Interior Designer **Dolores Pian** shares her ideas.





It's been a long time since the first statement lighting fixture in the universe was created with a bang.

Back here on earth and in our homes, we mortals have been trying to replicate the same wow factor ever since.

Entranceways, bedrooms, kitchens and even bathrooms can use lights that make a statement. More often than not, we love to use chandeliers for this purpose. They are grand. They command attention. And, most definitely, they are striking.

Traditionally, chandeliers with tiny lights were gathered up into one large fixture and were central to the décor of a room, in most cases the dining room. Distinguished homes had Schonbek chandeliers with Swarovski crystals. We would also see fanciful, sweeping shapes of colourful glass from Murano and Venice, Italy – much like a grand dame in her wonderful gown attending La Scala Opera.

Over the past 10 years, traditional chandeliers have become objects of desire once again, evoking an era of glamour and style. Sleekly styled teardrops, without the faceted cuts, are the updated version of crystals, creating modern styling in a traditional fixture, such as the Crawford by Hudson Valley Lighting.

Today, lighting statements come in twos, threes or in clusters. Some are floating sculptures. Modern technology allows us to be more creative with different shapes and materials.

Artemide, one of the world's most progressive and grooviest lighting manufacturers, from Italy, regularly creates fantastical pieces that provide a lifetime of beauty and joy. One of their latest pieces, Chlorophilia, designed by Ross Lovegrove, cleverly up-lights a series of petals that act as prisms, producing light and shadows with the help of LEDs, creating a delicate, space-expanding effect.

Sometimes a statement chandelier is not a chandelier at all, but a large lamp that arcs overhead, such as the Arco, by Italian manufacturer Flos. It is considered an ageless classic suitable for any décor or function.

#### **Light It Up**

- Think of your chandelier as a stunning investment in visuallybeautiful eye candy that will make an impression both by night and by day.
- In open-plan spaces, while your chandelier is the focus, it's good to mix sizes and type of fixtures that are flexible to your needs. The other fixtures don't have to match, but they do need to coordinate.



- Structurally, make sure your ceiling can support the weight of your light fixture. Not usually a problem but best to consult with your contractor. Better safe than sorry.
- There are so many wonderful options out there: traditional, vintage, transitional, modern, ultra modern, suspended, ceiling-hugger, colourful, clear, metal, glass, wood. No matter your tastes there's something to suit your personality and style.

#### Turn it On

- Buy quality bulbs with a colour temperature of 2700 K to 3000 K. The lower the number the warmer and cosier the atmosphere. Different lighting and colour temperatures will bring out different shades in your wall colours, fabrics and carpets.
- Dimmers set the mood and provide as much light as required when needed. Dimmers can also be calibrated to preset light settings to provide the atmosphere and the timing of your choice.
- Incandescent filament bulbs are still the best for that warm fiery glow. They are the softest and most flattering bulbs available.
- Halogens are crisp and warm and make objects look sensuous and rounder.
- Fluorescents make objects and colours look flat, despite the colour temperature.
- LED lights are efficient and can be warm providing that you choose a warm colour temperature. Beware of pointy hot spots make sure that you have a diffuser to soften the light source.
- If you're feeling nostalgic and you want to see a clear bulb, Bulbrite produces bulbs that replicate the exposed filaments of clear bulbs through LED technology.

Although lighting's primary function is to see and be seen, it's important to think of your empty ceilings and walls like a canvas to create your personal statement. Now all you have to ask yourself is: How will I light up my universe and make my statement? **OH**

A whisk is a staple tool for any chef or baker, but which whisk is the right one for the task at hand?

The variations, shapes and uses are many. Our guide will fix the mix-ups so your sauce is thicker, your cream is creamier and your egg whites reach the thickest peaks.

The most popular material for a whisk is wire. however, there are wooden whisks and silicone-coated variations in different shapes and forms, each serving a specific function. Silicone-coated whisks are made of wire coated with heatproof silicone, perfect for non-stick pans.

### Balloon Whisk -

Dubbed the balloon due to its shape, this is one of the most popular types of whisks. Amazingly, the balloon is made from eight or more flexible wires joined at the ends and attached to a handle. It comes in a number of sizes, from tiny to quite large. Wide uses for this type of whisk make it the most sought after for beating eggs, creating meringues and whipping cream into a thick delight.

