








#### editor's note

Tile. This all-purpose material used on floors, walls and ceilings, in wet or dry locations, as decoration or as a versatile workhorse, is available in a variety of shapes, sizes, colours and textures. Today's manufacturers have the shocking ability to mimic concrete, brick, wood, marble, carpet, wallpaper, sand – you name it – in ways that look more real than real. The options are endless.

Here's what you really need to know when choosing the right tile.

#### PIANNING

Research online to see the many possibilities. Know what you're looking for to make purchasing easier.

Have a floor plan. The size of the room and its intended use will dictate what's possible.

Determine your colour scheme. Bring home a sample tile to make sure it coordinates with other elements.

Explain to your contractor what size and type of tile you're using. The size and weight of the tile affects the application and labour costs.

Plan and start the tile layout from the room's centre line and work outward, balancing the pattern and minimizing odd pieces.

#### MINI TO MAXI

Tiles can be as tiny as ¼-by-¼-inch or super large at five-by-10-feet.

The size and condition of a floor or wall will determine what size suits your space best. Uneven surfaces and curves have different size and installation requirements than do large, flat surfaces.

#### TILE VOCABULARY

Application: What is the tile's intended use? High or low traffic? Floor or wall? Wet or dry? Answer these questions before making your final choice.

Ceramic: Stoneware body with a surface application of colour or texture. Highly decorative and mostly used for walls.

Porcelain: Made from fine white compressed clay, fired at a high temperature to create a dense tile, impervious to moisture. It has colour throughout the tile so that if chipped, the surface colour appears in the body of the tile.

Glass: Made of glass where colour lies behind or throughout the body of the tile.



Mosaic: Individual small tiles, purchased on mesh sheets 12-by-12-inches to 118-by-118inches. Can be easily cut to size. Perfect for inside and outside curves.

Large Format: 141/2-by-141/2inches or larger.

**Specifications:** Technical information including intended use, material composition, country of origin and LEED certification. Always read your specs to know what you're buying and how to maintain it.

Matte Finish: Non-shiny surface, easy to walk on, slip resistant.

Polished Finish: Shiny surface and slippery.

Stacked Pattern: Tiles are aligned to form a repeating grid pattern.

Staggered Pattern: Joints are not aligned. Each tile requires different offset spacing depending on size.

#### THE FINISHING TOUCHES

Grout: Filler used between tiles allowing for flex. The tile setter can make minor adjustments along the way.

Grout Size: The space between tiles - 1/8-inch for wall tiles, 1/4-inch for floor tiles. Super large tiles require larger grout lines.

Grout Release/Sealer: Same product, different names. Matte porcelain tiles need to be sealed to avoid the cloudy effect that occurs after wiping off the edges.

**Grout Colour:** Use as a design element. Match grout to wall colour. Use darker grout for floors. Grout tends to darken with regular foot traffic and cleaning.


**Epoxy Grout:** Guards against germs. Especially for spillage of bio fluids in kitchens and bathrooms.

#### SPECIAL PIECES

Trim pieces are usually L or U shaped and cap off tile edges for a smooth, clean look, making it easier to clean. They come in a variety of finishes and colours. Most pros like to use the Schluter System, available in any large hardware store.

Super large tiles covering a large surface require expansion joints. All structures and materials expand and contract. Planning a strategic cut will make your super-size tile age gracefully with no cracking over time.

Now that you have the right information, you'll produce the right solution for you and your special project. он

Whether you're looking to bring a leafy green to your home for warm, year-round vibes, or you prefer a different accent hue, these tips for adding liveable colour can help you have fun

with your palette – inspired by this cheerful Toronto Interior Design Group project.



#### GET COMFORTABLE WITH COLOUR

For this project, we wanted to create a look that respected the heritage details of the home, but didn't feel too safe. This meant adding some colour and taking a few strategic design risks, one of which was a cool sectional sofa. The modular style meant being able to use a contrasting upholstery for a few sections, and a neutral fabric for the rest. It also leaves the option open for switching up the look later by rearranging the pieces or changing just a few covers.

