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
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
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
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Open concept living might be a challenge to some, but the Marcils say they are happy with the design. "It isn't the ideal place for little children," laughs Hélène, referring to hardwood flooring and high ceilings, which echo every word and footstep. "But we love it here." Hélène says she likes the open feel of the home's design. "At first we thought about a raised counter in the kitchen to act as a barrier, but we changed our minds," she says. In fact they did the very opposite. The breakfast counter, the ideal place for her visiting grandchildren to colour while the grownups are busy in the kitchen making dinner, is lower than the rest of the counter. This also allows for an unobstructed view of the vast living area. Continued on page 20



Strategically-placed custom windows on the home's main floor, by Dalmen Windows and Doors, frame the view of the river like a piece of art, while a large octagonal window placed higher up in the dining area serves the dual function of letting in plenty of natural light while minimizing the view of the neighbour's roof line. Lighting by Multi Luminaire illuminates the spaces the grand windows can't

A graceful spiral staircase leads down from the main floor to the home's lower level; a space decorated in a palette of soft colours. This is where the Marcils' grandchildren watch TV and cuddle by the fireplace. Three bedrooms and one bathroom easily provide for the occasional sleepover.

Bernard and Hélène are also wine collectors and connoisseurs, and they recently had a wine cellar built in the lower level of the home. "We wanted a place where we could come and enjoy the wine," says Bernard. "We wanted to admire the wines. There's a story behind each acquisition."

Eric Schuller of Choice Vintners created a 1,500-bottle cellar for the Marcils where they can store and enjoy their fine vintages. Armed with an original design plan by **Sonia Grenier**, which incorporated rich warm tones and stylish decorative finishes, Schuller was able to create a gorgeous space that provided proper display, storage and climate control for the Marcils' collection. 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
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ABOVE: The large kitchen has an unobstructed view of the vast living area and a scene of the river beyond.

When designing a cellar, it is important to create a balance between storage and style. "With all of our design work in every cellar we do, we always try to have maximum storage and maximum display to be able to showcase the vintages properly," says Schuller. "When you're looking at designing a wine cellar you really want it to show nicely. You don't want it to just be about basic storage."

The coolness of the slate and the warmth of the wood binds the elements in a way that works for a space that could easily have given way to the practical side of storage instead of the beautiful side.

The place where the city and the country truly intersect is only steps away outside the home. One-hundred-and-fifty tons of rock was trucked in by Gilles Sarault of **Leo Sarault & Fils**, who designed and built roughly hewn stone steps, which lead from the back of the home down towards the river. It's a truly organic transition between the two; the stairs bridging the space as if the ancient riverbed itself was rising up in greeting.

Denis Brûlé of **Brûlé Enterprises** and Rossignol Landscaping perfected the natural feel of this outdoor space with a style of landscaping that solidifies the connection between home and water, country and city. While they enjoy their view of the river, Bernard and Hélène say they don't spend much time by the river anymore. It's mostly their children and grandchildren who take advantage of the new deck (the old one floated away – complete with furniture – after a storm) and the proximity to the water.

Regardless, it is certainly the Ottawa River that is the star of the show here. Although the vista is visible from almost every corner of every room, it's the main floor terrace that has become a favourite place to eat dinner and share a quiet glass of wine. "The sunsets are magnificent," says Bernard. "We spend a lot of time out here."

Views of the river, a glass of wine, the company of family... it's no wonder it's one of their favourite places. **OH** 

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
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# A STEP BACK IN TIME

THE PLACE: Located in Stittsville, Gendron Antiques and Reproductions makes its home inside a massive 10,000 sq. ft. red barn-like structure. The main floor halls are lined with a seemingly endless choice of antique pieces – from beautiful vintage hurricane lamps to large, solid wood armoires. The second floor boasts a collection of newer reproduction pieces which offer traditional styling paired with modern day functionality. Owners Marc and Line Gendron each have their area of expertise. When Marc was five years old, his father began an antiques business, which is why Marc feels more at home among the antiques. Line's preference is among the new reproduction pieces; something she attributes to her childhood surrounded by the pieces in her father's new furniture store.

**THE STYLE:** Since their humble beginnings more than 18 years ago in an exterior booth at the now defunct Stittsville Flea Market, the Gendrons' business has flourished and offers an array of traditional pieces for discriminating tastes. From one-of-a-kind antiques, to reproductions made of new or reclaimed wood, the store has much to offer. "We can incorporate a sentimental piece





into a larger piece so that it becomes useful," says Marc. One particular furniture piece was created using an old wooden framed window as a starting point. A solid wood structure was then built to house and feature the beautiful window to give it new life as part of a large armoire.

**WHAT'S HOT:** Antiques that can be used or that are unusual. "People want their pieces to be functional and to look like new," says Line. The Gendrons refinish pieces and even transform them by adding new features. "We have taken sideboards and

turned them into vanities by adding sinks ," she says. "One customer loved an antique sideboard and we converted it to hide a flat-screen TV."