### French Whisk -

This whisk is similar to the balloon, however its shape is longer and more cylindrical and the series of flexible wires overlap each other to then join together at the handle. Chefs prefer this tool for mixing sauces or for combining ingredients in a deeper pan to access the sides and edges. The flexible wires are preferred when cooking with liquids to create thicker sauces and custards.

This type of coil whisk with a slightly angled head is a bit of a luxury purchase, but was specifically designed to make constant contact in a pan or bowl to ensure even mixing and prevent scorching or lumps. This is the perfect tool for smooth vinaigrettes, or for incorporating liquids into a roux.

SHOWN HERE **RÖSLE:** Spiral Whisk



This type of whisk is characterized by its one single wire, which spirals into a round shape. Unlike other whisks, which are stirred around the bowl to aerate liquids, this type remains stationary in the bowl, and is pumped up and down. Not to confuse things, but sometimes this is also called a spiral whisk, too. Used to incorporate liquid ingredients, especially in a deep vessel.

# FlatWhisk

Also commonly called a roux whisk, used when cooking flour and fat to thicken sauces. There are fewer loops than you'd expect in a whisk, but they lie flat, rendering the orientation uniquely suited to stirring in shallow pans to create sauces and rid the creation of any unwanted lumps.

### Ball Whisk

Fans of the ball whisk claim the lack of the typical whisk loops makes it easier to clean, and allows for quicker and better aeration. The quick aeration makes it a preferred choice for whipping egg whites into the ultimate meringue. Pastry chefs also use this to make elaborate spun-sugar decorations for dessert toppings.

WMF: Flexi Whisk Profi Plus 27 cm

The strange triple-loop shape and strength of this whisk is best used to lightly blend mixtures like batters, fruit fillings and muffin batters without overworking the mixture or breaking down the fruit. It can also be used to bring together yeasted pizza dough without all of that sticky mess on a spoon or spatula. он

#### Mirror Magic

As you enter this room, you pass a custom mirrored sliding door (located next to the tub/shower), hiding a stacked washer and dryer combo. This puts the laundry centre in a functional spot, but without taking away from the aesthetic elegance of the bathroom – in fact, large mirrors can help a space feel more expansive.

#### Open Eyelines

Other features help give the room a larger feel: glass doors are used for the shower and on the tall custom storage compartment to keep sight lines open. The airy material and colour palette emphasize pale tones and subtle textures, adding interest while maintaining a breezy feel. Using the same inviting wood to create the floating vanity shelves and the sliding door frame adds consistency and a touch of visual warmth.

#### Bringing the Heat

Two hidden features keep this room feeling cosy all year. A heated floor system (a perfect complement to cool, crisp tile) radiates warmth – a smart way to make a relatively compact space feel ultra-luxe. To top it off, the stylish wall-mounted towel bar is also heated, for that fresh-out-of-the-dryer feeling any time. Continued on page 20

#### Niche Appeal

Often, one or more of the walls inside a shower will have a large open cavity, free of pipes – space that can be "borrowed" to add a little extra room to the shower via a wall niche. Placing a niche at elbow height will give you a handy place to store essential products and open up the feel of the space just that little bit more, making it a worthwhile upgrade during renovation.

#### Featured Selections

Although most of the tile in this bathroom is a classic white 12-by-24-inch porcelain plank (which creates a large, almost seamless look), an accent tile was used to make a statement in the shower. This tile was then repeated as the sink backsplash (run wall-to-wall for a sharp look), for a feeling of continuity. Repeating materials at least once is a good way to make any room appear more harmonious.

**DESIGN TIP:** Bordering an accent tile with an outline of plank tiles (as done in this shower) frames it like artwork and visually connects the materials, rather than taking the accent wall-to-wall. It's a contemporary twist that makes a sophisticated statement.


#### Bright Answers

Keeping the lighting scheme richly layered is important in any space, even a smaller one like a bathroom. Here, pot lights are used in the shower area (an often overlooked spot for lighting), but the long vanity wall is actually lit with a subtle LED strip tucked into the ceiling. This gives efficient, even lighting in a soft ethereal glow, for a real sense of brightness despite the lack of a window. Thin accent lights flank the medicine cabinet, adding a little task lighting.

