RECENTLY, I WAS ASKED TO PARTICIPATE in an archival film about the history of The Georgian Peaks Club. My father joined The Peaks in the early 60s. We grew up in a tiny igloo-like chalet that he built at the foot of the chairlift.

The club "property" became our neighbourhood. It was part of land originally owned by well-known local orchard/farm families, including the Wards, Reekies, Sheridans and Hartmans. The mountain lands were eventually transformed into seven

private ski clubs dotting the escarpment – Devil's Glen Country Club, Osler Bluff Ski Club, Toronto Ski Club, Craigleith Ski Club, Alpine Ski Club, The Georgian Peaks Club and Beaver Valley Ski Club.

The kids I grew up with, whether striving for gold, the Olympics or just free skiing and enjoying après fun, formed decades long friendships.

My earliest memories include my father lacing up my first pair of

ski boots. I remember full days up and down a wooden T-bar under bluebird skies, teen racing in the Nancy Greene league, years of Ladies Days and end-of-year costume parties!

These days, I am a fair-weather skier enjoying winter hiking and snowshoeing, but the bond that connects so many of us here in Southern Georgian Bay is that original love of skiing.

It's appropriate then that we Celebrate Life At Home this issue (page 146) with Canadian ski champion Todd Brooker.



LOWER LEVELS NOT THE DUNGEONS THEY USED TO BE

Gone are the days of low-ceilinged unfinished basements that smell of mould and mildew; meagre places to do laundry and store sports gear and Christmas decorations.

Now that fixer-uppers in some cities are going for a million dollars or more, spending \$100,000 to \$150,000 doesn't sound unreasonable to reclaim existing space. Basement renos are a lot cheaper than an addition and much easier than an attic.

In posh neighbourhoods with historical designation and height restrictions, contractors are now digging deep to create spaces three or four levels below ground, so that they can house bowling alleys, Olympic-size pools – you name it, just dig it. Called "iceberg" architecture, what you see above ground is just the tip of what lies below.

For regular folks, the new-found square footage becomes a fantasy space. When all the necessary rooms for daily living are accounted for above ground, the basement becomes a space where your imagination can run wild.

That's when I dub basements "The Lower Level Retreat." With a shift in name comes a shift in thinking about the space and its possibilities and functions.

These spaces can house entertainment centres with large 50- to 60-inch televisions, sizes that would normally dominate a regular living area.

For the practically minded, extra storage room is always welcome and if you're going to have a laundry room, then why not add a little panache. The ultimate home office can double as a guest room when grandma and grandpa come to visit.

Other leisure lair spaces include wine cellars, spa retreats that double as doggie grooming centres with heated floors, therapeutic pools for athletic injuries or music studios. The possibilities are endless.

How do you design a livable, lovable space that feels warm and cosy? Let's start with the basics:

Planning

Open plan seems to work best. If you need to enclose spaces for privacy, then make the walls moveable, to enclose or open a space as required.

Building

Ideally, a finished eight-foot ceiling suits everyone best. Remember that recessed pot lights, flooring and under-floor infrastructure all reduce available height.



Make sure to address structural issues and all possible moisture issues. Hire a contractor who knows all about basements.

I prefer to add radiant floor heat. If not the whole floor, then in the washroom or spa area. When your tootsies are warm, then the rest of you will feel warm, cosy and pampered.

Lighting

The trick is to find light fixtures and bulbs that spread light in all directions, filling surfaces with light and minimizing harsh shadows to help decrease the cave-like effect.

Choose a warm colour temperature of 2700 kelvin (K) or 3000K. Bluish light of 4000K is cool and will feel fridge-like and not somewhere you'd like to hang out, especially in the winter.

Use different sources of lighting throughout the space such as lamps and LED strips in built-in shelving.

Décor & Design

Raise sofas and other large pieces of furniture off of the floor. Your eye travels underneath furniture on raised legs, keeping the look light and airy.

Use lighter colours and textures as a focal point for emphasis and drama.

Don't place a television over a fireplace. Together they are visually overwhelming. ture off of iture airy.

Flooring

Make sure to use a modular flooring system. Should water damage occur, pieces can be popped out of place and new product installed easily. Large rolled goods such as carpet or linoleum should be avoided. When wet, mould and mildew occur.

I've had a lot of success with carpet tile over plywood. Carpet tile acts as an insulator. It's removable, easily cleaned and easily re-installed.

Your options for flooring are: porcelain or marble tile, or vinyl or laminate planks. Engineered hardwood is debatable, but plank flooring is your best bet.

