Interior Designer **Dolores Pian** shares her ideas.

Tile. This all-purpose material used on floors, walls and ceilings, in wet or dry locations, as decoration or as a versatile workhorse, is available in a variety of shapes, sizes, colours and textures. Today's manufacturers have the shocking ability to mimic concrete, brick, wood, marble, carpet, wallpaper, sand – you name it – in ways that look more real than real. The options are endless.

Here's what you really need to know when choosing the riaht tile.

PIANNING

Research online to see the many possibilities. Know what you're looking for to make purchasing easier.

Have a floor plan. The size of the room and its intended use will dictate what's possible.

Determine your colour scheme. Bring home a sample tile to make sure it coordinates with other elements.

Explain to your contractor what size and type of tile you're using. The size and weight of the tile affects the application and labour costs.

Plan and start the tile layout from the room's centre line and work outward, balancing the pattern and minimizing odd pieces.

MINI TO MAXI

Tiles can be as tiny as ¼-by-¼-inch or super large at five-by-10-feet.

The size and condition of a floor or wall will determine what size suits your space best. Uneven surfaces and curves have different size and installation requirements than do large, flat surfaces.

TILE VOCABULARY

Application: What is the tile's intended use? High or low traffic? Floor or wall? Wet or dry? Answer these questions before making your final choice.

Ceramic: Stoneware body with a surface application of colour or texture. Highly decorative and mostly used for walls.

Porcelain: Made from fine white compressed clay, fired at a high temperature to create a dense tile, impervious to moisture. It has colour throughout the tile so that if chipped, the surface colour appears in the body of the tile.

Glass: Made of glass where colour lies behind or throughout the body of the tile.



Mosaic: Individual small tiles, purchased on mesh sheets 12-by-12-inches to 118-by-118inches. Can be easily cut to size. Perfect for inside and outside curves.

Large Format: 141/2-by-141/2inches or larger.

Specifications: Technical information including intended use, material composition, country of origin and LEED certification. Always read your specs to know what you're buying and how to maintain it.

Matte Finish: Non-shiny surface, easy to walk on, slip resistant.

Polished Finish: Shiny surface and slippery.

Stacked Pattern: Tiles are aligned to form a repeating grid pattern.

Staggered Pattern: Joints are not aligned. Each tile requires different offset spacing depending on size.

THE FINISHING TOUCHES

Grout: Filler used between tiles allowing for flex. The tile setter can make minor adjustments along the way.

Grout Size: The space between tiles - 1/8-inch for wall tiles, 1/4-inch for floor tiles. Super large tiles require larger grout lines.

Grout Release/Sealer: Same product, different names. Matte porcelain tiles need to be sealed to avoid the cloudy effect that occurs after wiping off the edges.

Grout Colour: Use as a design element. Match grout to wall colour. Use darker grout for floors. Grout tends to darken with regular foot traffic and cleaning.

Epoxy Grout: Guards against germs. Especially for spillage of bio fluids in kitchens and bathrooms.

SPECIAL PIECES

Trim pieces are usually L or U shaped and cap off tile edges for a smooth, clean look, making it easier to clean. They come in a variety of finishes and colours. Most pros like to use the Schluter System, available in any large hardware store.

Super large tiles covering a large surface require expansion joints. All structures and materials expand and contract. Planning a strategic cut will make your super-size tile age gracefully with no cracking over time.

Now that you have the right information, you'll produce the right solution for you and your special project. он

Pine cones dipped in clean-burning soy wax are an eco-friendly option to get your home fires burning. Leave them white or colour the wax and they become seasonal décor.

TOOLS & MATERIALS

Soy wax flakes, 2 lbs.
Pine cones, 10-13
Candle dye blocks, colours of your choice (optional)
Wired candle wicking
Wooden spoon
Small double boiler
Wax paper
Tinfoil
Knife
Scissors

NOTE: Any materials used in this project should not be used again for food preparation.



