OUTSICE DECOR

Every year when summer rolls around I stare out at the deck and start amassing large scale plans for vegetable beds and new furniture, sunshades and fire pits. The season closes and alas, we have usually accomplished one or two of those items. Sun kissed and relaxed, I normally care less about the surroundings and more about the summer experience – family, friends and being outdoors.







But let's face it, as a designer, or as anyone who looks at Houzz, reads decorating magazines like OUR HOMES, goes shopping or surfs the net, we are inundated with ideas – there's always a desire for change. Here are a few ideas to modernize your outdoor entertaining space and a few others that will make life that much easier:


great ideas from Govino on the Wine Enthusiast's website. My favourites are stemless with a cute notch-out for your finger.





CONTAINER NOW GARDENS

An herb garden is a delicious way to keep your body, mind and cooking healthy. Since herbs don't need pesticides to keep critters away, tending to your herb garden is easy, fun and organic.

We've put together three creative ways to make a simple herb garden for your back porch, window or wall.

1. Reuse old mason jars on old barn board for a shabby chic wall-hanging garden. Mark the spots you want your plants to hang from with chalk. Using screws, attach metal pipe clamps to the board. Insert jars and tighten clamps. Fill jars with rock and soil. Plant herbs. Affix chalkboard labels.

Materials: Mason jars, rocks, potting soil, screws, herbs, screwdriver/drill, barn board, metal pipe clamps, chalk, chalk labels.

2. Create a simple window garden with recycled cans. Use rocks to create a little bed at the bottom of each can. Fill with soil and transplant your herbs. Label with a paper tag, attach with twine.

Materials: Recycled cans, rocks, potting soil, screws, herbs, paper tags, twine and marker.

3. Plant your herbs in individual pockets of a hanging cotton shoe organizer. Fill each pocket with moisture retaining soil. Make cute labels from scrapbooking paper and plastic nametag covers.

Materials: Hanging cotton shoe organizer, potting soil, herbs, paper or labels, marker, plastic nametag covers with pins.





TIPS:

- Fill your containers one inch below the top with moisture-rich potting soil.
- If potting containers aren't breathable, then make a rock bed at the bottom to help drain excess water. Only a half-inch of rock is needed.
- For the shoe organizer garden, place a small plant underneath to catch water run-off. Water the plants from top to bottom, creating a waterfall effect.
- Use wide-mouth mason jars for large pre-grown herbs. **o**H

A BREATH OF FRESH AIR: CONSIDER YOUR FLOORING

Living in a house with two- and four-legged occupants means a soup of familiar smells that a resident nose can easily identify. Like a wine sommelier, my nose can sense many smells in a regular day: the smell of nice cologne that follows my husband to work in the morning, the three-sport-a-day scent of my teenage daughter before a shower, and the garlic and onions hanging in the air at dinnertime.

While some of these sources are innocuous to our environment, others we need to get educated about to breathe easier and be healthier. The floor, ceiling, walls and furniture can emit invisible pollutants that can degrade the air we breathe. The scientific name Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) we hear bandied about in eco-speak is also known as off-gassing.

What causes indoor air problems?

The Canada Green Building Council (CaGBC) estimates that Canadians spend an average of 90 per cent of their time indoors, where levels of pollutants may be two-to-five times (and occasionally more than 100 times) higher than outdoor levels. We spend a lot of time in a sealed



environment, dependent on mechanical ventilation systems like Heat Recovery Ventilation (HRV) systems to circulate indoor and outdoor air. Good indoor air quality (IAQ) involves reducing and diluting pollutants with adequate fresh air. You could open a window, but a balance must be struck between additional fresh air, and the hydro meter spinning wildly as your furnace chugs along to heat or cool that air.

According to Susan M. Winchip, Professor Emitrus of Interior and Environmental Design at Illinois State University and author of Sustainable Design for Interior Environments, 2nd Edition, major contributors to VOCs in building materials include: adhesives and sealants, paints and coatings, carpet, composite wood products, furniture and seating.

Professionally, specifying materials is a large part of what we do as sustainable designers. Unbiased third party websites, like www.greenguard.org, provide a database to help consumers find building materials with low chemical emissions. The Greenguard Certification Program tests for VOCs, as well as other pollutants in a product, and reports the emission levels. Flooring is a good place to start, because it's one of the largest surfaces in your house.

