editor's note



ONE OF THE MAPLE TREES IN MY BACKYARD IS BEING REPURPOSED. It teems with life – three birdhouses,

a tire swing, a hanging flower basket, the base of a zipline and half the support for a whole-family-fits-in-it hammock. My kids (and I!) each play with, on or around it at some point nearly every day in the summer. Branches from it were offered to one son's elementary school for props in a school play. Shade from it cools us while we munch on berries that we pick in our garden. Twigs and trimmings from it stoke the flame in the fire pit that lights our August evenings. It will be three years that we've played and lived under the shade of our tree, planted a generation ago.

The 20-year-old, 30-foot sugar maple has just a handful of green branches. Leaves on the tips of those are browning and falling back, and some of these last branches will be dry by the end of this season. The maple may not return with greenery next spring. At some point in our home's history, a garage was built on the rear of our property. It's a wonderfully sound building, large enough for a vehicle and eight bicycles plus storage for the thousand things that a family needs to store. Possibly, when the building went up, or when the asphalt driveway went in leading to the garage, the roots of this maple were cut. Or possibly the earth was leveled around it and buried the roots too deeply. The tree hasn't been able to come back.

One by one the branches may come down, but I already know that we will keep the trunk up as high as we can – it will hold fast as an anchor for bird feeders, zip lines and hammocks. Woodpeckers will carve holes in it, grackles will alight at the top of it to survey the territory and squirrels and children will chase each other around its trunk.



FRONT ENTRIES

Much like your smile when meeting someone for the first time, your front door is the first impression of your home. It hints at the style to be found on the inside. Sometimes mess will permeate a front porch. Sometimes tidiness seems to glow from the inside out. There may be a hint of family life, a dog or kids, or a hint of artfulness – a homemade bench or a welcoming chalkboard. Whichever category you fall into, your front entry provides a clue to what lies ahead.

So how can we personalize such a small and seemingly important space?

A home will dictate the style of entry to a point, but it is also where you can add your own flair. For instance, you could add a glass door with a modern, lever handle to a red brick Victorian to give it a more contemporary edge. Eliminating the traditional, raised-panel, solid wood door will allow light to flow into your hallway and bring a modern touch to the outside of the home. For these changes to be made on a Victorian-style house, check with your local heritage society to ensure there are no restrictions on your updates.



ADD COLOUR

One easy tool for change is paint. For instance, an otherwise simple door redone in a bright welcoming colour can completely transform the feel of your home. Sometimes a good paint job is the best solution for a quick clean-up. Farrow & Ball has fabulous palette recommendations for window trim, shutters and front doors.



CHANGE HARDWARE

I really like the trend towards oversize door hardware. Rather than using a simple lever or knob, an oversize handle looks contemporary and unique. It defines the front door and provides a great design feature, dressing up an otherwise lacklustre, functional piece. The style works with modern and traditional depending on the finish of the hardware. See Rocky Mountain Hardware for a more traditional finish and Unison Hardware, Inc. for a more modern look.

IMPROVE FUNCTION

We are about to embark on a renovation and one of the items I'm most excited about is a steel grate at my front door (for inside too). This is a functional decision. We have a lot of gravel around our house and dirt seems to follow my kids and pets wherever they go. Insert a grate at the door so sand and gravel will fall right through and you can minimize your sweeping efforts. It also doubles as a slip-resistant surface.




UPDATE LIGHTING

Lighting is key for your front door. I prefer a very small and sleek light at the entry if it's coupled with some overhead LED pot lights to really illuminate the area. With LEDs being so small and versatile, lighting options have become much more creative. For a modern approach, use strip lighting under the nosing of your stairs to light up each step. It's a cool look and really useful on a dark night.


ACCESSORIZE



In life, things change – there is no avoiding it. And the ability to accept and adapt to change often dictates success. As with life, so it is with gardens. It is through adversity that both evolve. With some maintenance, you can delight in watching your garden getting better with age.

Great results take great sacrifice and a ripened garden takes work to realize its full potential. Gardens don't necessarily evolve naturally in a way that is pleasing. Saplings grow into full-bodied trees and a once sunny spot filled with abundant blooms becomes a shady nook with sporadic blossoms atop straggly stems. Mortar crumbles, patios heave and wood rots. The casualties of pruning mishaps are evident in evergreens with bare spots and trees sporting right-angled branching. Misguided pruning shows in hedging-gone-wild and gargantuan shrubbery blocking pathways and windows. Invasive triffids slink into the lawn. Alien species choke out the more delicate likes. Sadly the garden then resembles the Amazonian jungle more closely than a beautifully planted property. But, with change comes great opportunity. Amazing and exceptional beauty can be preserved and expressed with a few simple tactics!

