#### editor's note



MANY PEOPLE LOVE LIFE ON THE WATER. As someone who grew up near a river I can appreciate that. The Holland River was exciting and at times unpredictable.

When it overflowed its banks during Hurricane Hazel, it forced family friends and many others to flee their homes on the low-lying Holland Marsh, a 20,000-acre patch of vegetable farms at the south end of Lake Simcoe. Years later, after the dykes were reinforced and pumping stations improved, the river no longer seemed menacing. It was a place of sport and fun. As kids, my siblings and I loved fishing. We'd dig up the garden for worms with which to bait our hooks. When my dad got home from work, we'd beg him to take us fishing. More often than not, he agreed.


We'd cast our fishing lines from the riverside, near a pump house at the dead end of a farm road. Getting a nibble was exciting. The red and white plastic bobber would bounce lightly and wobble, stirring waves that rippled out in concentric circles. Sometimes an unseen fish jerked and pulled the float sideways. Nothing was as thrilling as seeing the bobber plunge completely under water, a sure sign a fish was hooked or had taken a big bite of the bait. Our catches were mostly sunfish, bass and catfish, occasionally a perch, prized as bait for pike. When sunset approached, we packed up for home. Our house cats, Kitka and Machek, among others, loved raw fish long before sushi became trendy. They were the chief beneficiaries of our angling prowess.

In this edition of OUR HOMES, we visit three homes on the water, built on lakes that offer year-round pleasures, calming and inspiring views and occasionally some good fishing. We hope you enjoy visiting these country places as much as we did.

## WINE **CELLARS**

WINE CELLARS AND WINE-TASTING ROOMS ARE COMING OF AGE.

Wine collecting requires a special space of its own and more homeowners are installing wine rooms in new and existing homes to ensure the right bottle is on hand. With today's technology, refrigeration and modern materials, wine can be stored in almost any location. However, this 6,100-year-old beverage still requires tender loving care.

#### **WINE IS FUSSY**

Wine breathes through the cork and ages in the process. Too much oxygen makes the wine bitter. The pace of this breathing is faster at higher temperatures and slower at lower temperatures. Fluctuations in temperature and humidity accelerate the aging process.

#### **WINE STORAGE**

Wine requires a cool, dark space with higher humidity than the average living space. Wine does not like noise or vibrations from any source.

It doesn't like any temperature extremes; 45°F to 65°F are the best temperatures for serving wine and 55°F is the ideal storing temperature for long-term storage, regardless of your wine style. Wine storage rooms come in two types: passive and active.

Passive Wine Cellars such as caves, basements and closets are naturally cooler and only receive indirect sunlight. They minimize swings in temperature and damage to the wine.

Active (Cooled) Wine Cellars are fully climate-controlled and can be set to the perfect storage temperature and humidity level that ensures ideal conditions. They are more flexible and can fit into any large, small or odd space in your home.

#### MODERN DESIGN TRENDS

Glass enclosures allow you to show off your wine collection and can be built as tall or wide as you want. The choice of tempered glass used is extremely important. The insulation value should maximize the refrigeration, humidification benefits and UV protection that is required for wine rooms that are in direct contact with sunlight. Etched or frosted glass are decorative options.

Integrating wine cellar design into your space for that WOW factor. Placing wine storage in living areas, man caves or kitchens allows you and your guests to engage with the wine while you show off

A label-forward design draws attention to the label art. It creates an intimate. interactive experience between the user and the bottle of wine.

Metal and acrylic wine racking. These materials are gaining popularity in contemporary wine cellar design. They provide the same quality for storage as wood and can be much more cost effective.

Bridging old and new. Combining wood with metal or acrylic allows for more flexibility in a project design that is less stuffy and ornate and more contemporary and inviting.



#### CONSIDERATIONS Use LED lights and UV film for

- glass enclosures. No vibrating wall speakers and no
- noisy air conditioners. Insulate your mechanical air ducts or use a ductless air conditioner.
- Vent equipment heat outside.
- ▶ Storing multiple bottles of wine requires plywood backing for wall installation.
- Proper wall insulation, a vapour barrier and moisture-resistant green board walls are essential.
- Easy access to electricity.
- Moisture-resistant flooring is a must. Consider the insulation value of the floor and materials.

