# SUMMER TRENDS

AND QUIRKY COLOUR COMBOS







# ting treasures The Ruby-throated hummingbird

STORY MELANIE REKOLA

I am an avid and all-inclusive bird-lover, and as promised in a previous fowl-related story, it's now time I tell the tale of the glorious pint-sized jewels of the summer sky – the hummingbird. Why not join in all the fun and ready your garden for the hummingbirds this year?



These beloved little creatures are an amazing feat of nature. The tiny seven-tonine centimeter birds have a heart rate that reaches 1,260 beats per minute and can hover in midair as their wings furiously beat 50 times per second! To keep up with this pace, they need to consume their weight in nectar each day and are continually just hours away from starvation at any given time. Although hummingbirds are well known to feed on nectar, they also eat many small insects. This fact makes garden chemical and pesticide use strictly prohibited for a safe hummingbird environment as these can kill both adults and young alike.

Putting up a feeder is a surefire way to entice hummingbirds to your garden, and the best feeders are made from glass or acrylic. It is essential to clean your feeders twice per week to avoid nectar spoilage and accidental fowl fatality. Place the feeder away from windows, ideally near tall plant cover such as a tree or hedge. Home-made food mix is a one-quarter sugar-to-water ratio, and it's best to avoid colouring the fluid for the bird's optimal health. Hummingbirds also love spraying water. Unlike most backyard bird bathers, these birds enjoy flying in and out of a spray of water.

It is in the hummer's nature to forage

constantly, and they only use a feeder for about 20 per cent of their daily nectar consumption. By providing spraying water, trees, a feeder plus their favoured flower-nectar sources in a succession of bloom you will deliver a utopia they may even nest in! But don't be surprised if you don't spot the nesting site. The tiny little cup-shaped nests made with spider silk, thistledown and animal hair often include lichens, which almost completely disguise them. If you happen to see a minute emerald/ red bird flying fast in a U-shaped flight pattern, you are witnessing a male's mating dance. After copulation, the petite pair does not raise their young as a couple. The male

leaves the female to raise their young unaided. Contrary to popular belief, Hummingbirds

do not feed only on red flowers or feeders. They will feed from any that is rich in nectar, but do have a preference for vivid colours.

Ruby-throated Hummingbirds migrate north much earlier and stay far later than one might assume. Ensure your feeders are full and available mid-April until late fall. It is the strongest males that return first to establish the premium territories, which usually include the all-important feeder. They are also the first to leave, often early August, followed by the females. The new fledglings are last to leave and left behind to accumulate fat stores for

their solitary migration south. Hummingbirds will not stay past their usual fall migration time when feeders are left out.

Our miniature feathered friends feed most actively in the morning and evening, making these the optimal times for viewing. At my home, the acrobatic performances of our resident hummingbirds are the afterdinner entertainment as we sit in the garden surrounded by a multitude of miniature speed-demons whizzing by our heads! The impatient and frustrated little birds are extremely territorial, and I've witnessed many a squabble between rival males. They'll even try to chase away other bird species,

bees and butterflies to defend their terrain. If you ever observe several birds at the feeder together without aggression, they are likely related family. Unfortunately, their small stature leaves them prey to a host of common backyard life such as the (gulp) praying mantis and blue jay.



Many of us will be entertaining outdoors. Here are some tips to help make your summer entertaining both environmentally responsible and stylish:


#### **THE TABLE**

Avoid using plastic disposable cutlery and plates. Try using your indoor cutlery, or glam it up with your inherited sterling silver and best dishes. If you don't have enough of one set, mix and match for an eclectic look. If you need to buy more dishes, grab some at your favourite charity shop – the ultimate in recycling.

Another alternative is bamboo. The ecofriendly dishes are inexpensive, reusable and outdoor friendly, and they are from renewable resources, or you can rent cutlery and plates.

If hiring a caterer, using your own dishes and serving platters cuts out another level of disposables and reduces cost.

