
Our People feature is all about businesses who are there to help, and this may be the time of year where you plan your next renovations.







### TRIM DETAILS

Architectural details are an important part of your home's aesthetic, whether they stand out as a dominant feature or remain minimal and inconspicuous. Crown mouldings, door and window casings and baseboards all aid in defining your home's overall style. But what are they for anyhow? Does your home require trim or can you do without it? Let's look at the purpose of trim and how styles can change the look of your home.

### The Basics

Traditionally, moulding serves a purpose. It is not just "make-up" for your home. Take baseboard (or skirting) for instance. A baseboard covers the gap between the bottom of your wall where it meets the floorboards or carpeting. Baseboard is traditionally composed of three parts – the base, the shoe and a cap. Using a more contemporary approach, the baseboard is one part and then a small shoe to cover the gap is applied. The more modern you go, the fewer parts you tend to use. Personally, I prefer a baseboard without a shoe mould, but in some instances it's unavoidable.


1. Crown

Casing is applied around a window or door and covers the gap between the window and the wall, or the jamb. Typically, this area is insulated and the casing is a decorative piece of wood that can be assembled in several parts to include a sill and a header, or as a simple picture-frame style. The casing that surrounds your windows would also follow through to the interior doors. A general rule of thumb is that a more decorative casing means a more traditional style.

Crown moulding is the piece that covers the seam between the wall and ceiling. It generally rests against the ceiling and wall with a space in between. A crown (or cornice) is typically plaster or wood, but more modern materials like plaster and foam are also used. In a traditional Victorian home for example, the living and dining rooms would have larger-scale cornice in stained wood and the second floor would use a smaller scale. This gave the main entertainment space a sense of grandeur.

Architectural details go way beyond trim. They include wainscotting, ceiling beams, plate rails, chair rails, plinth blocks, or any piece of trim that you would apply to walls or ceilings to enhance or define a particular look. You need an architectural dictionary to learn all of the terminology!

### A Modern Approach

So if all of this trim work has a purpose, how are modern homes going without? It actually takes (arguably) a lot more work to use NO trim than it does to use case, crown and base. And cost-wise, you may save on materials, but you will pay your drywaller much more for the finishing. And fair enough, because it's a lot of work!

A term that is very common in modern architectural detailing

is a "reveal." A reveal is a small gap that is used in place of a trim detail. Rather than adding pieces to your wall (casing), a reveal looks like an indent into your wall. This means that where the drywall ends,

there is a small indent or reveal. All of this is finished in drywall with corner beads and a painted finish. This allows for a completely clean and simple look.

If you want to achieve a modern look, you have a few things to consider. First of all, budget! You may save on materials if you choose to omit casing, but you will likely spend more on drywalling. Don't assume that less detail equals less cost.

If the budget is tight but you still want modern, a common choice is simple flat stock. A simple three-inch board can make a very nice trim piece if done correctly. It is cost effective and has a contemporary look. Get quotes first before making a decision.

Choosing these details is tedious and does require a certain amount of thought and expertise. The scale of everything has to coordinate with the scale of the house and with other architectural details. The style should be continuous. Having a contractor bring samples to a site and create a mock-up is the best way to actually see what your choices will look like in your home. This is where hiring a professional has value! OH

There is a particular kind of skill in appearing effortless, especially when you are creating something. It's even more impressive when the end result is built upon a myriad of minute details that silently slide into each other and positively combust with style and purpose.

This is precisely what you'll find inside **Mark Kranenburg**'s Greely home, which is proof positive that a space can be simultaneously utilitarian and stylish. Mark's home is comprised of sleek, contemporary design elements that each has a distinct function.

Mark is the owner and president of custom home building company **Greenmark Builders**, which is quickly gathering notoriety and acclaim in the Ottawa homebuilding market. To add to his collection of awards that Greenmark has received, Mark recently won the People's Choice Award at the annual Housing Design Awards, sponsored by the Greater Ottawa Home Builders' Association. And the home that won? The one that he designed for his own family to live in.

Mark shares this four-bedroom home with his wife Crystal and their young children.

There are so many "small things" in this home that just make sense and work together to simplify and support quality of life. "I favour design that is clean and simple," says Mark, "It's hard enough to keep things organized, so where we can help, we help."