A SHORT PRIMER ON SOME COMMON FLOORING MATERIALS

I. Soft floor coverings:

a. Carpet, nylon

- Winchip says materials used in the fibres, sealants, and adhesives are harmful to the IAO
- Carpet adhesives can emit high quantities of VOCs. Winchip suggests tacking carpet rather than gluing is a healthier solution. Refer to the Carpet and Rug Institute's Green Label Plus program for the lowest VOC emitting products on the market.
- According to Winchip, the highest levels of VOC gases are emitted with new carpet. Some estimates indicate that after the first 72 hours the VOC off-gassing subsides significantly. Whenever possible, new carpet should be allowed to air out outside the building, and people should wait several days before occupying the rooms.

b. Carpet, wool

- Absorbs noise and noxious gases from the air.
- Resists odour and resists fire more than other fibre choices.
- Hypo-allergenic and does not promote the growth of dust mites or bacteria or give
 off harmful emissions.

II. Hard floor coverings: wood, stone, tile, bamboo

- According to Interior Designer Corky Binggeli, in her book, Materials for Interior Environments, the glue binding bamboo together contains formaldehyde unless specifically noted otherwise. The amount off-gassed is very little, however. Zero VOC bamboo flooring is available.
- Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) certified wood floors are made from sustainably harvested wood. Low VOC stains and sealants are available.
- Particleboard, which may be used for an underlayment, should not contain formaldehyde.

III. Resilient Flooring: Resilient floor finish is elastic and has some "give" to it. Examples include linoleum, cork, rubber, vinyl and vinyl composite tile (VCT).

- VCT and rubber tiles are available with recycled content.
- Linoleum is made from renewable resources: linseed, wood flour and pine resins on a jute backing and is compostable.
- Vinyl flooring contains plasticizers and releases VOCs. Look for low VOC or PVC-free products.
- Flooring adhesives should be solvent-free, low- or zero-VOC and water-based.
- Frequently, rubber flooring is recommended only for outdoor or commercial use due to the potential for off-gassing.
- Some binders used in flooring such as cork are made of Urea-formaldehyde. **OH**

MINIATURE MARVELS SINGING THE PRAISES OF THE LOWLY O'O'O'O'O'O'O' PHOTOS AND STORY BY MELANIE REKOLA

Considering groundcovers are often in the forefront of garden beds everywhere, it seems little praise is given to these tough, tiny plants.

Groundcovers can add a whole new dimension of colour to your garden through their foliage, texture and abundant bloom. Many, with their trailing nature, can soften hard stonework when tucked in crevices, or be encouraged to spill down the front of retained beds giving an "aged" feel. Groundcovers can also help retain slopes and discourage weed growth. Some are so strong that they can act as a lawn or path substitution. Read on to discover more.

MELANIE'S PLANT PICKS:

Stonecrop (*scdum*) – There are so many lovely trailing varieties of the sedum family that I cannot pick just one! The fleshy, succulent leaves of this little plant often look like a flower. It comes in a variety of foliage and bloom colours, plus it's drought tolerant and happy in lean soil. Bees and hummingbirds love them and the presence of pollinators is an important indicator of a healthy garden. Stonecrop favours sun but will tolerate partial shade. My favourites are:

Angelina (Sedum rupestre) – This spiky evergreen variety offers bright golden foliage and turns orange in fall, with yellow flowers in early summer.

Dragon's Blood (Sedum spurium) – This well-loved stonecrop is a semi-evergreen specimen with rich reddish foliage and bright pink blooms in late summer.

Bronze Carpet (Sedum spurium) – This showy stonecrop sports brilliant bronze red semi-evergreen foliage with flattering pink flowers.

Miniature Stonecrop (Sedum requieni) – This miniature stonecrop is a tiny leafed evergreen sedum and is the only one that tolerates foot traffic. It forms a dense mat with tiny white flowers and is extremely hardy.

Creeping Phlox (*Phlox subulata*) – Dense and low growing, this soft-looking plant is a prolific bloomer! It's covered in small purple, pink, white or variegated flowers in spring, with short, stiff evergreen foliage. This low-maintenance perennial prefers sun/part sun and is accepting of lean soils.

Golden Scotch Moss (*Sagina subulata*) – Very dense and low growing, this mounding evergreen perennial, with tiny star-like white flowers in spring, boasts attractive chartreuse foliage. It tolerates foot traffic easily but its shallow root system requires steady watering to thrive. It prefers part shade.

