
Put on some music while you read, and here's wishing you find some inspiration for your own home in these pages as well.





Kids' bedrooms can be a challenge. The characters, favourite colours and toys can all create a bit of a circus effect. 

PLAN AND PREPARE

CHRISTMAS TREE **TYPES**

Choosing an Ontario-grown tree is the best choice not only for the freshest and longestlasting tree, but for the environment and local economy as well. Most of these evergreens are actually cut three to four weeks before they are available for sale to avoid messy sap production. You may recognize some of these specimens growing in local forests or even in your own backyard.

- White Pine: Graceful branching and **L** soft needles make this tree a bit hard to decorate, but it can be worth it for the sheer ornamental value alone. It sports nice greenish-grey foliage too.
- White Spruce: Strong slender twigs and dark-green foliage hold ornaments well. This spruce is a moisture sucker and requires frequent watering to prevent
- Scots Pine: A very thick, hearty, green tree that holds needles well. This is the most popular Christmas tree available.
- Balsam and Fraser Fir: Similar to white spruce in branching and shape but with softer needles. Great needle retention, and colours vary from bright green to
- **Blue Spruce:** Stout silvery blue or blue-grey branches with sharp, dense needles and strong branches that hold heavy ornaments with ease.

SELECTING THE FRESHEST TREE

Choosing a Grade A tree is similar to choosing the best produce at the grocery store.

- After you find the ideal-looking tree, lift it a few inches off the ground and let it drop. If needles shed from the exterior branches, this tree is far from ideal. Note that needle drop from interior branches is completely normal.
- Now it's time to give a branch a gentle squeeze. Are you left with a bunch of needles in your hand? If so, move on.
- The last test is to crush a few needles in your hand. Does it have a fresh tree scent?

That's a good sign as evergreens with little fragrance are often past their prime.

• Now have your chosen tree wrapped in netting for easy transport.

Before bringing your new tree inside, you

must make a fresh cut to its trunk. This is how the tree uptakes water, making this an absolutely essential step if you want it to last. While you're at it, remove some of the lower branches to leave room for the gifts. Once standing, be sure to give your evergreen plenty of fresh, clean water as soon as possible. This new Arbre de Noël is going to suck up at least a gallon of water over the next few days and needs constant top-ups. Keep at it until the uptake subsides a bit and keep water at a constant level from then on. Finally it's time to trim your tree, crank the Christmas tunes and be merry.

How lovely are thy branches! OH

LIGHTBULB ORNAMENTS

FILL: When your bulbs are empty, fill them with anything you like. We've used crystals, pearls, lace, paper confetti and curled paper. To make the paper confetti, simply use a hole-punch and some pretty, decorative papers. For curled paper, cut the paper into thin strips and curl with scissors. WRAP: Wrapping your bulbs is quite simple and they don't have to be empty. We've chosen to wrap ours with twine and yarn. Start with a dab of hot glue at the base of the metal neck and attach one end of your twine or yarn. Continue wrapping and gluing until the entire bulb is covered.

PAINT: For the painted bulb you'll need some multi-surface or glass paint in the colours of your choice. Once your bulb has been emptied, squeeze in some paint, cover the opening with your finger and shake the bulb until the paint has coated the entire inside. Hold the bulb upside-down over a paper towel and tap out any excess paint. Leave to dry overnight.

Visit our ourhomes.ca/mag/orns for a link to a great video tutorial that will guide you through the steps of emptying a light bulb.

To finish off your ornaments, attach a hanger. We've chosen wire and twine. You can also paint any exposed metal necks that have not been wrapped with twine. For your filled ornaments, you'll need to close off the tops to prevent the filling from spilling out. Wrap the twine around the top, attaching with some hot glue as you go along.

DRAVVING ON THE WALLS

The centuries-old blackboard is making a resurgence into the modern home in the form of a fun statement wall, which can be utilized in almost any room.

With the increasing availability of specialty paint, the blackboard has become a versatile home décor tool, transforming empty walls that have proven difficult to decorate. Both whimsical and practical, a blackboard can improve family organization or provide a place for displaying inspirational quotes and original art.