Use tablecloths. If you don't own any, buy vintage at a consignment shop, thrift store or flea market. 
As you begin to plan your menu, look for ingredients that are currently in season. This means you won't need to purchase imported goods that travel thousands of miles to get to your table.

#### THE CLEAN UP

You've just enjoyed grilled chicken and steak As delicious as they were, now you're left with loads of dishes and a sticky barbecue. Residue can affect the cooking process of your next grilled meal by sticking to your food and changing the flavour. It can affect cooking time too, but cleaning the grill thoroughly is the way to deal with it. If you clean it right away, then it's easier. Believe it or not, there is a way to get it clean without noxious sprays. Taking care of your grill means it will last for many barbecues, and it will be a healthier grill to cook on.

- Cover it all up! Close the lid of your barbecue, which will allow the temperature to rise to the maximum, and avoid a loss of heat, a crucial part of the cleaning process.
- Make it hot, hot! Turn both propane burners to high. Wait until the maximum temperature has reached the top of the thermometer. If you don't have one, simply wait five minutes for the barbecue to heat up. The high heat will turn the residue into ash. Shut everything off and proceed to clean the grill.
- Brush it all off! Use a good wire brush to clear off the ashes of what was the remains of your dinner. A quality wire brush can handle the heat and will not melt or catch fire.
- Alternatively, clean your grill with a barbecue brush and a thick paste of baking soda and water. Or, cut an onion in half and rub it over the rack once it has heated up; then brush a bit of olive oil on over the grill, so the food doesn't stick



#### "Drink eight glasses of water per day!"

A practice that is preached so often, by so many, it's generally accepted that eight glasses of pure H<sub>2</sub>O each day is the ultimate hydration goal. We know this, it's been drilled into our brains, but how many of us are actually drinking enough water?

Not many of us, according to the Angus Reid Forum, which polled 1,234 Canadian adults in nine provinces about their family's hydration habits. Forty-five per cent of Canadians drink four or more non-water beverages each day, while 55 per cent of the respondents said their children drink only one to three glasses of water a day, and 22 per cent said their child drinks fruit iuice the most often.

These numbers are worrisome as proper hydration is key to our overall health. Every organ, tissue and cell in our body is dependent on water, which makes sense since more than half of our bodies are made of it! Dehydration contributes to countless illnesses, as well as obesity and unhealthy food choices.

Now that the hot summer weather has arrived, it's even more important for us to guzzle our share of the good stuff. Sounds simple, but water can get pretty boring, especially with all the sweet, sparkling options available, and many of us know the challenge of convincing a toddler to make the clear, tasteless choice.

But that's just it... water doesn't have to be the clear, tasteless choice to reap the benefits! Try one of these many ideas to uplift your water and your health this summer...

To Make Flavoured Water: Layer fruit and herbs with ice in a water pitcher, then add cold water.

5-10 fresh strawberries, sliced

½ lemon, sliced

Herbs like basil, mint and lemon balm will help balance the sweetness of fruit and give your water an extra nutritional kick.


Having a fresh jug visible every time you open the fridge will encourage you to drink more water, even if it's tap water.










Middle child Harrison is now 8, their eldest, Charles, II and the youngest is 6-year-old Julia. The children thrive in their summers and winter weekends at the cottage, even more so now that it has doubled in size and they have a whole upper storey for themselves added by Paragon Carpentry in 2014.

Val and husband Rob had been coming to Georgian Bay to visit Rob's parents at Monterra for many years. As their family began to grow, Val and Rob decided to find a cottage where their kids could play in the sand. The family lives in Georgetown but the couple have already planned for their later years in part because of Rob's focus on his pensions and benefits firm


in Windsor; Val nursed in Detroit at one time. "We were very comfortable investing in a second home up here because we could see how much Rob's parents were enjoying retirement in the Blue Mountain area and we could see ourselves doing the same," says Val.

The original cottage was built in 1984 and had a solid foundation with three small bedrooms on one level. Val and Rob bought the property in 2007 and once their three children had all started school, the couple started talking about adding a second storey.