A wine cellar is a high-end investment and, in some homes, it is a must-have upgrade. With an average bottle price of \$95, it pays to design your investment so it can add value to your home.

SUMMER'S longer days and irresistible pool decks can also bring the sting of pricey air conditioning. The experts at Sustainable Buildings Canada (SBC) have come up with 10 tips for avoiding a sunburned wallet this year.

SBC is a Canadian non-profit advancing "the environmental and energy performance of the built environment." Its executive director Michael Singleton and board director Larry Brydon suggest homeowners balance old-school wisdom and eco-friendly practices to optimize savings.

#### **AVOID THE DEEP FREEZE**

Set the thermostat a little higher than the standard 22°C. Michael suggests 26°-27°C instead. "You know how you go into a mall in the summer and it's freezing? There's no need for that."

#### **PAY ONLY TO PLAY**

"Turn off the air conditioner when you're not home." It may seem obvious, but Michael says many people forget. Programmable thermostats can automate the change for regular outings, like going to work.

#### **CALL ON MOTHER NATURE**

Open the windows at night when it's cooler outside, and close them by lunchtime when it's cooler inside. Taking advantage of crossventilation by opening two or more

windows in a room or house can be particularly effective. "That's free cooling," adds Michael.

#### **CREATE A WIND CHILL**

Overhead fans generate a cooling breeze and use the same amount of electricity as a 75-watt light bulb, according to Michael. "Put them on counter clockwise and get the air moving." Again, he reminds homeowners to turn all fans off when not at home.

#### LANDSCAPE STRATEGICALLY

"It's most effective to shade from the exterior," Larry says. On the west side of a house, where the sunshine is most intense, he advises planting a maple tree. Not only will it help in summer, but in winter it'll drop its leaves and let the sun shine through for additional heat.

#### **BE AN INFORMED CONSUMER**

Air conditioners are ranked based upon their Seasonal Energy Efficiency Ratio (SEER) between 13 (the current minimum) and 21. "A 16 to 18 is fine," Larry advises. "Or purchase an Energy Star if you don't want to bother with SEER."

#### **KEEP A SUMMER CHECKLIST**

Larry's list starts with checking and replacing filters. An annual cleaning and inspection will extend an air conditioner's lifespan by ensuring all parts work and air flow is uncompromised.

#### PUT THE FIRE OUT

Check gas fireplaces and turn off any standing pilot lights. This task also made Larry's checklist. Although these pilot lights were more common 10 years ago, many are still in operation and give off the equivalent heat of a big candle, he warns.

#### TURN DOWN THE **HUMIDISTAT**

Adding moisture to dry winter air can keep wooden floors from buckling and cabinets from warping, says Larry, but it's unnecessary in summer. If the humidifier continues to run all summer, cooling appliances have to work harder.

#### REPLACE INCANDESCENT U LIGHT BULBS

Cool compact fluorescent lamps or lights (CFLs) and light-emitting diode bulbs (LEDs) save money in two ways, Larry reminds. First, they draw less electricity than their incandescent cousins, which has an immediate impact. Second, they don't produce heat that air conditioners have to remove.

When it's lovely outside, that's a good place to be. Outdoor cooking and living can lower the heat generated inside and the need for expensive cooling options. A final option: when it gets too hot, you can always grab a jacket and head to the mall. OH



#### **DOUGH**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

3/4 cup milk, warmed

 $\frac{2-\frac{1}{4} \text{ tsp active yeast}}{\frac{1}{4} \text{ cup white}}$ 

granulated sugar 1 egg + 1 egg yolk, room temperature

¼ cup unsalted butter, melted

3 cups all-purpose flour ½ tsp salt

#### **DIRECTIONS**

Place warmed milk (110-115°F) in the bowl of a stand mixer and sprinkle yeast on top. Yeast will begin to bubble/foam as it activates. If not, your milk was too cold or hot.

Once foamy and dissolved, add sugar, eggs and butter and mix with a spatula until combined.

Add flour and salt and stir until a dough begins to form.

Transfer bowl to the stand mixer fitted with the dough attachment and knead for 8-10 minutes on medium speed.

Transfer the dough to a large, well-oiled bowl and cover with plastic wrap and a towel.

Let rise for 1.5 hours or until doubled in size.