HOW-TO

PREPARE WORKSPACE

Cover your workspace with tinfoil to protect the surface from dripping wax – dipping will get messy!

Use wax paper to cover an area for pine cones to cool between dips.

Add water to the bottom of a double boiler and fill the top pot with wax flakes. Place on stove burner and gently heat until wax is fully melted, stirring occasionally.

Using a knife, shave off small bits from wax dye blocks, add to your hot wax and stir until completely melted and blended.





The colour will look much lighter once cool. Test your colour by dripping wax onto wax paper and allow to cool. It doesn't take much dye to colour the wax, so add small amounts at a time until reaching the desired colour.

Once satisfied with the colour, remove from heat and allow your wax to cool for 15-20 minutes before starting to dip. While wax is cooling, wrap pine cones

While wax is cooling, wrap pine cones with wicking.

WICK PINE CONES

Cut wicking into 12-inch lengths.
You may want them longer,
depending on the size of
your pine cones.



Fold each piece of wicking in half. Tie a small loop at the fold to use both as a wick and to hold the cones while dipping.

Place the loop on the tip of a pine cone and begin wrapping each length in opposite directions around and between the scales. Finish by tucking in the ends (use scissors to push ends in).





Hold each pine cone by the wick loop and dip completely into the wax. If the pine cone is tall, turn on its side and use a wooden spoon to help fully coat the pine cone with wax. Remove the pine cone from the wax and allow excess wax to drip into the pot. Set on wax paper to cool for 10 to 15



minutes between each dip.



Repeat the dipping process three or four times until you're happy with the amount of wax on each pine cone.









After they dry, break off any excess wax from the bottom of your pine cone before dipping again. Recycle these pieces when you reheat your wax, which you will need to do once or twice during the process as the wax cools.

TIP: If the wax looks lumpy on the pine cone, fix it by heating the wax to a higher temperature and re-dipping the pine cone. You may need to give the pine cone an extra dip to rebuild the wax.



Once you're happy with the amount of wax on your pine cones, hold each pine cone upside-down and dip the tops to finish them off.

Allow pine cones to fully cool before transferring to a display container.



FIRE AWAY

When ready to use the fire starters, build a base of paper and dry kindling, then simply light the wick and place the pine cone under the kindling. Using two or three will start a roaring fire. Stay warm!

Looking to simplify your holiday style? A minimalist Scandinavian style Christmas may be just the kind of uncomplicated holiday décor you are craving. Quiet your mind and transform your home into a chic winter wonderland without the Christmas chaos!

Nordic peoples know firsthand what a real winter is, making Scandi-style a natural fit for gorgeous Yuletide décor. It is rustic, minimalist and cosy all at the same time. Natural woods, a black-and-white colour scheme and handmade ornamentation provide the framework for a straightforward and inviting holiday home.

THE TREE

Initially, during the Winter Solstice, Norse pagans would bring entire evergreen trees into their homes to celebrate and sacrifice to the god Jul (now recognized as "Yule"). These massive evergreens were called Yule trees and it was believed that the spirits of the trees would bless the home's inhabitants and provide mystical protection from night-faring spirits during those darkest of days.

The current Scandi-style Christmas tree is humble by comparison. A modest evergreen simply placed in a woven basket or other unassuming vessel is all that's needed! Better yet, choose a few different sized trees, then group or smatter throughout your home for extra holiday allure (and possibly some additional mystical protection). There is a freshness found in the bare, standalone branches or add in just a few simple ornaments for hints of embellishment. Below the tree, instead of a typical tree skirt, place a faux fur rug or woolen mat. Add a few more woolly throws throughout your home for further cosiness. You'll be surprised how much warmth these can add to a space.

THE TRIMMINGS

Anything found in the forest (and sometimes your own backyard) lends well to Nordic style. Let nature be your inspiration! An artfully placed stack of logs, a set of plain vine wreaths or a wooden bowl filled with pine cones all fit in seamlessly. A single windswept branch with a few berries placed on the fireplace mantel may be all that's necessary as minimalist is the motto for classic Northern flavour.