"We were looking for workmanship," says Val. "I found an ad for Paragon Carpentry in OUR HOMES magazine, and I really liked the homey, cottagey style in it, so I contacted **Robin Smith**." After she and Rob met Smith in spring 2013, they found out that he was on the job site the majority of the time; that was key for the couple doing the renovation from a distance as they weren't able to oversee work at the site themselves.

Smith invited the couple to check out examples of his work. Says Val, "he would call a client and say, 'Would you mind if I brought someone to see your flooring?' and I could tell by the rapport he had with previous builds that he was good – everyone was happy to talk to us or allow us into their homes to see what Robin had built for them." 




The family explained what they were trying to accomplish with the addition, and Smith suggested they would enjoy working with **Pam Farrow** for the architectural drawings. "Pam understood me right away," says Val. "The two of them were a really good combination - both good at listening to us to find out what we were after." They settled on a Dutch colonial style with a gambrel roof to maximize headroom on the upper level.

Inside leaned more toward French country. Val appreciated Farrow's 3D renderings to help visualize the layout. Farrow suggested they look ahead 10 years when the kids would want their own lounge area, and laying out the upstairs washroom with separate shower and toilet areas, both features of which were incorporated into the upper-storey addition. A beautiful staircase with a bay window was added off the now open kitchen. A large mainfloor master bedroom (draperies by Ashton's **Blinds Draperies Shutters**), guest room and a bunk room remained on the main floor. The former enclosed sunroom has become a bright mudroom for laundry and sandy feet to enter the cottage. A window in the kitchen acts as a pass-through to the mudroom to draw light into the interior. 






Val and Rob spotted a Quebec farmhouse kitchen they loved in a magazine. It had wire-fronted red cabinets bookended by fourfoot-wide stone pillars inset with ovens on one end and cupboards on the other (masonry by John Davies of The Stone and Plaster **Company**). They worked with cabinetmakers Robert and Orleen Anderson to replicate the style and add an enormous stainless-steel island. The Andersons created built-ins as well for the mudroom and main-floor bath.


Smith's 38 years as a carpenter brought exceptional detail to the exterior and interior finishes. He chooses one or two builds each year where he can challenge himself. His styling is remarkable throughout the Tamblyn's cottage. The main-floor ceiling is coffered into a grid of recessed square panels. "I love working with wood to bring different effects," says Smith. He worked in clear pine on the window interiors and staircase, and poplar for the painted casings. The floors are antique elm. One of Rob's only requests was for a large wood-burning fireplace. Smith delivered with a tall Rumford design, constructed by Davies. The exterior chimney is finished in large river rocks. "We planned on site the angles where the chimney tapers to align with the window corners," says Smith. They also poured in place the unique fluted chimney cap, Smith preparing the forms himself on the rooftop.


The busy family is looking forward to seasons in the sun and snow. The kids are learning to paddle board and wakeboard, and they ski both cross-country and downhill. "We all look forward to coming up here. We're the same family but we're a little more relaxed, a little more fun," says Val. "We hope it's a place that we will pass down to our kids and their kids, durable enough to stand for generations." OH
















When Marlene Peters and Brian Wilson bought the Bruce Street home in 2012, an extensive renovation had already brought the home up to impeccable condition. "The master bedroom is in the incredible round tower – it's like a childhood dream of living in a castle – I couldn't resist," says Marlene as her eyes twinkle while she looks around the room. "It's been an immense pleasure to live in a home with so much history."

The couple have added their own layer of history to the property by purchasing the adjoining lot. They put in a beautiful pool (maintained by **Thornbury Clear Choice Pools & Spas**) and Brian built a spacious pool house to offer privacy from the street. They joined forces with daughter and interior design consultant **Lindsay Herbert**, whose store front **Baywood Designs** is two blocks down Bruce Street. Lindsay's decorating taste and her mother's imaginative flair have made for a stunning collaboration. So stunning, in

fact, that an offer came in this spring to buy the property that the couple couldn't refuse; this will be their final summer to enjoy the space.

