BATHROOM renovation

I would like to renovate my bathroom and make it more contemporary in feel, but I would prefer not to waste my existing vanity. Is it worth keeping and will I be married to its look if I do? – Helen

A bathroom renovation can be one of the most satisfying changes you'll make in your home and well worth the effort for both enjoyment and value. The key to this project (as always): Planning, planning, planning!

You can certainly give your vanity a facelift, changing the look and feel entirely, but it's only worth it if the piece is good quality to begin with. Also consider the amount you would truly be saving. In order to update that vanity, you need to send it to a refinisher, incurring a delivery charge plus the cost of refinishing. If you decide to purchase new, look into donating it for a tax receipt to offset some of the cost.

WHILE THE WALLS ARE DOWN...

There are lots of small cavities within your walls that can be made into storage spaces. With 16 inches between the studs, that leaves at least 10 inches (a safe measure) for the interior of a tall and skinny storage cabinet. Q-tips, soap, lotions – all of these smaller items – can be tucked into a convenient cabinet.

The same rules apply within the shower. Measure the largest bottle of shampoo that you would typically have on hand and design around that. Make sure the shampoo recess within your shower is large enough and has an extra shelf for soap and razors too. These can be tiled or made out of stone as a single unit and slipped into place. Glass shelves also work well, but I recommend thicker than standard to give a weightier look.

If you can squeeze a linen closet into your room, this will be a huge asset. Towels, toilet paper, plunger (measure the height and make sure it tucks discreetly under the bottom shelf) – all items remain hidden but still within the room for easy access.

UNDER THE GLOSSY FINISHES

The finishing touches are always the most fun, but don't forget about what goes on underneath them. If your floor was cold, consider radiant heat. This can be done with an electric pad that's set on a thermostat. It's a minor upgrade but feels like complete luxury.

HINT: Don't forget about accessories to complete your look:

If you didn't have good air circulation, now is the time to rectify that problem. Add a fan or re-route your current venting while the walls are exposed. Have an unwanted bulkhead? Maybe now is the time to see if that can be eliminated. Think while it's open. You won't fix it once you've finished.

THE FUN PART

Whether you've kept magazine clippings or have a Houzz.com account, study your images to assemble the look and feel. Choose finishes for longevity, even if it means spending a little more than anticipated on one or two things. Spend on countertops and quality trades; save on items like mirrors, lighting and hardware. The best way to make these decisions? Go shopping and see what's out there! Suppliers are happy lending samples to take home and look at in the space.


Here are some tips to achieving a modern look

- 1. Run your floor tile into the shower and eliminate the "curb" (the step up into the shower).
- 2. Use a linear drain at the edge of the shower (these can be pricey, check your budget).
- 3. Consider a "floating" vanity (no legs) that is mounted to the wall.
- 4. Fill the space above the vanity with mirror rather than using a decorative piece.
- 5. Investigate wall-mounted toilets and freestanding tubs.
- 6. Choose small, simple sconces.
- 7. Use wall-mounted faucets set into your backsplash.

Creating a more contemporary look comes down to simplifying the aesthetic but the key is to do it well. Good quality finishing and well thought-out details make or break a project. So, can you re-use that existing vanity to create your modern look? Likely yes, but you better start planning! **OH**





HOME SWEET HOME - the natural way

Whether we're greeted by soft, cushiony chintz, or sleek mid-century modern, every time we come through the door, we want to look around, as if to say, "Ahh, I'm home."



Furniture and artwork engage us with their obvious visual statements. But let's not forget about the subtle power of other elements, like fragrance, to layer the personal ambience of our homes. Of course, it's smart to stay away from artificially scented plug-ins or canned sprays. These smell fake and, worse, may contain harmful chemicals.

Instead, we can infuse our homes the natural way with clean, organic aromatherapy. Many non-chemical fragrances are available through specialty retailers. Lynda Phillips, who owns and operates Lyn-Dys in London carries "Air Therapy," a USDA certified bio-based product. One of several scents available, "Original Orange," is a concentration of essential oils distilled from orange peels only. While it freshens the air, this spray is also meant to restore balance, joy and harmony.

