# HARDWARE

It is so easy to take life's essential items for granted. When a job is done well, we don't ask questions. In design however, it is crucial to constantly assess how something could function better and look better.

Take hardware for example. We don't question a functioning cabinet or room door. The hardware simply becomes obsolete. Clearly this is a good thing in one sense because it's doing its job. It's functioning. Its look or form however, may be another story.

Hardware is like jewelry, or the finishing touch. Whether you want to be Armani or Kelly Wearstler, the look changes entirely based on the approach. Here are a few options – from minimalist to decorative – that will finish your doors in style and also function beautifully.

# **FULLY INTEGRATED**

This approach requires no hardware leaving your cabinetry clean + simple. A cabinetmaker uses the door itself to create the hardware. Here are two approaches:

One method is to carve a finger pull into the backside of the door (1) leaving the front of the door undisturbed. Bulthaup, a high-end cabinetmaker out of Germany, has mastered this minimalist aesthetic. If done properly, this look will highlight the lines of the cabinetry without drawing attention to any unnecessary extras.

Alternatively, (2) cut out part of the door face, enough to put your fingers through to pull the door open. This provides a design detail, remains functional; yet maintains an uncomplicated aesthetic. This approach creates a low-key look with a bit more detail.



# PARTIALLY INTEGRATED

Partially integrated means that in order to accommodate the hardware, the door must be notched out. This hardware needs to be applied by a professional. Take this piece (3) by architect Tom Kundig as an example. It is beautifully crafted and adds a hint of interest. On a simple wooden pocket door, this pull adds the perfect amount of detail.

On cabinetry, try a finger pull with a sleek, stainless steel finish (4). The door or drawer

is routered out at the back so the hardware can sit flush with the cabinet frame. To achieve this look on a budget, you can source a similar style that can be mounted to the side of the door or drawer without the need to carve into the cabinetry. However, ensure you have enough clearance so the hardware doesn't rub against the next door over or the underside of the countertop.

# APPLIED

The options are endless (5) but there are two approaches: functional versus decorative. You can keep it simple or make a statement. Leather, glass, lucite, wood, brass... you name it, it's out there. The key is to choose something that is the correct scale, functions well, and that you won't tire of. Good quality hardware can add up, so purchase a sample and bring it home to look at.



# THE BORING BITS

It's worth mentioning that some of the most important pieces are often working behind the scenes. Take your interior house doors. If you are trying to achieve a more minimal look, then a typical swing door may not be your style.

For a more contemporary approach, look at using a pivot hinge (6). These anchor to the floor and ceiling leaving the sides free of any unsightly hinges. With this

look, your door can also be ceiling height, giving your room a sense of scale. Another option is a barn slider (7). These hang on a rail system and

Another option is a barn slider (7). These hang on a rail system and slide on wheels or a rail at the base to prevent any side-to-side swing. The hardware is available in a multitude of styles, visible or hidden. Have a look at the Warehouse style from Rustica

Hardware for an industrial look. You won't get a tight fit so best to use this style on a mudroom or a hallway separation.

Hardware is often the last thing we think of – the afterthought that we run out and purchase at the last minute

when doors or cabinetry are complete. Next time you're planning a project, look at the hardware first. It will open your mind to a whole other world of design options! **OH**

Creating your own piece of luxury in an established Oakville neighbourhood may seem like a dream to many, but to **Dwight** and **Chris Lacey**, it's their dream come true.

The Laceys, parents to four grown children, always knew that they wanted to build their home in Oakville. It was just a matter of finding the ideal location. After a year and more than 60 lots later, they found the right place tucked into a well-established neighbourhood on Riverside Drive by Sixteen Mile Creek.

Their first call was to friend and designer **Danielle Fernald** of **Danielle Fernald Design**. Having worked with her in the past, the Laceys knew that Danielle would understand the look and feel that they desired. In turn, Danielle recommended the expertise of **David Small** of

**David Small Designs** to help put their ideas on paper and builder **Sadat Kolenovic** of **Dream Homes 92** to put the plan into action.

"I would never have guessed David would have given us the footprint that he did, but once I saw it sitting on the lot where the trees were positioned, how the lot worked, it made sense," Dwight recalls. Having grown up in a contractor family, Dwight felt it important to find a contractor like Sadat who understood their objectives and was comfortable with allowing him to be involved in the process.