The original turreted red brick was designed and built in 1917 by Harold and Eva Pedwell. Harold was one of three sons of local lumber baron and Thornbury mayor Henry Pedwell, who had built the home across the street, now incorporated into Errinrung Residence Retirement Living and Long Term Care, where you can still see its Victorian tower. Each Pedwell son built a house on Bruce and Alice Streets sporting Victorian towers, and father Henry built a second house next door. The group of five homes is known as the Pedwell Block.

Dr. Emerson Titcombe purchased the house in 1946 and ran his practice out of the lower level until the 1980s. Many Thornbury residents remember descending the stairs to see the doctor for a cough, spots, stitches or a needle. Continued on page 82



Between Dr. Titcombe and the present owners, the house was completely renovated. The renovation preserved details of the original features, including the treads of the staircase, which are cleverly integrated with new flooring in both stain and texture. The front door, with its full glass, dates back to the builder of 1917 and the stacked-stone wall that surrounds much of the property hails from that time, also.

The renovation added many features, all with impeccable attention to detail. The coach house was dismantled and each brick carefully cleaned to be used for a garage and upper-level addition that almost doubled the square footage of the house. The exposed brick of the original exterior wall marks the division between the old and the new. Each bedroom, of which there are now five, has its own beautifully-appointed en suite and the lines of the ceilings are angled to parallel the rooflines. The master bedroom above the rounded sitting room has a huge walk-in closet and a magnificent bathroom. During the renovation, the basement was dug out to a depth of nine feet. Every room, including those in the basement and the attached workshop, has in-floor heating. Continued on page 84

An interest in lighting is apparent in this renovation. The hanging fixtures and sconces include a Schonbek, bearing a certificate of authenticity, many Swarovskis featuring sparkling crystals and, in one bedroom, even Swarovski crystal drawer pulls. Two brass fixtures from a Cuban cathedral in Havana hang in the living room, where the ceiling was deepened just around the two lights to add enough height for people to pass under them. Although all the fixtures are unique, they add to the rooms rather than overpower them.

"We are so impressed with the quality of the renovation and the detail in every room," says Marlene. Lindsay updated wall colours,

using Gray Owl in all the halls and Sea Haze in the living room, sourced at **Birch and Benjamin Paint Inc. Jim Keast Painting** worked with Brian to do the painting. Marlene found a slipcover sofa at **Terase Art and Home** and a checkered chair at **At Home** Interiors. Baywood Designs provided a Jaipur rug for the living room, slipcovers for the dining room chairs and cushions and finishing touches throughout the house.

Brian is a furniture designer, cabinetmaker and carpenter and his attractive pieces are seen throughout the house. Fine examples such as the dining room sideboard and serving piece and the master

bedroom desk show his wonderful detail.

The kitchen was redone by Appleton Kitchens during the earlier renovation. 














## METAL **MADNESS**

### ADDING GOLD TONES TO YOUR KITCHEN

STORY YANIC SIMARD

With summer in the air, you're probably going to want to soak up all the sunshine you can. But don't totally leave your interior in the dark! This is the year to go for gold in your kitchen, and bring a sense of timeless radiance to the room that you can bask in all year round – UV free. Take some inspiration from my own kitchen redesign, and mix a new metal into your space for first-place results. Here's how:

Bold and Brassy While warm metals, in general, are seeing a huge resurgence, one humble material in particular is worthy of its newfound time in the spotlight: brass. To add a sunny metallic tone that doesn't feel too opulent, brass is the perfect understated option.

In my own home kitchen, I first opted to add brilliant brass handles to my cabinetry. Switching out cabinet hardware is an easy way to update a look, and moving from silvery steel to a warm metal creates a noticeable change instantly. Plus, research has found that copper (a fundamental element of brass) has antimicrobial qualities, for a healthier kitchen along with a beautiful design.



