

The good news is, this year it seems that anything goes, with anything! Green is definitely at the forefront. The weirder the green the better, and you can pair it with just about any colour. For 2015, it's back to nature with greens, metals and a handcrafted feel.







PINK + MINT PASTELS

Introverted & Soft

I'm a pink lover, and Farrow & Ball has it covered. Pink Ground is an amazing pastel tone that is soothing yet somehow modern. The mood it sets will please the introverted decorators with its gentle feel. They have it paired this season with two greens - Pale Powder and Teresa's Green. You get that Easter egg, spumoni ice cream vibe. This is classic and not trendy. To modernize, hang a mirror with faceted edges. This subtle detail is all the rage but won't overpower the softness of the backdrop.

COPPER, EMERALD & NAVY

Romantic & Daring

I adore copper, but I prefer mine aged with a patina, darkened but not green. Copper was a traditional background piece, like old, too heavy pots hanging above the stove. And for the

AUBERGINE, BRASS & GRANNY SMITH

Modern & Refined

I'm not quite ready to say goodbye to black forever, but it's time to add a little edge to our moody tones. Deep aubergine is certainly a step in the right direction and cooked is even better! Try Caponata from Benjamin Moore for a regal backdrop. It's lovely paired with brown or deep pink for a serious and refined look. For a contemporary edge, throw in a quirky green accessory like Martha Sturdy's resin flower bowl in granny smith apple. And for a little glamour, try these beautiful aged-brass wall hooks that I found on Etsy. Their clean lines highlight the brass and would be stunning on an aubergine backdrop.

AZURE, DEEP MAHOGANY & LEAF GREEN


Sophisticated & Fresh

Deep mahogany is another tone that will allow us to shift away from black. This rich brown creates a stunning backdrop on a wall or shelving unit. Simple pottery on a shelf disappears on a light background, but a deeper tone allows you to see the lines of each piece. Jewelry is a big inspiration in interior design this season. Take these Lindsay Adelman wall sconces for instance. On a much smaller scale they would make a lovely pair of earrings! Add a hint of nature with a leafy green through furniture, an area rug or a beautiful ivy plant. Sometimes there is no substitute for the real thing.

It doesn't have to be this way. Pets don't have to equal clutter, and they certainly don't have to be incompatible with your décor. Seamlessly integrating your pets' needs and accessories into you<mark>r ho</mark>me is simple, and it can be done stylishly – we promise.





Accessories You Can't Live Without:

The best options are tight-weave polyester fabrics. Fabric furniture should be vacuumed twice a week to prevent the oils from your pet's fur from penetrating the fabric.

When considering carpet, keep the same tips in mind: tight weaves and short nap will go a long way to eliminating headaches. The Mohawk Group's Lees brand of carpet tiles come with a special pet warranty to protect homeowners from stains.

Though hard-surfaced floors are more popular, even the most durable hardwoods won't withstand the wear and tear from your pets. If you are set on hard-surfaced flooring, consider tile, laminate and the newer vinyl luxury products. oh

Even without knowing who lives here, it's easy to see, from a simple stroll around the property, that this year-round cottage belongs to people who cherish family above all else. That the purpose of this home is to have a space for loved ones to gather, reconnect, and be physically near one another.

It's easy to imagine magical days with the sound of children's laughter echoing from the play fort, rambunctious splashing at the waterfront, large family dinners on the deck, and stories shared around the fire pit.

As if the land and water hadn't been generous enough, the maples provide plentiful sap during melting spring days, perfect for harvesting homemade maple syrup to be enjoyed all summer long over lazy pancake breakfasts with family and friends. It's a tradition that Eric, Lori, and their two children, Jodi, 19, and Carter, 18, have enjoyed cultivating over the years.

Family business owners with demanding city lives, Eric and Lori cherish all the time they can muster at their cottage. When it came time to renovate their cottage for an updated look, they went to long-time collaborator and designer, **Patricia Miragliotta** from **Interior Images**, for guidance.

"I couldn't even imagine how beautiful the cottage would turn out, but Patricia did," says Lori. "She has vision. She asks detailed questions, listens and then goes above and beyond your expectations."