The kitchen is one of the most popular spots to paint a blackboard. For the aspiring chef or dinner hostess, blackboards make functional menus. They're also great places to jot down the ever-evolving grocery list. If you don't have wall space in your kitchen, the end of a cabinet or the fridge are alternative spaces to paint. Transforming a traditional backsplash into a blackboard is also a unique option.

In the front entrance, a blackboard makes a convenient message centre, and a home-office wall can always benefit from a calendar. Children will love having an expansive blackboard to create a mural in a bedroom or a playroom. Add one to the craft or laundry area, two possible locations where a blackboard can be functional and decorative.

Break Away From Black

Companies such as Benjamin Moore and Rust-Oleum offer blackboard paint in a spectrum of colours, while Krylon has a spray paint in basic black and vintage green. An off-white blackboard, styled with colourful sidewalk chalk, will set you apart from the crowd while blending seamlessly with your décor. Experiment with the subtle and varied tones of grey to give your blackboard a softer appearance, or forget subtle and get wild with a bold blue or tangerine hue.

If the right shade or tone remains elusive, mixing up custom blackboard paint is a surprisingly simple process.

Make Your Own Paint

- You will need 2 Tbsp. unsanded tile grout per 1 cup matte latex paint.
- Mix the paint and grout in one-to-two cup increments.
- Use a grout mixer to combine the paint and grout. (Paint



mixer attachments are available for drills, which will make the task easier.)

• Properly prime your wall and then roll on your homemade blackboard paint. Once the paint has cured, it will need to be lightly sanded with 150-grit sandpaper and wiped clean.

Regardless of the paint you choose to use, season your new blackboard surface before you start practising any fancy typography. Take the broad side of a piece of white chalk and rub down the entire area, then rub it clean with a dry cloth. Don't neglect seasoning the surface or a ghost of your first design will permanently remain.

Mastering Chalk

Deciding what to draw or write on a new blackboard is only half the battle. As a décor centrepiece, the content should look attractive, and mastering the chalk may take a bit of practise. Here are a few tips that will help transform even the most novice chalk artist.

- Lightly sketch out the design a few times
- Use a level and a ruler to keep things straight and symmetrical

- A wet Q-tip is the perfect tool for cleaning up lines
- To generate a paint-like effect, keep the chalk wet
- Sharpen the chalk
- Give chalk markers a try

Alternative Surfaces

If you're a commitment-phobe, painting a wall may seem daunting. Think about using blackboard paint in your home décor

- Create an erasable pantry system by painting labels on jars






"We had a lot of fun the second time around," Coulter says. "The owners were decisive and knew that they wanted energy management on both levels of the home, and a master suite where they could access their own private garden. The view off the deck in their suite is incredibly relaxing."

The owners have had homes in a few different cities over the years. "But both our families have been coming to ski in the Blue Mountains since 1968. It's been the one constant place for children and extended family members to gather," says the owner.

Coulter has been building homes in Southern Georgian Bay for clients like them since 1981. In communities as close-knit as Thornbury and Collingwood, it didn't take long for Coulter's work to be noticed and in demand. The real estate market has stayed strong in luxury homes in Southern Georgian Bay – Coulter says a number of his newest builds are going up for clients from across Canada and around the world who have identified this region as a prime destination not only for its proximity to Toronto but because it offers four-season amenities and activity. It was the prime amenity of the Georgian Bay Club golf course that drew the homeowners to choose a lot in a premier development on a mountain ridge, near the green of the 11th hole of the course. It's a private, yet very social community.

The dramatic setting lends itself to the modern style of the build. Coulter prepared a nearly 40-page brief to get the design project started. Wanting to soften the stark lines of the home, the homeowners asked to add transitional dormer windows. They coupled deep-brown exterior cladding with steel-framed windows and a black metal roof. Inside, the couple worked with Coulter on the transitional aspects of the home – a tongue-in-groove ash ceiling that runs the length of the great room and the master suite are stained to match the hickory hardwood floors. The result is a modern element of understated elegance that provides a more intimate and warmer feel than it might if they

had followed a strict modern aesthetic.

The couple wanted to achieve the feeling of living in the outdoors with nearly panoramic views of the natural elements surrounding them. With the walls of the home's width mostly glass, they opted to use bronze-tinted windows to provide privacy and reduce the amount of ultraviolet light inside. Dormers punch out of either side of the great room's peaked roof, adding variation to the window heights and architectural interest to the rooflines. The home is equipped with a Crestron wireless system that fully automates window coverings as well as the heating and cooling systems and the LED lighting, installed by Coulter's sub trades.