For instance, in the sizable kitchen, Mark talks about the seemingly innocuous choice of placing the fridge and the freezer (Electrolux,

**Corbeil Appliances**) on opposite walls.

But as he explains it, you can easily see how this kitchen, like so many other rooms in the house, goes from good to great with small but significant choices. "This is something I would absolutely do again," says Mark. "In so many homes you have the fridge and freezer side by side, which is a waste of space," explaining that corner cabinetry doesn't get used to its full capacity. To create a more efficient use of space, he placed the fridge and freezer opposite

to each other, across the island (Masterpiece Granite & Marble Inc., Espresso Granite) and created a row of cabinetry (Harpstone Kitchens Ltd.) in between.

Also in the kitchen, Mark pulls out a drawer that houses a chopping board. This isn't just any chopping board though; it has a receptacle underneath to catch droppings from kitchen prep. The board is also completely removable, which makes for easy clean up. Continued on page 29



Often, Mark says, people see something really smart on *Houzz*, in OUR HOMES magazine or from other housing inspiration, and say, "'That's so cool! I would love that!' Well, I actually did that." At the front of the house, the mudroom (Harpstone Kitchens Ltd.) has sleek built-ins, with some highly functional qualities. As Mark points out, the room is well equipped with hooks as opposed to hangers for hanging coats and other items, which is genius from a space and ease standpoint.

In the front hall area, he has cleverly raised and widened the doorways, subtly changing the sense of space – from big to bigger – with huge impact. He matched the light fixture (Marchand Lighting & Electrical) to the floor (Barwood Flooring, Superior Oak Wire Brush Finish) as well, another small detail among many that serve to stitch the seams around this house's contemporary cool design.

A favourite gathering spot for the family

is the great room, with a contemporary natural stone fireplace (Harding The Fireplace Ltd.) that serves as a stylish focal point. This fireplace is not only fashionable, it's functional as well, in that it was designed to contribute to the family's comfort. They chose an LED fireplace, so that they could gather family and friends in the room without being too hot.

One of the coolest parts of this home is a stunning ledgestone feature wall (Olympia Tile) that you are greeted with immediately upon entry. It was the last thing that Mark did in the home. He really wanted to create a visual that not only impressed, but cemented the theme for the house. The end result? He got what he wanted. "Everyone that comes in my door says, 'I love that wall!"

Moving upstairs, the master bedroom is funky, with a textured feature wall that enhances the space without dominating it. In the master bathroom, you are greeted with a sublime pedestal tub,




dark granite countertops (Emerald Tile + Marble), Nero Angola) and sizeable shower (Olympia Tile) with a huge rain shower showerhead (Hansgrohe, Mondeau Bathrooms and Kitchens). Another one of Mark's clever design tricks is the way in which he has extended the mirror directly to the countertop rather than installing the usual lip to transition from counter to mirror.

Leveraging the reflective quality of the mirror, "It looks like your granite just flows," he says.

And that's not the only place he uses refractory light as a design tool; it's evident with a number of light fixtures throughout the house. "We're huge on lighting," says Mark, commenting on how light fixtures are an often overlooked design tool. As he explains, they aren't just focal points; they create effects in distributing the light, like shadows, which can alter your perception of a space.

Mark is not only an award-winning builder, he is a pioneer of sorts. He describes how he has kind of "morphed the idea of open concept" by using design elements like textured ceilings to define the space below as a separate but connected room, which he did in the great room.

The goal for his home, was to "include design everywhere," which is clearly evident, even in the most minute of details. 


















STORY MELANIE REKOLA Christmas TREE

Choosing a live Christmas tree is a time-honoured tradition that comes but once a year. Knowing what to look for, what variety to choose and how to keep it fresh and fragrant after decking your halls can be a challenge for many a yuletide enthusiast.

Heed these words of choosing well to keep your Tannenbaum from turning into a Charlie Brown special before Christmas day. And maybe, just maybe, it will last into the New Year's festivities!

### PLAN AND PREPARE

Firstly, choose and clear the space where you'll be standing your Christmas tree. Measure the area, including ceiling height, but remember to subtract the height of your stand and the angel or star you'll be placing at the top. Note the size of your stand. Will your tree's trunk fit? You must be sure, as trees whose bark is stripped to fit will surely die a fast death. Are there nearby electrical outlets that are free to service the lighting? And how will you get it home? As the old adage says, if you fail to plan, you plan to fail.