Assess your landscape with fresh eyes. Look at your garden from the whole perspective to decide what should stay, what should go and what should be changed. Don't focus on the emotional value of individual plants or outdoor objets d'art. Search for great bones lurking in the depths, and place equal importance on function and beauty. Write it all down.

TIP: This impassive approach is easier said than done for many, so if the going gets tough, enlist a friend with good taste or hire a professional.



Proper pruning can reinvigorate a well-established garden. To me, there is nothing as beautiful as mature wood, no matter if it's tree, shrub or vine. A lovely tunnel effect can be achieved by pruning out passageways and leaving overhanging branches above head height. This technique can also be used alongside a patio lending a divine feeling of walls and ceiling to an outdoor room. Where possible, remove only onethird of live wood at a time. Sometimes a shrub has grown so gangly there is no possible way to prune it aesthetically. In those cases the shrub can be lopped to the ground in hopes of rejuvenation. It's worth a try, as life wants to keep living!

TIP: Leave some dead wood, somewhere, to provide homes for our native stingless bee species that need our help by way of habitat.









Culling the garden can be a sensitive task, especially for those who place emotional attachment on vegetation. But realize many plants can be relocated, grown in a pot or given away. A struggling plant will require removal. Invasive plant species must go! Research your hostile offenders to choose the best course of eradication. Chemicals are not an option as a mature garden is a living, breathing ecosystem that many life forms have become dependent on. Digging and picking out the roots or layering newspaper with mulch placed on the surface may be the only option to stifle out noxious plants. Plastic is not an ideal choice as it will rob existing tree roots of needed moisture, often killing nearby trees.

TIP: Relocate any spiders and toads you disturb to retain their natural, pest-consuming attributes for your property ecology. Adding bat houses and attracting birds will also help keep down the mosquito populous that often plague shady yards.

Explore the world of new plants adapted to your gardens evolution when considering new additions. Shade gardens, though more discreet, can be as stimulating as sun gardens, but with more focus around foliage and form rather than flowers. Pale blossoms, markings and silvery foliage look especially beautiful in shade and glow in low-light situations.

TIP: The soil around conifers is naturally acidic, opening opportunity for plants that enjoy this environment, such as blueberry, blue hydrangeas and lupines.

It is said life brings us not what we want, but what we need. Case in point, patience is not a personality aptitude I naturally possess. But when it comes to the garden, I have infinite tolerance and endurance. Gardens, like fine wine, improve with age. Both are worth the wait. OH



Quikrete Anchoring Cement or Sakrete Fast-Patch Fast Concrete Repair

Non-stick cooking spray or Vaseline

Small containers to use as moulds, 2 per planter

Measuring cup or scoop

HOW-TO:

- Fill buckets with water. Use one to add water to your concrete mix, the other to store your tools while you're working so the concrete mix doesn't harden onto them.
- Select your moulds by pairing containers to create your planter form.
 Visit dollar or second-hand stores to find shapes that you like.
- Coat the inside of the larger container and the outside of the smaller container with non-stick cooking spray or Vaseline.
- Measure and mix small batches of concrete according to the package directions. Work quickly, especially with the Sakrete, or the mix will start to set.
- Pour wet mix into the larger container and apply quick taps to the bottom and sides to level the mix and release any air bubbles.
- Press the smaller container into the wet mix, being careful to leave a minimum half-inch thickness at the base; hold for 30 seconds. After 30 seconds, if the form rises when you release the smaller container, weight it down gently with water or stones. If mix overflows, skim the excess with a trowel
- Allow mix to set for 24 hours or more to minimize cracking.
- Once your concrete planters are completely set and removed from the moulds, give the tops a quick sanding with fine sandpaper.
- Add potting soil and your succulent plants and display!

NOTE: Any materials used in this project should not be used again for food preparation. Be sure to wear rubber gloves during the entire process while concrete is wet. OH







ILLUSTRATION HINKLEY LIGHTING

With a few beams of light, your outdoor spaces can sparkle underneath the night sky. Light fixtures in the right place will enhance your yard's style and extend your evening's outdoor entertaining. OUR HOMES shows you how to light your property and offers some style ideas.



1. Flush Mounts light seating areas, balconies or porches with lower ceiling heights.


Two years after building her family home on Old Mail Road, high on the Escarpment in Grey County, **Helen Thomson** was ready to landscape.

Designer and owner of **HT Designs**, Thomson's spectacular 35-acre property is tucked away from busy roads at the end of a long driveway amidst rolling hills and cycling trails. Noticing signs around the area, she contacted landscape designer **Tyler Speirs**, principal of **TS Design Build**. They met to chat and the creative energy grew.

