Get outside! Enjoy all the wonderful things our neighbourhood has to offer, and when you come home, please spend time with OUR HOMES.



The Ultimate OUTDOOR KITCHEN

Interior Designer **Dolores Pian** shares her ideas.

Our summers may be short, but from March through July and on to November, cooking outdoors allows us to share our food experiences with family and friends while we extend our outdoor play time. More and more people are choosing to invest in their homes and backyards rather than vacation elsewhere.

Before planning and spending on an outdoor kitchen, ask yourself some simple questions:

- How much time do I want to devote to maintenance? Knowing this will save you a lot of grief and disappointment.
- What's critical-to-have, must-have and nice-to-have?

Critical to Know

- Safety first. Make sure you meet your region's building and fire codes. There's a difference between a code for building a house and a code for preventing open flames in and near a building. They are two different things.
- Protect combustible materials.

Choosing Cabinets and Materials

Cabinets and counters need to be corrosion and weather resistant, low maintenance and made with stable materials. All materials

expand and contract with temperature change and moisture. Sun fades colours, and natural materials break down over time. There are three types of cabinetry-based kitchens for outdoor use: HDPE/Polymer, wood and stainless steel.

Polymer: Waterproof, sun safe, available in a variety of solid colours, lower maintenance, plastic, variable durability.

Wood: Flexible design, requires some maintenance, most affordable, not fire resistant.





Stainless Steel: Heat and fire resistant, non-corrosive, easy to clean, available in powder-coated colours.

Things to Consider

Appearance: What do I want to see when I look at my outdoor kitchen? Choose your landscaping and furniture for that perfect outdoor style.

Clean-Up: Install a sink with water. You may not want to use your indoor kitchen to clean greasy, sooty stuff. Plan ahead for plumbing.

Heating and Electrical: Layer your heat sources. Consider heat lamps, fire pits or a built-in infrared heater. Make sure you put in multiple electrical outlets that meet code. Plan ahead for electrical.

Shade: Create shade from the sun and protection from the rain with pergolas, retractable patio covers or tents.

Stay Cool: Cool yourself off with fans, misters or rugs to shield you from the hot floor and use light-coloured furniture.

Layout and Seating: Transition your rooms with removable screens, doors and walls. Offer a variety of seating – low Muskoka chairs, chaise loungers, stools and benches.

Storage Space: The ultimate amenity. Think of what else may need to be stored – equipment, furniture, sports and hobbies. You don't want to run back and forth from the house or garage, to the outdoor living area.

Small Spaces – Condo Balconies and Terraces

Electric grills make outdoor eating possible despite strict fire and safety codes. Brown Jordan has fully assembled kitchens for terraces, to be lifted by a crane, or custom units transported by a service elevator.

Nice to Have and Trending

- Specialty right-sized appliances replacing mammoth barbecue grills. These can include: Argentinian grills, smokers, side burners, pizza ovens, fridges, dishwashers, beer on tap, espresso machines, ice makers and Kamadostyle grills.
- Lighting schemes, televisions and sound systems. Treat this space like another room of the house.

Value to Your Home

Outdoor kitchens seem to be replacing the pool as an add-on feature. It increases your competitive edge when selling because people will imagine themselves having great times in their new backyard.

Good design blurs the lines between the indoors and the outdoors. In what creative ways have you designed your very own private outdoor oasis? **OH**





PAVLOVA with citrus curd

THIS MERINGUE-BASED DESSERT IS CRISPY ON THE OUTSIDE AND SOFTER INSIDE. CITRUS JUICE AND BERRIES MAKE IT SUMMER FRESH.

RECIPE AND PHOTOGRAPHY JENELLE MCCULLOCH

Pavlova

INGREDIENTS

4 egg whites

Pinch of salt

1/4 cup cold water

1-1/4 cups sugar

1 tsp vinegar

1 tsp vanilla extract

1 Tbsp + 1 tsp cornstarch

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 300°F. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Draw a six-inch circle in the centre on the side of the parchment that will face down. This will be your guide when you shape the pavlova.