Just past the foyer, you are struck by the great room, with its vaulted 20-foot pine ceiling and fish-bone placed boards. The spacious room is positively awash in warm sunlight. Patricia aimed to accommodate Eric and Lori's traditional and formal style, while creating a rustic charm and no-fuss casualness to the great room.

That is certainly achieved in the open-concept kitchen, designed by Interior Images. Sienna antique glazed and distressed cabinetry with a contrasting oxblood colour island from Downsview Kitchens, through **Astro Design Centre**, playfully dances with the ceiling's height. The same cabinetry panels conceal the sub-zero fridge for a subtle, cohesive look. The soft travertine backsplash by **Euro Tile & Stone** and hood fan from **Universal Appliances** give the kitchen a very European influence. Two shaded wall sconces over the cooktop are from Gingers.

In the dining area, a stunning Hubbardton Forge chandelier from **Marchand Lighting + Electrical** is an inspired choice with its rustic black chain and smoky glass cylinders that give off a soft turn-of-thecentury yellow glow.

Patricia clearly wanted to help Eric and Lori honour cottage life in the family area of the great room. "The furniture and fabrics were selected to lend a relaxed elegance Eric and Lori would feel comfortable in, but with nothing too precious for wet bathing suits, sand and cottage living," says Patricia. "Since this home-away-from-home is used year round, resurfacing the existing fireplace with cultured stone and a reclaimed wood mantel was used to create warmth for cooler days and nights." Tying it all together are the selections of oxblood and straw colours found in the wool plaid fabrics from Stroheim & Romann and Kravet, woven wood shades from Hunter Douglas, and a luxurious wool rug from Weavers Art.

There are many personal accents of family history displayed throughout the cottage, including a handsome wooden barrel with black straps that Lori's father, a self-taught craftsman, refinished. It holds a special place in Lori's heart. A weigh scale, once used for seed and grain was an auction find for Eric, who refurbished it himself. It now serves as the family room coffee table and a conversation piece. The sailboat on the fireplace was a gift from Eric's parents, and a nod to the family's favourite summer pastime, boating on the Ottawa River.

Although good design is an activity that draws on multiple senses, it is the visual influence that creates the biggest impact. When your visual acuity is led by a clever, multi-layered, cohesive design, the results are striking.

Shiva Gupta's sleek suburban home is nestled on a tree-lined Kanata street. However, this home absolutely hums with urban chic, from the moment you pull up to the curb. It pops out of the streetscape, with sublime landscaping by 7j Design, a front door with an elegant curve (Designer's Home Centre), original works of art and a contemporary exterior façade that packages the home and hints at the design experience that awaits inside.

Designer and proprietor of 7j Design, Shiva designed her entire home herself, both the interior and the exterior façade. She has a team of tradespeople, and prides herself on her personal investment in her projects - both emotionally and to the vision of the design plan. "I take a whole project from start to finish," she explains.

A trained designer, also an artist, Shiva's home is a testament to her craft, with each square inch filling an artistic need. Like brushstrokes on a canvas, each splash of colour or placement of line and shape combine to create a quiet visual impact. It's subtle yet profound, like a piece of artwork that stays with you long after you leave the gallery. Shiva's original pieces of art comprise the accent pieces throughout the home, including sculpture and paintings. Everywhere, on the walls and in the design elements, Shiva's preference for clean lines is clear.

She describes herself as a "minimalist" who "likes straight lines that are not too busy to the eye. It's all about what is pleasing to the eye."

Shiva has lived in this house for 30 years. Her 1,900 sq. ft. home has been renovated extensively (think moving walls and completely redefining and repurposing the space). The first wall came down 20 years ago.

Since then, among other things, she has redesigned her main floor plan. Originally, there was a sunken living room, which they didn't use often, and a dining room, flanked by a small galley kitchen. She raised the sunken living room because, as she explains, "a drop in level contributes to a chop in the space, giving it a narrow feel," and has repurposed it as the dining room.

The whole home is a study in geometry, with stripes and directed line patterns occupying the space. On several doors and windows, instead of traditional window coverings, Shiva has placed patterned films with cut-out shapes that accomplish privacy and décor at the same time.