Mix and Don't Match One reason people may be scared to go golden in the kitchen is the cost of a total overhaul. Fear not: even warm metallics (especially balanced brass) are still very neutral, so there's no pressure to go all-in, even with stainless-steel appliances on display. The hot and cool essences will complement and energize each other, so feel free to mix in a lot or just a little.

A few simple accessories can bring a strong feeling of gold to a space even without a hardware change. Look for textural golden accents like the Talis Hammered platter in my Yanic Simard Selected collection, and repeat the material in another zone (in a picture frame, candleholder or cocktail shaker) to make it feel integrated throughout the room.



 A Big Splash The future looks bright. A golden faucet makes a big statement, but with long-term potential. Brass has spent a few decades with a bad reputation, but this warm metal has enjoyed centuries of appreciation, so you don't have to worry about an investment in gold growing old any time soon.

Here in my kitchen, I upgraded to an Aquabrass Quinoa faucet with a sleek joystick control. While clean-lined faucets are still not widely available in golden finishes, many companies like Aguabrass do offer special finish options as a custom order. Alternately, try mixing the ornate details of a traditional faucet with contemporary cabinets and a sleek stone counter to create an elegant transitional style.

Golden Glow Lights are a natural place to go gold, as it suits and enhances the radiance they provide, plus it always helps to add a new layer of lighting in any space, especially in a kitchen where balanced lighting is key to ease of work

Look for brass-accented sconces to bring a touch of gold to the walls, and pendant lights to bring some further golden sparkle to your eyeline. Keep it current and understated by choosing styles with metallic bases and glass shades (like the Lander Sconce from Crate and Barrel), for a light and airy jewelry-like effect. Tying the Knot Wrapping up a shiny new golden look takes just a few finishing touches. Yellow accents will pick up the natural sunny undertones, so add a handful of blossoms, or display a lemon-hued cookbook (or some actual lemons).

Accents of blue will make gold pop, so toss in a few pieces of blue-hued dishware, or choose a navy cabinet treatment (like my Benjamin Moore's 2062-20 Gentleman's Grey finish). I contrasted my cabinet handles with cut crystal knobs (which you can also match from my Yanic Simard Selected collection at YSSelected.com), for the perfect mix! on



Here are some **DO's** and **DON'T's**:

**DON'T** wait six months to a year before applying any sort of treatment on a new wood deck. The elements begin to attack wood immediately, destroying its lignin (lignin is the organic substance binding the cells).

**DO** the splash test. Splash some water onto a few boards. If it is absorbed, that

means the wood is not protected and it's time to clean and seal. Three big **DO's** are cleaning; stripping old finishes; then staining the deck. There are excellent products in the market for cleaning your deck; stripping your deck; and finally staining and protecting your deck. If the manufacturer's recommended application is followed, your deck will look spectacular.




A visionary couple with a penchant for collecting have created their own version of maximalism in Collingwood – a space that is warm, colourful and packed with carefully curated delights. It's not quite the opposite of minimalist; everything in it has a purpose and place. As the homeowner describes: "It's funky."

Penny and Ray Jones's early years in England played a role in defining who they are today. Moving as a young couple to Canada – Ray in 1971 for a job, Penny a few months later with two young daughters in tow – the pair started life in Collingwood managing a youth hostel at Blue Mountain. "We've always been resourceful," reflects Penny. "We had nothing when starting out in England. I worked with what I had and learned to make do. I guess that just stuck."

Penny's passion for collectables led her to open **Clarksburg Antiques** with friend and business partner **Dorothée Potter**. A retirement project for the friends, the shop is open on weekends or by appointment and the selections are fascinating. Ray, after a lengthy career in the tiling industry, now designs and builds furniture in a workshop that hugs the backyard patio and pool area of their home.