### **CHRISTMAS TREE TYPES**

Choosing an Ontario-grown tree is the best choice not only for the freshest and longestlasting tree, but for the environment and local economy as well. Most of these evergreens are actually cut three to four weeks before they are available for sale to avoid messy sap production. You may recognize some of these specimens growing in local forests or even in vour own backvard.

- White Pine: Graceful branching and soft needles make this tree a bit hard to decorate, but it can be worth it for the sheer ornamental value alone. It sports nice greenish-grey foliage too.
- White Spruce: Strong slender twigs and dark-green foliage hold ornaments well. This spruce is a moisture sucker and requires frequent watering to prevent needle drop.

• Scots Pine: A very thick, hearty, green tree that holds needles well. This is the most popular Christmas tree available.

Balsam and Fraser Fir: Similar to white Balsam and reason in Summer spruce in branching and shape but with softer needles. Great needle retention, and colours vary from bright green to blue green.

**5** Blue Spruce: Stout silvery blue or blue-grey branches with sharp, dense needles and strong branches that hold heavy ornaments with ease.

### SELECTING THE FRESHEST TREE

Choosing a Grade A tree is similar to choosing the best produce at the grocery store.

• After you find the ideal-looking tree. lift it a few inches off the ground and let it drop. If needles shed from the exterior branches, this tree is far from ideal. Note that needle drop from interior branches is completely normal.

- Now it's time to give a branch a gentle squeeze. Are you left with a bunch of needles in your hand? If so, move on.
- The last test is to crush a few needles in your hand. Does it have a fresh tree scent? That's a good sign as evergreens with little fragrance are often past their prime.
- Now have your chosen tree wrapped in netting for easy transport.


### BACK AT HOME

Before bringing your new tree inside, you must make a fresh cut to its trunk. This is how the tree uptakes water, making this an

last. While you're at it, remove some of the lower branches to leave room for the gifts. Once standing, be sure to give your evergreen This new Arbre de Noël is going to suck up at least a gallon of water over the next few days and needs constant top-ups. Keep at it until the uptake subsides a bit and keep water at a constant level from then on. Finally it's time to trim your tree, crank the Christmas
















### "I WANTED MY HOUSE TO LOOK LIKE CAPE COD,

but in Russell," says Alana Lama of her three-bedroom home, built in 1906. This home is undeniably warm and charming, with a quiet elegance that emits from its history.

Why the connection to Cape Cod? Alana and her husband Ricardo have vacationed in Martha's Vineyard every year since 2006, and they are passionate and enthusiastic about that pocket of the world that is very special to them.

"We just feel so good when we are there," says Alana. "It's like we arrive and everything just feels better." It's no wonder then that Alana and Ricardo wanted to incorporate that glorious vacation feeling by creating a similar environment for their everyday lives.

As you approach this sweet house, you are greeted with a decidedly nautical theme on the front porch, complete with white picket fencing.

As you work your way through the house towards the back to their pleasant screened porch, you can really sense that they've successfully created a sanctuary.

In addition to the colour scheme that involves lots of white, navy and sea greens and the liberal use of bead board, there are small décor touches delicately placed throughout the house. A small lighthouse in the front window and a framed map of Martha's Vineyard in the master bedroom keep the Cape Cod theme on point.

When they moved in a year ago, they didn't set out to reinvent their home, but rather wanted to refresh the space while giving it their own personal stamp.

It was important to Alana and Ricardo to stay true to the character of this century house, which is why they decided not to undertake any major renovations and reconfigure the space. They both have a deep

reverence for both the age and endurance of this home, and acknowledge this with a respect that you'd have for a person that you admire for their age and wisdom.

Alana says of their decision to preserve a number of the house's original elements, "This old house deserves old things," and that staying true to its original design is the kind of thing that "the house would want."

That doesn't mean that Alana and Ricardo couldn't contemporize it though. They started by making a bold choice on the main floor with, of all things, an understated shade of white (Benjamin Moore's Natural Wicker).

NJCC Painting completed the work and also provided welcome advice on colour choices. It was Ricardo who first had the vision of covering the dark wood that was so prevalent on the main floor with white, on the premise that it would brighten the space.

In addition to the walls, they painted the stair railings, baseboards and trim and an elegant transom that sits like a regal textured archway between the front hall and the living room.