Fixing up the basement will add much happiness to you and your home. What is your Lower Level Fantasy? **oh**

FIRST HOUSE LAST HOUSE

A recent survey by CIBC shows 86 per cent of millennials view home ownership as important even though 42 per cent of them are renting and 21 per cent live with their parents. What about their baby-boomer parents? Will they downsize or stay put? OUR HOMES spoke to two millennials and two boomers about their next move in this hot housing market.

FIRST PURCHASE

First homes for millennials and a house to retire in for boomers may have more in common than we think.

"I imagine myself in a suburb setting, in a single-detached home," says Renée Chaperon, a 32-year-old millennial from Orillia. "I don't want to be downtown. I like to be on the outskirts of a city but still on a serviced lot with easy access to all of the amenities."

Chaperon would like her first home to have an open-concept living space, a large kitchen with a tucked-in eating space and a large entertainment area. "Inside, I like modern, upgraded countertops and cabinetry and a separation of living space versus private space, meaning the bedrooms have to be completely separate from the living space," says Chaperon, whose ideal house size would be 2,000 square feet. Her other must-haves are enough backyard space for barbecues and parking for guests.

Millennial Jordan Milks shares a similar vision. "I like doing dinners, so I'd like a modern large-sized kitchen and living room," says the 22-year-old, who lives in downtown Toronto. "I definitely want to do a kitchen island, something stationary, with modern cabinets, either stainless steel or cherry wood." But Milks doesn't see himself buying his first home in his current neighbourhood. "It would ideally be a detached or semi-detached house, one or two bedrooms, in a place that will begin to gentrify so that property values will go up

in a few years," he adds. The suburbs would also give Milks another must-have: a view overlooking green space.

FINAL LIVING SPACE

Greg Ioannou, a boomer with a love for downtown Toronto, wants many of the above features but right in the heart of the city. "I can't stand gardening, so definitely a condo or co-op," says the 62-year-old. "I want to be near restaurants, theatres, grocery stores and the library, so as central as possible."

Ioannou's must-haves include indoor parking for two cars, a dishwasher, decent laundry, a dining room big enough to entertain a dozen guests, a house wired with high-speed Internet plus a good sound system.

"Good soundproofing is a must, too," he says. "I don't want to have to keep my music quiet or have to listen to the neighbour's hip-hop."

Peace and quiet are also important for 66-year-old Linda White. "I would prefer a two-bedroom bungalow, all one level, without stairs, for easy maintenance inside the house," says the Ramara Township resident. "I still enjoy a yard, so a condo would sort of be my last choice."

Despite being afraid of losing mobility as she and her husband age, White says they like the idea of being in a close-knit community-livingstyle development with other boomers so they don't have to go far to connect and socialize. Alternatively, they'd rather be in the suburbs so they can enjoy a walk outdoors but still be a short drive or bus ride away from downtown.



SIMILAR WANTS

Both generations seem to agree on the necessity of incorporating green practices in their ideal homes.

"I'd like lots of windows and skylights," says millennial Chaperon. "I'd also like a rooftop garden, just to be more self-sustaining and because green roofs help reflect more heat and keep indoors cool and help with water runoff."

Boomer Ioannou would only opt for green practices that serve a practical rather than ideological purpose, including such features as insulation that cut down heating and cooling costs or solar energy for reducing energy costs.

Millennial Milks, who already leans toward using energy-efficient methods, such as using LED bulbs, would like to incorporate some tech-savvy factors in his first home. "I would look into using technology at home to monitor energy usage remotely," he says. Other green methods would have to stand the test of time before he. like boomer White, would consider using them.

She agrees with Milks and says she would only go for installing proven methods of energy saving and cost cutting, otherwise, it's difficult to splurge on trying out items on a fixed income

Both groups are eager about energy-saving methods, green spaces, good-sized kitchens and closeness to city amenities. OH

Hot chocolate warms short days and chilly nights. Our version not only spikes and spices it up, but homemade marshmallows make it an extra-special, personal treat.

SPICED HOT CHOCOLATE Serves 2

INGREDIENTS

1 ounce semisweet chocolate

2 cups milk

2 Tbsp cocoa powder

2 Tbsp sugar

½ tsp vanilla extract

½ tsp cinnamon

pinch of cayenne

pinch of salt

1 ounce orange liqueur, optional

INSTRUCTIONS

- Melt chocolate over low heat in a saucepan.
- Add milk, cocoa, sugar, vanilla, cinnamon, cayenne and salt and heat on medium-high, whisking constantly until the mixture is smooth and combined.
- Remove from heat.
- As an option for adults, add 1 ounce of orange liqueur before serving.
- Pour into two mugs, top with homemade marshmallows (recipe follows) and brown with a kitchen torch until golden!