In order to lead the eye, Shiva has used wide stripes of grey in the tile (Emerald Tile + Marble), both on the kitchen floor and on the backsplash, which provides contrast to the white surrounding. Continued on page 42











These angles and lines continue upstairs into the main bathroom, where the tile is angular and patterned, with just the right contrast and connection to each other. Of particular interest over the floating toilet, is a trail of red, which literally lures your eye around the room. "The grout lines in red detail what makes this space special," says Shiva.

Shiva doesn't like the visually jarring effect that happens when you cut between spaces. As the hardwood (Mirage Hardwood Floors, Select Grade Birch in Satin finish) of the dining room transitions into the tile of the kitchen and then back into the hardwood of the great room, she has added elegant curves in the flooring to soften the visual blow when you move from space to space. It makes an interesting subtext as well; while this is a wide open space plan, these subtle cues divide the perimeters of each room, without dividing the space.

Almost like a visual ladder, a textured fireplace (The Fireplace Center & Patio Shop) with a sculpted façade draws the eye in and up in the two-storey great room. Cathedral ceilings are punctuated with a skylight and natural light that enhance the sense of space.

The finishes in the main living space play a refractory purpose, with quartz countertops (Emerald Tile + Marble) in the kitchen and lacquer cabinetry (custom made by 7j Design) by catching the light and spreading it throughout. A glass block wall (Merkley Supply Ltd.) along the staircase to the basement sits in front of a mirror to help light the space. Continued on page 44

Shiva is keenly aware of the sightline in the space and goes to great lengths not to interrupt it. For instance, there is very little suspended lighting in the home, save for a super-funky light fixture (Marchand Lighting + Electrical) in the upstairs bathroom, in place "to provide a splash of colour," according to Shiva. This, like every other inch of this home, is the result of a deliberate choice.

Instead, Shiva favours recessed lights in the kitchen, which she has pragmatically put on dimmer switches to aid in work, or to soften the mood in the room. "Suspended fixtures cut into a small space," she says.

The focal point in the kitchen is a streamline hood fan (Bosch, Universal **Appliances**), and she felt that stacking the space with light fixtures would diminish the impact. There are also potlights in numerous areas around the house, meant to showcase her artwork, but to also diffuse and deliver light throughout the space in a way that uniquely suits it.

What is particularly appealing about this home is how it presents a visual experience, and then working backwards, and pulling the design elements apart, you can see how expertly they fit together. он





Attention to detail

The secret to satisfying returning customers.

For returning Westend Bath and Kitchen customers Jo Anne Gilbert and Paul Pagotto, the looming 25th anniversary of their Kanata home was all the impetus they needed to get started on the kitchen and family area renovations they had been fantasizing about for years. 





METAL **MADNESS**

ADDING GOLD TONES TO YOUR KITCHEN

With summer in the air, you're probably going to want to soak up all the sunshine you can. But don't totally leave your interior in the dark! This is the year to go for gold in your kitchen, and bring a sense of timeless radiance to the room that you can bask in all year round – UV free. Take some inspiration from my own kitchen redesign, and mix a new metal into your space for first-place results. Here's how:

Bold and Brassy While warm metals, in general, are seeing a huge resurgence, one humble material in particular is worthy of its newfound time in the spotlight: brass. To add a sunny metallic tone that doesn't feel too opulent, brass is the perfect understated option.

In my own home kitchen, I first opted to add brilliant brass handles to my cabinetry. Switching out cabinet hardware is an easy way to update a look, and moving from silvery steel to a warm metal creates a noticeable change instantly. Plus, research has found that copper (a fundamental element of brass) has antimicrobial qualities, for a healthier kitchen along with a beautiful design.



Mix and Don't Match One reason people may be scared to go golden in the kitchen is the cost of a total overhaul. Fear not: even warm metallics (especially balanced brass) are still very hot and cool essences will complement and energize each other, so feel free to mix in a lot

A few simple accessories can bring a strong feeling of gold to a space even without a hardware change. Look for textural golden accents like the Talis Hammered platter in my Yanic Simard Selected collection, and repeat the material in another zone (in a picture frame, candleholder or cocktail shaker) to make it feel integrated throughout the room.





The future looks bright. A golden faucet makes a big statement, but with long-term potential. Brass has spent a few decades with a bad reputation, but this warm metal has enjoyed centuries of appreciation, so you don't have to worry about an investment in gold growing old any time soon.