THE TEXTURES

Handmade decorations and gift-wrappings made of natural materials such as fabrics, paper and jute offer the subtle textures required for any well designed composition. Simple cutouts of stars, snowflakes and hearts are classic shapes associated with Scandinavian flair. These can be used in lieu of a table runner, as gift tags or hanging ornaments. For the more adventurous sorts, 3D snowflakes can have just as many variations as do the natural ones. Fun to create and captivating when grouped and hung from a chandelier, these can be tied to a gift or anywhere else you need a bit of joy.

THE TABLE

A festive table comprised of a limited colour palette allows for appreciation of form and lets the all-important meal take centre stage. Layer on the whites, from linens to tableware, to achieve a gorgeous monochromatic effect. Tie a spruce twig with a simple ring of twine to create the perfect rustic napkin ring, adding a hint of holiday without going over the top. Plate garnishes made of evergreens are the perfect accessory as spruce, pine and cedar are all edible. Let your imagination run wild! Don't neglect the kitchen either as family often flocks here. Display your baking triumphs alongside their pretty forms and the cookie cutters, too. Finish off both areas with lots and lots of plain white taper candles in various sizes for a magical celebratory feel.

Growing up, my relatives would often joke that "everyone knows Santa Claus comes from Finland." Given my Finnish heritage I experienced this holiday style and subsequent traditions first-hand and well before its current popularity. Yet over time I still succumbed to the glittery charms of Christmas and collected a multitude of plastic ornaments and greeneries. But as so often happens, priorities change and life comes back full circle (along with some major recycling). Back to my roots, I have again found my forever holiday style of choice. OH



BUILDING HISTORY

It was late afternoon one snowy January day in Dundas in 2016.

Ancaster resident Linda Pembroke was picking up her husband Steve Bruton of Heritage Construction

when she spotted a "for sale" sign peeking out of a knee-high snowdrift on South Street. "For some reason, I just knew we had to go back and look," Linda recalls. "It turned out to be a lot for sale, severed from the neighbouring property that's been here since the 1800s." Continued on page 26

At the back of the lot, Steve and Linda discovered an outbuilding and the remnants of a pool. The building dates back to 1833. "It was most likely a kitchen prep area where people would go to pluck feathers off chickens – that kind of thing – for dinner at the main house," Linda says. Decades later, in the 1950s and 60s, the building served as an impromptu pool house for neighbourhood bathers. One exterior wall was even painted white for summer evening movie screenings.

That sense of history, combined with the town's particular charm, appealed to Linda. "Dundas has always reminded me of my very British roots," she explains. "It's like a small village outside London with its High Street. So, when I saw the lot I said to Steve, 'I know we can't see much with all this snow, but I really want to live here."

Once they'd purchased the land, the pair had a decision to make. "The biggest and most daunting question for us was 'what shall we build on it?" Linda says. "We were very mindful of our environment, the older properties on the street and Dundas itself. We wanted to build something that blended in and that's why we gravitated toward the Georgian style."

That era's influence meant a return, in part, to separated main-floor

rooms rather than one open-concept floor plan. "We were mindful of having the kitchen area and the dining room quite separate, for example," says Linda.


"You talk to people about this kind of home and they say, "Oh, I never use the dining room,' but the way this house flows, it just begs for people to be sitting in the dining room and in the living room," says Linda. "I love it, personally. It's a great space for entertaining."

There's an attention to detail, too, that reflects the period, and lends each room a sense of occasion. The panelling, chair rails, crown moulding and simple coffers all reflect the time period. All the cabinetry by Fijn Woodworking is custom-made for the house, designed to look like pieces of furniture, rather than just doors in the wall.

The three crystal-cut chandeliers by **Avenue Lighting & Design** each reference that Georgian era, too.