Pro Tip: Green is near-neutral enough to withstand changing trends and mix with new accent colours in the future. This colour family in particular is a smart choice for accents you can live with for years to come.

#### USE A NEW NEUTRAL

Enriching your colour scheme doesn't always have to mean tossing in a new bold hue: adding a new neutral to your scheme will make the palette feel more diverse in a BENJAMIN MOORE: Chelsea Gray (HC-168) subtle way. Here, a cool mid-tone grey for the fireplace brick plays against the warm wood floors. This stone shade also helps soften the appearance of the black fireplace surround, plus, it's repeated in a cosy blanket, tying the entire palette further together.







Summer evenings still weave that moonlit magic on Huckleberry Island where Spiros's daughter Nadine and her husband Gary Walters have built a contemporary lake house to replace the aging cottage her father built more than 50 years ago. "In my mind there's nothing more beautiful than Georgian Bay," says Nadine, who has been summering on Huckleberry Island since she was a child. "The rocks, the wind-swept pines. It really is spectacular."

Her father bought a 1.2-acre parcel of rocky Crown land near the southern tip of the island for \$500 in 1964. Although he had never built a house before, using plans he found in the *Toronto Star*, he erected an A-frame cottage. "It was impressive," says Gary. "He built the whole thing with a handsaw and hammer."

Originally from the United Kingdom, Gary loves the outdoors. He had often explored Algonquin Park and sailed Georgian Bay aboard the Island Queen, unknowingly gazing at his future wife's summer cottage, just 100 yards from the Hole In The Wall, a narrow channel between steep granite cliffs that delights youngsters who thrill at diving off the rocks. Gary began coming to the island when he and Nadine were dating. Continued on page 36

Although the original A-frame had served the family well, constant repairs were a losing battle. "It was well past its best-before date," says Nadine. When they realized their sons, Kieran, 14 and Aidan, 15, loved the place as much as they do, they agreed a new cottage would be a good investment.


Nadine and Gary began exploring possibilities for a new summer home atop their sloping ground of twisted, folded granite, sculpted smooth by glaciers, waves and winter ice. "We actually got on the jet skis and went touring around the outer islands and inner islands, looking at various places." Drawing ideas and inspiration from around the bay, they developed a contemporary design with a shed roof. "The intention was to keep it as tight to the rock and as inconspicuous as

possible," says Nadine.

"We wanted it to blend into the rocks," says Gary. "The rocks here are magnificent and we wanted to build it so it, at least in our minds, fit into the rocks and the scenery."

To execute their plans, they hired general contractor Ron Bowman of Bowman **Custom Building**. He had built their neighbour's cottage, one of the first modern summer homes on the island, and came highly recommended. "He was awesome," says Nadine. Gary describes Bowman's work as phenomenal. "The detail, the finishing, the ideas they gave us were all great," he says. Building designer Adam Vokes of Mountainside Design rendered drawings for the project. Construction of the 1,900 sq. ft. home took about six months and was completed last fall. Continued on page 38



Aesthetic, environmental or functional, there are many reasons to let your garden stand tall this fall.

Instead of sanitizing the garden with a complete cut-back and clean-out, let's celebrate architectural value and those subtle hues of decay. Slow down and really look around to appreciate the understated allure in the many sumptuous shades of brown, gold and tan.

For many of us the garden season seems to end in September, but it really doesn't have to. Autumn's beauty is in more than colour-changing tree leaves, and winter's elegance is in more than just the evergreens. The time is now to consider creating fall and winter interest in your garden.