When you are trying to contemporize a space based on specific design criteria, but still respect the historical influence, where do you put the television? You design a custom fireplace (Romantic Fireplaces & BBQs Inc.) in the living room that houses the television, of course, with bead board and white trim, continuing the colour theme. When the television is not in use, a mirrored panel slides in front, making the small space seem larger. The mirrors also catch and redistribute the light back through the transom, making the room cheery and well-lit.

Alana and Ricardo also redid much of the flooring in the house, including reviving the original birch floors throughout the main level (**Artech Floor**). Ricardo sanded down the staircase himself, making the wood appear stylishly weathered. A fun light fixture (Regina Andrew Bird Chandelier, installed by **Pana Electric**) hangs in front of the staircase, adding visual interest without dominating the area. *Continued on page 42*

Alana wanted to accentuate the nine-and-a-half-foot ceilings and the huge windows on the main floor and made clever use of some custom draperies (Wicker Emporium, Ottawa Draperies) that underscore the nautical theme with subtle navy and white. A similar colour and pattern was used in custom slipcovers and cushions (The Old Chelsea Slipcover Co.) in the entryway and living room.

Alana and Ricardo love to entertain, and that is evident in their dining room, which is elegantly styled with warm Christmas décor (Beyond the House). A focal point in the dining room is a rustic, refreshingly authentic sideboard that Alana designed herself and had built and painted by Johnson's Antiques & Reproductions. The sideboard not only elevates the sophistication of the space, it is highly functional as well, with custom pullouts and tools that facilitate serving and dining.

Upstairs, there are marvellous features that connect this century home to its storied past, like opaque transoms over the doors and oversize baseboards. Like on the main floor, Ricardo and Alana used paint to renew the space upstairs, and this small change has major impact. The master bedroom, guest room and bathroom all utilize understated colours that serve to soften the space and make it current. Continued on page 44







### Natural Materials

Wood floors work for virtually any sort of space, but they're especially essential to making a white room feel like home. Don't have hardwood to show off? Add some in with accents like woodblock side tables, wooden picture frames, a butcher-block counter or some simple driftwood art.

Marble, quartz and other stones are a rich source of organic patterning that adds visual interest and even more texture to a space, further highlighting the crispness of white while adding some perfect imperfections to keep the look from feeling clinical.

**How To:** Use stone and wood for surfaces like flooring, counters, backsplashes and tile, or introduce these natural elements through stools, chests, tables and other small furnishings.







### Undercover Colours

Navy is a special kind of colour: it's a true neutral, but also a radiant hue. It's a perfect go-to when you want to add some interest to your palette without overwhelming other colours – plus it helps make whites look extra clean and bright.

Leafy greens are another option that feels like a neutral "noncolour" while actually sneaking a new hue into the room along with a sense of natural life. Grab anything from an oversized fiddle-leaf fig tree to a small easy-care cactus to give a room a breath of fresh air.

**How To:** Add navy upholstery, pillows, or accessories – and a living plant – to cheat some colour into an all-white scheme without disrupting the breezy ambience.

### Finishing Underfoot

Spreading your colour palette throughout a space creates cohesiveness, and this is true even for white. Use rugs, ottomans, or other low pieces to add hits of white into the centre of the space, so it isn't only found on the walls – this way the entire room will feel tied together.

As a final touch, a bold black and white rug can't be beat. Even a clean white space can use some graphic black to punctuate it, and a geometric pattern adds some dynamic energy that keeps the space engaging, no matter where you look.

**How To:** A timeless black and white stripe works anywhere, from the living room to the bathroom to the foyer. For an alternate option, try a classic black-and-white cowhide, which can fit into small or odd-shaped spaces. **OH**

Choosing the right light will not only provide a visual focal point in your room, but will create the ideal atmosphere for each dining occasion. Before visiting your local lighting showroom, consider these tips to help narrow your search for the perfect light.

### Measure

Before hitting the stores, consider the proportions of your room and furniture. The following three measurements will help determine the size of light that will best suit your room.

- Ceiling Height: The height of your ceiling will determine the approximate length of light you should be looking for. When hanging a light over your table, ensure there is enough space between the bottom of the light and your tabletop. Generally, this is about 30 to 36 inches.
- **Table Size:** A common rule of thumb is to choose a light that is one-half to three-quarters of the diameter of the maximum width of your table.
- Room Dimensions: If you're purchasing a light before picking your table, consider using the dimensions of the room to determine the right fit. A simple formula that many lighting experts use is to add the length and width of the room. The total of these two dimensions in feet will equal the appropriate chandelier diameter in inches.