Here in my kitchen, I upgraded to an Aquabrass Quinoa faucet with a sleek joystick control. While clean-lined faucets are still not widely available in golden finishes, many companies like Aquabrass do offer special finish options as a custom order. Alternately, try mixing the ornate details of a traditional faucet with contemporary cabinets and a sleek stone counter to create an elegant transitional style.

Lights are a natural place to go gold, as it suits and enhances the radiance they provide, plus it always helps to add a new layer of lighting in any space, especially in a kitchen where balanced lighting is key to ease of work

Look for brass-accented sconces to bring a touch of gold to the walls, and pendant lights to bring some further golden sparkle to your eyeline. Keep it current and understated by choosing styles with metallic bases and glass shades (like the Lander Sconce from Crate and Barrel), for a light and airy jewelry-like effect. (PHOTO COURTESY OF CRATE AND BARREL)

Wrapping up a shiny new golden look takes just a few finishing touches. Yellow accents will pick up the natural sunny undertones, so add a handful of blossoms, or display a lemon-hued cookbook (or some actual lemons).

Accents of blue will make gold pop, so toss in a few pieces of blue-hued dishware, or choose a navy cabinet treatment (like my Benjamin Moore's 2062-20 Gentleman's Grey finish). I contrasted my cabinet handles with cut crystal knobs (which you can also match from my Yanic Simard Selected collection at YSSelected.ca), for the perfect mix! OH

tiny treasures THE RUBY-THROATED HUMMINGBIRD

I am an avid and all-inclusive bird-lover, and as promised in a previous fowl-related story, it's now time I tell the tale of the glorious pint-sized jewels of the summer sky – the hummingbird. Why not join in all the fun and ready your garden for the hummingbirds this year?



These beloved little creatures are an amazing feat of nature. The tiny seven-to-nine centimeter birds have a heart rate that reaches 1,260 beats per minute and can hover in mid-air as their wings furiously beat 50 times per second! To keep up with this pace, they need to consume their weight in nectar each day and are continually just hours away from starvation at any given time. Although hummingbirds are well known to feed on nectar, they also eat many small insects. This fact makes garden chemical and pesticide use strictly prohibited for a safe hummingbird environment as these can kill both adults and young alike.

Putting up a feeder is a surefire way to entice hummingbirds to your garden, and the best feeders are made from glass or acrylic. It is essential to clean your feeders twice per week to avoid nectar spoilage and accidental fowl fatality. Place the feeder away from windows, ideally near tall plant cover such as a tree or hedge. Home-made food mix is a one-quarter sugar-to-water ratio, and it's best to avoid colouring the fluid for the bird's optimal health. Hummingbirds also love spraying water. Unlike most backyard bird bathers, these birds enjoy flying in and out of a spray of water.

It is in the hummer's nature to forage

constantly, and they only use a feeder for about 20 per cent of their daily nectar consumption. By providing spraying water, trees, a feeder plus their favoured, flower-nectar sources in a succession of bloom you will deliver a utopia they may even nest in! But don't be surprised if you don't spot the nesting site. The tiny little cup-shaped nests made with spider silk, thistledown and animal hair often include lichens, which almost completely disguise them. If you happen to see a minute emerald/ red bird flying fast in a U-shaped flight pattern, you are witnessing a male's mating dance. After copulation, the petite pair does not raise their young as a couple, leaving the female to raise their young unaided.

Contrary to popular belief, Hummingbirds do not feed only on red flowers or feeders. They will feed from any that is rich in nectar, but do have a preference for vivid colours.

Ruby-throated Hummingbirds migrate north much earlier and stay far later than one might assume. Ensure your feeders are full and available mid-April until late fall. It is the strongest males that return first to establish the premium territories, which usually include the all-important feeder. They are also the first to leave, often early August, followed by the females. The new fledglings are last to leave and left behind to accumulate fat stores for

their solitary migration south. Hummingbirds will not stay past their usual fall migration time when feeders are left out.