#### **GRASSES**

Grasses are likely the first plant that comes to mind when considering fall and winter. Their feathery or dotted plumage is divine and a lot of colour pop can also be found in their fluffy foliage, even after the freeze. By varying your grass selections you will be rewarded with warm winter browns, golden tans and hints of copper. A few of my favourite grass plants for fall colour are Big Bluestem (Andropogon gerardii), Little Bluestem (Schizachyrium scoparium), Switchgrass (Panicum virgatum), Northern Sea Oat (Chasmanthium latifolium) and Maiden Grass "Ghana" (Miscanthus sinensis Ghana). #### LASTING LEAVES

Many plants retain their dead foliage throughout fall and winter. Just as grasses do, other common garden perennials (such as the common Peony) sport varied shades of golden yellow and red-bronze. A characteristic known as marcescence, some deciduous trees (such as Beech and Oak) even retain their leaves all winter long. In the dead of winter when almost all deciduous trees are skeletonized, the coppery leaves of Beech are still clinging to their branches - a joyful sight to see.

#### SEED HEADS

Seed heads add drama and contrast. Their often very dark brown and spikey kernels can appear jet black. I find this makes one take notice and appreciate all the exciting diversity of shape and texture provided by the natural world. When large perennials are left to stand with their sturdy stalks and branches, architectural interest is achieved. Giant Coneflower (Rudbeckia maxima), large Sedum varieties and Globe Thistle (Echinops bannaticus) top the list for plants with beautiful seed production. Seed heads left to ripen also provide a food source for many birds and other forms of wildlife.

#### WILDLIFE

Leaving perennials to stand welcomes all kinds of exciting creatures. And a garden teeming with life adds a whole new dimension to its otherwise static state. Ground birds, such as the Mourning Dove, appreciate a refuge of thick cover. Furthermore, many beneficial insects, frogs and other wildlife hibernate in leaf litter so don't rake them out. Some of our native solitary bee species overwinter in hollow plant stems, so don't cut them down. You just might be "throwing out the baby with the bathwater," so it is said.

#### GARDEN HEALTH

More than just for aesthetics, leaving perennials to stand actually improves a garden's health. Standing plants accumulate extra snow, which in turn insulates their roots during cold winter temperatures. When that snow melts it also adds extra moisture to the surrounding soil. Plus, the decaying leaves feed soil microbes, making for a healthier soil ecosystem on the whole. Exposure to a certain soil bacteria will make you healthier too. Mycobacterium vaccae acts as a natural antidepressant, activating brain cells that improve mood, increase serotonin levels, reduce anxiety and facilitate learning.




by waiting to cut back your garden until springtime you can cross this chore off the fall to-do list. Then in wintertime, instead of a desolate, lifeless garden cut to the ground, you will enjoy exquisite frosty mornings where every leaf, stem and seed head is encircled with sparkling snow. You'll be captivated by the variance in heights, textures and forms. You may even see a blood-red cardinal pecking at your spent Black-Eyed Susan flowers. But, it is fairly easy and worthwhile to live a greener life. While composting and green bin use isn't always pretty, it may soon become mandatory by municipalities. To help make this job easier, here are some products and tips to help make your green bin experience more bearable, less of a choice and more of a routine.

#### Products

A. BioBag: These bin liners are designed for 35-litre containers and are highly breathable, made of biodegradable plastic and ideal for kitchen waste. BioBag products have a very high penetration barrier against bacteria, viruses, spores and mould.

B. Compost Pail Charcoal Filter: The charcoal filters in these Canadian-made pails absorb odours.

C. Greenlid: No leaks, no smells. This Canadian-made compostable bin boasts that it is leak-resistant.

D. Waste Management Odour Disposer: Using plant-based ingredients safe for kids and pets, this spray rapidly eliminates odour-causing bacteria.

E. Ecolife Odour Blaster: Eliminates odours instead of masking them.

#### Preventative measures:

To avoid those smelly liquids often found beneath your biodegradable kitchen-catcher, layer newspaper inside the bag to soak up any liquids or smells. You can also line the bin with newspaper or egg cartons to catch any spills from holes in the plastic.