When Penny and Ray were ready to downsize from their family home in 2006, Penny knew exactly what she was looking for: a smallish house with character, a private backyard, an outdoor living space and a garden. Anxious to recreate the functionality and privacy they were used to, they found a charming location in one of Collingwood's oldest neighbourhoods. The property offers the perfect hub for family visits and holidays, especially with five grandchildren living nearby.

From the street, many remark on the English cottage feel. Says Penny, "The house was built in the 1940s and people in town still remember the owner lugging buckets of stones from Georgian Bay to create the decorative exterior detailing. It became known as the Pebblestone House." A country garden to the right of the entrance adds to the character. A hard winter took its toll on a number of Penny's prized shrubs and roses, and one of her summer projects will be to source and replace at least one of her white standard rose trees.

The original house was 650 square feet; it is now 1,650. The couple worked with Garth **Wilson Design** in Stayner to design the rear addition. "We lived in the space before renovating so we knew what needed to be done," notes Penny. Drywalling by Marcel Rutte Drywall Inc. and electrical work by Wayne Eccles of Tri-Bro Electrical Ltd. completed the project. Continued on page 103

Inside, the open-concept living/dining space is rustic, warm and easy going. A custom dining table and other furniture crafted by Ray himself and tall rustic cabinets from Leuk Bij Hermas Interiors in Collingwood fill the space. A corner cabinet houses a collection of Staffordshire dog figurines, a nod to the couple's British roots.


The kitchen is compact. "I'm used to a space this size and it works," says Penny. Ray built the kitchen cupboards and added the finishing details. Tiling throughout the house

(heated travertine marble floor tiles, kitchen and bathroom backsplash areas) was done by Ray and the couple's daughter, **Tiffany Jones** of Sister's Enterprise.

Today the home is a showcase for the couple's treasured art collection, including works by several local artists and some international pieces. Always interested in art, Penny joins a class for figural painting and oils whenever she can. "Art is an expression of yourself, no one else," she smiles.

Salon-style artwork brings the walls alive.

Penny follows the work of local artists who capture the spirit of Southern Georgian Bay and keeps on top of upcoming exhibitions and shows. With an early connection to the late local artist Robert G. Kemp, known for his love affair with the people and landscapes of this area, she is delighted to have two pieces of Kemp's work, now in short supply. The couple have since expanded their collection with other local artists, including Alice Cowan, Andrew Peycha, Jonathon Houghton, Angela Plesa and Jason MacLaren. Continued on page 104



The couple's love of nature and the outdoors is evident everywhere. Through the kitchen down into the rear addition reveals a library and media space with walk-out to the patio and pool area. Broad sliding doors extend the space indoors and out. Windows and doors were supplied by **Cedarport Window and Door Centre Inc.** Evenings are often spent in this room, ideal for reading, TV watching or

cuddling with the couple's three cats.

Stepping outside, visitors enter an intimate and relaxing sanctuary. Penny and Ray carefully planned this unique space, considering pool and furniture placement, focal points and traffic flow, sourcing the rockery and trees with help from **Natural Blends** landscaping. The saltwater lap pool installed by **Clark's Pools and Spas** when

the grandchildren were small now includes geyser fountains, adding to the tranquility.

Wooden decks service the patio area – one off the master bedroom and one by the pool. The patio consists of wood and stone, with poured cement surrounding the pool. A metal gazebo with a retractable canvas roof gives much needed shade for outdoor lounging, offering the perfect hub for family gatherings.

Bordering landscaping includes euonymus plants and espaliered euonymus, trained to form a dramatic cross-hatched living wall against the flat cedar fence at the far end of the pool. An ornamental Japanese red maple adds a shock of colour and decorative grasses create movement while a collection of gazing balls are peppered through the foliage to add shine and interest.





### how to GRILL the PERFECT STEAK

Almost anyone can toss a burger on the barbecue and be happy with how it's cooked. A steak? Not so simple. But with a little prep and some know-how, it can be just as easy to cook a succulent, juicy steak on the grill as anything else.

