THE PLACE: Redecorating their family home turned out to be a life-changing experience for Bren and Kirk Petrunick. The owners of interior design shop Simply White Interiors and accompanying production space, The Designer's Workroom, had just moved back to Niagara from Toronto in 2004 and scoured the region for something – anything – they liked enough to use in their home. Inspired by Muskoka cottages, they sought clean, classic lines with the comfort of French country but everywhere they turned, they saw spaces that lacked the warmth and functionality they craved. "We wanted rooms that were meant to be lived in," Bren recalls. They achieved that doing the work themselves. Friends and family were so wowed by their efforts, the couple began to re-evaluate their corporate careers.



They eventually traded them in for 500 square feet of retail space in downtown St. Catharines to test the market for their design services. After a few months, the store moved to a larger location in the Garden City's core. Today, Simply White is in Niagara-on-the-Lake and is stocked with Pine Cone Hill, Brunelli and David Fussenegger bedding and blankets, lighting and wall art. There's also space for workshops and the unique Designer's Workroom, a large production area where the Petrunicks' design team makes custom bedding, drapery, blinds, headboards and upholstery for corporate and residential clients.



THE TREND: Simply White is Benjamin Moore's paint colour of the year for 2016, and much like the store, it's clean, crisp and multi-purpose. The Petrunicks are seeing a move away from bold colours, but plaids, tartans, chevrons, colour blocking, stripes and Aztec prints dominate as accents. Other go-to colours from Benjamin Moore are Sea Salt, Cosmopolitan and Plaster of Paris.

NEWS: Annie Sloan chalk paints were added to Simply White's offerings this past summer along with seminars to help the DIY-decorating crowd transform their homes with the stylish product. "It's turned into something where people are saying, 'I want to have 10 ladies together and I'm looking for something different to do,'" Kirk says. "That's great. It's not just going to someone's place and having cheese and crackers. It's something interesting to do and you're learning."



Once divided into apartments, the Ward House is now a single-family home that draws attention from





When Hugh Scholaert first showed the online listing for the Ward house property in Ridgeville

to his wife Christine, she thought the house looked haunted, and the neighbouring barn that held a tea room was, to put it mildly, in disarray.

The Victorian house has a three-storey turret with a widow's walk – the sort of look Hugh concedes is often associated with horror movies. From what he can tell, the home was originally two separate houses, and in 1880, Josiah Ward built brick walls around them to form one home. Floors were built to cover old foundations Exterior walls became interior walls.

As for the barn, Hugh says it had three generations of faulty wiring. His son touched the wall once and was blown back by a renegade current. A dishwasher once took a step and her foot went through the floor.

But the Scholaerts bought the property anyway. The old house, its 27.5 acres of surrounding land and its accompanying tea room and shop would be their retirement project. Now, three years of renovations later, Ridge Berry Farm is a showpiece.

When Hugh first looked for a property, he was in his last years as an executive for a telecommunications company. He and Christine were about to move back to Canada after five years in Switzerland. They had lived the commuter lifestyle for years. They were done.

"I just wanted to buy a farm and change my lifestyle and learn how to grow my own food," he says.

They found the Victorian house and farm on a website for people selling their own properties independently. And while they loved the description of the farm itself, the photos of the house looked "horrendous."

"I showed my wife and she said, 'No, no, no, that place is haunted. I don't want anything to do with it," he recalls. "It did look pretty spooky in the pictures. It was bleak and gloomy." So they clicked away from it.

Eventually, the house popped up on MLS and the Scholaerts' Oakville realtor brought it up with them.

"Our Realtor grew up in Niagara, and when she was a little kid, she used to walk by the house and always wanted to go inside," he says. "She asked if I would do her a favour and go see the house. So we came, saw the house and thought, 'This is not so bad.'"

The property has history. Ward was born in New York, the son of Quaker parents, Hugh says. He was a dredge manager for John Brown, a Welland Canal contractor. When Ward died in 1903, Alandis Crowe acquired the property and started the township's first canning factory.

As for the property's earlier history, Hugh has some clues. Ward bought the property around 1865 and didn't finish the Victorian house for 15 years. Maps dating back to 1840 show two brick buildings standing side by side. One of them, Hugh believes, may even date back to settler Ernest Martin in 1802.