#### Highs & Lows

Not everything has to be a budget buster. Here, a simple and sleek big-box-store vanity serves perfectly, acting as the quiet anchor in a moody grey. Adding an interesting faucet gives it a unique twist, and picks up on the other glass accents in the room. Remember: saving on some pieces and splurging on others always creates more drama than spending moderately across the board.

**DESIGN TIP:** One of the easiest ways to style your bathroom is to remove clutter, and then store essentials in minimalist containers like glass jars or white boxes. Just be sure to add at least one purely decorative accent like a fresh blossom!

I'm often amazed at life's tenacity. Dandelion roots can grow more than a metre to find water; without water, many sedum succulent plants can effortlessly survive a month; and the humble daylily can be uprooted from the ground to sit upside down for a whole fall and winter and still poke out some leaves the following spring.

The point is, life wants to keep living. A common example is garlic, onions and potatoes that sprout roots or leaves before you've had time to consume them. Tremendous life force is just waiting to be regrown again and again in your kitchen scraps. Grow edibles in winter? Yes you can.

Much easier than nursing a veggie plant from seed, regrowing most vegetables is an easy task - no green thumb required. Most begin regrowing in just water! And as world food costs steadily increase, you'll have a source of vegetables and herbs in regular supply at essentially no extra cost than the original purchase. Sound good?

There are numerous edibles that can be regrown with various degrees of difficulty, but who wants to wait three years for a pineapple to grow indoors? Here is my list of easy-peasy, fail-proof and fast veggies to try your hand at regrowing.

### Herbs

It's a well-known fact that all dishes are greatly enhanced by the addition of fresh herbs. Many herbs such as basil, mint, and cilantro will easily regrow. Simply place fresh-cut herb stems in a glass of water with the bottom third of its leaves removed. New leaves will form and roots will grow. After the roots are about two inches long, they can be relocated to a pot with soil. Rosemary also re-propagates in this manner, except the cuttings need to be taken from the top two or three inches of the plant.

#### Lettuce

Luscious lettuce in winter is, for many, a dream come true. Romaine, leaf-type lettuces and even bok choy will all regrow so long as their stump is intact. Place the stump upright in a bowl, covering the base of the stump with water. When new leaves regrow, the stump can be planted in soil.

Such a useful flavouring, green onions and leeks are likely the easiest veggies to propagate. Cut the stalks about one to two inches from the root and place the root in water and they will quickly grow. They can then be transferred to a soil-filled pot or planted directly in soil from the start. Red and yellow onions can also be regrown into lovely green onions. Next time you chop onions, save the base with about one to two inches of bulb. Place the base in a bowl of water. Once leaves grow, transfer to soil.

### Carlic

If you find your culinary garlic is already sprouting, just place the clove in a bit of water. Shoots will grow and can be harvested and used raw, much like chives, or the cloves can be planted directly in soil

Celery

Crunchy celery is a healthy and satisfying winter snack and hinders high-carb, comfort eating. Leave about five inches of celery stalk base. Place in a bowl of water and new leaves will grow from the middle. In about a week it can be moved to a soil-filled planter.

#### Carrots

Did you know that carrot leaves are edible? They're perhaps a bit bitter in taste but your household culinary genius will likely find a use for them. Cut the carrot top with one-inch base and place in a plate of water and the leaves will sprout from the top. After the leaves are about two inches, plant in soil and harvest as needed.

Whichever veggie you plan to regrow indoors, a few rules of thumb apply. All plants, whether placed in water or soil, need ample sunlight from a sunny window. Always change the liquid from a plant's growing water every two days. For earth-bound plantings, choose the appropriate nutrient-rich potting soil and water accordingly. Never harvest all of the leaves at one time, as the plant needs some foliage to continue the process of photosynthesis.

Perhaps when you picture a bunch of food items growing indoors it doesn't sound very aesthetic, but depending on the arrangement and the vessels chosen, they can be a beautiful statement. Imagine your glassware filled with green stems along your dining table or a collection of beautiful pots bursting with edibles placed by a sunlit window. Beauty is always in the eye of the beholder, so get creative with this cool and edible version of upcycling. **oH**





## FIRST HOUSE LAST HOUSE

A recent survey by CIBC shows 86 per cent of millennials view home ownership as important even though 42 per cent of them are renting and 21 per cent live with their parents. What about their baby-boomer parents? Will they downsize or stay put? OUR HOMES spoke to two millennials and two boomers about their next move in this hot housing market.