The owners worked with Coulter to choose stone accents on the exterior, and brought the same B.C.-sourced grey, black and buff granite inside to the floor-to-ceiling masonry of the wood-burning fireplace and a wall in the front foyer. Continued on page 52

THE PLACE: Yes, you will find hardware and lumber and, if you have a leaky faucet, a red-shirted expert is there to help you. But if you've walked inside

Solid Stone

Floor-to-ceiling stone is the ultimate luxe look for a bathroom, and in a powder room this can be achieved on a reasonable budget, as the walls are typically smaller. Splurge on a favourite tile, and break up the effect with a large inset mirror panel.

Disappearing Mirror



THIS NOT SOLVE HOUSE

Del Weale and Leo Longo hunted up and down the streets of downtown Collingwood, waiting for one of the town's distinctive red brick century homes to go up on the real estate market.

When a year or more had passed without a promising lead, the couple purchased a lot on Beech Street and enlisted Porter Skelton and Associates Ltd. to build them their own. The resulting reproduction of a Collingwood red brick Victorian home is a magnificent addition to the street - one of which most passersby assume to be a renovation.

"During the build, people stopped to ask us who did the work to clean the bricks," says **Chris Skelton**, who oversaw the project. "They thought we had sandblasted and re-mortared the brick of an older home." He takes it as a compliment following the extensive research Weale did to get the details just right.

The exterior was carefully reproduced. The owners collaborated with **Ron Martin**, at the time from the Town of Collingwood's heritage committee, on the initial house design, incorporating the exterior heritage concepts. Working and permit drawings were provided by Porter Skelton. Framing was the responsibility of Jorgenson Construction. The red clay bricks, supplied by Simcoe Masonry Supplies, are a smaller size, authentic to the Ontario homes of the period. The coursing around the upper storey of the house and the eyebrows over the windows, in the contrasting buff yellow brick, are not just reminiscent of the other older homes in the area, but are a genuine reproduction of turn-of-the-century brickwork. Masonry work was skillfully undertaken by **Rossco Stone Design**

A wide front porch and flagstone path welcome visitors into this attractive house. Landscaping at the front is reminiscent of the century style and was designed and implemented by **Heartwood** Landscapes & Gardens.

The interior is just as detailed. Designed by Weale and completed by Porter Skelton, it beautifully suits the Victorian style, as well as the tastes and requirements of the owners.

Throughout the house, simplicity and elegance are complementary to the many modern conveniences within. The heated floors in the entrance are one-and-a-half-inch thick flagstone and the hall walls, painted by **J. Ferraro Co. Ltd.**, are 10-inch poplar bead board. Weale designed the interior trim and woodwork, which was expertly installed by **Cameron Carpentry** and Porter Skelton site supervisor **lan Law**.

A number of years prior, Weale had been fortunate to obtain solid mahogany interior doors and had kept them with the thought to use them in her own home some day. There were enough to outfit the entire interior (aside from a guest bedroom) and they are wide enough to allow for future wheelchair access. Their rich colour contrasts with the lighter colours of the walls. During her 30-year career, Weale has enjoyed finding many unique antique and reproduction pieces that function effectively and aesthetically throughout the house. Such items include an

elegant front entrance armoire and a sideboard in the great room from the recently closed Sutton Place Hotel.


THE PERSON NAMED IN

The main floor master bedroom has a sitting area with built-ins by Southgate Cabinets Inc. and a spacious, wheelchair-accessible en suite bathroom, with a shower base that is flush to the mosaic-tiled floor and open to the tub deck. The fixtures are from Nepsco Electrical & Plumbing Supply; installation by Baymount Plumbing Inc.

The owners were particular about details in the house. Del designed the electrical plan to allow convenient light switches, power outlets and timers such as on the porch light. She avoided some wall clutter by recessing the **Huronia Alarms** keypads behind small hinged paintings.