**FAVOURITES:** The fact that many of these pieces are reused, repurposed or made of reclaimed materials makes sense to the eco-chic homeowner. There are also many charming, decorative items that provide the perfect finishing touch to a living space. **WHERE:** 1145 Carp Rd., Ottawa (Stittsville)

Summer is here and I can see neighbours, friends and family heading outside to enjoy the warm weather. Dinners in the yard or garden visits are what we are turning our attention to. We want to enjoy living in the great outdoors with all the comforts of being indoors. With the advancements in outdoor furniture, that is completely achievable.

### **POOL PARTY**

Have a look at the space that you have at the back of the house and decide how best to divide it up to create both comfort and luxury. A pool offers a clear, central focus and function to the yard. This is the area around which to create your lounge or living area as it will be where people congregate for fun. Depending on how large the decking is around the pool, there should be lounge chairs for the sun worshipers. However, we are now able to gauge just how much sun we get with canopies being built right into the lounge chairs. The other new addition to the lounger is hydraulic lifts eliminating the need to get up and adjust that bar behind the back rest.

If the decking has a little more area, you can also incorporate an outdoor sofa and coffee table set up so that area also becomes an ideal place to entertain or to simply curl up with a book and a summer drink. Conversely, you can create a wild lounge area so that your backyard will be party central.

Even if you don't have a pool, all of this can be achieved on the deck or back patio.

### **FURNITURE**

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You also want to be able to create a dining room outdoors. I think it is always best to have this area closest to the back door of the house as this

is typically where the barbecue is and it allows for easy travel of foods and dishes from the kitchen to the table. Again, the advanced styles of furniture means that you no longer have to be tied to the white plastic chairs that are available at the big box stores. With the development of some really fantastic furniture you can see that you are able to create spaces that will weather well and last you for years to come, while achieving the look of fine hotels around the world.

In terms of making furniture choices, you want to look for items that have classic lines. You also want to be sure that they weather well, as our Canadian climate is hard on furniture. Being able to have outdoor furniture that is every bit as beautiful as your indoor furniture allows you to double the size of your living area in the good weather. In the past, it was difficult to host a brilliant dinner party in the backyard as the seating areas were never all that comfortable. I think it best to look at styles that are similar to what you have chosen for the indoors of your house so that you create a seamless feeling between the indoors and the outdoors.

The upholstery for outdoor furniture can be changed when you tire of the look or pattern. If you use quality neutral-coloured fabrics for the main cushions, you can add a spark with great accent cushions in mould-resistant fabrics that can be found at any good fabric store. Summer by summer you can change these cushions, which will give you the feeling of a new space each year in the same way the surrounding gardens change year-by-year.

As we are pushing on the gates of time to get us back into the great outdoors, don't ignore the indoors but do what you can to marry the two. What you finally end up with is a fantastic space that will keep you feeling as though you have gone to a resort. Now, the only thing that needs sun block is your skin! OH

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A home has to be cleaned, de-cluttered and styled before it's put on the market. Presentation is everything. If you want to sell your home quickly, follow these tips and watch the offers roll in.

### **KNOW YOUR BUYER**

Who would buy your home? Would it suit a family, a retired couple or newlyweds? Is it a cottage or a full-time residence? Can a bedroom be converted to a den or office? Play up your home to attract the right buyer.

A potential buyer will know within the first 15 seconds if your home is a match, so make sure it welcomes buyers with open arms. Your front and back yards should be manicured and your front door should be freshly painted. Nothing should be left lying around the yard.

### POINTS OF INTEREST

The entrance of the home makes a strong statement. Highlight an interesting feature like a recycled barn beam. Also make sure to show the versatility of the space by using it effectively. An old church pew makes a long, empty wall in this home the perfect spot for extra seating near the kitchen and back patio.



Smell is often the first thing a buyer will notice when they enter a home. Make sure to keep their noses happy with a fresh lemon scent (often associated with cleanliness). Some homeowners will bake before an open house or showing to make the home feel cosy. Designer Heather Smillie suggests keeping the smell simple and clean.



More open space makes it easier for potential buyers to picture their possessions in the home. Keep the walls neutral so buyers can imagine their own colour scheme. The homeowner chose to bathe his home in Para P2707-4, a warm beige colour that complements the natural, eco feel of the home.

### TINY DETAILS

Don't assume buyers won't notice the smallest details. Make sure your paint isn't chipped and your floor isn't scuffed. Add fresh flowers to as many rooms as possible. Clean closets and organize your "stuff." Turn on all of the lights so buyers can see easily and don't have to look for switches.

Mirrors are your best friend. Besides allowing the buyers to literally see themselves inside the home, they amplify your space and throw additional light into the home. Also, remember that buyers will be checking out the home from all angles, so make sure when you are standing in the doorway of one room, the view of the room down the hall is also pleasing and inviting.