INSTRUCTIONS

- Line a 9x9 square baking pan with two sheets of parchment paper, allowing the paper to extend over each edge. Brush the parchment paper with light cooking oil, such as canola, and set aside.
- In a small bowl, combine icing sugar and cornstarch. Set aside.
- In the bowl of a stand mixer, combine ½ cup of ice cold water and gelatin. Let this mixture sit to "bloom," or thicken, the gelatin.
 Place the bowl on the stand mixer fitted with a whisk attachment but don't turn it on just yet!
- In a small saucepan, combine ½ cup water, corn syrup, granulated sugar and salt, cover and heat over medium for 3 to 4 minutes.
 Do not stir, the sugar will dissolve completely and come to a boil.
- Once boiling, remove the lid and place a candy thermometer to the side of the saucepan. Continue heating until the mixture reaches 240°F, the soft-ball stage. Turn off heat.
- At your stand mixer with the gelatin mix, turn the mixer on medium speed and slowly pour the syrup mixture down the side of the bowl to incorporate with the gelatin. Once incorporated, turn the mixer on high and beat for 10-15 minutes until the mixture becomes thick and looks a bit like soft-serve ice cream. Add vanilla extract during the last minute of mixing.
- Pour mixture in the prepared pan and flatten with a well-oiled spatula.
- Dust the marshmallows with half of the cornstarch-sugar powder. Fold the sides of the parchment paper over the mixture. Let sit for at least four hours or overnight.
- To cut the marshmallows, turn the pan over onto a board dusted with more sugar-cornstarch powder and cut using a pizza cutter or sharp knife. Dust each marshmallow in more of the sugarcornstarch powder and serve. Store in an airtight container. OH



Balloon Whisk

Dubbed the balloon due to its shape, this is one of the most popular types of whisks. Amazingly, the balloon is made from eight or more flexible wires joined at the ends and attached to a handle. It comes in a number of sizes, from tiny to quite large. Wide uses for this type of whisk make it the most sought after for beating eggs, creating meringues and whipping cream into a thick delight.

TOVOLO: Stainless Steel 11" Whip Whisk



This whisk is similar to the balloon, however its shape is longer and more cylindrical and the series of flexible wires overlap each other to then join together at the handle. Chefs prefer this tool for mixing sauces or for combining ingredients in a deeper pan to access the sides and edges. The flexible wires are preferred when cooking with liquids to create thicker sauces and custards.

Also commonly called a roux whisk, used when cooking flour and fat to thicken sauces. There are fewer loops than you'd expect in a whisk, but they lie flat, rendering the orientation uniquely suited to stirring in shallow pans to create sauces and rid the creation of any unwanted lumps.

Spiral Whisk

This type of coil whisk with a slightly angled head is a bit of a luxury purchase, but was specifically designed to make constant contact in a pan or bowl to ensure even mixing and prevent scorching or lumps. This is the perfect tool for smooth vinaigrettes, or for incorporating liquids into a roux.

Ball Whisk

Fans of the ball whisk claim the lack of the typical whisk loops makes it easier to clean, and allows for quicker and better aeration. The quick aeration makes it a preferred choice for whipping egg whites into the ultimate meringue. Pastry chefs also use this to make elaborate spun-sugar decorations for dessert toppings.

Coil Whisk

This type of whisk is characterized by its one single wire, which spirals into a round shape. Unlike other whisks, which are stirred around the bowl to aerate liquids, this type remains stationary in the bowl, and is pumped up and down. Not to confuse things, but sometimes this is also called a spiral whisk, too. Used to incorporate liquid ingredients, especially in a deep vessel.

Dough Whisk

The strange triple-loop shape and strength of this whisk is best used to lightly blend mixtures like batters, fruit fillings and muffin batters without overworking the mixture or breaking down the fruit. It can also be used to bring together yeasted pizza dough without all of that sticky mess on a spoon or spatula. он

CHALET REINTERPRETED

"But where are you going to put a dining room table?" asked designer Marina Farrow of Farrow Arcaro Design (FAD) during a walk-through of a traditional pine interior, Pan Adobe chalet near Osler Bluff Ski Club.