Use a smaller bin that is easy to access in your kitchen. The more frequently this bin is emptied, the less likely odours will consume your kitchen. Be sure to wash your small bin after emptying with warm, soapy water.



To prevent a gag-reflex-worthy encounter with pests and bugs, it is best to avoid tossing expired meats or meat scraps in the bin too early in the week. Wrap your meat scraps in newspaper and store them in the freezer until collection day.

In the winter, to keep your outdoor bin from freezing, try spraying the lid lightly with cooking oil.

In the summer, it is best to keep your bins out of direct sunlight, either in the garage or in a wellshaded area. The warmth from sun exposure causes moisture and makes the matter start to decompose and cause odours.

Problem solving:

Use natural cleaners in the bin to get rid of unwanted odours or pests. Sprinkling baking soda, spraying the bin lid with vinegar or cleaning with lemon juice are all appropriate ways to clean your bin without the use of harsh chemicals.

Eliminate odours by spraying the bin with a solution made of 50 per cent water and 50 per cent vinegar.

## GET READY TO SELL

Putting your house up for sale isn't just about listing it on the market. Experts say there's more to it than that.

#### **GET FEEDBACK**

"I think one of the first things people should do is to get a neutral opinion on their house on what is a good value to add," says Brendan Powell, broker and team leader at the BREL team, Sage Real Estate.

Getting an outsider to give feedback on what could make the house better helps homeowners decide on renovations that will be a real return on investment, he says.

"People often bring us in after renovating," says Powell. "That's usually too late because you can't do anything about it. If you spend \$100,000 on your reno, you can't add that much to the price. Just because you spent the money, it doesn't mean others will see the value, too."

#### SPRUCE IT UP

Be prudent in spending money, Powell says, but do fix the nitpicky items, such as bathroom or kitchen fixtures, creaky boards or crumbling brickwork.

Quick ways of sprucing up the inside of a house include a good cleaning, decluttering and a new coat of paint, preferably neutral colours, as they allow the house to look spacious and help buyers easily imagine their items in the same space.

Also, focus on getting rid of smells to which your nose is blind, be it cooking spices or pet odours, says Powell.



#### STAGE IT

If you still have no idea how to go about getting your house ready for sale, says Powell, real-estate agents can help stage or call in a professional stager for help.

Red Barrinuevo, professional home stager and interior decorator at Redesign 4 More says staging not only gives a fresh look to the house, but it also demonstrates effective use of space for buyers.

"If it's a living room, showcase it as a living room and remove other pieces that don't have to be there," he says. "For example, for a living room, all we need is a coffee table, a sofa and some chairs."

Another factor that helps determine a home's value and guides the preparation process for a house is its location. says Barrinuevo.

"If you're downtown, the buyer is probably someone working downtown and looking for a starter home. There, a small room could be staged as an office," he says, adding the quality of the furniture should reflect the value of the house. "If you're selling a house outside the city, an extra room could be showcased as a baby room."

#### **IMPROVE CURB APPEAL**

Make sure the exterior of the house is not neglected, Barrinuevo says. "That's the first thing buyers see."

Adding a fresh coat of paint on the garage door, taking care of the front yard and putting garbage bins in the back, instead of front, are just some items on the list. It should tell the buyer the house is well-maintained.

"The outside is like a teaser. If you get off on the wrong foot at the beginning, buyers will look for more faults," he says.

#### **GET GREAT PHOTOS**

Both Barrinuevo and Powell agree that once the inside and outside are taken care of, make sure a professional photographer takes the images shared for the listing.

"It has to be of professional quality, because this is one of the most expensive things you're going to sell," says Powell.

#### CONSIDER AN INSPECTION

Where most people focus on cosmetic fixes, it's also a good idea to get a pre-sale inspection done, says Graham Clarke, president of the Canadian Association of Home and Property Inspectors.

"It allows the homeowner to be aware of what conditions or deficiencies are going to show up when the buyer brings along an inspector," he says.