SPACE/SIGHTLINES

### COLOUR

Although you want to keep the home neutral, you also want to add subtle splashes of colour for interest. Use some bright pillows and a throw and carry that same colour throughout the home with simple hints in the décor.



### THEME

Your home should flow. If you change your theme in each room, the home and individual spaces feel much smaller. Here, Smillie brought nature inside the home with twigs, shells and artwork to continue the natural, eco feel of the home.




### **STRENGTHS**

Make sure your décor features aren't taking away from the unique features of the home. Highlight the strengths of the home. These include the space (use an appropriate furniture style) and the upgrades (like the floor here). Smillie chose a beach theme in this home.

Remember, less is more. Too much furniture in a room makes the room appear small. Edit and ask your trusted friends what they think. OH



"We are from the city and we like to work out so that became a critical part of the design," says Craig.


The Pryors are very pleased with their builder Mark Patterson of Patterson Homes.


The couple say Patterson showed a clear understanding of what they wanted during their first meeting, which is why they decided to put their trust in him to build their home. Continued on page 36



# ROASTED GARLIC SHRIMP COCKTAIL with 3 Dipping Sauces

Shrimp Cocktail is a classic entertaining hors d'oeuvre and a favourite for many. Instead of opting for the frozen ring variety from the local grocery store, try your hand at making your own from start to finish. Rather than water-logged shrimp and pale-tasting sauce, wow your guests with plump, sweet garlicky roasted shrimp and a choice of three cocktail sauces, each bursting with unique flavour. Serve the shrimp warm or chilled with your choice of sauce – or all three sauces and let guests decide for themselves.

For small parties, shot glasses with a spoonful of sauce and a shrimp each make an interesting and novel presentation. For larger groups, a platter and bowls for the sauce will do just as well. Be sure to set out an empty bowl for people to place their shrimp tails, better there than in your planters! Increase the recipe amounts as needed to suit the crowd.

### TO PREPARE THE SHRIMP:

Toss 2 lb large deveined shrimp, with tails left on, with 2 tbsp olive oil, 2 cloves minced garlic, 1/2 tsp salt and 1/4 tsp pepper. Spread shrimp in single layer on a foil-lined baking sheet. Roast in 450°F oven for three minutes. Turn each shrimp over and roast for an additional two-to-three minutes, until shrimp are opaque and firm. Transfer to serving platter. Refrigerate until thoroughly chilled, if desired.



### **BASIC COCKTAIL SAUCE:**

Stir Together:

1/2 cup ketchup

2 tbsp horseradish

2 tbsp lemon juice

2 tsp Worcestershire sauce

Serve with shrimp. Makes about 1 cup.

### **CHILI LIME COCKTAIL SAUCE:**

Stir Together:

1/4 cup ketchup

1/4 cup chili sauce

2 tbsp lime juice

1 tbsp horseradish

1/2 to 1 seeded and minced jalapeno pepper

1 tbsp finely diced red onion

1 tsp ground coriander and a pinch of salt

Serve with shrimp. Makes about 1 cup.

### **OLIVE PAPRIKA COCKTAIL SAUCE:**

Stir together:

1/2 cup ketchup

2 tbsp finely chopped green olives

1 tsp grated lemon zest

2 tbsp lemon juice

1 tbsp mayonnaise

1 tbsp chopped parsley

1 tsp smoked paprika

1 tsp Worcestershire sauce and a pinch of salt

Serve with shrimp. Makes about 1 cup. он





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"You can do the project for almost nothing, if you have all the supplies," says Johnston.

### HERE'S HOW IT WORKS.

### **MATERIALS**

Sandpaper or orbital sander Scraper (for digging paint out of corners) Wire brush Stain, urethane, paint or oil (to finish the frame) Window glazing points (to hold your mirror in place) Wire (to mount your project on the wall)

Remove old putty from the frame and diamond-shaped glazing points that help hold the glass. Sometimes, you'll have to break the glass to get it out of the frame.

Scrape and sand the old paint off the window frame. Sometimes, paint stripper is necessary. If there is no paint on the frame, scrape off the rough, weathered wood. If you're going to paint the frame, it's not necessary to remove all the old paint. Take care with older windows because old paint may contain lead. It's best to wear a mask while sanding and do it outside. Cleaning the old frame can be the most challenging part of the project. Scraping and sanding the inside edges of the window frame can take a

### STEP 3

Window mirrors can be left without a finish or simply covered with a coat of urethane. If you're staining them, apply a finish coat of urethane over your stain. Another option is to finish the frame with linseed oil or tung oil.

### STEP 4

Once the frame is finished, mirrors can be installed. You can find a large, old mirror in a thrift shop and have it cut in a glass shop to fit your frame, or you can buy a new mirror, perhaps a tinted one, and have it cut to size. Insert window glazing points to hold the mirrors in place. Finish your mirror window by installing picture wire on the back. Then choose a spot for it that will best reflect your work. OH