Both the house and the barn, which also dates back to 1880, needed work when Hugh bought them. A lot of work. The house had been converted into three apartments and had layer upon layer of makeshift fixes. One bathroom had live wires connected directly to the shower.

He hired **Tucker Homes** for the renovations, and they jumped into it. Jonathan Tucker, who worked on condo projects in Vancouver before coming home to Niagara to work in the family business, took the lead with his brother David.

The Tuckers grew up nearby and knew the property, too. "It was a place I had driven past my entire life because it was sort of overgrown and uncared for," Jonathan says. Continued on page 24

The renovation was extensive. Tucker Homes spent 18 months restoring the home to its original grandeur, honouring its narrative in the treasure trove of long-forgotten features they unearthed in the process. Brick walls were exposed, lending both a rustic and rugged feel juxtaposed with the opulence of other spaces, like the dining room with its old-world charm or the ornate widow's walk that sits like a beacon atop the home's entrance. Gingerbread was cleaned up rather than covered.

In the barn, they closed in the porch, which now serves as a three-season tea room. The timber-filled country store stuns with both its inviting feel and attention to detail in the woodwork.

In addition to the heavy lifting by Tucker Homes, there were new doors and windows from Crowland Sash and Frame Ltd.; new floors – hardwood, carpets and tiles – from Alfieri Floor Experts; new kitchen cabinets from Timberwood Custom Kitchens Inc.; counters from First In Counters; and new light fixtures from Home Lighting.

The further they got into the layers of the house, the less they knew. They found passageways that suggested the rooms had been reconfigured. They dug into the ground and found old foundations, which you can now see through glass inlays cut into the dark wood floor of a three-season room at the back of the house. They found closets and dairy boxes they didn't know existed, and a coin from 1819. "It was like playing archaeologist," Hugh says.

In one area of the house – part of what is now Scholaerts' personal glass art gallery – they dug in and discovered an old staircase. The

steps are likely more than 150 years old, and tree rings are still visible in the wood. They lead to a spacious cellar that was once two cellars. A Tucker worker found an old piece of wood down there with the word "Ward" scratched onto it. It now hangs on the door to the furnace room as a reminder of the home's heritage.

"Every room was like a special project," Hugh says.

The Scholaerts stayed in the home throughout the renovations, their belongings covered in tarps, coughing through the dust. They also renovated the barn into what it is today, which is the Ridge Berry Farm Tea Room and Country Store.

The tea room is a FeastON location, designated by the Ontario Culinary Tourism Alliance for the business's dedication to sourcing and selling local food. At the store, the Scholaerts sell the fruits of their farm labour – preserves using their raspberries and blackberries, their currants and gooseberries. They're reviving an old Concord grape vineyard and rousing some apple trees. Their dream has come true. They're growing their own food.

There's still work to do, Hugh says. But the house is majestic now, and the tea room and country store are quaint and comfortable. The main living spaces have maintained their historic appeal with furniture to match. The kitchen and bathroom areas have a modern look.

Is it haunted? Hugh can't say for sure, but there have been incidents. In one case, a window that had been painted shut by a previous owner opened when no one was around. In another, a door banged open and closed on its own.

But with all the work they've done, and their love for their farm and their Victorian home, they're not going anywhere.

"It's a nice little landmark," Hugh says, "and given what we've been able to piece together, we've enjoyed getting to share it." **OH**

Creating Dream Kitchens



to LAKE ONTARIO

If you love it, you will find a space for it. That's the advice designer **Anne Marie Wolochatiuk** gives her clients, and her lakefront St. Catharines home is a testament to it.





The open floor plan, which offers Lake Ontario views from all but one room, holds a mix of old and new, reflecting a life spent exploring the world.

"Our house is a scrapbook," Anne Marie says with husband Rick while enjoying the view from the comfortable breakfast nook off their kitchen.

On a clear day, you can see the Toronto skyline, but today it's overcast and the lake and sky appear an endless blue. "It's a hodgepodge of thrift and things that form memories for us."