Sadat's step-by-step approach to building starts with reviewing the drawings. He spends many hours contemplating how to deliver the best product possible. "As the guy that is building the home for them, I have to keep in mind that the customer's input on the house is crucial and extremely important, as at the end of the day, they are the ones that will occupy the house."

The exterior is a mix of traditional and modern, made of stone, wood siding and trim. "The 4,000 sq. ft. home has an irregular footprint allowing for a lot of architecture to be on display, both

from the street and inside," David explains. "The trim simplified the house, giving it an overall appeal of clean lines. They traded in the traditional Oakville architecture and cladding for their desire of a clean, crisp look."

With a love for the New England style of dark blue and bright white exteriors, they thought they knew what they wanted. After trying out different hues, they decided on more earthy colours that would blend in with the trees, rather than stand out. "It was important for us to respect the neighbourhood," Dwight says. Though the corner property initially possessed some issues with privacy and exposed the backyard, the final L-shape design of the bungalow provides an intimate and protective feeling. The backyard oasis champions any summer getaway. A pool, hot tub and Muskoka room are accessible through the kitchen walkout, mudroom and master bedroom. "You truly feel like you are on vacation when you're there," David says.

Inside, the Laceys feel David did a great job giving them a living area that reflects their lifestyle. "I have wanted, for more than 20 years, to have a great room like this and the only way to get one was to build my own house," Dwight says. "It's actually taking us back to an era where people entertained out of their kitchens, making the kitchen the heart of the house." The bright kitchen with large island and hardware from <code>Oakville Fine Hardware Inc.</code> flows straight into the family room with its comfortable yet elegant seating area with pieces from <code>Cocoon Furnishings Inc.</code>

The open-concept floor plan allows each room to transition to the next with ease – from the kitchen to the living area to the main floor master bedroom – while taking advantage of the natural light coming in through the large windows by Kolbe Gallery. Beautiful custom interior doors crafted by Victoria Strong Manufacturing Corporation add architectural appeal.

Wall colours were kept subtle in the open concept space. "A transitional use of paint tones was used in each of the rooms to give a timeless, yet current look without noticing the use of a different colour," Danielle explains. Continued on page 26


The unique roof lines allowed for something that was unexpected and well received: vaulted ceilings. They created an open and airy interior and gave way to additional bedrooms upstairs above the two-car garage and mudroom. "The huge arch ceilings give us the grandeur that we wanted while maintaining a timeless look that will never go out of fashion," Dwight explains.

They put their trust in Danielle to guide them to find the design elements that would best suit their home. "She streamlined the entire process," Dwight says. "If you go to the right place and if you've got someone who knows how it is all supposed to come together, it saves a lot of time and guesswork."

The high ceilings forced Danielle to think outside of the box when it came to lighting the main floor. Rather than going with the typical task and pot lighting in the kitchen, they chose beautiful, transitional lighting from Lighting Centre that completes the rooms in a way you would never have thought possible with typical fixtures.

For some, their dream house will always be a dream, but for the Laceys and their team of experts, it took 14 months to complete the entire process. It just goes to show you, that with the right people in your corner, dreams really can come true. OH

THE PLACE: Located in downtown Burlington, Fairhome first got its start 15 years ago as a fabric store in Oakville. Over the years, owner Janet Sachade and her dedicated staff have slowly transformed the business into an interior décor and specialty gift store, featuring unique items, custom sewing and drapery, reupholstering, interior decorating services and a newly added furniture showroom. In 2004, Janet moved the business to Burlington, and it has since become a mainstay of the downtown core. The upstairs loft and furniture showroom, opened in 2012, features high-end, affordable, yet distinctive items such as casual slipcovered furniture, painted furniture, lamps, area rugs and artwork.



# how to MAXIMIZE SPACE IN A SMALL LAUNDRY ROOM

Our homes are a reflection of ourselves, and many of us work hard to keep them beautiful. Through colour, materials and proper planning, we strive to create a stylish and pleasing environment in which to live. Much of our attention is focused on our living spaces and it's time we start thinking about the more utilitarian spaces like the laundry room. Given the amount of time they are used, they seldom receive the attention they deserve and they often become separated from the life of a home.





If your laundry room is small, you may find that it does not function the way you would like. It may feel cramped and unorganized, attracting an embarrassing mess. But with a little time and creativity, you can design a stylish and functional laundry room that will help make laundry day your most favourite day of the week!

