




So it was very much in character when, after completing renovations on a century home in downtown Hamilton, Frank decided to build a new home for his family of four – wife Patricia and sons, Michael and Daniel – right from the ground up.

In the early days of his career, Frank worked as a house framer. And over the past 14 years, he and Tim have seen their renovation and custom cabinetry business steadily grow through new and repeat clients. While the scope of this new project was big, Frank was more than ready for the work.

"We did pretty well everything you see except for the drywall," says Frank. "I helped frame the house and we did all the flooring, the millwork, the painting, the doors and the electrical."

Building an entire home from the ground up means endless decisions. For Frank and Patricia, the process wasn't nearly as tough as it might have been if it wasn't familiar turf. "The first reno there was a lot of head-to-head with my wife," says Frank. "I learned my lesson." He brought home magazines to work from, and they usually found themselves on the same page. "I'd say we agreed 85 to 90 per cent of the time," says Frank. "We did it once before so we did all the arguing then," he adds, with a laugh.

"We didn't have a designer. Between the both of us we designed the rooms, the layout of the house, all the details. It's a big advantage when you're in the industry, and you can walk through other homes and you really see things and learn what you want."

The customizing and attention to detail started early in the building process. "We found a house design and then I started playing with the lines and redoing the roof because I like the mansard look," says Frank. They built the trusses for the roof at the shop, and installed them after building a scaffold that covered the whole front face of the house.






As well, they raised the main floor of the house by eight inches after they laid the foundation, so the lower level now features eight-foot-high ceilings, even at its lowest points. There's a getaway space downstairs where Frank can spend time with his sons and friends. At the moment the rest of the area is unfinished, housing a laundry room, a well-equipped gym and the kids' play area.

The main open-concept living space includes a family room with a gas fireplace and a feature wall with quartz stone. Hand-scraped walnut flooring runs throughout the area, right through to the kitchen – the real heart of this home.

Tim and Frank were an ideal team when it came to designing the kitchen. "Tim's the details guy," says Frank. "I'm more big picture, so I see the flow of the house. I can tell him I want this kind of kitchen and want this detail and I want that." Frank adds, "And then Tim can tell me things like: 'Okay the door's not

going to open because the dishwasher handle is sticking out too far,' which is good to know before you cut it and build it!"

The oversize granite-topped island created by **Granite Plus** makes it easy for a crowd to gather. "When we built this, I wanted to be able to see everybody, so we can talk and eat together at the same time," says Frank.

The range hood is a focal point of the space, done in the same cream tones as the cabinetry, and featuring intricate carving and staining detail. Tim, who invested plenty of hours crafting the hood, says it's his favourite feature in Frank's home. "I had to redo that hood piece three times because it just didn't look right," he says. "There's a paint and then an antiquing and glaze on there as well." Continued on page 24

That attention to detail and intricate woodwork is evident throughout the house, including upstairs in the master bedroom. "I said to Patricia, 'Why don't we do a built-in bed unit instead of going out to buy the hutch, the armoire, all that?" says Frank, who created floor-to-ceiling built-ins for both the master and the main-floor guest bedroom, made with cherry veneer and a cherry moulding.

The end result is a home that shows the Riccis' personal taste, and also acts as


a showcase for Unique Custom Cabinets + Renovations' business. The details and personal touches make it clear this was a labour of love, and a love of the labour, as well. Ask Frank what his favourite thing about the house is, and he'll reply, "Building it!" He adds, "That was the best part. It's rewarding - you have to have an idea in your head and you see it flourish and see the end result. I would do it all over again, in a heartbeat." он





SUN-FILLED LEMON **CHUTNEY**

This chutney gets better and better over time. In fact, it is best when "aged" from four to six months. Whether you make it for the holidays for gifts or wait until the new year, this tangy grillbuddy is perfect for summer barbecue season. Its spicy, rich marmalade flavour lends zest to grilled vegetables, fish and chicken. Don't be put off by the overnight macerating of the rind, flesh and salt because it's easy: all you do is peel and chop the lemons, combine with salt, cover and let sit overnight.

Because I like this chutney to have extra heat for grilled foods, I add either dried chipotle or hot red pepper flakes, but you can omit these if you wish. Use a small, heavy spice mortar and pestle - mine is cast iron – or a rolling pin to crush the seeds and a micro-grater to grate the fresh ginger.

