head out for the day and the first space that greets you when you return (and perhaps the first space guests will see as well). Therefore, the mudroom should be designed with the utmost utility in mind to meet the specific needs and requirements of your household. Walking in and out of a tidy, organized and functional space creates a welcoming and comforting environment that can help calm your nerves and reduce stress.

Whether you're redesigning your current space or starting from scratch, here are some considerations when designing a mudroom:

MATERIALS

As the name suggests, the space should be designed with durable materials and finishes that can withstand the dirt, mud and snow. A non-porous hard floor surface, such as porcelain or luxury vinyl tile, is easy to mop and requires minimal maintenance. Just avoid light-coloured grout.

Consider hard-wearing wall finishes (the matte paint trend is not suitable for the mudroom). Wall tile, wood panelling and many wallcoverings are resilient and easy to wipe.

Be mindful of uneven surfaces and heavy textures where dust and dirt can settle and become difficult to clean.

Radiant floor heat is worth the investment in the mudroom as it helps to keep the space warm and dry in the cool, damp months and is a welcome treat for cold toes.



BLACKBERRY SHORTCAKE

with BOURBON CARAMEL

Go above and beyond with this modern upgrade to an old classic: the shortcake. Light sponge cake is layered with mascarpone whipped cream and topped with decadent blackberries with a hint of bourbon.



RECIPE AND PHOTOGRAPHY

JENELLE MCCULLOCH

Sponge Cake

For this super simple sponge cake you will need two 6-inch round baking pans.

INGREDIENTS

5 large eggs at room temperature

1 cup + 1 Tbsp cake flour, sifted

½ cup + 1 Tbsp granulated sugar
pinch of salt

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 340°F. Butter and flour sides and bottoms of baking pans. Cut out two 6-inch rounds of parchment paper and line the bottom of each pan. Set aside.

In the bowl of a stand mixer, combine eggs, sugar and salt. With the whisk attachment, beat on medium/ medium-high speed for 15-20 minutes until pale and fluffy. The mixture will be firm and will form soft peaks when ready. In batches, slowly sift in flour and carefully fold the mixture by hand to combine. Be careful not to overwork and deflate the batter.

When combined, divide the mixture evenly in the two prepared pans and bake for 25-30 minutes. Be careful not to open the oven as the cakes may deflate. The cakes are done when an inserted toothpick comes out clean. Turn off oven. Leave cakes to cool inside the oven for 5-10 minutes with the door propped open. Remove from oven and let cool for another 10 minutes before removing from pans and inverting them onto a rack to fully cool.

Blackberries in Bourbon

INGREDIENTS

2 cups fresh blackberries

- 1 Tbsp bourbon
- 2 Tbsp maple syrup

DIRECTIONS

Combine ingredients in a saucepan. Heat over medium until blackberries begin to render their juices. Chill until ready to use.



INGREDIENTS

1 cup sugar

½ cup water

½ cup heavy cream

1 Tbsp butter

1 Tbsp bourbon

Pinch of salt

DIRECTIONS

In a saucepan over medium heat combine sugar and water. Do not stir, but let sugar dissolve and come to a simmer. Simmer until syrup is a golden, amber colour. Swirl the mixture in the pan if necessary to ensure all of the sugar is dissolved and caramelized.

Remove from heat and whisk in heavy cream. Lower heat to medium-low and return pan to burner. Continue to stir the caramel for another 2-3 minutes.

Remove from heat, add butter and stir. Add the bourbon and salt, stirring again.

Transfer to a heat-safe container to cool. The caramel will thicken as it cools.

${\it Mascarpone Whipped Cream}$

INGREDIENTS

½ cup mascarpone cheese

½ cup superfine sugar

1 tsp vanilla extract

1 cup whipping cream

DIRECTIONS

Combine mascarpone cheese, sugar and vanilla in a small bowl.

In the bowl of a stand mixer, whip whipping cream until light and fluffy.

Slowly add cheese mixture to whipped cream while the mixer is still running. Mix until combined.

TO ASSEMBLE THE CAKE

Layer sponge cake with whipped mascarpone and top with blackberries. Drizzle with bourbon caramel to finish.

Serve cake soon after assembly for best results and cut with a serrated knife – the cake is very delicate. **OH**

MATERIALS

12-by-48inch pine project board 120/220/320 grit sandpaper

Two-inch painter's tape

Chalkboard spray paint

Minwax Wood Finish stain of your choice (we used Early American for our project)

Staining rag

Handles of choice and fasteners (we used drawer pulls)

HOW-TO

Sand both sides of the 12-by-48-inch project board using 120-grit sandpaper.

Wipe the surface with a lint-free rag, and sand both sides again with 220-grit sandpaper. Repeat with 320-grit sandpaper.

Using a staining rag, stain both sides of the board and let dry. For a deeper colour, add a second coat of stain.

Once the board is dry, use the painter's tape to mask off the perimeter and edges of the board to create a border that will remain unpainted.

Spray with chalkboard paint in even strokes on the unmasked portion of the board. Allow the project to dry completely before carefully removing the tape.

Fasten the handles of your choice.

Add a custom message or design with chalk and use to serve.

NOTE: Do not place food directly on the chalkboard surface. We use small, decorative dishes or wax paper for food safety. он