Combine egg whites and salt in a stand mixer and beat on medium-high until stiff peaks are formed. Be careful not to over-whip the egg whites at this stage. The egg whites will be thick and foamy and a peak will

form when the beater is lifted out of the egg. Turn the mixer to low and slowly add the water and then the sugar. Turn the mixer back up to medium-high and beat until stiff peaks are again formed. The eggs will be thick and glossy. Remove bowl from mixer and fold in vanilla, vinegar and cornstarch.

Pile the meringue onto the circle on the baking sheet. With a spatula, smooth edges and top of the pavlova so it almost forms a dome. If preferred, create ridges in the side of the pavlova by swiping the sides in an upward motion.

Bake the pavlova for 30 minutes. Do not open oven! Turn oven down to 275°F and bake for another 45 minutes. Let cool completely in the oven for an hour or overnight. It is normal for the pavlova to crack and the centre to sink in.

Remove from oven when cool.

Citrus Curd

INGREDIENTS

4 egg yolks

1/4 cup citrus juice of choice (lemon, blood orange, etc.)

1 tsp citrus zest

¹/₃ cup sugar

3 Tbsp unsalted butter

DIRECTIONS

Combine all ingredients in a double boiler and heat on medium-high, stirring continuously until mixture thickens and coats the back of a spoon. Strain curd through a fine mesh sieve into a bowl. Cover the top of the curd with plastic wrap directly on the curd and chill until cooled.

GARNISHES

Fresh whipped cream Berries Mint Powdered sugar


ASSEMBLE PAVLOVA

Assemble shortly before serving. Fill the centre of the pavlova with curd, whipped cream and berries. Garnish with mint and powdered sugar. OH

Nautical LIGHT POSTS

Light up the summer night with easy-to-make solar light posts. Storebought solar lights, commonly used on pathways or flower beds, become task lights in a cluster. Use on the deck, around the pool or at the lake.

DIRECTIONS

- Cut post into three lengths measuring 38, 32 and 26 inches each. Your lumber yard can make cuts for a small charge.
- Using a drill paddle, drill a hole 2-inches deep in the top centre of each post for the solar light stem.





MATERIALS

TOOLS

1 6x6-inch post, 8-foot length

3 Solar lights with stems

4 L brackets

2 Flat brackets

24 1-1/2-inch woodscrews

15 feet of rope (pick your desired thickness)

1-1/4-inch finishing nails

Paint or whitewash

Drill

Drill paddle (of the same diameter size as the light stem)


Screwdriver

Finishing nails

Hammer

Paintbrush or roller

- Paint posts and let dry thoroughly.
- Arrange and attach posts together with brackets and screws – L brackets for inside corners, flat brackets on the
- Attach rope around the middle of the post bundle. Tuck ends in behind wrapped rope and nail end in place. Using finishing nails, tack rope into post in random areas to hold in place.
- Cut solar light stems to 2 inches or desired length. Insert U light stems in posts, attach solar lights to stems. Enjoy. он





Clipped and formal hedgerows have charmed society for centuries. Used to create living privacy walls, boundaries and attractive garden borders, hedges have many practical uses and also add value to any property.





YOUR INVESTMENT

The use of hedges dates back to 4000 BC in ancient Egypt where the first boxwoods were clipped for ornamental purposes. Amazingly, this style has some serious staying power as they are still being used present day. As mentioned, hedges can serve multiple purposes: they can conceal unsightly views, create privacy from nosy neighbours and significantly cut down on noise pollution. Hedging can make a patio space warm and cosy by acting as a windbreak and it can cut down on snow accumulation by acting as a snow fence. It can delineate property lines and formalize gardens that contain more unruly plant life by creating a tidy edge.

Hedges can be planted in a range of types and sizes depending on the required result. Select the plant that meets your needs.

THYME: One of the shortest hedge plants available and sometimes called edges instead of hedges, these borders look especially smart in formal herb gardens when acting as dividing lines between other, wilder looking herb species.