#### FILLING

#### **INGREDIENTS**

¼ cup butter, softened

1 Tbsp brown sugar

1 Tbsp cocoa powder

#### **DIRECTIONS**

Combine butter, sugar and cocoa powder in separate bowl.

#### ICING

#### **INGREDIENTS**

¼ cup unsalted butter, softened

¼ cup cream cheese, softened

½ cup powdered sugar

½ tsp vanilla extract

#### **DIRECTIONS**

In the bowl of a stand mixer, cream together butter and cream cheese.

Mix while slowly adding powdered sugar and vanilla.

#### **ASSEMBLY**

Roll dough into a rectangle that is ¼-inch thick.

Spread filling over dough.
Fold dough in half.


Cut dough into 1-inch strips.

Twist each strip and tie them into knots. It's okay if they're not perfect!

Place knots on a baking sheet and loosely cover with a layer of plastic wrap and a towel.

Let rise again for 30 minutes before baking in a preheated 350°F oven for 12-15 minutes.

# MUSKOKA-COASCAC

Their newly built cottage on Lake Muskoka was a blank canvas for Kathryn and Michael McKendry.

They finished and furnished their lakehouse in a tranquil palette of blues, greys and whites. "We wanted something that would be very comfortable, a place where the whole family could gather and friends could visit," says Michael. Its natural setting, high among the trees, overlooking tiny islands dotting the lake, sold them on the property. "It was just a beautiful view," he says.

The couple bought the lake house last fall and promptly began applying their own

finishing touches – window treatments, bath fixtures, lighting and furniture for the five bedrooms, five baths and living areas. "It was kind of a daunting task but the goal was to get the place feeling like a home by the summer so we would be able to move up there and have a full season," says Kathryn. "We want it to be very welcoming, but not fussy. When you walk in, my hope is you feel relaxed, at ease with the space." *Continued on page 34*

The couple had renovated several homes before, but this was their first cottage, a place they wanted to feel different from their country home in Caledon. They enlisted the professional help of decorator Tary Roossien, owner of **Urban Rustic Living**. Within days of their first meeting, Tary presented them with a layout and design options that kept their wish list and budget in mind. "It was a collaboration," says Kathryn. "They used a computer program to understand, before we even purchased the furniture, how it was going to work in the space."

Working with Tary was easy, says Michael. When they visited her store in Huntsville they instantly connected with Tary and the furnishings in her store. "It just felt like home," he says. "At one point, it was as simple as saying what you have right here is exactly what we want."

Michael and Kathryn stayed at the cottage almost every weekend during the winter. They snowshoed on the frozen lake, around nearby islands, sometimes on five-kilometre treks, returning to the warmth of their wood-burning fireplace, installed by **The Fire Within**.

This will be their first summer at the lake house. Youngest daughter Tara has a summer job at Walker's Point Marina. Kathryn expects Tara will commute to work on one of the family's Sea-Doos. Daughter Kaylin loves daybreak at the cottage on a pedal boat. "I imagine Kaylin and I will wake up every morning and do that," says Kathryn. "It's such a great time in the morning. A friend dubbed their cottage Caisleán ag loch, Irish for Castle on the Lake. Its foyer opens to an inviting, intimate living room, the lake visible through glass doors and windows. "As soon as we come in the door there's a peaceful feeling that comes over you," says Michael. "It's relaxing."

Just off the living room, the lake view continues across the kitchen and its island breakfast bar with chrome and grey leather stools. A custom-made dining table, designed to extend for large dinner gatherings, connects the kitchen with the home's unique Muskoka room. Cutting Brothers Inc. built the cottage, borrowing Cape Cod style elements, with large dormers facing the lake and a towering Muskoka room that ascends more than two storeys. This room, where the couple play board games with their daughters, gather with friends and enjoy drinks, is one of Michael's favourites. A chrome chandelier, tiered with rings of tiny lights, from **The Lighthouse Design Centre**, illuminates the tower. **Ultra Electrical Solutions** installed the light fixtures, carefully selected for every space in the home.

On one end of the main floor, a guest room has its own entrance to the front deck where white Hockley Adirondack chairs, chosen for their comfort and contemporary look, contrast with the custom blue exterior siding. The master bedroom, furnished with a custom-made fabric bed and wooden night stands, blending modern and rustic styles, is on the top floor. It has a private balcony overlooking the lake. Kaylin's room is fitted with a white-painted vintage Celtic bed, whitewashed dresser and night stand. The ground floor, a teenagers' haven, has a large living room, propane fireplace and wooden Canadiana furniture that Michael made early in the couple's marriage. This floor also has two bedrooms, including one with queen-onqueen bunk beds. "It's fabulous," says Kathryn.