In fact, the therapeutic attributes of essential oils are considered as important as the scents themselves. Eucalyptus's herbal pungency is believed to clear the air of viruses. Citrusy lemon cleanses and bergamot, the source of Earl Grey tea's familiar scent, should alleviate anxiety, stress and nervous tension.

Lavender is another effective aromatherapy staple, according to Suzanne Steed, a former nurse who now runs Steed and Company Lavender Farm in Aylmer. "It's a really interesting herb," she says, adding, "It has a calming fragrance that also makes the home very fresh."

Steed reports that her linen spray, made from the pure essential oil of English lavender, is now her number-one seller. She praises lavender's pretty purplish-blue plant for its antiseptic quality as well as its compelling, pine-like scent. "People are now spraying it on their mattresses to get rid of dust mites," Steed says. "It's a natural pesticide, as well as a natural relaxant."

Lavender spray can be purchased from retailers or it can be homemade using pure essential lavender oil. "Just play around with the proportions of oil to water," Steed advises, adding the strength of scent is a highly personal choice.

Versatile lavender is often used in potpourri, as well. Making potpourri is time consuming, but if one is up to the task, the end result will be a mixture that's as decorative as it is fragrant. Even consider an old-fashioned simmer pot, which will have the aroma of citrus peels, spices and dried flowers and herbs wafting through the house in no time.

When it comes to natural fragrances for the home, choice is limited only by our imaginations. It's a creative exercise... and one best finished with a deep, cleansing breath.

HOME FRAGRANCE RECIPES

1. ROOM SPRAY

It's easy to make your own room sprays using pure essential oils and purified distilled water (avoid synthetic oils and tap water containing chlorine and fluoride). Try this clean and uplifting lemon-bergamot combination.

What You Need: 8 oz. distilled water 10 drops bergamot oil Lemon oil

Directions: Mix and shake well in a clean spray bottle. Shake well before every use. .

2. POTPOURRI

What You Need:

A fixative – such as oak moss or sandalwood chips


A filler - such as dried lavender, rose petals or eucalyptus; wood chips, leaves and spices such as cinnamon sticks or vanilla beans (you will need four cups of fresh filler to render one cup of dried)

A fragrance - the essential oil of one of your fillers, such as lavender, rose or eucalyptus

Directions: Mix your components in a glass or ceramic bowl or jar. Use a mortar and pestle to crush ingredients. Store the mix in an air-tight container in a dark place for about six weeks. Shake every few days to blend. Add drops of oil as required and display your potpourri in a pretty glass bowl. **OH**

Meet Colleen Wittlin and Mary Norris, owners of **Cherché House of Design** in Thornbury. As business partners, Colleen and Mary run a successful home furnishings and design shop, offering in-house design to clients. As close friends, they and their families spend much of their spare time and holidays together.

There's no question that they both have style, but Mary and Colleen enjoy different looks – especially when it comes to the holiday season. OUR HOMES visited both designers at home to see how they decorate for Christmas and to inspire you with fresh new ideas for your home this season.

COLLEEN'S HOME: Simple Elegance

In describing her personal decorating style, Colleen Wittlin quotes one of the greatest artists of all time – Leonardo da Vinci. He said, "Simplicity is the ultimate sophistication," which to this day continues to inspire home design and decorating around the world, and is ever so evident in Colleen's stunning Thornbury home.

"The simplicity of my design makes me feel relaxed and calm," says Colleen. "I love creams and whites, which make a space easy to accessorize and to change-up when the seasons change." This tone-ontone colouring is seen throughout Colleen's home; the walls are painted in Benjamin Moore's Cloud White with bright white trim (painting by Jimmy Keast); the living room furniture (Cherché) is upholstered in a light cream and the fireplace surround is a warm, creamy marble (**Georgian Design Centre**). The small space leaves no room for a Christmas tree, but if there was one, Colleen says it would be tone on tone as well. Instead, mini trees made of mercury glass adorn surfaces throughout the main living areas, as do other mercury glass accessories, like planters and candleholders, from Cherché. Preserved boxwood brings traditional warmth and a splash of colour to the space, complementing the winter greenery on display through the dining room solarium, which features custom blinds (Ashton's Blinds Draperies Shutters) in a simple Irish linen.