The home had a great location, but only a modest kitchen and dining space. "That's when I knew we were on the same page," says the homeowner about her home's gorgeous redesign and dining room addition. "Marina and I are both Italian, and it's all about having a space to get together with family and friends." Continued on page 51

The owners, a Toronto couple, had been renting in the Blue Mountain area for seven years and the family was ready for a weekend place of their own. Exhausting their search of suitable resales, the couple went ahead and purchased a vacant lot with intentions to build. But that all changed in summer 2014. "Sometimes the best purchases happen when you're not looking for them," says the homeowner. In Collingwood for her daughter's soccer game, the homeowner received word of a newly listed property in the Collingwoodlands neighbourhood - she checked it out while in town and immediately saw the potential. Contacting her husband, things moved quickly, and 24 hours later the property was theirs.


Switching gears from new build to renovation mode, the couple sat down with Marina and custom builder and renovator **Blake Farrow** of **Blake Farrow Project Management Inc.** "Marina is great at designating spaces according to function, and I appreciated that," says the owner. Blake could craft their designs into fruition.

Blake describes, "Marina adds the layers on top and I create the backdrop to put it on." Marina and her business partner **Katherine Arcaro** work from the **FAD** retail storefront in Collingwood and offer a full range of interior and exterior design services. The homeowners were inspired, and the project team was in place.

Situated on a quiet cul-de-sac, the home exudes a cabin-in-the-woods feel. But inside, guests now experience a reinterpretation of the classic chalet. Gone is the tongue-ingroove ceiling and pine trim, replaced with a new warmth – this time of hemlock – and the sophistication and personal style of this active family of five.

The couple wanted a larger space for entertaining in their weekend retreat. Something not too formal or sterile. "I like a clean feel anchored with accent pieces and signature detailing," says the homeowner.

"There was a lot of wood inside," says Blake. "It was competing for attention the same way it might if someone were wearing a plaid shirt with plaid pants and a plaid jacket. We wanted to balance that and achieve an inviting, modern chalet, allowing the wood to be a highlight."

With December fast approaching, it became clear they couldn't do it all before the holidays, so the renovation was done in two phases. Phase one from September to December focused on the second floor and some main-floor spaces. A transformed master bedroom and en suite offer a private retreat for the homeowners. Minimal space in the three kids' bedrooms didn't rule out comfort, with queen-size beds on wheels tucked into the sloped walls. A full family bath and a family room with a fireplace complete the second floor.

Phase two from January to April was what everyone was waiting for – Blake's bump-out to extend the kitchen and dining area, allowing it to become the real hub of the home. "We saw the kitchen and dining area as one unit, separate yet connected in an open-concept design," says the homeowner. Continued on page 56




"We used a 24-foot beam to support the second floor," says Blake, "and then extended the exposed beams in the kitchen over the dining space, connecting the two with steel joints so that the space appears seamless."

Black shaker-style cabinets, white Caesarstone countertops, island and island lighting were designed by FAD. The homeowner was at first unsure about the blue, hand-painted, concrete-tile backsplash, but trusted Marina and now has no regrets. "The kitchen simplicity was on purpose," adds the homeowner. "I didn't want any obstruction to the backyard view." Clean working areas and a built-in panelled fridge add to the serene space. The host's barstool on the serving side of the island allows the chef to be part of the action.

The owners were determined to bring the outdoors in, accomplished by a wall of accordion glass doors and a pull-down screen across the full width of the dining room addition. A custom chandelier from FAD anchors the family-sized table, bringing proportion to the space. Continued on page 58





Back inside the Pan Abode, wood and steel rule the custom work by Blake. Reclaimed hemlock is a signature throughout the home. In the front foyer, the hemlock wall boldly complements the staircase that was moved during the project and replaced with stunning open treads. The hemlock again appears on barn doors that close off the mudroom. In the living room, a hemlock feature wall plays off the traditional fireplace, while in the kitchen, the reclaimed wood wraps around the island.

Steel is introduced as a dramatic departure from the home's original wood moulding. The doorway between the foyer and mudroom is wrapped in steel, as is the connection to the living room.

"The homeowners trusted us and we were able to take this chalet to the next level," says Blake, of the collaboration with FAD. "Marina and I don't always work together, but when we do, there is no passing the buck – we're each the bottom line. We challenge each other in a significant way." он
















Mirror Magic


Open Eyelines

Niche Appeal

Often, one or more of the walls inside a shower will have a large open cavity, free of pipes space that can be "borrowed" to add a little extra room to the shower via a wall niche. Placing a niche at elbow height will give you a handy place to store essential products and open up the feel of the space just that little bit more, making it a worthwhile upgrade during renovation.