This helps reduce potential renegotiation after a potential buyer brings in an inspector.

"The more information you can disclose, the smoother the transaction will be and the more realistic the expectations of the buyer," says Clarke.

Some common items homeowners can fix before listing include safety issues that may arise from electrical, water or leakage issues and neglected porches and decks.

And it helps both the homeowner and their realtor understand what the real condition is and set a more realistic price for the market, he says. on









Master carpenter
Greg Hudolin
vividly remembers
the cold, wet day
in November when
he met a new client
near a small lake in
Seguin Township.

"It was pouring rain," he recalls. The owner of **LakeForest Construction** & Renovations, Hudolin and the landowner had driven to the lake 600 metres down a rough, jolting driveway where one of them nearly got stuck in the thick, oozing mud. "We stood out in the rain for about an hour talking about this building, about what he wanted to do and how he was going to approach the property," Greg remembers. The landowner's parents had bought the 16 acres of sloping, wooded land on 540 feet of lakeshore more than 30years earlier. The Salmon Lake property was a place to escape from the city. Initially, the family boated in on day trips.

They hiked in the forest and swam in the lake. As a young adult, the owner started bringing his own family north to camp in the woods. "There was nothing, just forest," the owner says. "We loved it so much we wanted to spend more time here."

With a long-held desire to build a cottage on the property, he just decided one day to do it and discussed his plans with several builders. After a friend put him in touch with Greg and they met on that rainy autumn day, the owner was convinced he'd found the right builder. "I knew exactly what I wanted," the owner says. "I just knew Greg would get it. He got it. He's a real mensch of a guy."

LakeForest built the 3,000 sq. ft. cottage, with four bedrooms and three bathrooms, as close to the lake as possible. The prow of the cottage, an angled two-storey wall of glass windows and doors, by **Ross Windows & Doors**, abuts the shore road allowance. "We designed the shape of the building to fit right in there so we could push it right up as close as we could to the water," Greg says. Builders preserved the backcountry setting, leaving as many trees as possible and keeping the cottage hidden amid tall pines, oaks and maples. **RH Designs** tied the landscaping and stone patio into the natural surroundings, to keep it wild and appealing.


The owner and his family love to be on the water. They shun motorboats in favour of quietly paddling the lake in canoes, kayaks or a small paddle boat. "One of the things that's so wonderful about this lake is it's a relatively small lake," the owner says. "It's a spring-fed lake,

so it's alive. It's healthy. It's clean." With no through traffic from other lakes, there are only a few hours during the high season of summer when they can hear motorboats, skiers and tubers. "Most of the time, we're alone." The opposite side of the lake, and terrain to one side of the cottage property is heavily forested Crown land. "It's complete privacy, it's extraordinary," the owner says. "We're

in the midst of nature. We've got the loons, ducks and geese, beavers, chipmunks and lake otters. There are bears and rattlesnake too. It's quite beautiful."

The owner says he knew what he wanted when he began designing the cottage and Greg taught him what was involved in creating different kinds of spaces. They used ideas from other homes Greg had built, refined

and expanded them with the help of the **RONA Building Centre Parry Sound**. "We went through seven or eight different designs in terms of roofline changes, floor plan changes and whatever else," Greg says. "At the end of the day, it is a completely custom-designed house."


While the cottage wasn't built in a specific style, some of its architecture harkens back

to the 70s, Greg says. Douglas fir posts and beams support a loft and games room over the open-concept kitchen. Maple cabinets, custombuilt by **Chervin Kitchen & Bath**, furnish the kitchen walls and island. Durable white oak, manufactured by **BreezeWood Floors**, a company that specializes in eco-friendly hardwood flooring, sheaths the floors on the main level, the loft and in the bedrooms. Pine covers the ceilings, where a massive, 20-by-10-inch, 36-foot Douglas fir beam, custom-milled and shipped on a rail car from British Columbia, spans the length of the house. "That's the kind of thing the owner wanted to see there," says Greg. "He wanted that rustic, real wood look. He likes natural things."