BOXWOOD: The "little black dress" of the garden world (meaning everyone should have one), boxwood is the perfect small to medium size hedge. Its pretty evergreen leaves take very well to pruning. Korean Littleleaf Boxwood (Buxus microphylla var koreana) is one of the heartiest, just be sure to plant it in an area that isn't exposed to high winds or road salt.


YEW: Yews make gorgeous hedges but range wildly in height from two-and-ahalf-feet to over 50-feet so read the plant

labels carefully. As with most evergreens, it can be susceptible to wind burn and needs to be protected from strong winter winds.

CEDAR: Probably the hedging you are most familiar with, cedar is an ideal choice where a tall, slim, year-round privacy screen is needed. White cedar, black cedar, even emerald cedar will work well. Rest assured, cedar trees don't specifically attract mosquitoes though any moist and shady spot will! Prune annually in mid-July for best results.

HEMLOCK: Although Canadian hemlock grow as large trees in the wild, they are sometimes sold in shrub form for use as hedges. Prune hemlock hedging twice per year, from late June to late August, for the first three years to encourage dense growth. After three years, prune once in late June, just don't cut the leader until it's at the desired height.

NORTHERN PRIVET: A lovely fast-growing deciduous hedge of about six feet in height. It has small bright green leaves and enjoys getting trims.

ALPINE CURRENT: A very hearty mid-sized deciduous shrub with interesting leaf shape. It also tolerates high winds, cold and road salt well.

PYRAMIDAL ENGLISH OAK, HORNBEAM,

DAWYCK BEECH: Perhaps not the typical scenario that most people think of for hedging, but really, any narrow deciduous tree can be planted tightly in a row to style a tall hedge. These work well where a tall screen is needed but spacing is tight. They can look very stately.

LILAC, DOGWOOD, ROSE OF SHARON. SPIREA. BURNING BUSH. HYDRANGEA.

WEIGELA: Many garden variety deciduous shrubs can be trained as hedges, just be sure to prune yearly to achieve the desired height and width. It's also imperative that if you'd like your hedge to flower, prune at the correct time of year so that you aren't removing the flower buds prematurely. A good rule of thumb is prune late-flowering shrubs in early spring and spring-flowering shrubs after flowering.

The amount of space you have and how dense you'd like your screen will determine the number of rows you plant. For large spaces, consider planting a double row to make a hedge fill in twice as fast. Spacing between rows is based on crown width, but at a minimum try to avoid root crowding by setting at least

12- to 24-inches apart, measuring from the centre of the plant. Spacing will depend on the type of shrub or tree chosen, how close you'd like them at maturity, and your patience level. Keep in mind, when planting in rows close together, trees and shrubs will not spread out as wide as if they were a single species in a landscape.

Start training your hedge after it is established and growing vigorously. Generally this takes one to two years after planting. To train, trim top and sides as required for the species, removing about one-half the length of new shoots. Ideal hedge shapes are wider at the base than the top to allow sunlight to reach the lower leaves.

It can take a few years after planting for a new hedge to take shape and start looking great. Be patient, they are worth the investment! OH








Lee Anne Downey always wanted to live in a stone house in the country. With properties in Oakville and Toronto, her husband, Tom Hitchman, was more comfortable in the city, but he acquiesced and the couple began their search for a new home.

Lee Anne's country dreamscape included not just a stone house. She envisioned rolling terrain with a pond and a stream – a place where she'd be surrounded by nature and be able to bike and snowshoe on her own property. She also dreamed of planting fields of lavender, raising chickens, and beekeeping. Tom's vision included a barn to house ATVs, tools and sports equipment.

In December of 2016, they found "the one," near the town of Erin. Not only is there a beckoning stone farmhouse, but also a guest house with a stone foundation. There are 93 acres for Lee Anne to plant lavender and develop more of her dream projects. And Tom gets two historic barns.

The two-storey house, built in 1872, had two bedrooms upstairs plus a tired bath in the original second-floor quarters. Downstairs was comprised of a parlour, huge dining room, large centre hall, sunroom and a small kitchen/living room in what was an attached stable. The original owner was a Scottish stonemason and the intricate stone pattern detailed at the front door is his signature trademark. The original stone well, which the farm is named for, remains intact at the front of the house.