Adding to the natural feel of Colleen's home is a soft basswood deer head above the fireplace. This is also where you'll find a few pieces of her cherished china collection. 



When decorating for the holidays, Mary follows her heart and encourages others to do the same. "Don't hold back if Christmas means a lot to you," she says. **OH**



Their custom home, built in 2005 by Valleyview Construction, reflects their individual passions and their joint pursuits. Lee is Associate Dean – Research in the Faculty of Music at the University of Toronto where one of his focuses is the effects of music on health. Linda is Professor of Education at the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education at the

University of Toronto where she specializes in children's literacy.

In 2003, the original century-old wooden farmhouse on the property that served as their weekend retreat tragically burned to the ground. They were away at the time so the house was empty, save for their belongings, including family photographs and heirlooms. After recovering from the shock, they determined to rebuild a home on the property that would honour the farmhouse's legacy.



Drawing on their influences in music, literature, spirituality and history, the couple began to imagine the possibilities: a Tudor style with many rooflines; a great room to house Lee's 1800-era Karn pipe organ and space in which their collective five children and families could gather; a library and master suite facing the valley; three guest suites that might allow them to open a bed and breakfast in the future and saving as much of the original gardens and trees as possible. Their concepts came together where the home and yard centre on a social space – the one element of the original home that remained: the outdoor pool.

They approached renowned local architectural technologist **Pamela Farrow** to draw the plans. She designed their master suite to sit in almost the same footprint as the original farmhouse. "We wanted it to look as if there were still a main house to which, over the years, additions had been added," recalls Lee. The master wing is a brick house made with

reclaimed Chicago brick from the early 1800s. To connect the master wing to the central kitchen and great room, Farrow suggested a timber-framed glassed conservatory. The great room exterior façade is Yorkshire buff tumbled limestone from Ottawa. The exterior window trim is also different on the three styles – some of it is pointed; some is round and the shutter treatments vary from one to the other (windows by **Cedarport Window & Door Centre Inc.**). To unify the house, Farrow designed a soldier course of brick all the way around.

With music and literature so central to their lives, when Lee and Linda found a clay relief depicting the mythological Greek gods Apollo and Dionysus – the gods of music – leading a party of the seven muses, it encapsulated the theme of their home so well they knew it must adorn the front of the house. The builder installed it in the stone plaster below the great room's large dormer, greeting visitors and hinting at the tone of the home.

Paul Rogers, owner of Valleyview Construction, remembers the project well. "It wasn't a build where you take a set of drawings and away you go," he says. "Linda and Lee loved to be intricately involved in the decision making, and we had a lot of opportunity to adjust details as we went. We give most of our clients a copy of *The Not So Big House*, by Sarah Susanka – it really opens your imagination to what you can do in your home to maximize the space." As they were framing an upstairs hall, for example, there was an area where two roofs came together and Rogers suggested they could push the walls back to create a seating area. Cameron embraced the suggestion and added bookshelves and toy cupboards to turn the space into a play area for visiting grandchildren.

"We did a lot of custom finishes, such as milling an ash tree Valleyview had fallen at a previous job to use as decorative beams in the couple's library," says Rogers. The wood was tinted to get the rich, dark brown colours of the Tudor style.

Rob Perry from Riverside Custom Cabinets Ltd. was brought in to create the cherry and maple wood cabinetry in the kitchen and wine bar, as well as the long refectory table in the dining area. The couple bought a full lot of Italian limestone and separated the tiles. Those with more corrugated colours were installed in the conservatory, darker orange-ish shades went into the kitchen, the more pinkish tiles went into the main floor guest bathroom and the lightest tiles went into the front foyer. The colour palette throughout the home was inspired by Lee's pipe organ: greens, golds and beiges (paint from Birch & Benjamin Inc.). Many design accents were collected by Linda: birdcages and bird ornaments perch high in the great room; decorative metal motifs flank the walls of the conservatory and exterior patios; stained glass panes act as transoms above the doorways of the great room.