There is very little in the home that is purely decorative, says the owner. "It's all functional," he says. "There's a lot that's aesthetic, but it's aesthetic and functional. There's nothing that's pure aesthetic and doesn't have some kind of a purpose." The Renaissance Rumford fireplace in the great room, for example, is enclosed in drywall

instead of a stone facade. "I didn't need to create the illusion of a stone fireplace," the owner says.

The main floor is wheelchair friendly. All doors are extra wide to accommodate wheelchairs and the cottage entrance is built low so a ramp can be quickly installed when needed. "That was an important feature for us," says the owner.

Two secluded spaces augment the main living area. Glass double doors open from the dining area to a large sunroom with pine-panelled glass walls that project into the forest. Upstairs, tucked into a corner of the house, is a comfortably furnished loft overlooking the great room. Glassed railings provide an unobstructed view of the lake from this aerie. In the dead of winter, the loft is the owner's favourite spot. "Winter is out of this world," he says. "Imagine looking out there and it's all white, especially on a blue sky sunny day. It's almost a mystical experience. The white is different colours, depending on the light. It sparkles. It's serene. The silence in winter is a special kind of silence."

Fall is his favourite season – the best time to walk in the woods and to savour the colour, the mood and the temperature. "I just love it," he says. "I love the crisp air. Everything about the fall is amazing. Yearround, the cottage is a beautiful place. It's wonderful to be in the forest. That was one of our concepts from the beginning. We wanted to live in the forest and to experience the changing seasons, week by week."

As autumn leaves fall, they carpet the forest floor in brittle bits of yellow, orange and brown. The air is cool. Most cottagers are gone. Rippled by a gentle breeze, the lake is silent. "It amazes me," says the owner. "Why would you leave now?" **OH**







#### **HOW-TO**

#### Vessels

Wash and dry glass vessels.

Use rubber bands and painter's tape to mask off stripes on glass vessels.



Set glass vessels upside down on a protected surface in a wellventilated area.

Apply 3 to 4 coats of metallic copper spray paint to vessels, following manufacturer directions for drying time between coats.



Allow paint to cure completely for 48 hours before removing rubber bands and tape.



#### **Wood Base**

Arrange vessels on one of the two wood planks and trace around the base of each vessel with a pencil.



Use hole saws to cut holes slightly larger than each vessel. Sand holes with a drum sander until smooth. If you have a hole saw slightly too small for your vessel, try reaming the hole with a drum sander and coarse sandpaper to enlarge it.



Sand all surfaces of both planks of wood with a palm sander or sandpaper.

On the plank with holes, apply wood glue to one side and clamp it, glueside down, to the second plank. Use scrap wood to protect the planks while clamping with C-clamps. Allow glue to dry for 24 hours.




Remove clamps and fill the joint with wood filler. Allow to dry. Sand the edges smooth.



Place the wood base on a protected surface in a well-ventilated area and apply as many coats of gloss white spray paint as needed, following manufacturer directions, until satisfied with the look. We applied 5 coats. A light sanding between coats will help achieve a smoother finish. OH

2 servings of rice or rice noodles

1 tsp light cooking oil

1 lb shrimp

1 tsp ginger, grated

1 tsp garlic, grated

2 tsp Thai chili paste

 $\frac{1 \% \text{ cups vegetable stock}}{1 \% \text{ cups coconut milk}}$ 

1 tsp fish sauce

1 tsp brown sugar

salt and pepper


Cilantro, lime and radish to garnish

### **DIRECTIONS**

- Cook rice or rice noodles according to package directions. Set aside.

# EVERYTHING OLD Is Truly New Again

Although Mark Wenn and Melanie Valentine's charming new cottage on the shore of Horseshoe Lake is only months old, it echoes a wonderfully heart-warming history.