Renovations happened in two phases. **Desmond Maraugh** of **Dreams and Reality** was contracted right away to work on the first phase. The work included painting, new floors, updating the second-floor bathrooms and moving the kitchen from the stable to the sunroom. Not needing a big dining room, it was converted to an office for Lee Anne and a gym for Tom. *Continued on page 40*

The new upstairs bath is stunning. With huge skylights streaming natural light into the room, and the back wall covered in sparkling grey-and-white glass tile from **Barton Bath + Floor**, it's an oasis of serenity. The freestanding tub calls for a long soak and a glass of bubbly at the end of a busy day on the farm.

Early in the initial renovation process, new windows became very important because the old ones were drafty. "Our biggest challenge was honouring the age and history of the house but wanting a contemporary interior décor," explains Lee Anne.

The new, brown vinyl windows have a modern, almost industrial feel, but provide the perfect transition between the contemporary kitchen and the lavender fields outside.


In the new kitchen, the original stone walls dominate the room, and are the backdrop for a spectacular piece of artwork by Canadian artist Joanne Currah. The couple's love of art is evident throughout the house. All pieces are by favourite Canadian artists, with the exception of one work from Vietnam.

"I didn't want anything to compete with either the stone walls or the view," Lee Anne says. "Thus, I went with the soft warm grey and solid white counters (Quartex Simply White fabricated by **Custom Granite & Marble**) in the kitchen. The rest of the house followed with **Benjamin Moore** Revere Pewter and Dune White paint throughout, highlighted by soft satin brass hardware. Likewise the closet cabinets were selected to complement the stone, as it is the star." Kitchen cabinetry is Cabico. Continued on page 42

The stable is now the living room with a marble fireplace rising to the vaulted ceiling.

Lee Anne found a piece of marble with cracks and faults that she loved and used it to face the fireplace. The tongue and groove treatment on the walls and ceilings are a nod to the farmhouse look and are a neutral backdrop for more artwork and Lee Anne's treasured rock collection.

The centre hall of the original house has doors to the newly located living room and kitchen. "It's really the hub of the house," Lee Anne says. The fireplace was existing and would have been the source of heat for the whole house. It had a red brick facing that has now been updated with another of Lee Anne's marble finds from Ciot Surplus. She has had the antique tiger stripe oak table "forever," and it opens up to nine feet, when the occasion calls for a sit-down dinner. The 150-year-old 1.5-inch thick pine floors were found on Kijiji, requiring a floor sander to be set up in the barn, and help from her dad to pull out all the square nails.

Phase two of the project included the addition of a new main floor master bedroom suite and a mudroom/garage added at the opposite end. Colin Cherry Renovations was tapped to do this phase. The living room now leads to a new glass breezeway, which is the connector between the old house and the new garage. The breezeway has doors from Bigfoot Door that look onto the stone well and terraced approach to the house and provide a gallery effect for treasured paintings.

The mudroom is heated solely by hydronic floors and has abundant storage space, both open and behind cabinet doors, to keep this active blended family organized. Seamus, the Wheaten Terrier, has his own shower in this space.

The new master suite is at the front of the house. Tom had a major say in the decision. He wanted a bedroom that looked out over the lavender. Where the parlour once was, they closed off the door. That space is now the



master en suite.

Cutting through the stone base of a window off the centre hall to make a door to the new bedroom, they've created a virtual indoor/outdoor experience that needs to be seen to understand its delight. Panoramic floor-to-ceiling windows create the feeling that you are one with the natural surroundings. There are rolling hills and trees, deer and fields of lavender, just like Lee Anne imagined. 





Look up. Is a popcorn ceiling staring back at you? If so, it might be time for a change. Here's some inspiration for that overlooked "fifth wall" in every room.



Reclaimed barn boards add rustic, textured character and provide an interesting colour palette to draw from. Plywood is another choice and when sealed with a gloss varnish, adds warmth and simplicity to a space.

BEADBOARD


No longer just for the cottage, use it on any ceiling. In a peaked ceiling, try running the boards vertically towards the peak, it will draw the eye upwards. A real time saver if placed right over a popcorn ceiling.