Our miniature feathered friends feed most actively in the morning and evening, making these the optimal times for viewing. At my home, the acrobatic performances of our resident hummingbirds are the afterdinner entertainment as we sit in the garden surrounded by a multitude of miniature speed-demons whizzing by our heads! The impatient and frustrated little birds are extremely territorial, and I've witnessed many a squabble between rival males. They'll even try to chase away other bird species, bees and butterflies to defend their terrain. If you ever observe several birds at the feeder together without aggression, they are likely related family. Unfortunately, their small stature leaves them prey to a host of common backyard life such as the (gulp) praying mantis and blue jay.

how to GRILL the **PERFECT** STEAK

Almost anyone can toss a burger on the barbecue and be happy with how it's cooked. A steak? Not so simple. But with a little prep and some know-how, it can be just as easy to cook a succulent, juicy steak on the grill as anything else.

Ja<mark>m</mark>ie Hussey, <mark>Execu</mark>tive Chef at Glen Abbey Golf Course in Oakville, Ontario, recommends strip loin or sirloin steaks for the grill. "They have a better flavour, and they are robust," he says.

Ted Reader, the author of Gastro Grilling, agrees but adds that he loves rib steak too. "I like my steaks to be cut about one-anda-half to two-inches thick and weigh about 12 to 16 ounces each, depending on the cut. A thicker steak will cook more evenly and give you a little wiggle room in case you get distracted," he says.

Prepare your steaks

According to Reader, good quality steaks do not need to be marinated or tenderized only if you want to add a certain flavour.

On the other hand, if you're using a tougher cut, marinate it for at least a day before grilling. Hussey recommends a base of red wine, garlic and herbs - and always a ratio of two-to-one for oil and vinegar.

Salt your steaks just before grilling. This will give them a nice crust. This is the time to season with herbs and garlic if you like, too. Chef Hussey says chimichurri is his favourite steak finisher of all time.

Bring your steaks to room temperature before placing them on your barbecue.

Hit the grill

Cook your steaks for a short time at a high temperature. "Six hundred degrees Fahrenheit or higher if you can," says

Reader. Leave your barbecue lid open and resist the temptation to poke your steaks.

Never overfill your grill. Leave at least an inch-and-a-half clearance around each piece of meat.

Cook your steaks to your preferred doneness (see our chart), and then let them rest for 10 minutes before serving, says Chef Hussey. This prevents bleeding onto your plate.

Never cut your meat to check whether it's cooked to your liking. "Cutting the steak lets all the natural juices escape, leaving you with a dry and tasteless piece of meat, says Reader.

Don't flip out

Only turn and flip your steaks as necessary. Reader suggests this flip-and-rotate approach:

- Place steaks on a hot grill on a 45-degree angle at 11 o'clock.
- Grill for two-to-five minutes to sear, depending on the thickness and doneness you want.
- Turn 45 degrees to 2 o'clock, cook for another two-to-five minutes.
- Flip steaks and baste the grilled surface with your favourite baste. Continue to grill for two-to-five minutes on a 45-degree angle.
- Turn 45 degrees and cook for another two-to-five minutes.
- Flip and baste again.

"Now you have that fancy steakhouse diamond pattern!"

Two final pieces of advice from Chef Hussey: "It's always better to undercook a steak than to overcook a steak. And have fun! Buy the best local products you can, have a couple of beers and enjoy it!"

Pick the perfect steak

Ted Reader's four rules for picking the best beef:

1. Buy the best quality steak you can afford: "Not all good top cuts (rib eye or strip loin) are always tender. There are many grades of meat." Grade A is the worst quality and AAA is the best.

- 2. Dry aging: "The older a steak is, the more tender it will be." Many butchers dry age beef themselves.
- 3. Fat: "To put it simply, fat equals flavour. Internal fat or marbling is what gives a steak its succulence and juiciness." External fat will also add flavour, but can be cut off after cooking.
- 4. Find a good butcher: Nobody else will be able to answer your questions better, nor cater to all your steak needs. Learn what you like and want and ask for it.