Typical of the period, the degree of detail in the home means it looks "dressed" even without furniture, and that influences design decisions. "If you tried to put too many colours and too many styles in a home like this, it just wouldn't work," Steve says. "You lose the continuity of it and it just becomes too busy." So the couple chose a limited palette painted by **Brouwers Painting** and stayed consistent through the entire home with white, pale oak and denim blue.

In the kitchen, that same blue is used for the base of the island – an inviting, oversize workspace that topped Linda's must-have list for her new home. "I love to cook and to entertain," she says, "so I really wanted a big space where I could spread things out and make a wonderful mess, and people could pull up a seat with a glass of wine and just shat."

The island's 2.5-inch wooden work surface in black walnut by Knotty's Woodwork adds warmth and provides contrast with the white cabinets and blue pearl quartz countertops.

Bathrooms in the home are a blend of Georgian style, contemporary comfort and practicality. Vanities were built like washstands so instead of having typical cupboards and doors, they have legs and shelving. Apron sinks in cast iron look like they belong in an older home. But a nod to modern living means bathrooms are also outfitted with contemporary showerheads, spacious claw-foot tubs, elegant modern faucets installed by **Precision Plumbing** and tile flooring by **Barton Bath & Floor** made to look like bleached hardwood planks.

In the living room, the fireplace is a modern twist on an older home's staple. The two-way unit by **HNC Mechanical** is also indoor-outdoor, adding warmth to the living room as well as a cosy seating area on the wraparound porch constructed of cedar from **Aitchison Lumber**. Lumber for the house construction came from Turkstra Lumber.

The breezeway – a one-storey hallway linking the garage with the main living area and housing the laundry and a powder room – is also a nod to the past with its exposed brick feature wall and black-and-white basket weave floor tile.

Eighteen months of hard work and research were worth it to recreate a little bit of history, Steve and Linda say. "We've been asked by visitors what part of the home we added or renovated," Linda says. "So people really feel it looks like a building that's always been here, and that's the very best kind of compliment. Now that we're finished and settled in, it looks like a home that's full of stories and history, and that's exactly what we'd hoped for." **OH**

THE PLACE: Heather Coward is a fan of alliteration. The name of her Locke Street South home décor and gift store LuLu & Lavigne Home **Studio** attests to that fact. But Coward is also big on pursuing passions. That's exactly what she did when she traded a career in advertising to do something more hands-on. She gave up her desk job to take a seat in school again in the late 1990s, studying furniture and design and graduating as an upholsterer. In 2000, she opened LuLu & Lavigne in Toronto, the name a nod to two friends who also changed careers at the same time. What started as a furniture upholstering shop, though, morphed into something bigger. Coward did draperies, sold upholstery fabric and vintage furnishings "to give people something else to look at. Whatever (suggestions) I got from the public I took into account when buying for the shop," Coward says. "Customer feedback continues to drive my purchasing." In 2004, she took another leap and moved to Hamilton at the suggestion of her sister, Cathie. Three years later, she re-opened LuLu & Lavigne on Locke Street where she now focuses solely on retail. It's now the go-to spot for new and vintage home décor and kitchenware, unique gifts, and small-batch lifestyle

> accessories. Coward also sews some of the toss pillows she sells and does the silkscreening for her hugely popular Hamilton tea towels and canvas bags.









THE STYLE: "It's a pretty eclectic mix," Coward explains. Still, she leans toward traditional over modern and "certainly not minimalist." She also loves mixing wood and metal for an industrial look. Her roster of suppliers is big, with Coward buying from at least 80 at any time. "I don't go too deep into lines," she says. "I cherry pick so it goes with my aesthetic of things. I also don't want to stock things I wouldn't feel comfortable paying for."

THE TREND: It's all about warmth and nesting, and finding pleasure in life's simple things. Candles, home entertaining pieces, blankets and jewelry are popular right now. "I feel like a lot more people are entertaining at home and staying home, and they want to be cosied up enjoying their home."

THE NEWS: The store just celebrated its 10th anniversary. "We're pretty excited about that," Coward says. "It's a big milestone."

GET READY TO SELL



Putting your house up for sale isn't just about listing it on the market. Experts say there's more to it than that.