COFFERED DIMENSIONAL

You need ceiling height to get the full effect of this style of finish, as the elements can overwhelm a nine-foot ceiling. This design adds formality and looks best in a living or dining room.

INDUSTRIAL

The unfinished, finished look is not for everyone. Exposed duct work and wiring can be a turn off to some, while others are excited by the conversion of industrial spaces into housing.





Metal ceiling tiles were introduced in the 1800s as an affordable alternative to detailed plasterwork. Today, reproductions are plastic and come in a variety of patterns. Of course, if you can find the antique tiles, their patina and dented appearance will add incredible character.

LIGHTING

LED lights come in many options these days. Pot lights are smaller and directional and bulbs come in cool and warm light. LED strips or tape come in several lengths and colours and are waterproof.



PAINT-

In some ways, paint is one of the easiest ways to finish a ceiling, but try to move away from white. Stencils, stripes, faux finishes and glazes will add that extra touch or just use a high-gloss paint in a rich dark colour.

MOULDING

With a seemingly endless choice of mouldings available, creating a design pattern on the ceiling is only limited by your imagination. Foam or plastic ceiling medallions can start the design and highlight a hanging fixture.



BEAMS

If beams are existing and need an update they can be re-clad. You can paint or stain existing beams. Faux wood beams can also be added. **OH**



ENERGY SAVING /

SUMMER has finally arrived with longer days and irresistible pool decks, but it can also bring the sting of pricey air conditioning. The experts at Sustainable Buildings Canada (SBC) have come up with 10 tips for avoiding a sunburned wallet this year.

SBC is a Canadian non-profit advancing "the environmental and energy performance of the built environment." Its executive director Michael Singleton and board director Larry Brydon suggest homeowners balance old-school wisdom and eco-friendly practices to optimize savings.

AVOID THE DEEP FREEZE

Set the thermostat a little higher than the standard 22°C. Michael suggests 26°-27°C instead. "You know how you go into a mall in the summer and it's freezing? There's no need for that."

PAY ONLY TO PLAY

"Turn off the air conditioner when you're not home." It may seem obvious, but Michael says many people forget. Programmable thermostats can automate the change for regular outings, like going to work.

CALL ON MOTHER NATURE

Open the windows at night when it's cooler outside, and close them by lunchtime when it's cooler inside. Taking advantage of crossventilation by opening two or more windows in a room or house can be particularly effective. "That's free cooling," adds Michael.

CREATE A WIND CHILL

Overhead fans generate a cooling breeze and use the same amount of electricity as a 75-watt light bulb, according to Michael. "Put them on counter clockwise and get the air moving." Again, he reminds homeowners to turn all fans off when not at home.

LANDSCAPE STRATEGICALLY

"It's most effective to shade from the exterior," Larry says. On the west side of a house, where the sunshine is most intense, he advises planting a maple tree. Not only will it help in summer, but in winter it'll drop its leaves and let the sun shine through for additional heat.

BE AN INFORMED CONSUMER

Air conditioners are ranked based upon their Seasonal Energy Efficiency Ratio (SEER) between 13 (the current minimum) and 21. "A 16 to 18 is fine," Larry advises. "Or purchase an Energy Star if you don't want to bother with SEER."

KEEP A SUMMER CHECKLIST

Larry's list starts with checking and replacing filters. An annual cleaning and inspection will extend an air conditioner's lifespan by ensuring all parts work and air flow is uncompromised.

PUT THE FIRE OUT

Check gas fireplaces and turn off any standing pilot lights. This task also made Larry's checklist. Although these pilot lights were more common 10 years ago, many are still in operation and give off the equivalent heat of a big candle, he warns.

TURN DOWN THE **HUMIDISTAT**

Adding moisture to dry winter air can keep wooden floors from buckling and cabinets from warping, says Larry, but it's unnecessary in summer. If the humidifier continues to run all summer, cooling appliances have to work harder.