A meat thermometer is the best way to test doneness. Here's Ted Reader's guide to the steak rainbow:

Blue Rare: A blue rare steak is quickly charred on the outside and barely cooked on the inside. For best results, bring the steak to room temperature before cooking. (130°F)

Rare: A rare steak has a cool red centre. (130-140°F)

Medium-Rare: A mediumrare steak has a warm red centre. (140-145°F)

Medium: A medium steak has a pink centre, and the juices are clear. (145-150°F)

Medium-Well: A medium-well steak has a hot pink centre, and the juices are clear. (150-160°F)

Well-Done: A well-done steak is grey throughout without any trace of pink and the juices are clear. (160-170°F)

Super Well Done: This steak is weighted with a brick until heavily charred on the outside and without any trace of pink and no juices inside. (170°F plus) он



A sunny southern exposure, breathtaking views and a sandy beach – alluring delights of a summer home are easy to picture. "We all want the dream," says realtor Caitlin Hill of Royal LePage. But the joys of summer aren't always available at a price buyers can afford. "The reality is, that dream is \$500,000 and you may only have \$300,000, so you have to give up something in your dream," says Fred Aitken, a Royal LePage broker. "We can go out and find the next best thing," says Hill.

The Lakes of Muskoka realtors expect another strong season of recreational property sales in Ontario's cottage country. A healthy economy, rising employment and low interest rates have buoyed the residential housing market. Like a rising tide, it has lifted recreational property sales to their highest levels since the financial meltdown of 2008. With house values rising, some people are leveraging equity gains in their urban homes to buy cottages and summer homes all over Ontario.

Typical cottage hunters want a woodland retreat within a two-hour drive of home. Ideally, they want a country house on the water, with cathedral ceilings and windows overlooking the lake - a property where children can play safely, where they can swim, launch a canoe, dock a boat or fish. With many of the six million denizens of southern Ontario cities eager for respite from summer heat and suburban hubbub, demand for summer homes is high, and so are the prices.

Royal LePage's 2014 Recreational Property Report estimates that cottages on Lake Erie and Lake Huron, within an hour or two-hour drive of London, ranged from \$195,000 to \$2.4 million. In Muskoka, two hours north of Toronto, typical waterfront cottages with road access were selling from \$525,000 to \$650,000. On larger Muskoka lakes, more than 100 waterfront cottages fetched between \$1 million and \$8 million.

There are comparative bargains. In eastern Ontario, in the land of 1,000 islands,

waterfront cottages with road access in the Kingston area ranged from \$185,000 to \$325,000. Waterfront properties accessible only by boat cost \$175,000 to \$210,000 while inland sites were \$80,000 to \$110,000.

In the Meaford and Collingwood areas, the average price of a waterfront cottage with land access was estimated at \$345,000. A similar property on the Bruce Peninsula ranged from \$250,000 to \$400,000. In Haliburton, the price averaged \$350,000.

If you're lucky enough to live in northern Ontario or are willing to drive several hours, you can buy an affordable recreational property and still have money for all the toys to equip it. Up north, they're usually called camps, not cottages. On St. Joseph Island, a 45-minute drive southeast of Sault Ste. Marie, cottage owners can watch gigantic lake freighters ply the St. Marys River from waterfront properties that can be bought for an average of \$150,000. Inland camps run about \$100,000.

Near Sudbury, home of Science North, Dynamic Earth and the Big Nickel, waterfront camps and cottages average \$190,000, while a water access only site will run about \$140,000 and an inland property \$100,000 - a bargain if you're willing to drive four hours from Toronto. Similar prices can be found around Lake Nipissing in the North Bay area.

The three things that most affect the price of the cottage are the size of the lake, size of the cottage and its condition. The proximity of amenities, such as shopping, dining, a


movie theatre or golf, is also a factor. The closer the amenities, the more a cottage might cost. Cottages accessible only by boat are less expensive as are those inland without any waterfront.

Rob Serediuk, a salesman with Chestnut Park Real Estate Ltd. Brokerage, estimates that more than half the people he deals with have considered renting their cottage when they're not using it to help cover expenses. Cottage rental agencies can screen tenants and handle all the administration for a fee. Keeping a cottage, maintenance and repairs, utilities and taxes will cost just as much as a home in the city.

Many people are making more use of their country homes than their parents did a generation ago. The demand for year-round road access and four-season liveability is hot. With the proliferation of reliable Internet service, four-day weekends at the cottage are getting more popular. "People who are working from their house are now working from their cottage," says Aitken.


More and more buyers view the cottage as more than a summer home. Rob and Jennifer Anderson of Newmarket designed their cottage on Lake of Bays with their three young children in mind. But they also planned years ahead. "It will eventually be where Rob and I will retire," says Jennifer. "We would be there half the time and hopefully somewhere warm through the hard winter months, when we get to that stage of our life." **OH**