Hens and Chicks (Sempervivum) – I like all varieties of this drought tolerant succulent. Their rosettes display dazzling progressive colour changes throughout the season. They favour full sun to bring out their rich colour. Sempervivums will bloom after the second or third year. An odd looking flower stalk will shoot up from the centre of the main rosette with a cluster of flowers. After the flower dies, gently twist off the stalk. The main rosette has put on new offsets that will fill in.

Cranesbill (*Geranium Bloody*) – Of the many variations of the Cranesbill family, my absolute favorite variety is Bloody, which, to me, is one of the best Cranesbill introductions ever. It bears handsome dark green foliage with happy, upright clusters of bright violet-purple, cup-shaped flowers. Bloom period begins in early summer and continues on throughout the garden season. It likes sun to part shade.


Creeping Jenny/Moneywort (Lysimachia nummularia or Golden Creeping Jenny) – Creeping Jenny is accused of being an aggressive perennial, however the Goldilocks variety is restrained in habit. It is ideal to combat soil erosion or on rock walls and tolerates lean soil. Preferring full sun to part shade, its yellow-green foliage makes a bright statement when paired with common greens typically found in the garden. The name "wort" suggests medicinal use; it was used by early English herbalists to heal superficial wounds of both man and serpents. It was also used for ulcers, scurvy, hemorrhages and ailments of the lungs.


Dianthus (*Dianthus*) – Dianthus range in colour from pink, to red, to white flowers with notched petals and finely textured leaves. Sweet Williams (Dianthus barbatus) are larger and are biennial or short-lived perennials covered with bicolour flowers in late spring. Pinks are low-growing, low-care dianthus suitable for rock gardens with happy open-face flowers and attractive greygreen foliage. Dianthus prefers full sun and won't stand wet soils.

Creeping Thyme Elfin or **Minus** (*Thymus praecox Elfin or Minus*) – This tiny gem has gorgeous miniature flowers and compact leaves. This is another "walk upon" plant and when trod on will let go its thymey scent – plus it's edible! It favours full sun and tolerates lean soil.

A host of mature, entangled groundcovers can rival the beauty of a tapestry. But be careful to consider the aggressive habit of many and choose the right plant for the right environment. Groundcovers are not only at home in the applications mentioned – consider planting a "mini" garden in a planter or two. Children love this pint-sized forest idea, or dare I say living wall. Perhaps it's just the thing to take a ho-hum exterior wall to a front-and-centre showpiece! OH





In this case, the lot was desirable for its view and depth, but was a bit narrow. "Since it was a narrow build, we had to focus everything into a 31-foot-wide lot," says Bill.

But his design prowess took what seemed like a minus and turned it into a plus by orienting everything toward the view. The home is on the same escarpment massif as the Georgian Peaks Ski Club, where the homeowners and their three children are members. "We were trying to get the feel of a chalet without it being too traditional," Bill says. "We wanted to keep the design influences toward the contemporary side but bring in that chalet element."

The home is a subtle hybrid of several themes inspired by the owners: the chalet elements a nod to their passion for skiing; the maritime theme a nod to Boyd's heritage (he was born in Newfoundland into a seafaring family and he and Janice remain avid sailors); and the cottage influence a nod to Janice who grew up during summers in a beloved clapboard cottage built by her family circa 1910 in the 30,000 Islands across the Bay.

But even with all that, the structure is not complicated by competing styles. "Especially at the front, it's a simple roofline," says Bill, "to be more symbolic of a cottage. The colours and materials have a bit of that coastal feel." The front approach to the house serves as a good example of Black Tusk's design-build ingenuity. Continued on page 47

"The garage and covered walkway did a couple of things," Bill explains. "It solved the technical problem of the narrow lot – the only place we could put the garage was out front. Normally it just gets slammed on the front and dominates it. We thought, 'How can we get away from that?' So we detached the garage and then connected it to the house with a covered walkway ... so it draws you into the house and also allows a lot of sunlight into the building."

Numerous facets of the home echo owners' Janice and Boyd's personalities. On the upstairs landing is an inset wood compass rose created by Toronto's Heartwood Architectural Wood Products. "Barb and carpenter **Hugh Grafton**, of **Grafton Carpentry** came up with the idea," says Janice. "They knew we were sailors." Boyd adds: "The compass is set to magnetic north. As Bill and Barb got to know us more, they wanted to bring out this nautical theme, the Georgian Bay theme." These themes

are referenced in many other details, including beach rock motifs in the bathroom and fireplace stone, and the coastal Newfoundland-inspired exterior siding colour.