GET FEEDBACK

"I think one of the first things people should do is to get a neutral opinion on their house on what is a good value to add," says Brendan Powell, broker and team leader at the BREL team, Sage Real Estate.

Getting an outsider to give feedback on what could make the house better helps homeowners decide on renovations that will be a real return on investment, he says.

"People often bring us in after renovating," says Powell. "That's usually too late because you can't do anything about it. If you spend \$100,000 on your reno, you can't add that much to the price. Just because you spent the money, it doesn't mean others will see the value, too."

SPRUCF IT UP

Be prudent in spending money, Powell says, but do fix the nitpicky items, such as bathroom or kitchen fixtures, creaky boards or crumbling brickwork.

Quick ways of sprucing up the inside of a house include a good cleaning, decluttering and a new coat of paint, preferably neutral colours, as they allow the house to look spacious and help buyers easily imagine their items in the same space.

Also, focus on getting rid of smells to which your nose is blind, be it cooking spices or pet odours, says Powell.



STAGE IT

If you still have no idea how to go about getting your house ready for sale, says Powell, real-estate agents can help stage or call in a professional stager for help.

Red Barrinuevo, professional home stager and interior decorator at Redesign 4 More says staging not only gives a fresh look to the house, but it also demonstrates effective use of space for buyers.

"If it's a living room, showcase it as a living room and remove other pieces that don't have to be there," he says. "For example, for a living room, all we need is a coffee table, a sofa and some chairs."

Another factor that helps determine a home's value and guides the preparation process for a house is its location. says Barrinuevo.

"If you're downtown, the buyer is probably someone working downtown and looking for a starter home. There, a small room could be staged as an office," he says, adding the quality of the furniture should reflect the value of the house. "If you're selling a house outside the city, an extra room could be showcased as a baby room."

IMPROVE CURB APPEAL

Make sure the exterior of the house is not neglected, Barrinuevo says. "That's the first thing buyers see."

Adding a fresh coat of paint on the garage door, taking care of the front yard and putting garbage bins in the back, instead of front, are just some items on the list. It should tell the buyer the house is well-maintained.

"The outside is like a teaser. If you get off on the wrong foot at the beginning, buyers will look for more faults," he says.

GET GREAT PHOTOS

Both Barrinuevo and Powell agree that once the inside and outside are taken care of, make sure a professional photographer takes the images shared for the listing.

"It has to be of professional quality, because this is one of the most expensive things you're going to sell," says Powell.

CONSIDER AN INSPECTION

Where most people focus on cosmetic fixes, it's also a good idea to get a pre-sale inspection done, says Graham Clarke, president of the Canadian Association of Home and Property Inspectors.

"It allows the homeowner to be aware of what conditions or deficiencies are going to show up when the buyer brings along an inspector," he says.

This helps reduce potential renegotiation after a potential buyer brings in an inspector.

"The more information you can disclose, the smoother the transaction will be and the more realistic the expectations of the buyer," says Clarke.

Some common items homeowners can fix before listing include safety issues that may arise from electrical, water or leakage issues and neglected porches and decks.

And it helps both the homeowner and their realtor understand what the real condition is and set a more realistic price for the market, he says. on

Done wrong, all white can look bland, unwelcoming, institutional. Done right, it looks sleek and modern, or as Sam puts it, "luxurious."

Sam gambled on white and won, but that's not a surprise. At 42, he's making a name for himself as a self-taught designer. And it's a skill that came in handy for his family's four-bedroom, five-bathroom custom home.


"I just love houses," says Sam, who with wife Ashley runs **Lucaria Design**. "It's hard to keep it all inside. It's like a medium walking into a place that's haunted. Everything's stuck inside, and you have to get it out."

Sam discovered his love of design when he was 20. He grew up in Hamilton, the son of a steelworker, and at age 20 bought a rental house near Mohawk College with his two younger brothers.