For example: If your room is 12 by 14 feet, you will be looking for a light that is approximately 26 inches in diameter.

### Locate

You've made your measurements, now it's time to find your electrical box. Ideally you want the electrical box centred over your table, but sometimes this isn't the case. Here are a few options to correct an off-centre electrical box.

- **Swag It:** For a quick and easy fix, consider installing a swag hook above the centre of your table. This means you should be looking for a light with a chain, so you can drape it from the electrical box to the hook. When installing the hook, don't forget to secure it to a ceiling joist.
- Hide It: In some instances, the existing electrical box isn't far from the middle of the table. It's possible to create the illusion of a centred light by selecting a fixture with a long electrical box cover. This will allow you to conceal the location of the box and make the light appear to be hanging directly over the centre of the table.
- Move It: If you're willing to invest some extra money, consider having an electrician visit to discuss the option of relocating your electrical box. You may even want to add extra electrical boxes to accommodate several pendants over your table. Consult with your electrician to discuss your options before choosing your fixture.

### Style

No longer are you confined to a limited selection of chandeliers and pendants. Today's lighting options include lanterns, orbs and a variety of geometrical shapes, allowing you to

truly incorporate your lighting into the overall style of your home. Consider other elements in the space, such as hardware finishes, accent colours and design style, before narrowing your selection. Are there other ceiling lights, lamps or wall sconces nearby? If so, you may want to consider choosing a light with a similar metal finish or style.

### Illuminate

While style and aesthetics are important, you also want to ensure that the light you choose will provide the appropriate illumination for your space. If you're replacing a light fixture, check the current number of bulbs and wattage. Is it enough? Do you need more light? If you are satisfied with the amount of light you currently have, make sure you choose a light with equal wattage. When in doubt, choose a light with extra wattage. You can always install a dimmer switch that will allow you to control light levels for each occasion. Now is a great time to switch to energy-efficient bulbs if you haven't already. Speak to your lighting consultant about energy efficient lighting options for your dining space.

### Budget

Dining room fixtures vary widely in price. It's a good idea to have a budget in mind when setting out to find the perfect light. A lighting consultant can help narrow down the options that fit both budget and style. It's also important to note that lighting showrooms will often offer a multi-product discount so it's a good idea to consider other upcoming lighting needs. **OH**

### **EGGPLANT LASAGNA**

Put a new spin on classic lasagna by replacing the noodles with eggplant, creating a low-carb and gluten-free comfort food. It's a perfect make-ahead meal for holidays and parties and will leave your guests satisfied and full!

#### **INGREDIENTS**

2 large eggplants

2 cups tomato or meat sauce

2 cups ricotta cheese

¼ cup Romano cheese, shredded

4 cups fresh spinach

1 egg

Handful of fresh basil, chopped

2 cups mozzarella cheese, shredded

Salt and pepper to taste

#### **TO PREPARE:**

- The first step is to prepare your eggplant. This process consists of salting the eggplant to draw out any bitter juices. Peel the eggplant and slice lengthwise into ¼-inch slices. Sprinkle each slice with salt on both sides and place them on a paper towel. Continue this process, layering the slices with paper towel.
- While the eggplant is sitting, preheat your oven to 400°F and then begin to prepare your ricotta mixture. Coat a pan over medium heat with a layer of olive oil. Begin to wilt the spinach in batches, adding more spinach as it continues to wilt. When all of the spinach is wilted, transfer it to a mesh strainer and press down on the spinach with a spatula to release all of the juices. Set the spinach aside to drain and cool.
- Rinse each eggplant slice with fresh water and pat dry. Layer the eggplant slices on a baking tray and coat with olive oil. Bake these in the preheated oven for about 20-25 minutes or until soft. Remove from oven and reduce oven temperature to 350°F.
- Place ricotta, Romano, egg and basil in a mixing bowl. Give the spinach one last good squeeze and chop roughly before adding to the ricotta mixture. Mix well and season with salt and pepper to taste.
- Once the eggplant is cool, it's time to begin assembling the lasagna. In a 9 x 13-inch pan, begin with a layer of tomato sauce, followed by a layer of eggplant, half the ricotta mixture and a third of the mozzarella. Repeat the following layer, ending with the mozzarella to cover the top of the lasagna.
- Cover with foil and bake for 45 minutes to an hour, uncovering the foil for the last 10 minutes, until bubbly and slightly browned on top. Let cool before slicing and enjoy! OH





# HOW TO SAVE ON high ENERGY PRICES

Soaring electricity bills and seesawing natural gas prices are spurring home energy conservation like never before.