LEMON CHUTNEY

Makes 4 cups (1 L)

8 thick-skin lemons, scrubbed

2 tbsp (25 mL) pickling or Kosher salt

4 large cloves garlic, minced

½ cup (125 mL) dried currants

½ cup (125 mL) chopped dried apricots

½ cup (125 mL) freshly squeezed lemon juice

½ cup (125 mL) cider vinegar

1 tbsp (15 mL) freshly grated gingerroot

1 dried cayenne pepper, crushed


1 tsp (5 mL) ground cardamom

1 tsp (5 mL) crushed coriander

½ tsp (2 mL) dried hot red pepper flakes, optional

2 cups (500 mL) +2 tbsp (25 mL) packed brown sugar

- Peel: Using a vegetable peeler, remove the zest from the lemons, being careful not to include the white pith. Finely chop the zest. Using a paring knife, cut away and discard the white pith from around the lemons. Coarsely chop the lemons, discarding the seeds.
- Combine: In a non-reactive bowl, combine the zest, lemons and salt. Cover with a clean cloth and set aside in a cool place overnight.
- Cook: In a Maslin pan or large saucepan, combine macerated lemon mixture, garlic, currants, apricots, lemon juice, vinegar,



ginger, cayenne, cardamom, coriander and hot pepper flakes. Bring to a light simmer over high heat. Reduce heat to medium and stir in the brown sugar. Stir constantly until the sugar is dissolved.

- Simmer: Adjust the heat to keep the mixture at a regular simmer and cook, frequently stirring for 30 to 45 minutes, or until the mixture becomes thick and mounds on a wooden spoon.
- Jar: Meanwhile, place four, 1 cup (250 mL) Mason-type jars in a canning kettle. Cover with water and bring to a boil. Place 4 flat lids in a saucepan and pour boiling water
- Fill: Skim and discard any foam on chutney. Fill hot jars one at a time, leaving a ¼ inch (0.5 cm) headspace. Wipe rims with a clean cloth, top jars with flat lids and screw on metal rings. Return jars to the hot water bath, topping up with hot water if necessary to bring the water one inch (2.5 cm) over the tops of the jars. Cover the canner, bring water to a full rolling boil and keep boiling for 10 minutes.
- Cool: Turn the heat off, remove canner lid and wait 5 minutes before removing jars to a towel or rack to cool completely. Check seals, label and store in a cool place for up to one year
- Use: Once it has "aged" for a month or more, serve Lemon Chutney right from the jar with baked whitefish (as shown), trout or salmon. You can also mix 1 cup (250 mL) with 3 tbsp (45 mL) chopped capers for a flavourful and different tartar sauce. Mix with orange juice or an equal amount of yogurt and coat chicken before baking. Mix ¼ cup (50 mL) chutney with the same amount of soy sauce and use as a sauce for stir-fried foods. Serve as a condiment for cooked chicken, cold cuts of meat and with a cheese platter or over brie, cream cheese or goat cheese. OH





A couple cans of paint and a dose of inspiration started something of a colour revolution in the Zell family's Greensville home.





When Kirby decided a few years ago to paint her room black with white accents, she and Janet were so taken with how good it looked that they decided to carry the colour scheme through to other rooms in the house, as well.

"It was a bit unique to do a room in black back when we first did this," says Janet. "But we had this big window and Kirby has an oversize mirror too, and both of those things make a huge difference."

The result is a room that's dramatic, and not at all gloomy. White trim emphasizes the windows, black and white curtains add a little fun and bed linens and pillows play with the colour theme.

"We love black because it's a neutral," says Kirby. "We can put any pop of colour with it." She adds, "Different colour trends come around and I can just throw a few coloured things in the room to update it."

Not long after, the family decided to repaint their main living area. When it was time to do the family room – it used to be burgundy and grey – Kirby kept saying, "You need to do black in the family room!"

Not everyone was immediately on board. "Bill's reaction was, 'Are you kidding me?" recalls Janet. "But now he wouldn't change it. None of us would."

"Bill was away the weekend our painters (**Brush It Quality Painters**) transformed the great room," says Janet. "That was probably good."

"We went with a matte finish at first, but after the first coat, it looked almost like a chalk board," explains Kirby. "So then we got the painters to do the next coat in a satin finish and that looked much better."