With today's real estate prices, Sam says, that never could have happened. But it was the late 1990s, and it was still possible to buy a decent house in Hamilton's west mountain for \$135,000. The brothers pooled some money together and the income they earned from renting to students paid the mortgage.

That led to another house, and then another, and another after that. They'd re-finance one to buy the next, and use rental income to pay the mortgage. They sold off most of the homes in 2016 and early 2017, in the thick of Hamilton's housing boom, when formerly \$135,000 homes around the college sold for more than \$350,000. The brothers flipped a few homes over the years, too, and that's when Sam really discovered his knack with interiors. He'd stage the homes when they went on the market, and everyone would ask about the woman they'd hired. Interior decorating and design is seen as a female-dominated profession, Sam says, and people are constantly surprised that he's male.

He began to read books, learn on the internet, and stay up on trends. He built a custom house in Dundas, and with Sam's design work, it gained so much attention that he was asked if it could be used in film shoots.

"From there forward, I thought, 'I'll give this a go,'" he says. "Eventually I told my wife, 'Let's do this full time.'"

Sam's current home is on a quiet residential drive near Ancaster's bustling Wilson Street. They bought the property last year, demolished the one-and-a-half storey house already on it, and built their own. They moved into it in May.

The new home is 4,050 square feet with two storeys plus a finished lower level, and stunning facade by **Euro Stucco Design & Construction**. Sam wanted white for a modern and luxurious feel, but he knew it was important to break up the visuals.

The millwork is key. It forms shapes throughout the house, bordering walls and guiding visitors up stairwells. Sam designed it and hired **David Banko** of **Monticello Carpentry** to build and install it. It took three months, he says, and his family got impatient. "My wife just wanted to get it done so we could move in."

He has wall niches in the upstairs hallway, and a Romeo and Juliet balcony overlooking the front door. When he comes home, he says, he often sees his children – Lucas, 4, and Aria, 2 – peering over it.

There are circles everywhere, from the wall mirrors to the design on the closet doors in the main bedroom. (Sam designed most of the doors, too, some of which were manufactured by Metrie and entered into the company's North American-wide design contest.) The shapes add visual breaks to the white walls, painted by **Summer Sun Painting**, as do the numerous shelves with framed photos of the family. Continued on page 42

SAM'S DESIGN TIPS

HAVE LOTS OF PLANTS

They add warmth to a home, Sam Alaimo says. He has fiddle leaf fig and majesty palm in his home.

CHOOSE TIMELESS TRENDS

Interior design trends change often, Sam says. Right now, frescos are popular, as are cement tiles. It's okay to indulge in trends, he says, as long as they won't look dated years down the road. An example: he has black and white hexagonal tiles from Factory Tile Depot in one of his bathrooms, which will hold up for the next few years.

USE MIRRORS TO ADD SPACE

Sam's home is filled with mirrors, including a large one on the dining room wall, and mirrors by **Thanks Glass** on either side of the living room fireplace. They make a room look more spacious, he says, and when done right, add a luxe look.

DON'T BE OBSESSED WITH MATCHING

Some people tend to focus too much on colour, Sam says. They choose a shade of green, for example, and focus on having everything match it. Good design, he says, is as much about how textures and geometric patterns flow together as it is about colour.

Sam isn't afraid to include either. The shower in the master bathroom has two waterproof speakers tucked discreetly into the walls by **Russell Works Security**. He listens to jazz in there.

"I can't take a shower without music," he says.

The family has two favourite spaces. One is the large kitchen designed by Sam and fabricated by **Baresa Kitchens**. It has 10-foot ceilings and a large island with a Caesarstone quartz counter installed. There, they look out picture windows by **Pollard Windows & Doors** at the backyard and often see deer. The other favourite spot is the covered porch at the back of the house.

There's a fireplace out there with LED lights that illuminate at night. The family barbecues, entertains friends and watches

TV on the porch. When it rains, the kids can still play outside.

"There are many times when I fall asleep out here," he says. "I just sit out here and have a coffee and read a book."