#### FIRST PURCHASE

First homes for millennials and a house to retire in for boomers may have more in common than we think

"I imagine myself in a suburb setting, in a single-detached home," says Renée Chaperon, a 32-year-old millennial from Orillia. "I don't want to be downtown. I like to be on the outskirts of a city but still on a serviced lot with easy access to all of the amenities."

Chaperon would like her first home to have an open-concept living space, a large kitchen with a tucked-in eating space and a large entertainment area. "Inside, I like modern, upgraded countertops and cabinetry and a separation of living space versus private space, meaning the bedrooms have to be completely separate from the living space," says Chaperon, whose ideal house size would be 2,000 square feet. Her other must-haves are enough backyard space for barbecues and parking for guests.

Millennial Jordan Milks shares a similar vision. "I like doing dinners, so I'd like a modern large-sized kitchen and living room," says the 22-year-old, who lives in downtown Toronto. "I definitely want to do a kitchen island, something stationary, with modern cabinets, either stainless steel or cherry wood." But Milks doesn't see himself buying his first home in his current neighbourhood. "It would ideally be a detached or semi-detached house, one or two bedrooms, in a place that will begin to gentrify so that property values will go up in a few years," he adds. The suburbs would also give Milks another must-have: a view overlooking green space.

#### FINAL LIVING SPACE

Greg Ioannou, a boomer with a love for downtown Toronto, wants many of the above features but right in the heart of the city. "I can't stand gardening, so definitely a condo or co-op," says the 62-year-old. "I want to be near restaurants, theatres, grocery stores and the library, so as central as possible.

Ioannou's musthaves include indoor parking for two cars, a dishwasher, decent laundry, a dining room big enough to entertain a dozen guests, a house wired with highspeed Internet plus a good sound system.

"Good soundproofing is a must, too," he says. "I don't want to have to keep

my music quiet or have to listen to the neighbour's hip-hop."

Peace and quiet are also important for 66-year-old Linda White. "I would prefer a two-bedroom bungalow, all one level, without stairs, for easy maintenance inside the house," says the Ramara Township resident. "I still enjoy a yard, so a condo would sort of be my last choice."

Despite being afraid of losing mobility as she and her husband age, White says they like the idea of being in a close-knit community-livingstyle development with other boomers so they don't have to go far to connect and socialize. Alternatively, they'd rather be in the suburbs so they can enjoy a walk outdoors but still be a short drive or bus ride away from downtown.

#### SIMILAR WANTS

Both generations seem to agree on the necessity of incorporating green practices in their ideal homes.

"I'd like lots of windows and skylights," says millennial Chaperon. "I'd also like a rooftop garden, just to be more self-sustaining and because green roofs help reflect more heat and keep indoors cool and help with water runoff."

Boomer loannou would only opt for green practices that serve a practical rather than ideological purpose, including such features as insulation that cut down heating and cooling costs or solar energy for reducing energy costs.

Millennial Milks, who already leans toward using energyefficient methods, such as using LED bulbs, would like to incorporate some tech-savvy factors in his first home. "I would look into using technology at home to monitor energy usage remotely," he says. Other green methods would have to stand the test of time before he, like boomer White, would consider using them.

She agrees with Milks and says she would only go for installing proven methods of energy saving and cost cutting, otherwise, it's difficult to splurge on trying out items on a fixed income.

Both groups are eager about energy-saving methods, green spaces, good-sized kitchens and closeness to city amenities. OH











Such is the case with **Mike Welton**, whose family owns **Sunvale Homes**, and Meghan Barber, whose family owns Barber Glass (and who is also a sales representative with Guelph's Eve Claxton Realty). At just 25 years old, these two already know a lot about homes and design - and when they got stuck, they turned to their nearest experts: their families. The pair recently built a living model for Sunvale Homes (Waterloo Region Homebuilders' Association's homebuilder of the year for 2016) in Waterloo's **Woolwich Estates**. The 2,408 sq. ft. home was built to show local customers how they could build a customizable modern home at an obtainable entry price. "It is a product of collaboration of design inspiration from two families with deep roots in the building industry," says Mike. He and Meghan built the home together and each say they learned a lot along the way.