"It's a great bedroom because it has its own en suite, but it allows us to have flexibility, should we have family come up. One family can stay in that room and it's quite a comfortable space." Below the stairs is a gated doggie hotel with comfy beds for their two dogs, chocolate and golden yellow Labrador retrievers. Every bedroom in the house has an en suite bathroom.

**Window Quilt Muskoka**, directed by owner **Ann Vail**, installed window treatments throughout the cottage and boathouse. "She's so professional to work with, I would recommend her highly," says Kathryn.

Tary describes the home's style as a contemporary and coastal mix. Each piece of furniture was carefully planned. "We chose every piece to fit the space perfectly," she says. "They gave us the time and we worked together." Tary's team strived to make the furniture multifunctional. "Versatility was the key, being able to adapt to different circumstances and different gatherings," she explains.



## **TREAT YOUR**





Painted drywall is the traditional interior wall finish in new home builds and renovations. However, there are countless alternative materials and finishes for walls that can create a significant visual impact while also defining your style. Here are seven wall treatments and the areas of your home you might want to splurge on for the best investment.





#### 1. WALLPAPERS OR WALLCOVERINGS

Material: Rolls or sheets of grasscloth, paper, cellulose or vinyl. Whether foil, flocked, embossed, block printed or textured paper, there is an endless selection of patterns and colours.

Installation: It is generally recommended to hire a professional, but if you're up for a challenge, do-it-yourself types often hang their own paper. Ensure you do the proper prep work - plot out the install, level everything, smooth the surface, have all the tools required and know whether you have a pre-pasted wallpaper or if you require an adhesive. Always check the pattern repeat, as it will affect the coverage provided per roll.

Pros: Natural fibres breathe and add an element of Mother Nature to the space, while vinyl is highly durable, stain and moisture resistant, colourfast and scrubbable. You can completely change the overall look and feel of a space with a wallcovering.

Cons: Natural fibres are more delicate, less scrubbable and more susceptible to sun fading. Vinyl cannot breathe. If selling is in your immediate future, perhaps give wallpaper a pass as some potential buyers can be hesitant.

**Application:** An entire room or a simple accent wall. Powder rooms are a great place to try out a bold print.

#### 2. TILE

Material: Porcelain, ceramic, slate, limestone, glass, mosaics, cement encaustic or marble.

**Installation:** Professional installation is generally recommended. Labour cost will vary depending upon size and style of tile and design of pattern and layout.

Pros: Easy to wipe up and clean, durable finish, waterproof when installed correctly.

Cons: Cleaning grout lines. Natural stones require a sealant to be applied a couple of times per year, or more frequently depending upon use and exposure.

Application: Great for bathrooms, powder rooms, kitchen backsplashes or fireplaces.

#### 3. BARN BOARD

Material: Weathered boards, generally but not exclusively sourced from a barn.

Installation: Can be a DIY project with the

Pros: Texture, visual interest, improved durability of walls in high-traffic areas. Provides a natural, rustic aesthetic. Commonly planks are installed horizontally but can be used to create various patterns such as herringbone.

Cons: Can collect dust.

Application: Great for accent walls, mudrooms or laundry rooms.

#### 4. SHIPLAP

Material: Typically either long planks of MDF or a paint-grade poplar, installed horizontally. Traditional shiplap has a special rabbet or notch cut on the long edges of the boards to aid in spacing.

Installation: Can be a DIY project with the proper tools.

Pros: Texture, visual interest, improved durability of walls in high traffic areas. Typically white, but shiplap can be painted any colour you desire. Gives a farmhouse or coastal vibe.

Cons: Can collect dust.

**Application:** Great for accent walls, mudrooms or laundry rooms.





#### 5. WAINSCOTTING OR APPLIED TRIM

Material: Tongue-and-groove wainscotting, bead board, board-andbatten and traditional applied-panel details are available in wood or MDF.

**Installation:** A trim carpenter is generally recommended however, depending upon the complexity of the installation, an avid DIYer can attempt with the proper tools.