REPLACE INCANDESCENT LIGHT BULBS

Cool compact fluorescent lamps or lights (CFLs) and light-emitting diode bulbs (LEDs) save money in two ways, Larry reminds. First, they draw less electricity than their incandescent cousins, which has an immediate impact. Second, they don't produce heat that air conditioners have to remove.

When it's lovely outside, that's a good place to be. Outdoor cooking and living can lower the heat generated inside and the need for expensive cooling options. A final option: when it gets too hot, you can always grab a jacket and head to the mall. OH

Canadians who purchased a newly built home shows walk-in closets topped their list of must-have features. Surprising? Not really says Tim Bailey, division president of Avid Ratings Canada Ltd., a customer satisfaction company that works with Canadian homebuilders to determine what buyers want in a new build.

New home buyers across the country are asked to answer 190 questions based on a recent new home purchase. It's the largest survey of its kind in Canada. The result is a comprehensive report by region, buyer type and demographics that Canadian projects based on consumer wants

WHAT





Avid Ratings is currently compiling results for 2019 but Tim doesn't anticipate dramatic changes. There's only been moderate changes in the four years Avid Ratings has been conducting the survey.

Consumers clearly want energy efficiency, Tim says. "But they also want granite and quartz and all the fine features so it's really about trying to strike a balance between what buyers can afford to spend. Energy efficiency is a hot button for consumers, especially with the carbon tax and rising utility costs. Buying a home is one thing but then carrying the cost of that home is another thing."

Homebuyers also want storage, lots of it. "We're a four-season country," Tim explains using his family as an example. "We're a Brady Bunch family with four kids and storage is critical. We have off-season gear, four seasons of clothing and four seasons of sporting goods."

People also want open-concept kitchens with an island. "Quartz countertops and smart home technology score high on the survey as well," Tim says. Other wants include a single-detached home, doublecar garages, brick exteriors, tankless water heaters, LED lighting and a main-floor master suite.

What's surprising is the renaissance of the formal dining room. According to the survey, formal dining rooms have increased in importance since year one of the study.

What isn't a priority for new home buyers is outdoor spaces. Tim figures it's because landscaping isn't an immediate concern, it's not part of the purchase and new home buyers have to save and budget for outside projects that happen a couple of years down the road.

The 2018 study found the largest cohort of today's Canadian homebuyer is the growing family with kids followed by single couples with no kids. Millennials have edged out Gen Xers as the largest group of homebuyers.

How does the survey translate for resale homes? Tim believes new homes inspire renovations to older homes and stimulate the resale market. OH



They consulted Fergus firm **Crozier Designs Inc.** to draw up the plans.

Kevin Crozier recommended two builders he trusted to take on the extensive renovations. Kate and Daryl had only to meet with Seth Wyga and Ian O'Keefe from Centrix Building Group to know they'd found the right fit. Seth became the designer and project manager, and his father Otto Wyga the on-site supervisor. They were both involved at every stage of the process.

Seth recalls that first meeting and talks about his philosophy. "Undergoing a huge renovation like this is almost impossible for a

client to fully grasp on day one. The number of decisions to be made is uncountable and overwhelming. The best way forward is to get a team working with you – a designer who can communicate well and show you your home's potential in an exciting new way, and a contractor who is willing to engage with you early on and walk with you in a totally transparent process."

Flannery Electrical Inc. installed all electrical elements in the home, including Smart Home technology and landscape lighting. There is energy efficient lighting throughout the house.

The entire house was gutted to the original two-foot thick stone walls, being mindful and respectful of the property's heritage status.



Historically being a waterfront property, where the front of the home faces the water, the street side of the home had no windows. Four large windows were added to allow natural light into the new kitchen and second-floor bedroom space. Bavarian Window Works sourced a beautiful and historically accurate double-hung window that was used throughout the old spaces of the home.

"Everything we need is on the main floor, a house we can grow older in," says Kate. Hence the spacious open-concept kitchen/dining/ family room area that spans from the front to the rear of the house. They wanted the space to feel warm without being cavernous. All cabinetry in the home was custom designed and installed by **Homestead Woodworks**.


The family shares a love of cooking. Kitchen elements from their previous home, including multiple prep stations, steam oven, warming drawer, induction cooktop and secondary dishwasher were must haves.