Rogers has remained friends with the couple over the years. "Our notion at Valleyview is that we have to do a good job and keep the project looking good, because we live in the area and our clients are my sales people now," he says. The couple welcome Rogers to bring potential Valleyview clients to tour their home. "We do a bit of a wine tour, I call it, where we show the house to prospective clients and leave behind a bottle of wine for homeowners," says Rogers.

Lasting, trusting relationships are the hallmark of Valleyview, operating since 1980 with Rogers supervising construction and his wife, Anne, managing the accounting and paperwork. "We have craftspeople that are long dedicated, working for us for 10, 15, 18 years," he says.

At the hands of Valleyview, Lee and Linda's home has gained a mythical presence in the area. Their music and stories abound. OH

Nothing beats the feeling of walking into a freshly renovated home – especially when you didn't do the work or pay the bill! If you're thinking of taking on a reno project yourself, I've got some smart tips on how to keep your sanity and avoid driving into debt!

The Importance of Planning

The time you spend planning will be the most valuable time you spend in the renovation process - so don't look at it as a waste of time because good planning will make for a good renovation. Going into something like this "blind" is never a good idea. Make sure you have a clear plan and have carefully thought about what you want and what you're trying to achieve at the end of all this. If you think that handling a renovation on your own might be too overwhelming, then hiring an interior design company will be the best money you ever spend, because everything is taken care of for you. A professional and experienced design firm can help you from start to finish, including space planning, finish selection, bringing trades, project management and execution.

Realistic Budgeting

You can never determine what you'll find when you begin opening up walls and tearing out flooring. You might find water damage or mould - just prepare for the unexpected and know that you should always have a "cushion" of money set aside for what you never saw coming. For example, if you plan on spending \$30,000 on your bathroom renovation, in actuality you'll probably end up spending at least \$40,000. Costs are almost always about 30 per cent higher than what you expected (or more sometimes doubling).

Allocating Your Money

A renovation is much more than the materials needed (such as paint, tile, hardware, faucets, etc.). Keep in mind that on top of material, you have to pay for the trades people (like an electrician, plumber and painter) who will perform the work, and labour always costs around the same amount as the material. If you're hiring an interior designer, you will need to budget for design services as part of your renovation, however keep in mind that designers will save you money in many situations by using their resources wisely, increasing creative thinking but most importantly by avoiding costly design mistakes.

Avoid Risking Your Home

You should have a separate savings account at the bank exclusively for your renovation. Don't bite off more than you can chew and risk losing your house if you can't afford the payments. The safest bet would be to take out a home equity loan or a home equity line of credit, just be sure that you're willing to have the added debt. If the renovation goes as planned, you'll meet the goal of paying for the renovation and end up with some extra bucks in the bank.

The Right Trades

How do you know if the person you're hiring is going to perform quality work? It's hard to judge based on a website or a conversation had on the phone. Another one of the added benefits of hiring a reputable design firm is that they work with trades people on a regular basis that they know and trust. This way you can be sure that the people working for you are reliable and provide good service.





Smart Renovation Suggestions

- Find inspiration from homes you love before you plan look at magazines for ideas on architectural detail, space planning, finishes, etc. If you really like something specific from what you sourced, ask yourself if it will work well in your own home. Just because it looks good in the style image doesn't mean it will fit with the overall look of your house.
- I always say, "Work with what the space and the architecture of your house has to offer you, don't fight it." Be sure to give your layout/floor plan careful consideration (how will you use the space, how much room do you need, traffic flow).
- Consider installing heated flooring as this needs to be done before your floor is laid. It is a luxurious feature to have, surprisingly without the price tag you'd think would be associated. (My personal favourite manufacturer being Nuheat.)



holiday hints

You're finished your shopping and you've picked out the perfect gifts for all your friends and family. Now it's time to wrap each one up in a pretty package that's just as special as the gift itself – and the recipient.

If you have an at-home wrapping station (whether permanent or temporary for the holidays) you'll find wrapping easier and more enjoyable. Here's how to set one up in your home.