Even though the colour is dark, the overall effect is anything but. "If you look at the room and consider the cabinets and trim and window and doorways, the black really only borders things," maintains Janet.

Also keeping the room light and airy is the wall of windows running the entire length of the family room and eating area, looking south over the multi-level decks and backyard.

"You do need good lighting if you're painting with black," Janet states. "Lots of it, whether it's something you install or natural light coming in through windows."

A light-coloured floor treatment balances the colour, too. "We chose to put carpeting in the family room," she continues. "The kids spent a lot of time living on the

floor when they were younger, and carpet was a cosy solution. However, there is hardwood in the formal dining room and living room, installed by **Cam Hayes Hardwood Floors Inc.**"

The adjacent kitchen, with glossy white cabinetry, features a peninsula with barstools that are, says Kirby, the most popular seats in the house. "We're pretty much always sitting there. It's the perfect spot to see everything that's going on."

Between the peninsula bar stools, the eat-in dining table and the oversize sofas facing the fireplace, the main, shared space in the house is almost always in use. "I think we're a close family because we all come in here to sit together," says Kirby. Continued on page 38

The other spot where the family frequently gathers is the recently-finished lower level. Here, the colour palette turns significantly softer. Laminate in a sandy grey shade provides a soothing base. At the centre of the room, a cream-coloured sectional sofa faces an eight-foot electric fireplace, surrounded by quartzite, which Bill installed himself. Tucked above and out of sight is a motorized projection screen for movies and television.

It's a natural party zone. The 18-foot-long bar, topped with Caesarstone, is paired with sleek modern cabinetry and backed by a wall inset with display nooks and feature lighting. It's a spot for both entertaining and family gatherings, and the design hits the note the family was hoping for.

"It was originally supposed to be a man cave down here, but we decided we didn't

want that," says Janet. "I think we captured the feel we were after. We wanted it to feel open and really inviting."

The home, both upstairs and down, captures the Zells' style, says Janet. It has sparked the imagination of the family's neighbours as well. Janet and Kirby have taken to lending a little assistance to friends in the area, in need of a little design inspiration.

"I think we take risks where other people don't," suggests Kirby. Janet agrees, and adds, "I think we encourage risk-taking in our design advice too."

And courage, say Janet and Kirby, is sometimes what it takes to make a home look unique and personal. "When you take a little design risk, you create a space that makes a bold statement, but still feels like home because it's just an expression of what you're all about." он



My birdfeeders are a tremendous source of home entertainment. I fancy myself as the Scandinavian Snow White, attracting as much wildlife as I can to my suburban property. The normally barren winter landscape comes alive en masse with the cheerful sights and sounds of assorted songbirds. Attracting feathered friends to your backyard can be as simple as setting out a feeder, but persons who follow the guidelines below will be rewarded with a multitude and variety of bird life!



The Comforts of Home

Birds need a setting that mimics their natural environment to feel safe. Generous amounts of trees and tall shrubs (especially evergreens) are essential for shelter and concealment as they flit from tree to tree in approach of a feeder. Native varieties can also provide food and nesting opportunities. Fowl favourites are: cedar, white spruce, pine, hemlock, cherry, serviceberry, oak, elderberry and honeysuckle.

When taking care of garden maintenance, don't keep things too neat and tidy as birds prefer a naturalistic setting. Designate a rough area and build a brush pile for ground-dwelling birds. Leave those spent blooms of Echinacea and Black-eyed Susans

standing, and they'll provide a natural food source. And when raking fallen foliage, leave some under your trees, and they will be a magnet for insect-eating fowl. Dry leaves double as nesting material as well!

A bird paradise needs a water source, and garden ponds and birdbaths are ideal watering holes. Water will draw all sorts of bird species that don't eat feeder fare. Place them near shrubs with dense branching so the birds have a safe place to dry off when they are wet and vulnerable. Watering in the winter proves a difficult conundrum. A practical solution is to put out a fresh tray of warm water at the same time every day. The birds will quickly learn your routine and adapt.

The Feeder

The ideal bird feeder is sturdy enough to withstand winter, tight enough to keep seeds dry and easy to dismount for important cleaning purposes. It is also best to only fill enough food to be consumed within a day or two to avoid feed moulding/spoilage. Mould creates toxins that are fatal to birds. Therefore, all bird feeders should be frequently cleaned.