In the past five years, Ontario's hydro rates have jumped 50 per cent for off-peak power and 77 per cent for on-peak energy. During the same period, natural gas prices have bounced year-to-year and currently sit at 24-30 per cent lower than in 2010. But in 2014, one major gas company was charging twice as much as it did in 2015.

Home heating takes the biggest bite of home energy costs in Canada and it's where homeowners can best pare expenses. Keeping cold out and heat in is the most basic and cost-effective method to do so.

### **Improve The Thermal Envelope**

Improving a home's thermal envelope – the walls, windows and doors – with insulation, weatherstripping and caulking can cut heating bills. Double-pane windows and insulated doors also help. "The best way you can save energy in a home is the envelope," says Dale Tebby, owner of Team Tebby Air Conditioning and Heating. "Insulation is the best place to spend your money. There's no question about that," says Tebby, a home heating expert for 48 years. "If you get your heat loss on the structure low enough, it doesn't matter how you heat it. It's cheap."

### **Install A Programmable Thermostat**

Small and inexpensive, a programmable thermostat that automatically turns heat down at night or when a family is out of the house can cut energy bills by as much as 10 per cent, Ontario Hydro estimates.

### **Burn Wood**

A clean-burning, energy-efficient wood stove or fireplace can save money on home heating, says Shelley Wallace, co-owner of Fireplace & Leisure Centre. "Even using your woodburning appliance in just the two coldest months of the year, January and February, can save up to 40 per cent of your annual heating costs," she says. A reliable firewood supplier, she says, is essential to getting wood in a timely fashion and dried properly or delivered early enough to be stacked and dried before the heating season. The cost of a wood stove and installation varies, depending on the type of stove, difficulty of installation and chimney height. "A full system, including product and installation, would range from \$4,500 to \$15,000," Wallace says.

#### Go Solar

Harnessing sunshine to make electricity can help to offset electrical bills. Under Ontario's microFIT program, homeowners can get a 20-year contract to produce solar energy and sell it to the power grid. Stuart Watt, general manager of Paid4Power, a firm that installs solar panel systems, estimates the average cost of a microFit project at \$36,000. He predicts it will generate a gross income of about \$80,000 over 20 years. "These systems pay themselves off after approximately seven-and-a-half years," he says.

Net metering is another method using almost the same technology. It has a twodirectional meter that credits a homeowner's hydro bill with the solar energy produced for the grid, effectively lowering the monthly electricity bill. "While it is impossible to eliminate the bill completely, a proper sized system can lower the bill by as much as 95 per cent," Watt says. These systems pay for themselves after about 10 years, he estimates.

Harnessing sunshine to make electricity

For those who want complete electrical energy independence, an off-the-grid solar power system that stores electricity in batteries costs an average of \$55,000 and takes about 20 years to pay for itself.

### **Increase Efficiency**

If a home furnace is 15 years old or older, replacing it with a high-efficiency Energy Star model can save more than 30 per cent of annual heating costs, manufacturers estimate.

Tebby's heating company goes even further. "We wouldn't sell you a furnace that wasn't way better than Energy Star," says the owner. "What we're selling now typically is 96 per cent efficient – two-stage furnaces that have an electronically controlled, variable speed

motor. We consider that a bare minimum,"
Tebby says. "That's what's going to give
everybody the best bang for their buck both in
comfort and energy."

He cautions against scrimping on the cost of the furnace itself. Someone who insists on a cheaper furnace might save \$100, but will promptly pay that saving to Ontario Hydro or a fuel supplier within a year, he warns.

### **Total Control**

For homeowners who want to control more than heat, smart technology, such as the Control 4 system, is an option. These systems can regulate thermostats, manage lights, adjust the blinds or draw the curtains. If the garage door is left open, the system can alert the homeowner and then shut it. It can turn off all the TVs in the house, lock doors and set alarms – all controlled from a touch screen, computer or cell phone, from anywhere in the world.

Improving your home's thermal envelope – adding insulation, weatherstripping doors and caulking windows – can cut your heating bills.