The main-floor laundry room is a masterpiece with heated flagstone floors, extra storage and wine and beer fridges. Also included are drying cupboards with open floor grates that allow the in-floor heat to circulate for faster drying. The sun-filled room displays artwork and sports convenient access to the home's mailbox contents. *Continued on page 104*

The couple have collected art from many local artists to add colour and often an eclectic focal point in the rooms. In the powder room, framed postcards show historic scenes of downtown Collingwood, allowing for an interesting read to pass the time. A clawfooted magnifying glass is offered on the vanity for guests to read the handwriting.

The great room houses the living room, dining room and kitchen under a vaulted ceiling at the back of the house. The perfection of Porter Skelton's execution of the design is evident, as is the passion of the owners. Two dormer windows above allow light into the room. The space is warmed by a wood-burning Rumford fireplace with surrounding masonry done by Rossco Stone Design.

The kitchen is a chef's delight, featuring an island with granite countertop fabricated by Di Pietra Design. Weale designed the plentiful cabinetry and had it built by Shelburne Kitchens. The surrounding tile backsplash was installed by Gervase Custom Ceramics. Lighting is both modern and traditional and creatively installed by Rigney Electric to align with the owners' specifications.






















Centre hall built-ins keep linens organized for each of the bedrooms and bathrooms. The dormer wall was filled with a bookcase and storage below.

The wonderful design details that the owners envisioned in a Collingwood century home have come to life in this reproduction by the excellent workmanship of Porter Skelton built to withstand the century ahead. OH






If you've ever tried ordering a Caesar

outside the country, you were likely met with a confused expression or offered a Bloody Mary in its place, and then disappointed to learn that the latter tastes nothing like its much-loved Canadian sister.

It's now estimated that more than 350 million Caesars are consumed each year in Canada!

With such a following, it's surprising that the Caesar's origin hasn't been touted more in national ad campaigns, like the infamous poutine has been.

Clamato juice is a proprietary blend of tomato juice and clam broth made by Mott's – created very soon after the success of Chell's drink invention. Although several brands offer similar tomato and clam blends, the Caesar has really become synonymous with Mott's.

Clint Pattemore, Mott's Clamato Caesar Mixing Officer, says, "With over 350 million Caesars enjoyed in Canada each year, it is clear that the Caesar is something special. The flavour is unlike that of any other cocktail and the unlimited possibilities are what make the Caesar so unique and enjoyable."



Recipe Note

Pure coconut water is the clear liquid found inside young, green coconuts. It's delicious on its own and has a wide range of uses in recipes. As a refreshing drink, it tastes nutty-sweet with a hint of toasted coconut. With 730 mg potassium, 32 mg calcium and 18 mg magnesium, it's a very good substitute for water in recipes. I use it in stir-fry dishes and to cook rice for savoury or dessert dishes.

Look for pure, plain coconut water (the ingredient on the label should read: coconut water) and avoid brands with added juice or sugar or flavourings, which make them virtually the same as soda or other sugary beverages.

STORY AND PHOTOS PAT CROCKER

A good curry paste or powder is essential for this dish – you can make your own from fresh, whole spices or find excellent quality spice blends at whole/health stores and gourmet food shops. We used coconut water as the liquid, but you can use coconut milk for a thicker soup. You can customize this soup according to the season: potatoes and carrots in winter, asparagus and peas in spring.

Makes 4 servings

3 Tbsp (45 mL) extra virgin coconut or olive oil, divided

6 oz (175 g) white fish or cod fish fillet

1 onion, chopped

1 Tbsp (15 mL) curry powder or paste

2 cups (500 mL) coconut water (see Recipe Note)

1 cup (250 mL) vegetable broth or water

½ cauliflower, divided into flowerettes

1 potato, diced


2 carrots, shredded

- In a soup pot or large saucepan, heat 2 Tbsp (30 mL) oil over medium-high heat. Sauté fish for 3 to 5 minutes on each side (10 minutes total per inch of thickness) or until fish turns opaque and flakes easily with a fork. Using a slotted spoon or lifter, transfer to a plate and set aside.
- Add remaining oil to the pan and sauté onion for 4 minutes. Add curry powder and cook, stirring constantly, for 1 minute. Add coconut water and vegetable broth and bring to a boil. Add cauliflower, potato and carrots. Reduce heat to medium and simmer for 15 to 17 minutes or until vegetables are crisptender. Add fish to the chowder, break into large chunks with a spoon, and heat through. OH