Platform Feeders

- They attract the widest variety of seedeating birds but also attract squirrels and chipmunks. Place a baffle on the chain or pole if squirrel feeding is undesirable. These feeders do get dirty as the birds stand on their food while eating, causing fecal contamination. Clean the platform bottom frequently to keep it sanitary.
- Window feeders entice smaller bird species, but like the platform feeder, it also needs constant cleaning due to fecal food pollution. Luckily, they are easy to access and bring the birds up-close for your enjoyment.

The Fare

 Black oil sunflower seeds provide nourishment to a broad range of bird species, but by offering Nyjer seed, Safflower seed, suet and various fruits and nuts, an even wider range will result. Mixed seed blends can be problematic as aggressive wildlife, such as Grackles and squirrels will quickly empty a feeder looking for a favourite food inside. By offering multiple feeders with different food in each, you will reap maximum bird benefit while reducing waste.


Location, Location

 Place your feeding station close to evergreen trees or shrubs, but far away from the reflection of windows. Or set directly on the window frame or affix to the glass to avoid bird window fatality. By moving the feeder placement periodically, you reduce the risk of contagion under the bird's feeders where waste builds up.
 Many birds are ground feeders and just as the feeder needs housekeeping, so does the area below the feeder.



- Hopper/House feeders can look great and offer convenience in that they can hold enough seed to last for several days. Unfortunately, the seed within can be prone to mould and spoilage.
- Tube feeders often attract smaller birds while excluding larger, more aggressive species. Similar to hoppers, they can hold enough seed to last for several days.
- Suet feeders can provide life-sustaining and high-quality calories during a harsh winter. Put out only enough to be consumed in a day, and you will also avoid attracting skunks and raccoons.
- It is a common misconception that by feeding the birds year round it will disrupt their migration. In Canada, we have many bird species that stay year round and could use your assistance for winter survival. Give them an extra helping hand by installing a roosting box or two, thus protecting them from frigid seasonal temperatures. OH


FOWL FACTS

- By attracting birds your yard will also greatly reduce pest insect populations as most birds (and some exclusively) eat insects.
- A bird-friendly yard is one without chemical pesticide and herbicide. These chemicals get injected into the food chain and harm our bird populations, but sadly the worst scourge affecting fowl is household felines killing up to 3.5 billion per year in North America alone.
- Be cautious when cutting your lawn or pruning vegetation. If you do find a nest, have patience. It only takes about two weeks for the babies to hatch and fly away!
- Never offer birds bread crumbs or other baked goods. They are especially prone to mould and also don't provide the proper nutrition.
- A number of factors trigger the urge for birds to migrate, but the most significant one is day length.

LIGHTBULB ORNAMENTS



Don't toss your burnt-out light bulbs - re-use them to create adorable decorations for the holidays. They make a unique, handmade gift. Fill them, wrap them or paint them!

FILL: When your bulbs are empty, fill them with anything you like. We've used crystals, pearls, lace, paper confetti and curled paper. To make the paper confetti, simply use a hole-punch and some pretty, decorative papers. For curled paper, cut the paper into thin strips and curl with scissors. You'll need to wind your strips tightly around a pen or wood skewer to get them through the neck of the bulb.

WRAP: Wrapping your bulbs is quite simple and they don't have to be empty. We've chosen to wrap ours with twine and yarn.

Visit our ourhomes.ca/mag/orns for a link to a great video tutorial that will guide you through the steps of emptying a light bulb.



Start with a dab of hot glue at the base of the metal neck and attach one end of your twine or yarn. Continue wrapping and gluing until the entire bulb is covered.

PAINT: For the painted bulb you'll need some multi-surface or glass paint in the colours of your choice. Once your bulb has been emptied, squeeze in some paint, cover the opening with your finger and shake the bulb until the paint has coated the entire inside. Hold the bulb upside-down over a paper towel and tap out any excess paint. Leave to dry over night.

To finish off your ornaments, attach a hanger. We've chosen wire and twine. You can also paint any exposed metal necks that have not been wrapped with twine. For your filled ornaments, you'll need to close off the tops to prevent the filling from spilling out. Wrap the twine around the top, attaching with some hot glue as you go along.