Barbara and Janice sourced the reclaimed elm flooring from Northern Wide Plank. It originally came from a 120-year-old barn in the Kitchener-Waterloo area. Another old Ontario barn provided reclaimed hemlock for the many interior panels throughout the house. Janice is especially attached to the hemlock as its grey unfinished tone reminds her of her weathered Georgian Bay cottage dock. These panels – prepared and installed by cabinetmaker **Charles Davies of Charles Davies Custom Fine Furniture** – are cleaned with a power brush then ripped to a consistent width and planed on the backsides. "That's what gives it that crisp-lined look," Barbara adds. Continued on page 48









So much of the reclaimed wood in the house has an interesting backstory. For example, the bookcase top on the landing: "It's solid antique brown ash," says Barb, "purchased from an old-timer in Owen Sound who had operated a sawmill." Charles Davies adds: "finding this piece of wood and using it for a build like this – it just doesn't get any better."

Even the custom bathroom vanities by Jason Holmon of JTI Design feature reclaimed lumber with clear coat, and the basement wine cellar is old wood as well. Redridge Millwork & Design Ltd. in Stayner did the cellar mechanics, wood wine-storage and display; Skot Lawrence of Desiron Custom Metal Artwork in Clarksburg did the iron display rack with leather slings. Barbara found the 1920s grape-cluster ceiling lamp in an obscure vintage lighting store in Toronto and thought the owners would love it. They did. Continued on page 50













Those sightlines are magnificent. Apart from the very top of the Blue Mountains, you'd be hard pressed to find a more sweeping view of the Bay anywhere in the region. "We were able to optimize the view very well," says Janice. "You can see the Bay from almost every room." Oasis North Landscapes completed all landscaping and exterior hardscapes.


During framing, the Black Tusk team realized they needed to reconfigure the second floor to maximize the views of the Bay from the master bedroom. "When we started framing the second floor," Bill relates, "it was obvious we were getting tremendous views. So we reconfigured the upper level, opened up a loft at the top of the stairs and added a dormer. Boyd wanted to wake up to a view of the Bay." Barb counts the second-floor configuration as one of the highlights of the build. "The big thing for me was getting the second-floor package on and realizing just how big the view got from up there."

"We wanted to build a house for Georgian Bay," emphasizes Boyd. "We wanted it in a Georgian Bay style, with local craftsmen. Initially the place was envisioned as more for winter, for skiing. But as the kids get older, we're using it four seasons." Continued on page 52

Two years ago, the 34-year veteran cardiologist from the Toronto area built a 2,530 sq. ft. second home with **Curtis Barr** of **C. Barr Construction**. It wasn't until last summer that he finally found the right landscaper to design a yard he envisioned for his weekend retreat, and possibly his retirement home (upon his wife's approval).

Using the Arizona landscape and golf courses as his inspiration, the homeowner imagined a backyard with a silhouette of varied heights, rocks and plants and, of course, a maintenance-free lifestyle. "I like playing golf, so I thought it was a good idea to putt," says the homeowner. "I wanted it to look like Arizona. I like what the desert looks like – the desert vegetation."

And that is precisely what he got with **Jeff Eichenberger** from **Ikes Turf Synthetic Grass Solutions** in Nottawa. "I had actually gone to another company, and they did three different drawings," says the homeowner. "I told them I did not want grass, and I wanted it to look like Arizona, but none of the drawings even looked like Arizona," he adds. "When I called Jeff from Ikes Turf, he did one drawing within 24 hours, and it was exactly what I was looking for."


Jeff created "an arid look using unique rockery and minimal turf – like you would see at a golf course in the desert." To the golfer's delight, the golfing green is faux grass, which is 100 per cent maintenance-free – no weeding, no watering, no cutting and no chemicals. Additionally, "The turf fibres and the backing material are recycled polypropylene and polyethylene – general plastic," says Jeff. "The UV inhibitors allow the turf to withstand fading from the sun."

Jeff was able to add dimension to the flat space by building up portions of the yard with leftover soil from the excavation, creating wave-like bends, curves and elevation. Carrying out the Arizona theme, Jeff used an enclave of distinctive Canyon Rock boulders to accent the landscape. "These unique rocks make the space what it is and play a large role in creating the desert feel," says Jeff. All boulders and rocks are from **Greenmarc Farms** in Nottawa and Grand River Natural Stone Ltd. in Fergus.