Anne Marie worked closely with

Chapman Murray Associates Architects
and Gerald Redekop Builders Ltd. to
create a home that's cosy despite its open floor
plan and high ceilings. The couple wanted a
space that was both beautiful and functional,
particularly for all the entertaining they
do. Anne Marie hand-picked wood beams
at JD Wood Revival in West Lincoln
to complement antique Indian doors and
pillars she picked up when the couple lived
in Seoul, South Korea, and to add warmth to
the great room.

She found the pillars and doors by chance in a frame shop she frequented in Seoul. The owner was moving back to India where the hand-carved doors were made, and couldn't take them with him.

"I didn't have a plan for them," recalls Anne Marie, who runs **AMW Design Intervention** in St. Catharines and Austin, Texas. "I had no idea if I could even incorporate them." But she did. She had carpenter **Lee Bambridge** install the intricate doorway of the front foyer to open into the main living space, which functions as four distinct areas: a bar, living room, family room and dining room. When the architect suggested columns in his proposal, Anne Marie had just the pieces – those pillars she purchased in Seoul in a package deal that was a steal.

The real star of the great room is the large, picture-frame windows from **Penner Building Centre** that give view to the beauty of the lake.

Vintage barn beams from JD Wood Revival form the fireplace mantel and run across the ceiling in the dining area. Salvaged barn floor planks, which Anne Marie sanded by hand, are now shelves behind the bar and in the kitchen, where they're set against a geometric backsplash by **Anfra Tile & Stone Ltd.** in Thorold. Anfra Tile and Stone also installed the quartz countertops. *Continued on page* 30

Anne Marie worked with **Elmwood Fine Custom Cabinetry** in St. Catharines to design the cabinetry throughout the house, including in the only room without a lake view, the laundry room.

The rustic wood floors in a chardonnay oak from Golia Flooring in Niagara Falls tie together the home's theme of vintage-meets-modern.

The majority of the furnishings throughout the home were picked up in the more than 40 countries they have visited – experiences for which they are grateful. It includes the four countries they've lived in, plus another 20 that Rick has visited for business. Everything was purchased at thrift shops, consignment stores, markets or

"I'm a big thrifter," Anne Marie says. "I find a lot of treasures in thrift shops. I find out where they are in every city we visit."

Those treasures appear in every room. Walls are lined with carvings and other art from various cultures. There are framed posters that hold memories: a "Sir Isaac Brock Wants You" poster from Brock University in the 1980s that's a nod to the time and place the Wolochatiuks met; and one from a bull fight they attended with their two daughters while

visiting Spain in the mid 90s. They're complemented by pieces that Anne Marie found and simply thought were neat, like the yellow, original Czech Beatles poster she picked up at an old print shop in Prague.

"It's definitely a mix - an eclectic mix taken from our travels," says Rick, who credits his wife for much of the design of the home. "I never worry if it's going to work in the décor," Anne Marie adds. "It just does."

The house is a new build but that wasn't the original plan. The Wolochatiuks purchased the lakefront property in 2005 with hopes of renovating the century home that was already there. That proved to be too much of an undertaking, however. "We worked with architects for a year on a plan," Anne Marie recalls. "We took it to tender and it was not doable. Everyone told us we were better off to start over."

Though the original home was torn down, the Wolochatiuks salvaged what they could and incorporated it into the new house. A 1940s cabinet from the office of a lawyer who once lived in the home fits in amongst the new cabinetry in the kitchen, which is a mix of dark and light palettes with the commercial stainless steel fridge and matching gas stove from **Goemans Appliances**. Four old, oak doors and trim

were given a place in the lower level vestibule. Anne Marie set aside other pieces to use when they finish the lower level. She also salvaged a pair of leaded-glass windows, bowed over time. They've been given a place of prominence in front of the windows in the master bathroom. "I didn't have the heart to get rid of it all; I like labour-intensive things like that," she says standing in front of an antique cabinet that contains trinkets and thrift store finds from her travels, along with wine glasses she painted by hand. "Someone had to go to a lot of trouble to make those."

Most of the furnishings in the home were laborious to create. From the hand-carved Indonesian rice beds to the handmade Balinese gamelan clay figurines - each piece tells a tale, and is now part of the home that tells the Wolochatiuks' story. on

nook and makes the dinner table a favourite gathering spot.