A history that speaks to 50 years of family gatherings, lazy summers, bracing winter snowmobile rides across frozen trails and so much more. Weekends dedicated to construction, reconstruction and renovation projects, generations of family members working side by side, creating a delightful setting that year after year renews their affection for this very special part of the north country.

Mark's parents, Wally and Alice, first discovered Horseshoe Lake through Wally's brother Roland in the early 60s. Its remote location, quiet bays and open spaces were all the reasons they needed. In 1968, Wally got together with Rocky Marshall, who owned a great deal of the lakefront and surrounding property on Horseshoe. The two sat down on a rock on the shoreline of the current cottage location, shook hands

and cut the deal for the property on the back of a cigarette pack. Not exactly how it works today.

As small boys, Mark and his brother Craig assisted their dad, along with friends and neighbours, in building the first Wenn family cottage. No hydro, no road, no modern conveniences. Just hard work, tenacity and the creative use of anything they could find, recover, reclaim and repurpose – an ongoing project and labour of love that lasted years.

Some 15 years ago, Melanie and Mark purchased the property. They managed to maintain the original handyman special for quite some time, with a little ingenuity, "spit and a prayer," until a couple of years ago when it became obvious it was time to rebuild. Continued on page 85

Melanie scoured magazines, attended cottage shows, researched websites and eventually found a building plan they both loved – a modern take on a traditional lakeside retreat with a respectful nod to the property's family history. Simple, but elegant, open and functional with just the right amount of space to keep it cosy when friends and family get together. As it always was.

They approached **Kris Smith**, an architectural designer at **RONA Building Centre Parry Sound**, who finessed the basic plan to meet their specifications. Delighted with the result, they ultimately chose a general contractor to bring their finished plans to life. 


Melanie and Mark did most of the sourcing of materials and fixtures. Toby was more than easy-going about it. Both she and Mark come from the world of management and human resources and although they were keenly involved in the project, they were measured in their approach to ensure that the various trades felt a sense

The interior is relaxed with flowing, uncomplicated textures, from the vaulted great room ceiling, finished in V-groove pine and illuminated with lighting by **Northern Iron**, to the open shelving, wall units and lovely rustic details. The exterior offers traditional, clean lines of deep blue-grey wood siding, bordered with black window frames and eaves. This cottage is both a tip of the hat to the historic architectural style of the area and an excellent reflection of what can be done today with the latest building materials.





# rustic PALLET PUMPKINS



Using reclaimed pallet wood is the latest trend for easy DIY home projects. Grab your jigsaw, drill and paint to make these adorable pallet pumpkins for your outdoor fall décor. Continued on page 96

**MATERIALS: TOOLS:** 

Plywood Pry Bar **Pallets** Jigsaw Tree Branch (dead **Brad Nailer** wood preferred) Drill

Brad Nails or 5/16-inch Drill Bit Screws

Pencil **Paint** Paintbrush 5/16-inch Dowel

Sandpaper (Coarse)

- Pry apart pallets and remove nails.
- Draw a pumpkin shape, any size you like, on a piece of plywood and cut it out with your jigsaw. This will be your template.
- Cut two small pieces of pallet wood for support backing and place them on the back of your plywood template. They should be slightly shorter than the height of your template. (see image 1)
- Lay uncut slats of pallet wood over the backing and template, about ¼ inch or so apart, covering the entire template. Nail or screw the slats to the backing (you're not attaching the slats to the template). (See images 2 and 3)
- Remove template from under backing and slats, and place on top. Trace a pencil line around template. (see image 4)
- With your jigsaw, cut slats around pencil line. Now you have your pumpkin. (see image 5)
- Cut two identical triangles from some pallet wood and nail or screw them to each of the backing pieces. These will support your pumpkin so it can stand upright. (see image 6)
- Cut a piece of tree branch for the pumpkin's stem.
- Drill a 5/16-inch hole, 1 inch deep, in the end of the branch as well as the top centre of your pumpkin. (see image 7)
- Cut a 2-inch piece of dowel and use it to join the stem to the top of your pumpkin. (see images 7 and 8)
- Now you can give your pumpkin a coat of paint. We've used Annie Sloan Chalk Paint in Barcelona Orange.
- Once the paint is dry, give it a quick sand to distress the edges and bring out the rough texture of the wood.
- Repeat these steps to make pumpkins of different shapes and sizes.