The boulders are an art piece of their own with beautiful grey and gold striations, creating a strong and firm presence within their environment. Small pieces of reddish-orange and grey and black Canyon Rock engulf the beds around the synthetic turf in both the back and front yards – bringing a little piece of the desert to Collingwood.

The doctor's yard isn't without a few natural green elements though. Small trees and plants also dot the landscape. "Unfortunately, we can't get cactuses here," laments the homeowner. Sourcing plants native to Ontario, "we used a lot of ornamental grasses, yuccas, sedums, yews, large hostas, and Amur maples (from **Clearview Nursery Ltd.**) to name a few," Jeff recounts. 





GOODBYE ASHTRAY, HELLO SPECTROPHOTOMETER




floating. This minor change allowed us to install a larger soaker tub and shower. This






If the mint condition 1985 motor home parked out back is any indication, Rhonda and Doug Green have a great sense of humour on top of their sense of preservation. The RV has obviously been as lovingly maintained as their 150-year-old Heathcote home.

Celebrating a century-and-a-half of history, the Greens live in the community's former St. Augustine Anglican church. The church appears much as it did in the 19th century, when Heathcote was on a bustling Grey County trade route and the village supported six churches.

Decommissioned in 1957 and converted to living quarters in the 1960s, Rhonda, Doug and their two daughters moved into the 1,400 sq. ft. church when it came up for sale in 1990. Doug had had his eye on the building since he was a boy. A true Heathcote native, Doug was born and raised in the scenic village in the Beaver River Valley.

He remembers visiting the church when the generous owner would open it to the locals as a kind of community centre. "All the village kids used to sleep in there in the summer," recalls Doug. The owner had a small living space at the back of the church, and the whole front was open, minus the pews. "As many as 15 of us would be in here. The moon through the windows at night was phenomenal," he says.

Doug's grandfather owned the property behind the church, where

Doug's grandfather owned the property behind the church, where there was a small orchard. "I didn't know this would come back to haunt me, but we would play in the orchard and throw apples at the church windows," says Doug. "The owner didn't fix the broken windowpanes; she just covered the holes with little strips of plywood. So when we bought the place, we ended up fixing each of those broken windowpanes."

With 735 individual panes in the church, set in eight pairs of 12-foot tall, gothic-peaked windows, maintaining them is indeed a major undertaking. While the Greens have replaced the broken panes, all the gorgeous original pine casings have been left intact. "They were solidly made," says Doug.

The 1863 building is heated with one wood stove in the centre and another one at the back; the Greens have made their peace with the building's winter drafts. Doug does forestry management work in the winter months and the couple love the home's cosy fires. Rhonda's father built the stone mantel in the living room with Wiarton ledge rock.

"There is a real tranquility in the church," says Rhonda. "It's peaceful and beautiful and comfortable." The couple renovated before moving in, adding three bedrooms and a loft at the front, a large bathroom in the mid-space, and a kitchen and dining area at the rear – in the church's original altar.

The plaster on the inside of the exterior walls is original, as are the ceiling and front vestibule door, complete with original skeleton key. The hemlock floors, likely logged and milled locally out of a nearby grove, were taken up to reinforce the floor joists, but the hardwood was all carefully re-laid and restored to a deep brown lustre. Outside, the roof was replaced with steel in the early 2000s by Hy-Grade Steel Roofing Sytems in Guelph. Continued on page 100



Today the Greens' home is more than a just a piece of local history, it is a showcase for Rhonda's artwork and collectors items, as well as for her favourite furnishings sourced through her décor shop. The Greens are the owner-operators of **Greentree Gardens and Emporium**, a nursery and décor store located west of Collingwood on Highway 26. Doug manages the nursery and Rhonda the emporium.

Rhonda's eclectic aesthetic has introduced such delights to the home as a black sparkled cow trophy, a trio of stacked steamer trunks for extra storage space, many gorgeous mirrors to help bounce light and energy into the dark interior, a collection of jewelry from the 1920s, and lovely interior wood doors reclaimed from a local demolition company.

Portraits of the couple also adorn the home – Rhonda's was painted at the beautiful age of 18 wearing a leather fringe 1970s necklace, and Doug's adorable blown-up photo shows him at the age of four in overalls in the garden, complete with bucket and hoe. Continued on page 102







Doug's love of nature and plants clearly goes back a long way, perhaps also inspired by the church's previous owner who planted extensive gardens with medicinal herbs and berries in the churchyard. "It was a spiritual place," recalls Doug. "She taught a lot of us how to garden. She knew about medicinal herbs, berries, composting, making manure tea and doing things to enrich the soil, and she taught us how to encourage bees by leaving out a kind of carrot juice. She was really ahead of her time."