Pros: Instant character and charm to a room, adds an element of elegance, great texture for visual interest and is more durable than drywall.

Cons: Can collect dust, can be costly depending upon species of wood selected and installation method for desired aesthetic.

**Application:** Dining rooms, dens, bedrooms or hallways.

Natural or manufactured stone can provide a good return on investment

#### 6. STONE OR BRICK VENEER

Material: Natural or manufactured stone and brick, generally sold in pieces by square foot or in sheets.

Installation: For masonry work, hiring a stonemason is recommended. Labour cost will vary depending upon the stone and method of installation. Sheet veneers can generally be managed by the average DIYer.

Pros: Strong visual impact. Can provide good return on investment. Noncombustible and available in a wide variety of styles and colours.

Cons: Can collect dust. Manufactured stone veneer products are formed and often a repeating pattern will emerge. With a natural material every piece comes from the earth and has its own uniqueness but requires cutting and fitting.

**Application:** Focal walls or fireplaces.





#### 7. PLASTER

Material: Clay, lime, Venetian, gypsum or tadelakt plaster each has its own pros and cons.

**Installation:** Professional trowel installation recommended. Pre-planning is required to ensure proper backing is installed as some plasters require wire mesh or blue board, while clay plaster requires a primer with added sand for adhesion.

Pros: Beautiful, timeworn aesthetic adds a depth and luminosity to walls that is impossible to achieve with paint and drywall. Plasters are generally more durable than drywall. Generally sanding is not required and therefore dust is limited at time of install. All-natural materials and low VOCs.

Cons: Costly and time-consuming to install.

Application: A splurge for rooms you'd really like to highlight. For tadelakt, use it in areas that require waterproofing (showers or perhaps a kitchen or bath backsplash). on

Gargantuan mahogany dining sets. Towering armoires. Royal Doulton figurines, anyone? If items like this aren't your thing, you're not alone. As the New York Times recently reported, thanks to today's small homes and pared-down aesthetic, the market for traditional antiques has shifted sharply in the last two decades.

"As far as decorating, I think we're contemporary," confirms Marlene Cook, owner of the Sunday Antique Market in Toronto. So, why is thrifting all the rage? And why are markets like Marlene's still mobbed on any given weekend? 

#### **QUICK FIRE** (AND LITTLE QUICK FIRE)

Quick Fire hydrangea (as the name suggests) blooms earlier than all the others. The flowers open white and quickly turn to dark pink. Little Quick Fire is exactly the same except it grows only about four feet in height - great for small spaces.



#### BOBO

Bobo hydrangea is a dwarf panicle that is exceptionally floriferous. White blossoms turning to blush pink smother this small statured three-foot shrub.

#### LIMELIGHT AND LITTLE LIME

Yet another wonderful panicle type, Limelight hydrangea sports cool limegreen blooms. Little Lime hydrangea does too, in a smaller size.



#### SMOOTH TYPE (HYDRANGEA ARBORESCENS)

Sometimes called wild hydrangeas, these have gorgeous, round snowball blooms that last for weeks in mid/late summer. They are much more shade tolerant than the panicle types but bloom best with some morning sun. They flower on new wood and can be pruned to the ground or near ground level in late winter/early spring to encourage abundant blossoms. The leaves of arborescens are large, dark green, heart shaped, and thin.



#### ANNABELLE

Annabelle hydrangea is a well-loved classic hydrangea with tremendous staying power. It has large, pure white snowball blooms but they do tend to flop after a heavy rain. Peony rings work to keep them upright and are quickly hidden by their large leaves or you can prop them up with strategically placed dead branches.



#### INCREDIBALL

Incrediball hydrangea is exactly like Annabelle but with even more gargantuan white blossoms the size of basketballs!

#### CLIMBING HYDRANGEA (HYDRANGEA PETIOLARIS)

As the name advises, these hydrangeas are actually vines. Gorgeous white and fragrant lace-cap flowers cover this sturdy vine in June/July. Mid-green leaves turn yellowish in fall with pretty peeling bark. This is a slow grower that enjoys a shady spot but can grow 50-feet, so plant wisely.