CREATE A WRAPPING STATION THAT WORKS

It's a hassle to wrap on the floor one day and in the dining room the next, spending time moving from room to room, squeezing in wherever you can and trying to avoid rogue dog hairs and carpet fluff.

Dedicate a small space for wrapping to make things easier on yourself. Corinna Vangerwen, an editor, writer and stylist who offers creative gift wrapping services and workshops in the Toronto area, says "crowded equals crinkled." A large dining table made to seat six to eight people is great, but you can manage with a smaller table, desk or kitchen island, as long as it's not too shallow. You need space to spread out. Vangerwen suggests a surface that's at least five to six feet long and two to three feet deep.

SUPPLIES TO KEEP ON HAND:

Essentials: tape, scissors, tissue, paper, ribbon

Bonuses: Toppers and gift tags. Vangerwen prefers double sided tape and likes to keep a variety of paper on hand.

Rolls vs. Sheets: Not sure which type of paper to buy? Sheets of wrapping paper will have creases, but they're also easier to store. Rolls are smooth but take up more space and can get squished more easily.

HOW TO KEEP YOUR SPACE TIDY

Vangerwen's number one rule for creating a gift wrapping station that works: have a spot for everything. Pick up a few plastic containers to store your supplies so you can tuck them away when they're not being used. Try a wastebasket for storing your rolls of paper - "when it's full, you know you need to stop buying paper," laughs Vangerwen.

T-shaped ornament and jewelry stands are perfect for storing rolls

Most importantly, keep everything in one place so you always have it handy when you're ready to wrap.



CORINNA'S TOP TIPS

7. "Enjoy it, don't stress about it." As soon as you relax, wrapping becomes more fun and is easier, so you end up with a nicer finished product. Take your time and don't rush. "It's a pretty present - don't forget you're celebrating something!"

4. You can do a lot with material selection.



Rustic, DEFINED

Such structures are rare in Ontario today, though a few survive. Wind Haven, the home Jonna Chalmers shares with her husband, Ralph Kertcher, near Meaford, is the happy marriage of two heritage log cabins. The front portion of the home is a cabin made of rock elm dating from the early 1800s that was probably one of the first European-built structures in Sullivan Township south of Owen Sound, where Jonna found it 37 years ago. The excellent condition of the wood attests to the durability of rock elm, a tree prized by pioneer builders, but all but wiped out by Dutch elm disease. The back half of the home is a pine log cabin, well over a century old, that Jonna found in Quebec. She had both structures dismantled, the logs numbered and then painstakingly reassembled. She originally envisioned the home as a chalet and planned to keep her house in Toronto, but she became attached to this area. She soon made Southern Georgian Bay her permanent home and today owns Jonna's Rustic Refinement, a décor and furniture boutique near Blue Mountain.

Jonna made the architectural drawings for her home and then brought in an architect to check them. Both cabins were two storeys but Jonna removed the second floor of the back cabin to open it up, retaining a loft as the master bedroom, accessed by a spiral staircase. The front cabin has a second floor containing an office, guest bedroom and second bath. The unifying element between the two original structures is a large brick fireplace and chimney. When Jonna found the front cabin, it had been converted into a barn with an oversized doorway. Instead of filling it in, Jonna saw an opportunity to use this space. "Looking at this big opening, I thought, 'this is the perfect place to put a fireplace.' I wanted it double-sided, "she says. "When I had company here and I was cooking, I wanted to see the fire." The fireplace provides comfort and a cheerful spectacle for anyone seated in the dining room or in the living room. Jonna keeps her holiday décor low-key and natural, using pinecones and pine and cedar boughs. "It's always festive in here, so I don't have to add a lot," she says. **Continued on page 100







The living room with its two-storey height and pine floor (not original to the cabin, but installed by Ralph in more recent years) is the showcase for much of Jonna's custom furniture and collectables. She sells many of the items in her store – the Mongolian sheepskin throw, the copper-shaded Lodge-style lamp, the slate-topped tables and iron lamps made by her son, John, and the cowhide rugs and furniture, to name just a few. The sofa is custom-made from 19 cowhides. "I wanted this to last me the rest of my life," she says, turning the cushions to show that the quality is consistent. "Leather looks better the older it gets." The rugs and accent pillows are also cowhide, as are the dining room chairs. "I love cowhide rugs and I sell a lot in my shop," says Jonna. "They last, you can vacuum them, and if you spill on them, you just wipe it off."