"We are a couple that have a passion for design, building and the housing market," says Meghan. Their complementary skill sets are what helped shape this home and make it so special.

The layout of this particular model was inspired by a home designed by David Small Design in Oakville. Mike oversaw that high-end custom build and was moved to start sketching out his own modern layout with Meghan.

Many of the features in this home are a bit different, and they come together cohesively to form a beautiful finished product. This is Sunvale Homes' most modern build yet and it has been a hit with visitors. "People really like the modern look," says Mike.

The pair purchased their windows and doors from Golden Windows Limited. Their flooring, from their brushed oak engineered hardwood to their tiles and carpets, was all purchased through Sarmazian Bros. Ltd.

Upstairs, the home has one family bathroom and two secondary bedrooms, one of which Mike and Meghan use as an office, an open-to-below media space, and a grand master suite with a gorgeous en suite bathroom. Continued on page 46



The five-foot wide pivoting wood door leading into the master, rather than standard double doors, is a special feature the couple came up with together. Meghan had been inspired by a door she saw in a restaurant, and later photos on Pinterest when she had been scoping out door options for the master bath (which has an equally beautiful sliding barn door) and asked Mike to build the pivoting door. He used reclaimed barn board from Century Wood Products in Marsville and made the design work with the space.

Both the media room and the master bedroom walk out onto top-floor balconies with enough room for sitting areas. They look out over the new neighbourhood in Woolwich Estates. However, it's the main floor living space, open to the grand kitchen and dining areas, where Meghan and Mike tend to spend most of their time. This room also walks out to a patio, which leads into the backyard.

The kitchen cabinets were built by Barzotti Woodworking Ltd. in Guelph and the leathered granite countertops were purchased through Graniteworx.

It's the windows and glass elements in the home that really make a statement, though. "Lots of people comment on the corner windows and how much natural light comes in through them," says Meghan.

Similarly, Barber Glass not only created the frameless structural glass railings on the floating staircase, which is the first thing you see when you walk in the front door, but they also installed the master bedroom fireplace, master bath doors, the sliding glass door that separates the kitchen from the laundry room and the range hood and kitchen backsplash, not to mention furniture like a bench in the foyer and the night stands in the master bedroom.

Needless to say, Barber Glass played an integral part in pulling this beautiful home together. Established in 1883, the company has deep roots in working with glass, but they're always trying new designs. Its sister company Barber Gallery is an art, framing and furniture business alongside the glass operation. Most of the art in Meghan and Mike's home comes from Barber Gallery, as does their dining table, buffet and chairs and the stools at their island.







"They definitely came up with some remarkable concepts for the glass, furniture and art products and the house in general," says Mike. On the other hand, he says he owes his design inspiration to his own parents. Mike has watched them design and build homes for his entire life.

Meghan's in-depth knowledge of real estate comes from years of working with designers, builders and architects through Barber Glass, and more recently as a sales representative with Eve Claxton Realty in Guelph.

Working and living with Mike has given her an inside look at costing as well, so she can accurately price and list properties for sale - which will come in handy this spring, when she and Mike list this modern build for sale and move to another home nearby. The couple is currently drawing up concepts for their new build and are trying to come up with more innovative ideas to differentiate it from other homes, just as they have with this model.

Next up, Sunvale Homes will be developing some detatched homes in Durham region, although they are hoping to procure more lots in Orangeville and Waterloo soon. "We don't buy anything that isn't a good location," says Mike. His own home is a testament to that. OH

#### **MATERIALS**

Clear glass vases (I sourced my collection from a dollar store)

Drop cloth or plastic sheet Disposable gloves

Lint-free rags

Krud-Kutter Concentrated Cleaner

1/₃ cup white vinegar

⅓ cup water

Spray bottle (with mist setting)

Rust-Oleum Mirror Effect spray paint in gold or silver (gold was used for this project)

Rust-Oleum Painter's Touch 2X Ultra Cover in Clear Matte



#### **PREPARATION**

- Using a lint-free rag and Krud Kutter cleaner. thoroughly clean, rinse and dry the glass surface to ensure that any sticky labels, dust or dirt are removed.
- Fill the spray bottle with one-part water to one-part white vinegar and gently shake to mix.
- In a well-ventilated area. lay a drop cloth on a flat surface and place the first glass item upside down in the centre of the cloth.
- Put on your disposable gloves and shake the can of Mirror Effect spray paint well for about two minutes.