#### **BIGLEAF TYPE** (H. MACROPHYLLA)

These include both lace-caps and mophead types and are sometimes called French hydrangeas. They have big, glossy leaves and have gorgeous pink, blue, purple or white blossoms and are the fancy kind coveted by many. I hate to be cynical and the bearer of bad news, but in our Ontario climate, this type of hydrangea will often produce lots of leaves, but blossoms can sometimes be a scarcity. Most varieties bloom on old wood, making the flower buds susceptible to killing winter temps, though there are some that flower on both old and new wood. Read below.

#### **ENDLESS SUMMER**

Endless Summer hydrangea and its offspring (The Endless Summer collection) bloom on old and new wood making them the most reliable of the bigleaf type for our climate. The blooms of the whole series are beautiful! Just be prepared; they are high maintenance and if you want to keep them blooming, you need to water them often and just the right amount. They need to be kept moist, but not have wet feet. Best of luck! on



Long before his Huntsville cottage was complete, Dave McEwan was living the Muskoka waterfront lifestyle.

His decision to contract the project himself meant long days on his Lake Vernon property, waking up to the call of loons, breaking for lunch in a Muskoka chair on the dock and ending each fulfilling day watching the sun set over the lake, as he swept his work site.

Saving on labour and contracting costs was a part of his reason to self-contract, but being a "hands on" person, Dave simply loves tackling a building challenge. He'd built an addition and detached garage at his home in Ayr, and found the end result gratifying. "Basically, I was the general contractor and I lined up the trades and picked out the finishes," he explains. But this was his first cottage construction, and his largest project at 4,879 square feet. "I enjoyed the whole process," he says. "Even though it was stressful, it was still enjoyable." The two-storey cottage has four bedrooms and an office, including a guest suite above the two-car garage. The full basement offers a lake-view gym, theatre room, games room and a temperature/humidity-controlled wine cellar capable of stocking up to 400 bottles.

Design objectives were achieved with a walk-out basement, a deck overlooking the lake and by maximizing windows on the lakeside. "We built everything for the view," Dave explains. "When you're sitting on the sofa in the great room you actually feel like you're in a boathouse because you can't see land. All you can see is water."

Low maintenance features were a priority throughout, including landscaping. Most notable is the siding installed by **Muskoka Timber Mills**, which has a Timberthane polyurethane coating that gives the wood siding a protective shell and vibrant colour. Unlike latex paints, Timberthane coating makes it nearly impossible for water, sun and abrasion to affect the wood or colouring.


Keeping the design as rustic as possible was a priority. Visitors seem to appreciate the atmosphere. "They'll say that for such a high end cottage, it doesn't feel fancy. It feels comfortable," Dave explains. "That was our idea."

After ground breaking in October 2017, pouring the foundation in December and framing heading into 2018, Dave himself was a working fixture on site. By July, his wife Tricia, a teacher, and their two sons and daughter were able to join him for their summer vacation during that busy year.

"We did pretty much everything ourselves," Dave recalls. "We did the window and door trim, installed the bathroom vanities and counters and the laundry cabinets. The list would be pretty long."

Electrician **Aaron Madill** from **Madill North Electric** in Novar was among the favourite tradesmen that Dave hired. "He was easy to deal with," Dave recalls. "He'd show up when he said he would and was always really accommodating with any changes that came along."

Tricia, who is passionate about antiques, helped Dave with the decorating, interior design, picking out artwork and all of the furnishings. They worked closely with **Simply Cottage** in Bracebridge, which supplied most of the furniture. Together, Dave and Tricia chose an array of soft neutral colours and did some of the painting themselves.

Money saved in labour allowed Dave to splurge on his wish list.

Topping the list of above-standard expenditures is the 100-year-old reclaimed hemlock barn board flooring from **Northern Wide Plank**. In tandem, **The Stair Guy Inc.** sourced reclaimed hemlock and made

the stairs, dovetailing their craftsmanship into rustic magic. **Muskoka Lighting Company** furnished light fixtures.

Scrimping on the roof wasn't an option. The low maintenance composite shingle Enviroshake roof installed by **Muskoka Roofing Company** is guaranteed for 50 years, it doesn't get the mould and mildew often plaguing cedar shakes and is fire resistant. Continued on page 62

Feature walls of barn board throughout - plus authentic factory brick sliced into veneer – adding character in the gym – were indulgences too.

Dave opted for real rock veneer rather than manufactured stone to grace the great room fireplace and cottage exterior, completed by Jamie Short of Stephenson Concrete.