Ja<mark>m</mark>ie Hussey, <mark>Execu</mark>tive Chef at Glen Abbey Golf Club in Oakville, Ontario, recommends strip loin or sirloin steaks for the grill. "They have a better flavour, and they are robust," he says.

Ted Reader, the author of Gastro Grilling, agrees but adds that he loves rib steak too. "I like my steaks to be cut about one-anda-half to two-inches thick and weigh about 12 to 16 ounces each, depending on the cut. A thicker steak will cook more evenly and give you a little wiggle room in case you get distracted," he says.

### Prepare your steaks

According to Reader, good quality steaks do not need to be marinated or tenderized only if you want to add a certain flavour.

On the other hand, if you're using a tougher cut, marinate it for at least a day before grilling. Hussey recommends a base of red wine, garlic and herbs - and always a ratio of two-to-one for oil and vinegar.

Salt your steaks just before grilling. This will give them a nice crust. This is the time to season with herbs and garlic if you like, too. Chef Hussey says chimichurri is his favourite steak finisher of all time.

Bring your steaks to room temperature before placing them on your barbecue.

### Hit the griff

Cook your steaks for a short time at a high temperature. "Six hundred degrees Fahrenheit or higher if you can," says

Reader. Leave your barbecue lid open and resist the temptation to poke your steaks.

Never overfill your grill. Leave at least an inch-and-a-half clearance around each piece of meat.

Cook your steaks to your preferred doneness (see our chart), and then let them rest for 10 minutes before serving, says Chef Hussey. This prevents bleeding onto your plate.

Never cut your meat to check whether it's cooked to your liking. "Cutting the steak lets all the natural juices escape, leaving you with a dry and tasteless piece of meat,' says Reader.

### Don't flip out

Only turn and flip your steaks as necessary. Reader suggests this flip-and-rotate approach:

- Place steaks on a hot grill on a 45-degree angle at 11 o'clock.
- Grill for two-to-five minutes to sear, depending on the thickness and doneness you want.
- Turn 45 degrees to 2 o'clock, cook for another two-to-five minutes.
- Flip steaks and baste the grilled surface with your favourite baste. Continue to grill for two-to-five minutes on a 45-degree angle.
- Turn 45 degrees and cook for another two-to-five minutes.
- Flip and baste again.

"Now you have that fancy steakhouse diamond pattern!"

Two final pieces of advice from Chef Hussey: "It's always better to undercook a steak than to overcook a steak. And have fun! Buy the best local products you can, have a couple of beers and enjoy it!"

### Pick the perfect steak

Ted Reader's four rules for picking the best beef:

1. Buy the best quality steak you can afford: "Not all good top cuts (rib eye or strip loin) are always tender. There are many grades of meat." Grade A is the worst quality and AAA is the best.

- 2. Dry aging: "The older a steak is, the more tender it will be." Many butchers dry age beef themselves.
- 3. Fat: "To put it simply, fat equals flavour. Internal fat or marbling is what gives a steak its succulence and juiciness." External fat will also add flavour, but can be cut off after cooking.
- 4. Find a good butcher: Nobody else will be able to answer your questions better, nor cater to all your steak needs. Learn what you like and want and ask for it.



A meat thermometer is the best way to test doneness. Here's Ted Reader's guide to the steak rainbow:

Blue Rare: A blue rare steak is quickly charred on the outside and barely cooked on the inside. For best results, bring the steak to room temperature before cooking. (130°F)

Rare: A rare steak has a cool red centre. (130-140°F)

Medium-Rare: A mediumrare steak has a warm red centre. (140-145°F)

Medium: A medium steak has a pink centre, and the juices are clear. (145-150°F)

Medium-Well: A medium-well steak has a hot pink centre, and the juices are clear. (150-160°F)

Well-Done: A well-done steak is grey throughout without any trace of pink and the juices are clear. (160-170°F)

Super Well Done: This steak is weighted with a brick until heavily charred on the outside and without any trace of pink and no juices inside. (170°F plus) он