Featured Selections

Although most of the tile in this bathroom is a classic white 12-by-24-inch porcelain plank (which creates a large, almost seamless look), an accent tile was used to make a statement in the shower. This tile was then repeated as the sink backsplash (run wall-to-wall for a sharp look), for a feeling of continuity. Repeating materials at least once is a good way to make any room appear more harmonious.

DESIGN TIP: Bordering an accent tile with an outline of plank tiles (as done in this shower) frames it like artwork and visually connects the materials, rather than taking the accent wall-to-wall. It's a contemporary twist that makes a sophisticated statement.

Bright Answers

Keeping the lighting scheme richly layered is important in any space, even a smaller one like a bathroom. Here, pot lights are used in the shower area (an often overlooked spot for lighting), but the long vanity wall is actually lit with a subtle LED strip tucked into the ceiling. This gives efficient, even lighting in a soft ethereal glow, for a real sense of brightness despite the lack of a window. Thin accent lights flank the medicine cabinet, adding a little task lighting.

Highs & Lows

Not everything has to be a budget buster. Here, a simple and sleek big-box-store vanity serves perfectly, acting as the quiet anchor in a moody grey. Adding an interesting faucet gives it a unique twist, and picks up on the other glass accents in the room. Remember: saving on some pieces and splurging on others always creates more drama than spending moderately across the board.

DESIGN TIP: One of the easiest ways to style your bathroom is to remove clutter, and then store essentials in minimalist containers like glass jars or white boxes. Just be sure to add at least one purely decorative accent like a fresh blossom!

VEGGIE



I'm often amazed at life's tenacity. Dandelion roots can grow more than a metre to find water; without water, many sedum succulent plants can effortlessly survive a month; and the humble daylily can be uprooted from the ground to sit upside down for a whole fall and winter and still poke out some leaves the following spring.

The point is, life wants to keep living. A common example is garlic, onions and potatoes that sprout roots or leaves before you've had time to consume them. Tremendous life force is just waiting to be regrown again and again in your kitchen scraps. Grow edibles in winter? Yes you can.

Much easier than nursing a veggie plant from seed, regrowing most vegetables is an easy task - no green thumb required. Most begin regrowing in just water! And as world food costs steadily increase, you'll have a source of vegetables and herbs in regular supply at essentially no extra cost than the original purchase. Sound good?

There are numerous edibles that can be regrown with various degrees of difficulty, but who wants to wait three years for a pineapple to grow indoors? Here is my list of easypeasy, fail-proof and fast veggies to try your hand at regrowing.



It's a well-known fact that all dishes are greatly enhanced by the addition of fresh herbs. Many herbs such as basil, mint, and cilantro will easily regrow. Simply place fresh-cut herb stems in a glass of water with the bottom third of its leaves removed. New leaves will form and roots will grow. After the roots are about two inches long, they can be relocated to a pot with soil. Rosemary also re-propagates in this manner, except the cuttings need to be taken from the top two or three inches of the plant.

rettuce

Luscious lettuce in winter is, for many, a dream come true. Romaine, leaf-type lettuces and even bok choy will all regrow so long as their stump is intact. Place the stump upright in a bowl, covering the base of the stump with water. When new leaves regrow, the stump can be planted in soil.

Unions

Such a useful flavouring, green onions and leeks are likely the easiest veggies to propagate. Cut the stalks about one to two inches from the root and place the root in water and they will quickly grow. They can then be transferred to a soil-filled pot or planted directly in soil from the start. Red and yellow onions can also be regrown into lovely green onions. Next time you chop onions, save the base with about one to two inches of bulb. Place the base in a bowl of water. Once leaves grow, transfer to soil.

Garlic

If you find your culinary garlic is already sprouting, just place the clove in a bit of water. Shoots will grow and can be harvested and used raw, much like chives, or the cloves can be planted directly in soil

Crunchy celery is a healthy and satisfying winter snack and hinders high-carb, comfort eating. Leave about five inches of celery stalk base. Place in a bowl of water and new leaves will grow from the middle. In about a week it can be moved to a soil-filled planter.

Carrots

Did you know that carrot leaves are edible? They're perhaps a bit bitter in taste but your household culinary genius will likely find a use for them. Cut the carrot top with one-inch base and place in a plate of water and the leaves will sprout from the top. After the leaves are about two inches, plant in soil and harvest as needed.