If you find that your laundry room lacks the square footage you dream of, take a look at the space you have and see it for all of its possibilities. By choosing a front loading washer and dryer, you will be able to utilize an extra surface that every laundry room dreams of. The smooth flat tops they provide are useful for laundry basket storage or as a place to fold and organize. Step it up a notch and install a durable water-resistant countertop over the machines. An inexpensive laminate will provide a smooth and easy-to-clean surface for your laundry needs. If your space is limited, a stacked washer and dryer set will leave room for other necessities. A customized slide-out shelf installed between the machines will provide that extra surface you otherwise would not have.

Chances are the washer and dryer will take up most of your floor space, so, when thinking about storage and organization, think vertical. By maximizing vertical space, you can amplify a small laundry room's storage capacity. As demonstrated in the drawing, shelves and cubbies stylishly contain laundry supplies while built-in cabinets keep seldom-used items and less-than-attractive necessities (such as cleaning supplies) out of sight. To brighten up the room, install under-cabinet strip lighting. If built-ins are not in your budget, you can create ample storage space by investing in adjustable wire shelving (ensure that your most utilized items are made available on the lower shelves). Incorporate pull out wire baskets for clever storage of odds and ends, including those pesky socks whose matches have yet to be found! And don't ignore the back of a door. It makes a perfect spot to hang baskets and holders.

A great feature to have in any laundry room is a place to air-dry delicates or to hang shirts fresh from the dryer. Use a tension bar installed between built-ins (or walls), or even a bath towel bar mounted on the underside of a shelf. Remember to position the rod far enough from the wall to leave adequate space for the hangers. If space is limited, pull-down and accordion-style drying racks are made to pull out from the wall and then be pushed neatly away.

Laundry rooms tend to be the place to keep a bulky ironing board. The problem is where to put it. Hanging it on the wall is a simple solution. Another is to purchase a built-in board that drops down from the wall. It saves space and makes ironing easier. Just flip out the board and plug in the iron. Better yet, there are fold-out ironing boards that can be built into cabinetry and pulled out with an expanding frame, concealing them completely.

Finally, incorporate decorative elements to liven up the space. If the room makes you happy, laundry will become less of a chore. Add a splash of colour with paint, or with patterns and colourful fabrics on your storage containers. Add style with bead board or with a fun backsplash in a shiny or iridescent tile. Why not hang up a piece of art? Prints, photos or wall decals will add whimsy and character. Now, with your laundry room feeling so refreshed and organized, you will wish that laundry day was every day! OH

# in the kitchen

Knives: they're an essential kitchen tool but most of us just guess as to which one we need at any given time. Choosing the right knife is about more than size – they're shaped the way they are for a reason, and caring for them properly is just as important as how you use them.

"Pay respect to the knife. It's a deadly object. It's too easy to cut yourself!" says Chef John Higgins, Director of the George Brown College Chef School.

Chef Higgins says his five essential kitchen tools are a serrated carving knife, an eight-to-10 inch French knife (a style of chef's knife), a paring knife, a potato peeler and a spatula. "I could go anywhere in the world and cook something with those," he says. His personal brand of choice is Victorinox, but says they may not be ideal for everyone – personal preference rules when it comes to knives.

# **PURCHASING KNIVES**

When you're shopping for knives, Chef Higgins says it's important to consider what you're going to use them for. What do you like to cook? What do you need to accomplish? Then consider your budget. Most importantly, hold different knives in your hands. "A good knife is like a golf club or a baseball bat," he says. "It needs to feel good."

While you don't have to spend a fortune on knives, Chef Higgins says "you're not doing yourself any favours if you buy cheap knives. Not all knives are created equal." Invest in the knives you know you'll use and add others piece by piece as necessary. Again, "think of it like a set of golf clubs. Start off with the basics and add what you need as you go along."

# THE SHARPER THE BETTER

According to Chef Higgins, nothing is worse than a dull knife. It's bad for the tools themselves, for your cooking and potentially for your safety. You shouldn't be hacking away at food. Even more important than investing in good quality knives is investing in a sharpening stone, he says. Learn how to hone the steel at just the right angle and you'll always have sharp knives that are easy to use.

# STORING AND CARING FOR KNIVES

Contrary to popular belief, it's not essential to keep your knives in a knife block. In fact, Chef Higgins prefers to keep his in a tray in a drawer, free from other kitchen tools. This frees up space on his counter and is easier to clean.