Today, the property grounds extend over an acre, and with the couple's peak working season in the nursery being the spring and summer, they have chosen to put in stunning perennials and trees to keep their yard at home low maintenance. "We've put in over 80 varieties of trees here," says Rhonda. "We do some experimenting in our yard to see whether a certain species can survive in this climate zone." She points to one of their experiments: a trio of Redbud trees that are native to Georgia, which are absolutely thriving with gorgeous heart-shaped leaves that turn yellow in the fall. 


above the existing ceiling," she notes. "Whatever we do, it will be functional, but won't take away from the beauty and character of the church."



SAUCY SMOKY BBQ PORK RIBS

To me, ribs are the ultimate summer food. I mean, we're already eating outdoors – why not make it messy? On rib nights at my house, I cover the picnic table with paper, throw down a heaping platter of these ribs, a pile of napkins, a bowl of coleslaw, some fluffy dinner buns and we dig in! And if this scene doesn't evoke summer. I don't know what does!

Ribs do take a while to become tender, but so many steps along the way can be done in advance. The day before you plan to serve them, rub the ribs with the spices and marinate, and make the sauce. In fact, the sauce can be made up to five days ahead. The sauce is equally delicious on chicken, steaks, burgers, chops – you name it!

While you may want to experiment with other sauce/rub flavours through the summer, perhaps even the meat (beef ribs are a treat too!), this one is a total classic – saucy, smoky, a little sweet and may truly be the only rib recipe you'll need all summer!

CAN'T STAND THE HEAT? GET OUT OF THE KITCHEN...

• Too hot to bake the ribs first? Grill the ribs over indirect heat instead. The timing will be approximately the same, but your kitchen won't overheat. For indirect grilling, place the ribs over a portion of the grill that is not lit or heated. In a gas grill, achieve this by lighting only a few of the burners – in a charcoal grill, by piling the coals to one side of the grill. Be sure to place a drip tray below the ribs to catch the fat and prevent flare-ups.

RIB DONENESS

• The phrase "falling off the bone" often comes to mind when we think of cooked ribs. However, technically, if the meat is actually falling from the bone the ribs are likely over cooked. A perfectly cooked rack of ribs is very, very tender but should still be clinging to the bone. The best way to test doneness is to insert a toothpick into the thickest part of the meat. If it pokes in and removes with ease, the ribs are done. Be sure to check each rack individually as each one is a little different.

CHIP APPEAL

 If using a gas grill, consider adding wood chips to achieve the natural smoky flavour that's inherent in a charcoal grill. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for using the wood chips, as each gas grill will have different specifications.

SAUCY SMOKY BBQ PORK RIBS:

Serves 6 to 8

4 lbs pork back racks (about 2 racks)

1 tbsp packed brown sugar

2 tsp smoked or regular paprika

1 tsp garlic powder

1 tsp onion powder

1 tsp salt

½ tsp dry mustard

½ tsp pepper

SMOKY BBQ SAUCE:

1 tsp vegetable oil

1 onion, finely diced

3 cloves garlic, minced

1 cup passata (strained bottled tomatoes)

1/4 cup molasses

1/4 cup cider vinegar

2 tbsp packed brown sugar

1 tbsp chili powder

1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce

2 tsp smoked or regular paprika

1/4 tsp salt


- Trim fat from ribs: Remove membrane from underside of ribs, if attached. Mix together brown sugar, paprika, garlic powder, onion powder, salt, mustard powder and pepper. Rub all over ribs. Cover and refrigerate for one hour or for up to 24 hours.
- Smoky BBQ sauce: In saucepan, heat oil over medium heat; cook onion and garlic until softened and lightly golden, about six minutes. Stir in tomato passata, molasses, vinegar, brown sugar, chili powder, Worcestershire sauce, paprika and salt. Simmer, stirring occasionally, until thickened and reduced to about one cup, 20 to 25 minutes.
- Place ribs in shallow roasting pan. Bake, covered with foil, in 350°F oven until very tender, 1½ to 2 hours.
- For a charcoal grill, place ribs on grill directly over the coals. Cover and grill, turning once halfway through grilling and brushing occasionally with sauce, until ribs are browned, about 10 minutes. For gas grill, place ribs on grill over medium-high heat. Cover and grill as directed. Serve with any remaining sauce. OH