Whichever veggie you plan to regrow indoors, a few rules of thumb apply. All plants, whether placed in water or soil, need ample sunlight from a sunny window. Always change the liquid from a plant's growing water every two days. For earth-bound plantings, choose the appropriate nutrient-rich potting soil and water accordingly. Never harvest all of the leaves at one time, as the plant needs some foliage to continue the process of photosynthesis.

Perhaps when you picture a bunch of food items growing indoors it doesn't sound very aesthetic, but depending on the arrangement and the vessels chosen, they can be a beautiful statement. Imagine your glassware filled with green stems along your dining table or a collection of beautiful pots bursting with edibles placed by a sunlit window. Beauty is always in the eye of the beholder, so get creative with this cool and edible version of upcycling. OH



CAPAINEL TARTE TATIN

STORY AND PHOTOS PAT CROCKER

Elegant and best of all, easy, this open-faced tatin, or fruit pie, may be made up to four hours ahead of time and kept in the refrigerator (just bring to room temperature before baking).



Puff pastry is a simple dough that when cooked separates into several thin layers of light, flaky and crisp sheets. There are excellent store-bought brands available in the supermarket frozen pastry section. Thaw the dough in the refrigerator overnight and, if not pre-rolled, roll out on a lightly floured board. You only need one square or pre-rolled sheet of puff pastry for this recipe, so remove from the package and thaw, resealing and freezing the remaining square or sheet for later use.

For this dessert, you will need a pan that can be used on top of the stove and in the oven because you make the caramel sauce in the same pan used to bake the tarte. If you have a tarte tatin pan, use it, however a metal pie plate or cast iron skillet works just as well.



Makes 1 tarte, 4 to 6 servings

3/4 cup (175 mL) caster sugar

3 Tbsp (45 mL) unsalted butter

½ package (14 oz/397 g) puff pastry, thawed (see recipe notes)


3 pears, halved and cored

- Preheat oven to 375°F (190°C).
- Heat a tatin dish, pie plate or skillet over medium-low heat for 2 minutes.
 Add sugar and heat without stirring for 2 to 3 minutes or until the sugar begins to liquefy around the outside of the pan or in hot spots. Gently stir for 6 to 8 minutes. Turn off heat and keep stirring until all the sugar has melted. Immediately remove from the burner and beat butter into the caramelized sugar. Set aside to cool, stirring occasionally.
- Roll out one square of puff pastry to about 9-inches (23 cm) square. Arrange pear halves in one layer, cut side down in the tatin dish, nestling them in the caramel. Cover the pears with pastry, tucking in the edges all the way around the pan.
- Bake in preheated oven for 25 to 30 minutes or until pastry has puffed up and is evenly browned. Remove from oven and let the tarte rest for 10 minutes.
- Position a serving plate over the tatin dish and turn plate and dish upside down so that the pears are on top of the pastry on the plate. Serve immediately while warm. OH

While the crew from **Batteaux Creek Kitchens** and Cabinetry are finishing work on a wet bar in the dining room, homeowners Doug and Lesley Paul hang up their coats in the new mudroom that Batteaux Creek carved out for them at the back of their Collingwood home.

After downsizing from a house in the country outside town, the couple knew they needed more storage. Since they primarily use the back entrance to get in and out of the home, the space needed to be welcoming, organized and bright. HOW-TO

PREPARE WORKSPACE Cover your workspace with tinfoil to protect the surface from dripping wax - dipping will get messy!

Use wax paper to cover an area for pine cones to cool between dips.

MELT WAX Add water to the bottom of a double boiler and fill the top pot with wax flakes. Place on stove burner and gently heat until wax is fully melted, stirring occasionally.

Using a knife, shave off small bits from wax dye blocks, add to your hot wax and stir until completely melted and blended.





The colour will look much lighter once cool. Test your colour by dripping wax onto wax paper and allow to cool. It doesn't take much dye to colour the wax, so add small amounts at a time until reaching the desired colour.

Once satisfied with the colour, remove from heat and allow your wax to cool for 15-20 minutes before starting to dip.

While wax is cooling, wrap pine cones with wicking.

WICK PINE CONES Cut wicking into 12-inch lengths. You may want them longer, depending on the size of your





Fold each piece of wicking in half. Tie a small loop at the fold to use both as a wick and to hold the cones while dipping.

Place the loop on the tip of a pine cone and begin wrapping each length in opposite directions around and between the scales. Finish by tucking in the ends (use scissors to push ends in).