Wash your knives in hot, soapy water. Don't dump them into the sink with anything else. Rather, keep them separate and get them into a drying rack on their own, too. Let them dry fully before storing them. Do not wash knives in the dishwasher.

### **CUTTING BOARDS**

Just as it's important to use the right knife for every job, the right cutting board also makes a difference. Choose one big enough for your job so food isn't hanging over the edge or falling off. Chef Higgins also stresses only having one knife on a cutting board at a time to avoid disaster.

Stumped about what's what? Here are the basic knives you'll find in any set and the jobs they're made to do.

# Paring knife

Small, versatile knife ideal for peeling fruits and vegetables or making small, intricate cuts for cleaning or garnishes.

# Utility knife

A close cousin of the paring knife, but slightly longer and thinner and good for chopping small vegetables and fruits.





# CURB **APPEAL**



Once again doors are opening up to the outside world. Celebrating your outdoor space and paying a little attention to your exteriors can dramatically increase the value of your property, while also giving you much more room to live in. To make sure your front door sets the right tone every time you come home, here are my top tips for maximum curb appeal.

One of the most overlooked keys to unlocking vour home's exterior potential is well thought-out lighting. Use layers of light to eliminate harsh shadows for a more welcoming environment at night.

- Line the path to your door with lights to guide both your eye and your guests to the entrance.
- Use a combination of potlights with pendants or sconces (or all three) on the landing or porch to create an even and inviting glow.
- The current trend in pendants is to go big to make a statement, so if you're at all unsure choose a larger lamp and let there
- Place sconces one-to-two feet lower than the top of your door frame, centred above your mailbox or house numbers (if they are
- You can also add a sconce above the door instead of a pendant choose something bigger or bolder than the lower sconces so it dominates.

# **FURNITURE**

Besides the lighting, you can take many other cues from interior styling when creating an outdoor space. Add a seating grouping around the front door to create a moment to come home to instead of just a pathway to pass through

- Place a weather-appropriate chair on either side of the door, dressed with a fun, seasonal pillow for colour.
- Then, back each chair with a large shrub or miniature garden arrangement, in a simple but sizeable planter, to create a visual backdrop and add a variety of heights.
- Use a brightly patterned, full-size outdoor rug, layered under the traditional-size door mat, to create a truly welcoming outdoor space.
- If you don't have a path or anywhere to set your seating, Envirotile recycled rubber faux-stone tiles are much lighter than true stone and easy to lay, rearrange or store.







- Choosing one colour for all of your exterior details can drag down the look – use an accent colour for emphasis to generate interest
- Start with a colour a few shades lighter than the siding (or white) for the primary trim moulding - the roof cornice, window trim,
- Then, go darker for the shutters and window sashes (the inner frame holding the glass) so they appear deeper, richer and timelessly sophisticated.
- When in doubt, this same accent colour can then dress the door. However, for a fun and modern look, try one of these Benjamin Moore hues:



1. Costa Rica Blue #2064-50 for yellow masonry



2. Hunter Green #2041-10 for traditional brown brick



# It's Maple Syrup Time!

We are blessed in Canada, especially here in the east, with a climate that supports the sugar maples that produce this delicious nectar. Long before recorded history, Native men and women used birch bark baskets to collect sap as it flowed from the trees, boiling it down slowly over open flames. While the gathering, equipment and cooking techniques may be different today, the result is still the same – a sweet and sticky amber liquid that bears the call of spring and is best enjoyed with a mile high stack of fluffy, buttermilk pancakes.

# **Buttermilk Pancakes**

1½ cups all-purpose flour

½ cup whole wheat flour

2 tbsp sugar

2 tsp baking powder

1 tsp baking soda

½ tsp salt

Pinch nutmeg


2 cups buttermilk

2 eggs


1/4 cup melted butter or vegetable oil, plus extra for cooking

# 1 tsp vanilla extract

- · Put all-purpose flour, whole wheat flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda, salt and nutmeg into a large bowl and whisk to combine. Set aside.
- Whisk together buttermilk, eggs, melted butter and vanilla in separate bowl. Pour into flour mixture and whisk until just combined to make thick batter. For most tender pancakes don't overmix batter. Let stand for five minutes.
- Heat skillet over medium heat. Melt butter in skillet until foam subsides. Pour in about ½ cup of the batter. Cook pancake, turning once, until golden brown on both sides. Transfer to a plate and keep warm. Repeat with remaining batter and additional butter as needed. Serve hot with maple syrup and butter. on