#### **PAINTING**

- Holding the Mirror Effect can approximately eight inches away from the glass, apply a light coat of the paint around all glass surfaces.
- As soon as the glass is well coated and while still wet, lightly mist the painted surface with the vinegar and water solution. The mixture will react with the paint to create a speckled, mercuryglass patina.
- Repeat on each of the remaining glass pieces and allow all to dry for approximately 10 minutes.
- To protect the mercury-glass paint finish, apply a light coating of 2X Ultra Cover to all of the glass, allowing it to dry, before placing on display. on

Hot chocolate warms short days and chilly nights. Our version not only spikes and spices it up, but homemade marshmallows make it an extra-special, personal treat.

#### SPICED HOT **CHOCOLATE** Serves 2

#### **INGREDIENTS**

1 ounce semisweet chocolate

2 cups milk

2 Tbsp cocoa powder

2 Tbsp sugar

½ tsp vanilla extract

½ tsp cinnamon

pinch of cayenne

pinch of salt

1 ounce orange liqueur, optional

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- Melt chocolate over low heat in a saucepan.
- Add milk, cocoa, sugar, vanilla, cinnamon, cayenne and salt and heat on medium-high, whisking constantly until the mixture is smooth and combined.
- Remove from heat.
- As an option for adults, add 1 ounce of orange liqueur before serving.
- Pour into two mugs, top with homemade marshmallows (recipe follows) and brown with a kitchen torch until golden!

#### HOMEMADE **MARSHMALLOWS**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

1/4 cup icing sugar ¼ cup cornstarch

½ cup ice cold water

3 packages gelatin

½ cup water

1 cup light corn syrup

1-1/2 cups granulated sugar

½ tsp salt

1 tsp vanilla extract

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- Line a 9x9 square baking pan with two sheets of parchment paper, allowing the paper to extend over each edge. Brush the parchment paper with light cooking oil, such as canola, and
- In a small bowl, combine icing sugar and cornstarch. Set aside.
- In the bowl of a stand mixer, combine ½ cup of ice cold water and gelatin. Let this mixture sit to "bloom," or thicken, the gelatin, Place the bowl on the stand mixer fitted with a whisk attachment – but don't turn it on just yet!
- In a small saucepan, combine ½ cup water, corn syrup, granulated sugar and salt, cover and heat over medium for 3 to 4 minutes. Do not stir, the sugar will dissolve completely and come to a boil.
- Once boiling, remove the lid and place a candy thermometer to the side of the saucepan. Continue heating until the mixture reaches 240°F, the soft-ball stage. Turn off heat.
- At your stand mixer with the gelatin mix, turn the mixer on medium speed and slowly pour the syrup mixture down the side of the bowl to incorporate with the gelatin. Once incorporated, turn the mixer on high and beat for 10-15 minutes until the mixture becomes thick and looks a bit like soft-serve ice cream. Add vanilla extract during the last minute
- Pour mixture in the prepared pan and flatten with a well-oiled spatula.
- Dust the marshmallows with half of the cornstarch-sugar powder. Fold the sides of the parchment paper over the mixture. Let sit for at least four hours or overnight.
- To cut the marshmallows, turn the pan over onto a board dusted with more sugarcornstarch powder and cut using a pizza cutter or sharp knife. Dust each marshmallow in more of the sugar-cornstarch powder and serve. Store in an airtight container. OH

# NO-KNEAD BREAD and spreads

### no-knead bread

#### **INGREDIENTS**

3 cups all-purpose flour

½ tsp instant yeast

1½ tsp salt

1½ cups water

- In a large bowl, mix together flour, yeast and salt. Add water and stir with a wooden spoon until combined. The dough will be wet and shaggy looking – this is ok.
- Cover with plastic wrap and let sit for 12 to 18 hours or overnight to rise at room temperature. The risen dough is bubbly and double in size.
- Set oven to 450°F and place a castiron pot with lid in the oven to preheat for 30 minutes.
- Meanwhile, turn dough onto a wellfloured board and shape into a ball.
- Transfer the dough to a sheet of parchment paper, dust with more flour, cover with plastic wrap and let rise for another 30 minutes.
- Transfer the ball and the parchment paper to the preheated cast iron pot, cover and bake for 30 minutes.
- Remove lid and bake an additional 10 to 15 minutes or until golden brown.
- Remove from oven and allow to cool.
   Remove from pot, peel parchment and serve.