Sam's goal now is to grow his interiors business, branding himself as someone whose specialty is helping people build their custom homes and doing the design. Sam says he can guide the process from permits to completion. He'd also like to do more commercial design.

"I like to walk into somewhere and turn it completely into a spot that anybody would enjoy," he says.

"When people walk in here, they'll talk to my wife. They'll say, 'Great design. I can't believe you did all this stuff.' GINGERBREAD LOAF with BROWN BUTTER ORANGE GLAZE

SPICE UP YOUR NEXT GATHERING WITH THIS WINTER LOAF. WARMING SPICES ARE BAKED INTO THE CAKE AND TOPPED WITH A ZESTY BROWN BUTTER GLAZE.

LOAF

INGREDIENTS

1 ½ cups all-purpose flour

1 tsp nutmeg

2 tsp cinnamon

2 tsp ground ginger

½ cup butter

½ cup brown sugar

1/4 cup molasses

1 egg

2/3 cup milk, warmed

1 tsp baking soda

DIRECTIONS

- Preheat oven to 300°F and line a loaf pan with parchment paper.
- In a medium bowl combine flour, nutmeg, cinnamon and ground ginger
- In a small saucepan over low heat, combine butter, brown sugar and molasses until melted. Add to flour mixture and combine until smooth.
- Beat the egg and stir into the batter.
- Combine warm milk and baking soda together and mix into batter until smooth.
- Pour batter into prepared pan and bake for 60-70 minutes or until toothpick
- Let cool completely before adding glaze.

GLAZE

INGREDIENTS

1 cup icing sugar

¼ tsp vanilla

1 Tbsp brown butter


1-2 Tbsp milk

Zest of one orange

DIRECTIONS

- To prepare brown butter, place butter in a saucepan over medium heat and cook until fragrant and golden brown. Remove
- Combine icing sugar, vanilla, brown butter, 1 Tbsp of milk and orange zest in a medium bowl and mix.
- The glaze needs to be thick and opaque but still pourable. If needed, add more milk to reach desired thickness
- Pour glaze evenly down the centre of cool loaf and let fall down the sides. OH

MATERIALS

Picture frames (new or used)

Primer

High gloss spray paint (colour of your choice)

Sandpaper (fine grit)

Hot glue gun

High test fishing line, 50 lb weight



EMBELLISHMENTS

Pine cones (we used seven)

Cluster of jingle bells

Ribbon, two styles

Plastic Christmas balls (we used seven)

Styrofoam bird

Fresh pine

HOW-TO

Remove glass from frame along with any staples, nails, screws or wire from the back.

Lightly sand the frame, apply primer to one side and allow to dry. Turn over and prime the other side and allow to dry.

In a well-ventilated area, on a drop cloth, spray one side of each frame with two coats of gloss paint, allowing to dry between coats. Repeat on reverse side of frame.

Your frame is now ready to be embellished.





1. PINE CONES AND BELLS

Pick two different textures of ribbon and tie into a shoelace bow. Leave tails that are as long as half the frame. Set aside.

Cut two-foot lengths of fishing line for each pine cone, and tie and knot each strand around the bottom of each cone.

Cut a three-foot strand of fishing line and tie to jingle bells.

Place bells on the floor and arrange pine cones in a staggered fashion above bells. Tie all strands of

fishing line in a knot at the top of the last pine cone.

Set the dry frame against a wall.

Hang bells and pine cones in the frame to the length that you would like and tie to top of frame. Using fishing line, attach bows to the top of the frame.

2. CHRISTMAS BALLS

Repeat steps from previous wreath, using Christmas balls instead of pine cones.


3. BIRD AND FRESH PINE

Using fishing line, hang fresh pine from the top of the frame. Secure bird and bow to frame with a hot glue gun.

TO HANG

Tie a strand of fishing line to the top of the frame and secure to a door-wreath hanger or a small nail. OH

USE A NEW NEUTRAL






FRESHEN UP YOUR WINDOW TRIM


