Margaret Newell first heard this quote when Nate Berkus gifted Oprah Winfrey with a plaque donning the same words. "That's how I feel about a house too," says Newell. "I need to get my own framed copy. If Oprah can have it on her wall, so can I!"

When Newell and her husband James moved to Kitchener a few years ago, they purchased what had once been an **Adelaide Custom Homes** model in Deer Ridge. Other buyers hadn't seen its potential (some called it too small, but once the basement was finished, others called it too large) but the Newells knew they could transform it into the right home for them and they've been working at doing just that since moving in.

To help pull everything together, Newell enlisted **Carolann Mackie** and her team at **The Frugal Decorator**. "She seemed to connect with what I like," says Newell, "and she works with my taste. She gets me."

They used the kitchen, which was finished by **CW Kitchens Inc.** and already to the Newells' tastes, as a starting point. It features cream-coloured cabinets, dark finishes and a large, bold range hood over the stove.

From there, The Frugal Decorator team tackled the living space, which opens right

off the kitchen. It already had a fireplace, which became the focal point of the room. The addition of great seating, a large ottoman, a television and a desk off to one side makes everything work in the space. The whole room opens up to the backyard through tall sliding glass doors.

Mackie and her team carried the black and camel colours through most of the main floor. "The whole house has continuity," says Mackie. Newell had **Rita's Painting Co.** take care of applying all the right Benjamin Moore colours to each wall.

"It was very clear to me that we needed to go with a very traditional look in here," says Mackie, "but it's a traditional classic with a twist of old Hollywood and surprise vintage." She achieved this by layering patterns and textures. "Tone on tone can get boring quickly without pattern," says Mackie, who also incorporated plenty of warm metals and sparkles. "Marg is a classic type of beauty and her home really reflects that," says Mackie, who says Newell has a "regal spirit." This doesn't mean the décor is uber-feminine, though. The camel and black colour scheme appeals to masculine tastes, as do many of the textures, such as the living room chairs Mackie covered in a dark herringbone pattern. She topped them off with damask cushions.

The all-around favourite space, though, is the master bedroom. It has similar layers of fabrics, patterns and textures all in the same palette. In lieu of a traditional headboard, Newell hung a mirror she'd found a few years ago and had been saving for just the right space. This rich bedroom with a black ceiling is it, although Newell admits she was hesitant to paint the ceiling so dark. "I knew I wanted a dramatic colour so I trusted Carolann and in the end I absolutely love it."

The valances, Newell's charming collection of antique perfume bottles and a beautiful light fixture from **The Lighting Shoppe** are just some of the details that come together to make this bedroom such a masterpiece. The en suite is light and bright and features a built-in mirror with an ornate frame and a glassed-in shower, both installed by **St. Jacobs Glass Systems Inc.** 

"People are afraid to say they're traditional these days," says Mackie. "Everyone wants to be contemporary but everything is coming full circle. I think this style could work for any age group."

There are two other rooms at the front of the house – a parlour and a dining room – which Newell and Mackie haven't yet tackled. "I have big plans for those rooms!" laughs Newell.

There are also two spare bedrooms on the main floor, on the opposite side of the living space from the master. Each has its own unique features, including sentimental elements such as a photo of Newell's mother as a young woman. Continued on page 30



"We have a round table with elegant chairs that is perfect for a small group eating group of neighbours we do wine tastings and progressive dinners with," says Newell. "We always end up down there." And it's easy to see why: with some renovation help from Mike Couto of Couto Interiors, the Newells divided the space into different zones, starting with a sitting area with a sectional couch (from **Cornerstone Home Interiors**) aimed at the television and a charming gas fireplace installed by **Comfort Plus Heating and Air Conditioning Inc.** Beyond that, Newell has set up a