A strong foundation was laid between builder and homeowners. The result is a thoughtfully-designed, custom built family home where the Holmes' enjoy living in the heart of the city. OH






Sara and Richard Kaune have a love for old houses. Having spent 25 years living in downtown Guelph, Richard had often admired the beautiful homes on Park Avenue. He noticed a red brick, two-storey beauty for sale one day and encouraged Sara to look at it. They both loved it and took possession in 2004. Built in 1908, it needed a lot of work.

They lived in it for four years before starting their renovation plans by refurbishing the front room, which was originally an open porch that was glassed-in, probably in the 1920s. Planning to use the room as a library and home office, they hired a local artisan, **Roelf Zantinge**, to design and install a built-in bookshelf. The original radiator was left intact, along with the wide window ledge that now showcases Sara's collection of potted plants, all purchased from **Sweet Violets**. Continued on page 89

Over the years they worked on the windows throughout the house, which were all painted shut. Richard unstuck them. "I love doing the paint stripping," he says, "but I leave the painting to Sara, who's the expert."

Fast forward to 2018, Sara and Richard were feeling the time had come for the big renovation. Their wish list included making the kitchen more functional, replacing wiring and updating plumbing and mechanicals to current standards – plus a basement reno. As with many renovations, there were surprises lurking behind those walls! While updating plumbing in the second-floor bathroom, they discovered that some of the wooden joists that hold up the ceiling on the first floor had been completely cut in half.

They commissioned **Van-Del Contracting Ltd.** to help with the design and reconstruction of the kitchen and then had to add a renovation in the upstairs bathroom. All of the millwork and craftsmanship in the house is by Van-Del's millwork shop, **VDCM Architectural Woodwork Inc.** Richard and Sara can't say enough about how helpful they were with design suggestions and translating their dreams into beautiful, functional spaces.




The renovations necessitated a complete gutting of the main floor kitchen and sitting room. The family moved out of the house on July 6th of 2018, shuffling family members between her sisters Mary and Jane's homes in the interim. Richard's love of stripping old windows was put to work at Mary's house. Back at their own home, new storm windows were fabricated by **Webwood Windows**.

The kitchen was an existing extension of the original home, likely added in the 1970s. As it was, the workflow was dysfunctional. Sara always wanted a galley kitchen and Van-Del listened to her ideas and created just that. She wanted food storage on one side and dishware on the other. She planned the size of each drawer according to how it would be used. New appliances were purchased from Goemans Appliances - all Kitchen Aid brand, except for the Miele dishwasher, which Sara also recommended for Mary's new kitchen.

The floor is Marmoleum from **Rich-Craft Interiors**. It was Sara's first choice because "it's durable and easy to clean," she remarks. It reminds me of the floor that I walk on every day where I work. Like linoleum, Marmoleum is made of natural fibres and has funky and fun patterns. She chose a periwinkle blue stripe that adds a burst of colour, warmth and personality to the room. The colour was matched and used on cabinet fronts. The encaustic tiles in the foyer are also from Rich-Craft Interiors . Continued on page 92



A prep/beverage/breakfast nook at the rear of the kitchen is a clever and efficient use of space. Richard is the primary cook and he loves the sleek new design. A bench in the nook with a bespoke cushion cover was tailored by Fergus Custom Upholstery & Design to match the wing chairs they recovered in the adjoining sitting area.

An original fireplace with a sea-green tile surround was existing and unchanged except for the addition of a gas fire insert from **Bast Home Comfort**. The cosy room is now a family favourite.

The stunning artwork over the fireplace is by local artist **Karin Silverstone**. Karin repurposed the lath that was removed during the demolition to create a whimsical design together with plaster and strips of wallpaper. Richard chose the wallpaper patterns that echo the blue hues in the room, "in spite of my colour blindness," he says.

The adjoining living room has not been changed and is the gathering place for the whole family when they get together for the Grey Cup or the Super Bowl. The oriental carpet used to be in sister Mary's master bedroom, but it didn't fit, so she gifted it to Sara. Continued on page 94

and had it stained to match the rest of the second floor.