Every piece of Wind Haven has a heritage story behind it. Against the


living room wall stands a thick-hewn pine school bench and desk, dating from the mid-19th century, from Quebec. Like most of the antiques in the house (and the logs and beams of the house itself), it is old and rare. "It's a double bench, meant for two kids side-by-side. There's even graffiti on it," says Jonna.

Her extensive collection of antique native North American handicrafts, including hides, leatherwork, baskets, blankets, prints and twig furniture, is one of the home's dominant themes. One of the rarest pieces is a circa-1900 Navajo rug that hangs on the living room wall. Jonna points out how native art is increasingly rare. "I can't find these anymore," she says, referring to an Ojibwa reed basket decorated with sweetgrass and porcupine quills. "And very few people make new ones anymore." Continued on page 102

Jonna had the kitchen, dining room, bathroom and front hall renovated recently, and re-floored in stone. Kim Hall of Pinetiques in Clarksburg, oversaw the kitchen renovation, which embodies a rustic style similar to the rest of the home, with antique windows serving as the cupboard doors, and detailing like old-world lime green inside the cupboards.

The iron pot rack-lamp over the island is one of several forged pieces in the house made by Jonna's father, Ernst Mortensen. Fascinating decorative details abound throughout the home, including panels, picture frames and other detailing in birch bark and twigs by the late Diane April McVittie. On the living room wall is a colour print from an early 20th century automobile calendar in which a native man in traditional dress, paddling a canoe in a lake, looks up at a shiny new car passing on a winding road. This sums up Jonna's sense of style: a deep regard for the past and an eye for the contemporary. OH





The season of giving is upon us and for many of us, the list is long. What to give the boss? What to give the person who has everything? Is there something interesting to take to a holiday party other than the old standard of a bottle of cabernet sauvignon? Well, hopefully I can help in this department, as there's a world of fun gift-giving options out there. Of course there are all sorts of budgets, but I'll try to at least point you in the right direction for possibilities. Consider the following as a shopping list for all your gift-giving needs! (If you are unfamiliar with any of these wines or beers just ask for help while in your store, they should all be readily available).

HEADING TO A HOLIDAY PARTY?

Try taking a bottle of prosecco or cava, both are festive sparkling wines that won't break the bank.

A BOTTLE FOR THE BOSS?

A cabernet sauvignon from California, an Amarone from Italy or a burgundy from France are always solid choices. Or try a 10, 20 or 30 year old tawny port, this will last longer than one bottle of wine and will remind your boss how great you are over and over again.

THE FATHER, BROTHER, FATHER-IN-LAW, AND SO ON ...?

Put together an interesting basket of beers, choose all different varieties to allow a real taste experience. Fill it with wheat beer, stout, Abbey-style ale, an India pale ale and anything else that seems interesting.

THE MOTHER, SISTER, MOTHER-IN-LAW, AND SO ON ...?

Why not try a bottle of something floral, sweet and pretty. Dessert wines such as icewine, Beaumes de Venise, moscato or late harvest wines are a real sweet treat and are the perfect way to finish off a meal or to sip chilled as an aperitif before dinner.

THE FOODIE IN YOUR LIFE?

Choose a region in the world such as Spain or Niagara and then fill a basket or wine crate with wines and food products from that area. You can add olive oil, cheese, mustards, preserves, etc.

If you have a little extra time on your hands you can always make some gifts that incorporate wines and spirits. Here are a couple of suggestions that are easy and delicious!

CLASSIC FRENCH CHICKEN LIVER PATÉ

Give this as a hostess gift with a nice baguette and a bottle of Chardonnay from France or Niagara.