A whisk is a staple tool for any chef or baker, but which whisk is the right one for the task at hand?

The variations, shapes and uses are many. Our guide will fix the mix-ups so your creamier and your egg whites

The most popular material for a whisk is wire, however, there are wooden whisks and silicone-coated variations in different shapes and forms, each serving a specific function. Silicone-coated whisks are made of wire coated with non-stick pans.



### Balloon Whisk

Dubbed the balloon due to its shape, this is one of the most popular types of whisks. Amazingly, the balloon is made from eight or more flexible wires joined at the ends and attached to a handle. It comes in a number of sizes, from tiny to quite large. Wide uses for this type of whisk make it the most sought after for beating eggs, creating meringues and whipping cream into a thick delight.

### French Whisk

This whisk is similar to the balloon, however its shape is longer and more cylindrical and the series of flexible wires overlap each other to then join together at the handle. Chefs prefer this tool for mixing sauces or for combining ingredients in a deeper pan to access the sides and edges. The flexible wires are preferred when cooking with liquids to create thicker sauces and custards.

### FlatWhisk

Also commonly called a roux whisk, used when cooking flour and fat to thicken sauces. There are fewer loops than you'd expect in a whisk, but they lie flat, rendering the orientation uniquely suited to stirring in shallow pans to create sauces and rid the creation of any unwanted lumps.

### Spiral Whisk

This type of coil whisk with a slightly angled head is a bit of a luxury purchase, but was specifically designed to make constant contact in a pan or bowl to ensure even mixing and prevent scorching or lumps. This is the perfect tool for smooth vinaigrettes, or for incorporating liquids into a roux.

### Ball Whisk

Fans of the ball whisk claim the lack of the typical whisk loops makes it easier to clean, and allows for quicker and better aeration. The quick aeration makes it a preferred choice for whipping egg whites into the ultimate meringue. Pastry chefs also use this to make elaborate spun-sugar decorations for dessert toppings.

### Coil Whisk

This type of whisk is characterized by its one single wire, which spirals into a round shape. Unlike other whisks, which are stirred around the bowl to aerate liquids, this type remains stationary in the bowl, and is pumped up and down. Not to confuse things, but sometimes this is also called a spiral whisk, too. Used to incorporate liquid ingredients, especially in a deep vessel.





### **INGREDIENTS**

2 cups all-purpose flour

2 cups brown sugar

2 large eggs

1 cup butter, melted

2 tsp vanilla extract

½ tsp salt

½ cup white chocolate, chopped

½ cup dried cranberries and a handful for garnish

### **DIRECTIONS**

- Preheat oven to 350°F. Line a 9-by-9-inch baking pan with parchment paper.
- In a large mixing bowl and using an electric mixer, beat together melted butter and brown sugar until smooth.
- Add eggs and vanilla extract. Beat until smooth, then slowly add flour and salt and mix well.
- Add white chocolate and cranberries and, on low, mix until incorporated.
- Pour batter into pan and bake for 20-25 minutes until set in the middle.
- Remove from oven and let cool on rack.

### **INGREDIENTS**

18-ounce package cream cheese

1 cup butter, softened

2-3 cups icing sugar

1 tsp orange zest

### **DIRECTIONS**

- While the bars are baking, with an electric mixer, beat together butter and cream cheese until fluffy.
- Add icing sugar 1 cup at a time until reaching desired sweetness. Stir in orange zest.
- Top cooled bars with an even layer of frosting and garnish with extra cranberries. OH