### INGREDIENTS

**SAVOURY TOMATO** 

(Makes 3 half-pint jars)
1 pound bacon, chopped

1 large white onion, finely chopped

spreads

**BACON JAM** 

1 pound roma tomatoes, chopped

¼ cup brown sugar

1 tsp paprika 1⁄4 tsp chili flakes

1 Tbsp apple cider vinegar
Salt and pepper to taste

- Cook bacon over medium heat in a large pot until brown.
- Transfer bacon to a bowl lined with paper towel.
- Discard all but three tablespoons of oil from pot.
- Add onions and cook until translucent, about 4 to 6 minutes.
- Add bacon and the remaining ingredients back to the pot.
- Increase heat slightly and bring to a boil, then lower to simmer and cook for approximately 1 hour or until spread is the consistency of jam.
- Cool, spoon into sterilized jars and close with sterilized lids. Refrigerate and use within one week or preserve by canning. Go to bernardin. ca/stepbystep.htm for instructions.



### SPINACH & WALNUT PESTO

#### INGREDIENTS (Makes 1 half-pint jar)

About 3 cups of spinach

½ cup walnuts 2 cloves garlic

½ cup grated

parmesan cheese

1/4 cup olive oil

- In a food processor, add spinach, walnuts, garlic and cheese. Pulse to chop and incorporate all ingredients.
- With the food processor running, slowly drizzle in olive oil.
- Spoon spread into sterilized jar with lid. Refrigerate and consume within one week.

#### ROASTED GARLIC OIL

### INGREDIENTS (Makes 1 half-pint jar)

2 whole garlic bulbs

1/4 cup olive oil

Fresh rosemary and thyme

Salt and pepper

- Preheat oven to 400°F.
- Slice off the narrow top of the garlic bulb to expose the cloves of garlic inside.
- Place on tinfoil, drizzle with olive oil and season with salt and pepper. Wrap garlic in foil and roast for 20 to 25 minutes until soft.
- Remove from oven and let cool completely. Peel away the skin of the garlic to expose the cloves or squeeze the bulb to push the cloves out.
- Add the roasted garlic, herbs, salt and pepper to a small sterilized jar, cover with olive oil and close with a lid.
- To serve, place a clove on a slice of bread, mash and spread.
- Consume immediately and do not refrigerate.



It's beginning to look a lot like winter. These wood trees are a nature-inspired addition to your seasonal décor. Dress up your front porch or keep them indoors. Add twinkle lights or garland to incorporate them into your festive designs.

For this project, we used pine boards. Want something more rustic? Make them from pallets or reclaimed wood. We produced a 3-plank tree, a 4-plank tree and a 5-plank tree.

Add layers to make your trees as large as you like!

#### **HOW-TO:**

- Set your mitre saw to 30 degrees.
- Cut the triangle for the treetop by mitre-cutting the end of one board, flipping the board and cutting the third side of the triangle.
- To cut the plank below the treetop, line your board up against the triangle and mark one inch on either end to offset your miter cut and create the desired layer effect.
- For cutting subsequent layers, offset the board up against the preceding cut piece so that the layered tree effect will remain uniform.
- Mock up one tree, measure its total height, add 2 to 3 inches and cut a

- tree trunk to that length. Repeat for all trunks.
- Sand any rough edges of your pieces.
- Stain your tree and trunk pieces and let dry. We mocked up our trees to know which shades we wanted on each layer.
- Once dry, apply a bead of wood glue to the trunk. Line up your tree layers and press them gently to the trunk to adhere. Extend the trunk at least 4 inches below the bottom layer to create a good-sized trunk.
- Once dry, turn over and fasten 1-inch wood screws through the trunk to the back of each plank. **OH**

#### **MATERIALS:**

For the trees: Three 1x5x8 boards

For the trunks: Three 1x3x4 boards

Measuring tape

Pencil to mark cuts

Mitre saw

120-grit sandpaper


Wood stain in one or more shades (we used Minwax Early American, Old Grey and Dark Walnut)

Stain brushes

Wood glue (we used Lepage)

Screwdriver or power drill with screwdriver bit

1-inch wood screws