After almost five months, Sara and her family left the temporary shelter of her sisters and moved into their own home, transformed by thoughtful design, personal style and masterful craftsmanship. он









My husband and I spent years making rough sketches of our dream home, bookmarking photos, discussing features we admired in other houses, visiting building lots. We had a fairly specific idea of our wants and needs, but the reality of building a custom home seemed out of reach.

When a cottage we purchased as an investment proved structurally unsound, our plans changed and we found ourselves digging through our stack of magazine clippings and feverishly researching details. The cottage had to come down. In its place we'd build the custom home we always wanted.

While the ins and outs of design decisions and project management would come easily to us, financing a home build was utterly perplexing. With the mortgage we had in place for the cottage, and modest savings, how could we fund the needed construction? Would a lender approve us, a couple with no prior homebuilding experience, to be the general contractor of our own construction?

We were fortunate enough to enlist the help of Treena French, mortgage specialist with RBC, our everyday bank, who answered our questions, quelled our fears and walked us through each step (and there are many).

Yes, we could act as general contractors, as we had gathered and presented detailed cost estimates and drawings. Yes, our financials were sufficient for approval of our small home build. But just how would our construction mortgage operate?

Ours was the most common type, a construction draw mortgage. The first draw was enough to replace our original mortgage and gave us sufficient funds to begin the building process. Then, as work progressed on the house, we made three further draws against our final mortgage amount. Each time we reached a milestone in construction, we contacted Treena, who set the process in motion for the next draw.

That draw process was straightforward. An independent appraiser stopped by to evaluate the percentage of completion, and his report indicated that number to the bank, who released the next set of funds.

Those funds could take anywhere from days to weeks to arrive, during which time contractors required payment. In addition, each draw had its own holdback – a percentage of the funds that are held

CONSTRUCTION MORTGAGES AT-A-GLANCE

COMPLETION

A completion mortgage is one in which the builder receives all funds only after the home is complete – therefore all costs for the build are shouldered by the builder during the construction process. These types of mortgages are more common for homes with fewer customizations, as most lenders require construction to be complete within 120 days in order to lock in your interest rate.

With a completion mortgage, your application is approved before building commences. But, as the mortgage will not be registered in your name until completion, your financial position must remain unchanged during this period. A change in employment, a new car purchase, additional loan, etc., could jeopardize the mortgage of your home.

DRAW

With a draw mortgage, your mortgage is registered before the building process begins. Your builder receives payment throughout the build, via periodic draws on the final mortgage amount. The interest rate is locked in from the initial draw of funds, and you hold the title.

Each time a draw is initiated, an appraiser assesses the progress of the build, and funds are released through a lawyer. As a result of these steps, additional fees can be associated with a draw mortgage. In some cases, a larger down payment may be required up front to purchase land for the project, as well.

Your mortgage specialist will walk you through the details of both options, and help you choose the right plan to suit your needs.

by lawyers until project completion. For these circumstances, we were able to utilize our existing line of credit, which was required for the construction mortgage's approval.

If our line of credit had not been sufficient, or if we were otherwise not a good fit with our bank, where could we have turned for our mortgage? I contacted Gerard Buckley of Jaguar Mortgages to gain some insight.

As an independent mortgage agent, Gerard works to match the objectives of his clients with the strengths of his various lenders. In the case of an insufficient line of credit, the right fit might be a lender who offers far more than three or four draws throughout the construction process – perhaps on the order of 25 or 30. Buckley describes these draws as buckets, noting, "Thirty buckets is less precise and gives more flexibility to the homebuilder."

In our case, four buckets was exactly what we required. We hit no snags on the way, only asked a handful of needless questions of our lender, and somehow finished on budget.

I often mention, and speak highly, of the team who built our custom home – the tradespeople who spent weeks and months drilling, sawing and painting. But, although she was never on site, one of the most important players was Treena, our lender. Having an accessible, supportive mortgage specialist was crucial to the success of our build, and we found that finding someone we could trust and with whom we had a comfortable rapport was just as important as choosing tradespeople. **OH**