2 tbsp unsalted butter

½ lb chicken livers, cleaned

½ cup white onion or shallots, finely chopped

2 tsp fresh thyme, finely chopped

½ cup dry white wine

Salt and pepper to taste

- Melt butter in a pan, add onions and thyme and cook until onions are translucent, about 10 minutes.
- Add wine and reduce for 1 minute.
- Add livers and cook through, 3-4 minutes. Place everything in a food processor, pureé to



 Place mixture in a glass crock or decorative ramekin and keep refrigerated until ready to give. Spread paté on bread slices and serve with chilled white wine.



LIMONCELLO



Here is an easy recipe for the sunny liqueur from the Amalfi coast in Italy. The first year I lived in Rome I made this as a Christmas gift for everyone in my family. On returning to Canada for the holidays I was stopped at Customs with a suitcase filled with the yellow bottles. Fortunately for me

(and my family), the Customs agent was Italian and let me pass through with my clandestine stash!

5 large lemons, washed well

750 ml vodka, a mid-priced brand is sufficient

2 3/4 cups sugar

2 ¼ cups water

- Peel the zest from all the lemons, making sure to avoid the white pith. Place in a large glass jar along with the vodka. Cover and let stand for 2 weeks in a dark place.
- When ready, heat sugar and water in a small pot, stir until sugar has completely dissolved. Let cool to room temperature.
- Strain vodka into sugar mixture and divide into decorative bottles for gift giving. Make sure to serve Limoncello straight from the freezer in small sherry glasses or shooter glasses. Salute! **OH**

ALMOND GINGER CHOCOLATE BARK + lots of topping variations

Every year about this time, as the mercury drops and the days get shorter, my mind naturally turns to the fast-approaching holiday season. And one of my favourite holiday traditions is poring over cookbooks looking for inspiration for this year's homemade gifts from my kitchen. Nothing is sweeter than stirring, swirling and baking up tasty treats to wrap and deliver to friends, family, co-workers, teachers and other special folks in my life. While the cookies, candies and breads I bake may vary from year to year, a staple gift from my kitchen is chocolate bark. It's appealing because of its simplicity and opportunity for variations. Plus, it's chocolate – and who doesn't love the gift of chocolate?

There are few ingredients involved, so I like to splurge a little and choose the best chocolate I can find. Dark chocolate is my favourite base for bark – its rich, deep flavour complements the roasted nuts and sweet fruits that dot the surface. But milk chocolate and white chocolate (or perhaps all three!) work wonderfully as well. As for the nuts and fruit, anything goes. Peanuts, cashews, pecans, pistachios, hazelnuts, apricots, cranberries, raisins, cookie bits, candy pieces, pretzels, marshmallows – you get the point! Stick to three toppings at most so that each flavour gets a chance to shine without getting muddled in the mix.

For this year's bark, I'm going with the combination of dark chocolate, almonds and candied ginger – a little bit toasty, a little bit spicy and perfectly decadent. Happy holidays!

ALMOND GINGER CHOCOLATE BARK

(Makes: about 20 pieces)

1 lb (450 g) dark chocolate, chopped


3/4 cup toasted whole almonds, coarsely chopped

²/₃ cup candied ginger, thinly sliced

- Melt chocolate in a heatproof bowl set over a pot of gently simmering water, stirring often until smooth.
- Stir in about one third of each of the almonds and candied ginger. Pour mixture onto parchment paperlined baking sheet and gently spread with the back of a spoon until about an even scant ½-inch (1 cm) thickness.
- Sprinkle with remaining almonds and candied ginger.
- Refrigerate until solid, about 20 minutes. Break or cut into pieces.
- The bark will keep refrigerated in an airtight container for about 1 week.
- For gift giving, package as desired.

VARIATION:

Pistachio Cranberry
Apricot Swirl Bark - Melt
separately 10 oz. (280 g) dark
chocolate and 6 oz. (170 g) white
chocolate. Stir one third of each: ¾
cup roasted shelled pistachios, ¼ cup
dried apricots, quartered and ⅓ cup dried
cranberries into the melted dark chocolate.
Spread onto baking sheet. Drizzle with
melted white chocolate. Use toothpick,
skewer, or back of knife to swirl the
chocolates together. Sprinkle with
remaining pistachios, apricots and
cranberries. Continue as