DIP PINE CONES Hold each pine cone by the wick loop and dip completely into the wax. If the pine cone is tall, turn on its side and use a wooden spoon to help fully coat the pine cone with wax. Remove the pine cone from the wax and allow excess wax to drip into the pot. Set on wax paper to cool for 10 to 15 minutes between each dip.





Repeat the dipping process three or four times until you're happy with the amount of wax on each pine cone.









After they dry, break off any excess wax from the bottom of your pine cone before dipping again. Recycle these pieces when you reheat your wax, which you will need to do once or twice during the process as the wax cools.

TIP: If the wax looks lumpy on the pine cone, fix it by heating the wax to a higher temperature and re-dipping the pine cone. You may need to give the pine cone an extra dip to rebuild the wax.



Once you're happy with the amount of wax on your pine cones, hold each pine cone upside-down and dip the tops to finish them off.

Allow pine cones to fully cool before transferring to a display container.




FIRE AWAY

When ready to use the fire starters, build a base of paper and dry kindling, then simply light the wick and place the pine cone under the kindling. Using two or three will start a roaring fire. Stay warm!


The home is wired for sound, security and convenience thanks to **Cam Posch** of **Huronia Alarm & Fire Security Inc.** Schneider controls the lights, the window coverings, the music and the security through an app on his smart phone. James, Skye Woolston and their blended family of four teenage children enjoy the open-concept floor plan, which easily accommodates the demands of an active family.

Like the outside, the style inside is contemporary zen. "There are 49 shades of grey in this house," laughs Schneider. 



There's a certain warmth and familiarity in the air at this Minnesota Street home.

Maybe it's the white wood siding that has endured since 1873 when the home's original owner, local lumber manufacturer George Buck, put it up. Maybe it's the original pine floorboards that have supported nearly 150 years of its owners' lives. Or maybe it's those lives themselves that have left the home with such character and charm.

The history – and the incredible large lot with mature trees - was what drew its new owners, Judith and Andrew Turnbull, back to the property after touring the home with a realtor and being unconvinced they could commit to the updates they knew the home needed.

A colourful history of hospitality and entertaining has filled the home for decades. Mary Bellerby, who owned the home in the 1920s, used the front parlour area as a tea room, so the wood-clad, picket-fenced house became known as "The White Gate." In the 1950s and 1960s, Lila Plunkett and her husband, Captain Merton Plunkett, owned the house. Captain Plunkett was the founder of The Dumbells, a Canadian vaudeville troupe circa the First World War, who would entertain soldiers around

the globe with marching songs, comedy routines and performances in drag costume. In the 1970s, Isabel Irwin, who ran the Collingwood heritage society, owned the home. She and her husband Dudley had the house raised onto a proper block foundation. A current neighbour even remembers being hired to chase raccoons and skunks out of the basement at the time.

Collingwood was a natural choice in retirement for new owners Judith and Andrew, who were living in Saskatchewan, but had both been raised in Ontario century homes. Southern Georgian Bay had been a gathering place during holidays and family affairs after

Judith's mother and stepfather retired here. Judith and Andrew are also skiers and hikers, so Collingwood was an ideal choice for four-season activities.

Andrew was retiring as general manager of Saskatoon's Delta
Bessborough, a heritage hotel dating back to the Depression era. His 32 years of work in hotels, including the Royal York in Toronto (where he and Judith met), and the Algonquin Resort in St. Andrew's by-the-Sea, New Brunswick, had given him a comprehensive understanding of how to maintain the historical integrity of a building while updating its facilities for modern life. Their affinity to history and hospitality won them over to the home, along with the confidence the Turnbulls felt by appointing **Chris Skelton** of **Porter Skelton & Associates Ltd.** to manage the renovation. "It had some good bones, it had a phenomenal lot, and some character, but it was ready, not just physically, but mechanically for its next life," Andrew remembers. The Porter Skelton team was instrumental. "Because we were starting the project from 3,000 kilometres away in Saskatoon, we really needed a one-stop shop," says Andrew. He and Judith were familiar with the firm's experience on other heritage restoration projects in the area.