The landscape would be designed around her home, a 5,000 sq. ft. modernist twist on a country barn. With stunning architectural work by **Rockside Campbell Design**, the house was built by **Creek Valley Homes** in 2010. "It was a great build," says Thomson.

There was much to consider before drawing up a landscape plan. Speirs is an award-winning landscape designer with a hands-on approach to his work. "Tyler is wonderful to work with," offers Thomson. "He gives off good energy, really listens to his clients, follows through and puts his heart and soul into the project."

When Speirs first approached the property, he was drawn to its unique qualities. "I saw fields of corn flanking a contemporary home on the Escarpment," he recalls. "There were great vistas with a forest-like setting behind, and it was quite secluded." Thomson and Speirs had the same vision: To create an outdoor living space that would blend and flow well with Thomson's design taste and style, and create a balance between the modern elements of the house and the natural outdoor setting.

But Thomson had a longer wish list, which evolved over the three-month project: A pool with a patio area, a spa/hot tub with decking extending over the pool, a pergola to shelter the dining area, a barbecue and bar area, a fire pit with a seating area and plants. With the plan in place, Speirs and his team of four got to work. Says Speirs, "No landscape is complete without fire, water, art and personality," and this project has it all.

Thomson envisioned the hardscaping as solid, clean lines and the softscaping as low maintenance with large swaths of soothing colour in mass-planted garden beds. A broad assortment of perennials, including salvia, Russian sage, lavender, creeping thyme, maiden grass, iris, euonymus and fountain grass offer a cool palette of blues and purples in late summer. A single white paper birch tree further defines the space. Irrigation managed by The Sprinkler Guys.

There were privacy considerations. Fencing was needed for the pool, but also to deter visiting wildlife, including deer, foxes, coyotes and wild turkeys. With the forest offering some privacy, the homeowners wanted an enclosure that felt open and did not obstruct views. Speirs designed a unique fence using galvanized steel mesh, framed by cedar posts stained black. A horizontal wood fence blocks the nearby circular driveway from the patio area.

concrete creates a bar with floating countertop, reminiscent of the home's interior design. The opposite side of the bar holds a large barbecue and food preparation area. ABOVE RIGHT: The custom fir pergola uses canvas overhead for added shade. Aluminum bar stools and dining chairs are practical and add to the industrial vibe. RIGHT: Hot pink chairs with footstools bring the interior colour scheme outdoors.



decking, poured and made smooth but with texture to prevent slipping. The hot tub surround is heat-treated ash, a popular maintenance-free option, and LED lighting glows from beneath the spa steps. A waterfall feature flowing gently into the pool was later added to the hot tub wall.

The custom pergola is constructed of fir posts and beams, with a canvas shade overhead. A floating concrete countertop designed by Speirs completes the barbecue and bar area. Board-formed concrete, consistent with design details in the home's interior, was used for the barbecue area, pool retaining wall and fire pit. Muskoka chairs and a custom bench by Speirs cluster around the fire pit, on a bed of pea-stone gravel.


Entering the house, visitors are struck by the bold and innovative design details, enhanced by the interaction of light, glass, concrete and wood. The south-facing main floor is bathed in natural light through floorto-ceiling windows and doors (Cedarport Window and Door Centre Inc.), and a partial glass floor acts as a skylight to the lower level.

Board-formed concrete, antique pine and reclaimed-wood accent walls seamlessly blend with outside landscaping. There are some surprises, such as the use of hot pink as an accent colour. "My daughter and I love pink," says Thomson. "And as a designer, I know interior colour choices are often influenced by what colours actually look good on my clients." Continued on page 62




"You can't always buy what you need," adds Thomson, pointing to the dining room table and side table she herself designed. Two dramatic chandeliers, some of the few man-made light sources in the home and sourced by HT Designs, define the dining area. The sleek custom kitchen cabinets and built-ins were provided by Riverside Custom Cabinets Ltd.



Make It Last

Buy the best quality outdoor furniture you can afford and keep these quick tips in mind to maximize the life expectancy of your furniture.

- When in doubt, hire a professional designer and landscaper to save time and money in the long run.
- Ensure all fasteners (nuts, bolts, washers, etc.) are rust-proof stainless steel.
- Choose furniture that's made of weather-resistant material (see "Select Your Type").
- Choose only tempered glass for tabletops for safety and make sure they are scratch, impact, and heat-resistant.
- Fabrics for cushions should be labelled UV tested and made of acrylic materials that are waterresistant.
- Look for cushions with foam cores wrapped in water-resistant, breathable synthetic fibre padding.
- Accents like rugs, lights and heaters add comfort and extend the use and enjoyment of your outdoor living spaces.
- The more you shade your furniture, the longer it will last while providing comfort for you and your quests. Consider adding trees, umbrellas, gazebos and shade structures.
- Clean with a soft cloth using only mild dish soap and warm water or cleaners specifically formulated to protect fabrics and all outdoor furniture, including aluminum, plastic, steel, resin, wicker, wood and rattan.



This cordial is one of a few homemade drink syrups that give my entertaining a very personal flavour. I enjoy having this on hand for mixing tall, summer iced refreshers and winter cocktails.

Combined with carbonated mineral water or chilled white wine, it makes a light and fruity drink. Mixed with spirits, the result is a dark and mysteriously delicious drink with plenty of panache. Brandy adds an alcohol dimension to this rich, dark syrup, but is not required, especially if you want to keep your drink options open and use it in a non-alcoholic punch.

BLACKBERRY CORDIAL (Makes 4 cups)

3 lbs blackberries

1-1/2 cups water

1 tsp whole cloves

1 tsp freshly grated or ground nutmeg

½ tsp ground cinnamon

¼ cup freshly squeezed lemon juice

3 cups granulated sugar

1/3 cup brandy, optional

- In a large stockpot or canning kettle, combine blackberries, water, cloves, nutmeg and cinnamon. Cover and bring to a boil over high heat. Reduce the heat and simmer for 15 minutes, or until the blackberries are very soft.
- Strain through a cheesecloth-lined sieve, allowing the juice to drip into a non-reactive bowl or pan overnight. Combine the strained blackberry juice, lemon juice and sugar in a large saucepan or canning kettle. Bring to a boil over high heat and boil for 1 minute.
- Skim and discard any foam. Stir in brandy if using. Pour into 2 pint or a 1-litre jar, cap, label and let cool. Store cordial in the refrigerator for up to 3 weeks.


NOTE: If you fill Mason-type jars, cap with 2-piece canning lids, cover them with boiling water and keep the water boiling for 10 minutes and the cordial will keep for up to 1 year. Refrigerate the cordial once the jar is open.



Cordial is perfect for making Kir: combine 2 Tbsp Blackberry Cordial with 1 cup white wine or champagne. I have tossed it with fresh fruit as a quick dessert and

it is a great base for Blackberry Granita: in the bowl of a blender, combine ½ cup Blackberry Cordial with 10 ice cubes. Process on "chop" until ice is blended with the cordial. Serve with a spoon. **0H**

Sequestered down a maze of dirt roads ringing the Kolapore Uplands sits a new home, the product of Scandinavian inspiration, smart engineering, a thirst for sustainable design and the cooperation of university alumni. The home of Martin Mansikka and Sara Woodward is perched high in the Uplands, a nature preserve surrounded by undeveloped land with Metcalfe Rock as its focal point.

Mansikka and builder Milan Smeh of Legendary Group connect on tongue-and-groove ceilings on the deck blend seamlessly with the interior. Cords of wood heat the home in the colder months on the few days that passive solar heat isn't enough. **OPPOSITE, TOP:** A Scandinavian aesthetic gives the Uplands home a minimalist look functional house. **BOTTOM:** Not a single residence or light at night is visible from the home's secluded

Not far from the four-bedroom home is the **Legendary Group** shop in Collingwood. A hive of year-round activity, Legendary Group is a leading-edge manufacturer of prefabricated custom homes. Inside that shop is founder Milan Smeh, a civil engineering alumnus of Martin's at Western University. Together the duo developed a pared-down white-on-wood modern design for Martin and Sara to call home. The popularity of this style of home among Milan's clients would come to inspire Legendary Group's new Mod² collection, which features innovative design concepts and optional heavy steel construction for even larger room spans and increased design flexibility. With Martin manning the helm as designer and general contractor, Milan led the charge in the development of the 2,700 sq. ft. home with his company's prefabricated hybrid wall systems. Together they produced a home beautiful for its authentic minimalism, simple materials and breathtaking view. From the seamless concrete of the basement, to the wall-to-wall glazing, the home is endearing in its bare-it-all attitude.

"The modern design of Martin's home is reflective of our system," says Milan. "Martin was very interested in green building and energy efficiencies, and our system follows those mandates of sustainable design. Our roof system is super insulated and he spent a lot of time working on passive solar heating to develop a very economically heated home. We also work with Ontario wood products and use Forest Stewardship Council (FSC)-certified lumber."

The passive solar heating is so effective that, in conjunction with radiant in-floor heating on the lower level and a wood stove from Hearth & Leisure upstairs, the home's back-up, forced-air furnace ran for only five days this past winter. Well-designed roof overhangs that anticipate the sun's seasonal shift eliminate heat gain in the hot summer months.

Legendary Group fabricated the 10-foot high wall-panel systems (pre-finished with exterior siding and windows), roof panels (pre-finished with pine tongue-and-groove on the ceiling) and heavy timber trusses and gables in the factory, and then assembled the home on site with a crane (Vanwyck Crane Service Ltd.) in an unbelievable two days. Following site work in the first week of November, Martin and Sara were living in the home by February – a shocking feat during a Grey County winter.





"It's a lighter impact footprint on the site," says Martin.

"They were only here for two days, comparing that to 40 guys with their trucks hanging around for a few months. Materials don't get damaged by the weather and there isn't the material wastage you get on a conventional job site." Martin adds, "It's pretty sensitive land here. We had to do a deer study and a walk-through with a botanist to look for endangered species on the whole 25 acres."

In contrast to a conventional build, the Mansikka home was constructed in a controlled environment that facilitates quality and predictability. All the components are built more precisely, without exposure to the elements, which ensures the air barrier remains intact and delivers an air-tight building envelope. Everything is inspected before it leaves the Legendary shop floor.

"Prefabricated homes are a smarter way to build," extols Milan. "The greatest benefits are that prefab homes guarantee quality and are 100 per cent predictable with respect to both time and cost. Our home package costs are fixed, so there is no risk of cost over-runs and no time delays. The delivery time and cost is always fixed, and people are always comfortable with that." With solid planning, Martin and Milan were able to plan to hide away plumbing and electrical inside the home's few interior walls, while leaving the ductwork and structural floor exposed from above and below in order to establish a clean design.

Natural materials predominate, including striking wormy maple that Martin sourced at Bill Brown Woodworking & Building Supplies Ltd. to produce a half wall in the front foyer, butcher block waterfall kitchen countertop and the modern harvest dining table. Paint throughout the interior is Behr's Premium Plus Interior Flat line, a zero-VOC paint in Ultra Pure White (1850). Outside, the couple went with the low-VOC Behr Marquee Exterior Flat paint in Carbon (N520-7).


"The exposed heavy timber structural floor was a great way to minimize material usage," adds Martin. "I have LEED (Leadership in Energy & Environmental Design) credentials, so I tried to incorporate a lot of those principles into the house design."


The open-concept floor plan is facilitated by the heavy timber trusses, wide passageways and few doors. Only the bedrooms and bathrooms are closed off, while sight lines to the laundry and mudroom, front foyer and even the principal bedroom walk-in-closet are broken only by right-angle walls. Many of the walls themselves are absent of trim, lending to the seamless minimalist sensibility. Continued on page 102







"The absence of trim is done with a I-moulding, so wherever the wall system meets the floors or the doors, you get the really clean look of no trim and it produces that nice shadow effect," notes Martin. "I really like seeing the physical elements of the house."

Legendary Group was a natural ally in the construction of Martin and Sara's home. Not only is Milan an excellent problem solver, according to the homeowners, but the product Legendary Group produces is top-of-the-line quality, adhering closely with industry trends. 



The coveted white kitchen: it may sound strict, or even boring to some, but if you start with a solid base, this classic scheme actually leaves lots of room to add personality, drama, and yes, even colour. Read on to learn how to do a white kitchen the right way – your way.

Never Run-of-the-Mill

Cutting corners with your millwork will usually show in the long run: good solid cabinets in a classic style can always be repainted or touched up, while low-end or trendy options will grow dated much faster as materials are dinged or peel. A good investment here will anchor the space for years to come.

TRY: Flat slab drawer/door fronts for a sleek modern look, with a lacquer or ultramatte finish that highlights the beautiful simplicity. For a balanced transitional appeal, opt for shaker doors with a simple frame-like border, which can then be dressed to look more traditional or more contemporary with hardware. Hard to Forget

Often, cabinet hardware goes overlooked, but good knobs and pulls can be the jewelry of the kitchen, so don't be too quick to settle for plain factory options. I often like to add variety by using different styles on the lower and upper cabinets, such as brass pulls and glass knobs - but play it safe with just two styles.

TRY: Brass or copper cabinet pulls for warmth, gem-cut glass or crystal for boutique elegance, or fun, patterned knobs for a trendy indulgence. To go minimal, use knob-free reach-in fronts, or try inset finger-pulls for a traditional upscale touch.

Colour Chameleon

The white kitchen endures because it's so adaptable: a strict palette of neutrals for the fixed finishes still leaves room to update and accessorize the look endlessly. A hot trend for 2016 is to mix white with warm off-whites for a subtle richness, but a crisp white will work with virtually any favourite hue. When in doubt, keep the major investments neutral and add spice through noncommittal accents.

TRY: Colourful tea towels (like this Bumble Bee Dish Towel from CB2), containers or appliances (like a KitchenAid stand mixer in Blue Willow), and be sure to leave room for a natural element like fresh flowers or fruit. Choose glass inserts for a few upper doors to let beautiful dishes and glassware add even more personality.



Contrast Control

A colour pop isn't the only way to make a statement - lighting from unexpected sources, such as under-cabinet light pucks, floating shelves with LED strips, or inner-cabinet lights (with a windowed door) add interest and functionality. Consider mixing in a darker element such as espresso floors or smoky, stone counters for a pleasing contrast, and finish the scheme with a dimmer to change the mood at whim like a filter on Instagram.

TRY: Oversize pendant lights (like the Mason Wide Pendant from Arteriors) to add evocative points of interest without a single new hue.

Try one of these Benjamin Moore hues to suit your white kitchen style.



Chantilly Lace (2121-70): A long-time favourite,

and an ultra clean and fresh white tone. This is a safe bet to avoid difficult-to-match undertones and just a breezy all-over colour for walls, cabinetry – everything.



Cotton Balls (**OC-122**): A faintly yellow-tinted

off-white with a heritage character that works for elegantly traditional kitchens, or paired with a cleaner white to add sophisticated interest in an otherwise stark modern space. Try it for just cabinetry, where it will also hide a few fingerprints.



Distant Gray (**OC-68**): A barely-

there grey, with ashy crispness that grounds bright white or offsets warm woods. Try it for just the walls, especially paired with a veiny stone backsplash, to make the cabinetry look extra crisp.



Simply White (OC-117): Benjamin Moore's 2016 colour

of the year, and a warm justoff-white. Try this for painted floors or wood panelling (on, say, the front of an island) to give a cottage-inspired feel, or use it on walls with warm wood accents like exposed beams or floating shelves. OH



No doubt everyone in your neighbourhood has a different approach to watering plants through the summer months: there are those who over-water, those who let their gardens dry up to desert-like states and many variations in between with endless methods of water application.

This summer, help your plants thrive and add value to your property by adopting some water-smart gardening practices. Your yard, the environment and your wallet will all thank you.

"In a nutshell, a water-smart garden is a sustainable garden, where conserving and nurturing all natural resources leads to a healthy, mature landscape," says Diana Maranhao, author of *Water-Smart Gardening: Save Water, Save Money, and Grow the Garden You Want*. Anyone can achieve this through a combination of conservation methods and good gardening practices that will help maintain, preserve and nurture soil and water supplies. Once plants have what they need to grow to maturity, she says, "they can survive and thrive on what Mother Nature provides!"

INCREASE YOUR PROPERTY VALUE

According to Maranhao, "Planting, nurturing and growing healthy trees adds assessed value of between \$1,000 and \$10,000 to properties," depending upon the maturity, type and number of trees. Similarly, she adds, "Developed landscapes add as much as 20 per cent to total property values – not to mention the energy savings from the cooling effect of mature trees around a home." So what are you waiting for?

START SAVING: 3 STRATEGIES

Although Maranhao outlines in her book countless ways to save water and grow a garden destined for longevity, she offers her top three water-saving strategies:

1. Apply and Re-apply Mulch

If you only do one thing for your garden this year, says Maranhao, make it mulch. A thick layer (about three to five inches) of organic mulch across your whole garden will conserve water immediately. It seals in moisture, cools the soil and plant roots, creates a layer of darkness that discourages weed-seed germination, reduces sun damage on plants, diminishes erosion and protects soil from drying winds

"Chipped tree trimmings, pine needles and shredded bark are my favourites in the landscape," says Maranhao. "Allow leaves that fall from trees to lie where they fall or rake them up if they shade the lawn and spread them elsewhere in the garden. Use straw in the veggie garden – it's good for at least two seasons before you can rototill it in." Continued on page 110

2. Share the Resources

Zone your plants so you can water sections of your garden accordingly. Group low-water need plants together, plant shallow-rooting shrubs and flowers under trees with deep root systems and try incorporating your edibles into your wider landscape so they can help each other out.

3. Capture, Direct and Slow the Flow of Water

This is the year to finally install a rain barrel! Capture the free stuff falling from

the sky. If you already have a rain barrel and are looking for more ways to minimize your water bill, Maranhao suggests creating and moulding the landscape that will best direct the flow of water where you need it: berms, basins and swales can all work to your advantage.

STOP WASTING

Being water smart isn't just about installing rain barrels or irrigation systems. It's also about changing bad habits that waste water

Give plants the space they need to grow to maturity and water them slowly and deeply to the entire root zone during their developing years so they can put down solid, deep roots and better fend for themselves.

"'Right plant, right place' means considering all of the environmental needs of the plant before selecting and then siting the plant so that it can grow naturally to its mature size and form – the best horticulture practice to have a healthy plant," says Maranhao.

















A Hitchcockian wroughtiron gate swings open to the brick, Arts and Crafts-era home of Lisa and Matthew Rotenberg.

The architecture of the Thornbury house remains traditional to 1928, when the home was built, and Lisa, Matthew and their silver lab Blue, are just the third homeowners. The couple transplanted from Toronto in July 2015, but Lisa says that she already feels like a local. With a history in the Grey Highlands and a passion

for Canadian art and the southern Ontario landscape, she is well versed in the area.

Lisa is a prolific folk artist. She is currently represented by Gallery de Boer – Fine Art in Owen Sound, and has a multi-decade background in a variety of artistic positions. After graduating from the Ontario College of Art and Design, Lisa worked in graphic design, and became an account director. "I needed a creative outlet, so I began painting at night." This turned into a full-time career. Her vibrant paintings have evolved time and again, but have maintained the ability for commercial application. She has illustrated with several companies, painted the labels for her own

coffee company, rocketfuelcoffee.com, and even wrote and illustrated a children's book, *Rodeo Pup*, published in 1999. Many of Lisa's paintings are hugely inspired by the southern Ontarian landscape and culture, capturing the beauty of the area and the people's history.

Today, Lisa's studio is tucked behind carriage-style doors in the home's carport. Easels, paints and recent work fill the space. Inside the house, Lisa and Matthew's passion for Canadian art is on display. Recognizable Canadian artist Norval Morrisseau commands attention on the walls, alongside Flo Campbell, Robert Markle, and Travis Schilling, to name a few. Continued on page 117










Twenty-five years ago, a modern addition was put on the back of the home. The combination of mid-century modern style with the original architecture brings unique character to the space. Lisa credits **Lindsay** Herbert of Baywood Designs for the interior colour palette. Dark hardwood floors contrast with a neutral wall palette of white and pale grey, a backdrop for the Rotenbergs' art collection. The modern kitchen on the back addition of the home -"Matthew's kingdom," describes Lisa – adds contemporary sophistication against the traditional architecture of the front portion of the house. Unique Kartell dining chairs are works of art on their own, with varying abstract prints upholstered onto clear plastic bases. A few steps down into the living room, a mid-century occasional chair and curved sofa surround a coffee table covered in art books (Kandinsky and Morrisseau among them).

In the cosy, square dining room off of the kitchen, a round, wooden table is accented with pale grey upholstered dining chairs. The centerpiece is a yellow lighting fixture that Lisa and Matthew repurposed, which elevates the traditional room and brings a bright pop of colour to the space. Continued on page 118

At the front of the house are two smaller rooms with atmospheric charm. Vintage mid-century furniture fits in the music room, including a miniature salesman sample chair placed beside an antique piano. A portrait of a hockey player by Charles Comfort, purchased by Lisa and Matthew as a special anniversary present to themselves, is proudly hung in their "scotch and bourbon library," the name a play on New York City's Brandy Library in Tribeca. This is where Lisa displays her impressive whisky collection, and a sleek, modern grey sofa from **Leuk Bij Hermas Interiors** sits underneath the large front-facing windows.

Between the library and music room is the front door to the house, accented with original stained glass. A whimsical owl sculpture by artist Viktor Tinkl greets visitors, and contemporary work by Heather Cook hangs on the wall.

"It's the most incredible hide-and-seek house," says Lisa. Secret doors, rooms, quarter-sawn oak finishings, narrow doorways and unexpectedly large closets are some of the many vintage charms that come with owning a nearly century-old house. She gushes, "Sometimes Matthew and I look at each other and I say, 'Can you believe we live in this house?'" Continued on page 120















Upstairs, the master bedroom oozes calmness. A south-facing balcony is steps away from the bed, flanked by portraits of the couple photographed in 1983. Lisa describes their morning ritual: "Whoever goes and gets the dog in the morning has to make coffee and bring it upstairs. Then we sit out here and have coffee. It's like being in a hotel." The balcony overlooks the mature backyard with its intimate trees, lush gardens and bright blue pool. A rare butternut tree is thriving.

When the Rotenbergs began the restorations in the garden, they wanted to keep the original home in mind. What would the gardens have looked like in 1928? Skilled gardeners worked with the couple using this vision during the planting and re-establishing process. The home is surrounded by a multitude of perennials: peony, hydrangea, fuchsia, 40 varieties of tulip and nine varieties of narcissus (daffodil), for starters. Original rosebushes remain lively, having been nurtured over the years. Lisa plans on having fiddlehead ferns and mint planted in the front gardens this year. Continued on page 122







Sometimes, when work needs to be done on a home, it's

better to do it all at once, which is what the owner of a nine-year-old home in The Orchard at Craigleith decided to do after seeing the plans for the kitchen makeover she had requested. Corinthian Kitchen & Bath Studio had presented materials and concepts for the kitchen. An awkward shower had been tucked behind the door, which Katrine suggested would be a more suitable space for the toilet. The existing bath could then be extended and integrated with a glass-walled shower to fill the entire far wall, and a double vanity could be replaced by a pair of vanities sitting on opposite sides of the room. The finished space is luxurious, while organic touches - such as incredible light fixtures in gold-leafed branches with crystal leaves - and mixed metals give it a comfortable air suited to the chalet atmosphere.

« This master en suite is the pinnacle of style-meets-function-meets-comfort. With minimal shifting of plumbing, some gorgeous basalt and tempered glass, the homeowner gets a luxe, pampered bathroom to ready herself for a day on the slopes or a night in the village. Gorgeous tempered glass from G. Lawrence Enterprizes runs the room's full 10-foot height. A custom sliding panel closes the shower.



>> The greys of basalt feature in the room. The dramatic, fine-grained, volcanic rock is formed from cooling lava and quarried from the Atlantic basin – either on the eastern coast of North and South America or the western coast of Europe and Africa. A honed, dark slab surrounds the tub and extends into the shower as a seat. On the floor, large, honed rectangular tiles from Olympia Tile are heated to keep the en suite warm in the cooler months. Small, rectangular tiles cover the full rear wall of the room as well as the face of the tub and interior of the shower.





≪ A pair of solid maple vanities are painted white and topped with Casearstone in Pure White with white undermount Toto sinks. Light fixtures coordinate throughout the master suite, where gold-leafed, branch-theme, crystalleaf pendants hang in both the bedroom and bath, and wall sconces on either side of the vanity mirrors host small, white shades. 





Radish, thinly sliced Jalapeno, thinly sliced

Queso Fresco

PICKLED RED ONIONS

1 medium red onion, thinly sliced

2 cloves garlic, smashed

A few slices of jalapeno or a dried chili

½ tsp peppercorns or pickling spices

½ tsp sugar

½ tsp salt

½ cup white vinegar

Boiling water

CHIMICHURRI SAUCE

1 bunch of parsley

½ cup olive oil

juice of 1 lime

2 Tbsp vinegar (red wine, apple cider or white)

salt to taste

AVOCADO SAUCE

2 large avocados

4 cloves garlic

1/4 cup onion

handful of basil

handful of parsley

olive oil, as needed

salt to taste

1/4 medium onion

2 cloves garlic

handful of watercress

water, as needed

MARINADE

• Mix together ingredients for the steak marinade, pour over steak and set aside.

PICKLED RED ONIONS

- Bring 2-3 cups of water to a boil.
- In a large bowl, mix together garlic, jalapeno, peppercorns or pickling spices, sugar, salt and white vinegar.
- Place thinly sliced red onion in a mesh strainer and pour the boiling water over the slices, letting them drain in the sink. This par-cooks the red onion before pickling.
- Once strained, add the red onion to the pickling mixture and set aside.
- This can be done in advance, but let pickle for at least 30 minutes.

CHIMICHURRI SAUCE

- Finely chop parsley, onion and garlic.
- Mix together with lime juice, vinegar and salt, and set aside.

AVOCADO SAUCE

- Add garlic to a food processor with a teaspoon of salt and pulse.
- Add onion, watercress, parsley, basil and avocado flesh.
- Blend together and slowly add olive oil while processor is running. If the sauce is too thick, add water as needed. Season with salt to taste.

COOK AND ASSEMBLE

- Preheat a cast-iron skillet over high heat, or preheat your outdoor grill, and coat with a layer of cooking oil.
- Once heated, pat the steak dry and sear on each side for 4 minutes for rare (cook longer if preferred).
- Remove steak from heat and let rest 10-15 minutes.
- Thinly slice meat against the grain.
- Serve with flour tortillas. sauces and optional toppings, including radish, jalapeno and Queso Fresco. on