The Insulated Concrete Forms (ICF) foundation is highly energy efficient. Extra insulation is not required when framing the walls because it's all built into the whole system. The ICF is integral for in-floor heating in the basement, so heat is not lost through

the foundation walls. TJB Construction of Novar installed the environmentally-friendly septic system.

The kitchen, set in the heart of the open layout, was kept fairly simple with shaker cabinets and quartz countertops. Deviating from the popular white kitchen trend, the robin's egg blue ceiling plays off the nautical royal blue base of the eat-in island. An impressive built-in stone-fired oven is capable of cooking pizzas in 90 seconds. "My background is that I do marketing for a pizza company - so that oven was a given," he says, smiling. "It was a splurge too." Continued on page 64







It is here, in this lovely inlet off the greater waters of Georgian Bay, that Laura Langevin and Tom Teed found their piece of paradise and an opportunity for renewal. A place that, by all measure, speaks to second chances, to starting over, while paying tribute to a rich history and heritage.

For Tom and Laura, life has seemingly always been about having regard for the past, reclaiming and repurposing products and materials and making the most out of what they found or fell upon. "Treasure hunters in every respect," they suggest.

Laura has a gift for seeing the possibilities in whatever she stumbles across. She is a Zero Waste Designer and co-owns and operates **Echoes in the Attic**, a company taking new, but excess textiles from high-end designers and up-cycling them into a line of fashion and home accessories like bags and pillows. 






Fairwinds was listed for sale on Kijiji at a time when the couple were looking for a cottage. It was to be a change from their years around Rosseau and Port Carling with their respective families. They were drawn to the bay, as many have been. "It is less predictable and adventurous, wilder and maybe primitive... the way it used to be," Laura says. The island was a place they could invest time, hard work, creativity, along with a nominal amount of money.

The property, with a cottage built in 1948 and a 1960 boathouse, had gone to seed in most respects. It needed Laura's vision and ecoconsciousness and Tom's handiwork and resourcefulness. The plan was to re-claim its history and heritage and breathe new life into it, without losing what it had always been – an idyllic getaway in an iconic part of the north-country. "An homage to the original intrepid owners who found it and constructed it back in the day," says Laura. A challenge in every respect, but they were up for it. Continued on page 84

They began this three-year odyssey in the winter of 2015, with numerous trips across the ice, ferrying building materials and supplies from Dillon Cove Marina or Katawoda Resort on the mainland. The couple remain very grateful to both locations for their hospitality and assistance with their project. Driving up every weekend and dealing with the harsh, demanding conditions was no easy feat, but as both Laura and Tom will attest, "It was worth every bone-chilling ride across the bay and all the frigid nights spent under mounds of blankets trying to stay warm." Laura is not sure they could do it again. "It wasn't easy, but we are so happy to have managed it."

Laura and Tom started by deconstructing the buildings, board by board, and cleaning out decades of old debris. Anything that could be recycled would be. After all, that is what they are all about. Old workbenches would eventually become countertops, old windows were repaired, repainted and hung as mirrors or picture frames. Shipping crates were modified, painted and installed as kitchen shelving. A beautiful old dresser, rescued just before it was left as junk, has become the centrepiece for their delightful guest bunkie.

Countless trips to the local landfill would reap a bounty of re-fashionable furniture, building material, hardware, artwork and the like. As they say, one man's trash is another man's treasure.

They augmented salvaged furnishings with practical, decorative items from Red Canoe Interiors, Rafters of Muskoka and HillTop Interiors. Continued on page 86









Tom purchased sheets of plywood from McNabb Home Building Centre and had them cut into nine-inch wide strips. He laid them down in random lengths, whitewashed and sealed them, giving floors a look of reclaimed planking. Plywood was also used on the walls in a faux shiplap approach. Again, they discovered a simple, effective, inexpensive and most importantly, an elegant solution. "We carried the theme forward by painting the existing wall panelling white and giving it a nice light new finish," says Laura.

"There is an old storage building that was filled with all kinds of old hardware and an array of bits and pieces," says Tom. "For the last couple of years, whenever I needed some piece of hardware, fastener or whatever, I was likely find it in there." Nothing went to waste. Laura and Tom are masters at stretching the dollar. They both grew up in large families under tight economic conditions and so they take little for granted and make the most out of what is around them. Continued on page 88