"I think most people are attracted to the downtown heritage area of Collingwood because of an appreciation for the architecture," Skelton notes, "but when it comes to putting modern features in homes, most people are not hidebound to a kitchen that could have been built in 1912. In Judith and Andrew's case, they wanted the modern amenities, but they didn't want it to look as though those amenities were imposed on the interior." Continued on page 134





The kitchen and living area were opened up, and what used to be a mudroom became a large pantry that houses the fridge and stove, and other appliances like the Turnbulls' coffee bar. This makes the kitchen and living space incredibly welcoming for family and guests. From their days in St. Andrews by-the-Sea, Judith says, "We have that maritime hospitality vibe; everyone's in the kitchen." Twenty-four-inch pine boards that once formed a wall between the kitchen and living spaces were repurposed by **Wally's Woodwork** into a dining table and console table (that doubles as an extension for the dining table).

At the front entrance of the house, "There wasn't that sense of grandeur that many of the older homes in town with broader staircases and entryways have," Chris explains, "So the Turnbulls had us expand the width of the entry hall, and also put a new stairway in that looked as though it was original, but was just a little more grand." These changes enhance the sense of flow through the home.

Original flooring was restored by **Chris Bickerton of Northland Custom Flooring Inc.** In the front parlour, custom bookshelves by **Clearview Woodworking** slide apart to reveal a television. Upstairs, four original bedrooms have also had their layouts adjusted. Iudith and Andrew now have a master bedroom with walk-in closet and en suite, and there's a guest bathroom occupying what was an underutilized part of the upstairs hallway.







In 1505, William Warham was enthroned as Archbishop of Canterbury in England and one of the "banquetting stuffe" served on boards at the great celebratory feast following the grand event was marmalade.

Arriving on ships from southern Europe, marmalade, at that time, was a firm, dry paste made from bitter citrus fruits and peels that had been boiled in water and re-boiled with sugar or honey.

By 1797, James Keiller and Son in Scotland was established as manufacturer of a fine preserve made with Seville oranges. Keiller's wife Janet sugared, chipped, boiled and potted up Seville oranges salvaged from the cargo of a storm-driven ship that ended up in the Scottish harbour of Dundee, giving the marmalade its "Dundee" moniker.

Now, over two centuries later, we've put a new twist on the famous Scottish breakfast spread. Enjoy the sweet-tartness of marmalade in a holiday cake made from another exotic ingredient: almonds. With minimal ingredients, this cake is gluten free and, for a cake that relies on nuts for its structure, it is surprisingly light due to the egg-white meringue. Orange sauce is drizzled over the warm cake or it can be passed separately at the table.

INGREDIENTS

1 cup granulated sugar

2 Tbsp chopped fresh rosemary, optional 4 eggs, separated

1-1/4 cups blanched almonds

Grated rind of 3 oranges (about 3 Tbsp) Juice of 3 oranges (about 1-1/4 cups juice)

1/4 cup Dundee marmalade

1/4 cup icing sugar

INSTRUCTIONS

- Preheat oven to 350°F.
- Line the bottom of a 9-inch circular springform pan with parchment paper. Lightly grease the bottom and sides of the pan with butter or coconut oil.
- Using a food processor, process the sugar with the rosemary until the rosemary is fine. Transfer herbed sugar to a bowl and wipe out processor.
- In a separate bowl, whisk the egg yolks with ½ cup of the herbed sugar until well blended.
- Using the food processor, add almonds and process until coarse. At this stage, the almonds should not be ground or finely chopped. Stop the processor. With the yolk mixture in hand, restart the processor and add the yolk mixture through the opening in the lid, processing until the mixture is thick and smooth. Scrape the mixture into a large bowl and stir in orange rind. If the mixture is too thick or dry, stir in 1 or 2 tablespoons orange juice until it is the consistency of thick cake batter.
- In a separate bowl, beat egg whites until soft peaks form. Sprinkle 1 Tbsp of the herbed sugar over and beat until the peaks hold their shape in a stiff meringue. Fold half of the meringue into the almond mixture until just evenly mixed. Quickly fold the remaining meringue into the mixture, being careful not to overmix in order to keep the air in the whites.
- Gently spoon the batter into the prepared pan. Bake in preheated oven for 35 minutes, or until set in the centre and a golden colour.
- Set aside to cool on a cooling rack until the sides have shrunk away from the pan. Remove springform and transfer cake to a serving plate.
- Make orange sauce. In a saucepan, combine orange juice, marmalade and remaining herbed sugar. Bring to a boil over medium-high heat. Lower the heat and lightly boil for 10 minutes or until thickened slightly.
- Drizzle orange sauce over the top of the cake and let sit for 20 minutes before serving. Or make a puddle of orange sauce on each serving plate and arrange a slice of cake on top. Dust with icing sugar. он




OH Tell us about the renovation:
